Did you know?

- The top three causes of 1999 farm-related injuries in Iowa were machinery (27 percent of all injuries), animals (20 percent), and slips and falls (11 percent). However, the severity of these injuries differs. Only 10 percent of injuries caused by animals resulted in hospitalization while 15 percent of injuries involving machinery and 17 percent of injuries involving slips and falls lead to treatment.
- Acute chemical injury accounted for one percent of the total reported agricultural injuries in 1999.
- Tractors remain the number one killer of lowa farmers with 24 deaths reported. Other types of machinery caused five deaths.
- Youth age 19 and younger made up 16 percent of the total number of farm-related injuries. Fifty-three percent of the 270 injuries to youth were work-related. Five children under age 14 died as a result of farm-related injuries.
