#### HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 1987 UNCF STATISTICAL REPORT

- \* Enrollment at UNCF colleges showed little change: 43,561 students attended the member institutions in the fall of 1986, down 0.1% from the previous year.
- \* First-time freshman enrollment increased 2% to 12,116 in the fall of 1986. At private four-year colleges nationally, freshman enrollment fell 0.3%.
- \* UNCF faculty earned, on the average, only two-thirds the salaries of their peers at private four-year colleges nationally.
- \* The percentage of UNCF faculty with doctorates increased to 46% in 1986, up from 44% the previous year.
- \* Business continued to be the most popular major for UNCF students, representing 29% of all UNCF degrees awarded in 1985-86.
- \* UNCF colleges have been awarding an increasing proportion of degrees in the sciences and technical fields such as computer science, mathematics, and the health professions since 1980.
- \* UNCF institutions received a total of \$161.8 million in financial aid in 1985-86, an 8.4% increase over the previous year.
- \* Half of all UNCF students received loans in 1985-86, totalling \$46.6 million. Loans represented 29% of all financial aid at UNCF colleges.
- \* UNCF students paid an average \$6,108 to attend college during the 1986-87 academic year, two-thirds the \$9,089 charged at private four-year colleges nationally.
- \* The average endowment at UNCF colleges, \$6.1 million, was just over half the average endowment at private four-year colleges nationally (\$11.5 million).

#### INTRODUCTION

The United Negro College Fund's Annual Statistical Report is a compilation of the most recent statistical information on UNCF's forty-two member institutions.<sup>1</sup> All UNCF institutions are private, accredited, predominantly black colleges and universities. Forty member institutions offer baccalaureate programs, while two (Atlanta University and the Interdenominational Theological Center) offer graduate degree studies exclusively. Several member institutions, including Fisk, Tuskegee and Xavier, offer graduate programs in addition to their undergraduate curricula.

The UNCF member institutions have special significance because of their traditional and continuing role in educating minority group students for productive and creative participation in American life. During the past century, the private black colleges have provided education otherwise unavailable to thousands of able and deserving youths.

Public and private historically black colleges (HBCs) comprise about 3% of all institutions of higher education in the United States, yet they enroll 20% of all blacks attending college. Of over 3,000 colleges and universities nationw'de, 100 are considered historically black'. Of these, 43 are public and 57 are private; 87 are four-year institutions. Of the 87 four-year HBCs, 49 are private and 38 are public. Forty-two of the 49 four-year private HBCs are members of the United Negro College Fund.

Total black enrollment in higher education in the fall of 1984 was 1,101,500, with 216,050, or 20% enrolled in HBCs<sup>3</sup>. Nearly 71% of the students enrolled in HBCs attended public HBCs; approximately 29% attended private HBCs. Of the 62,889 enrolled in private HBCs in 1984, 43,805, or 70%, attended United Negro College Fund member colleges.

About 42%<sup>4</sup> of blacks enrolled in higher education in 1984 attended two-year institutions; the remainder attended four-year colleges and universities. With regard to UNCF colleges, approximately 7% of blacks enrolled in four-year colleges in 1984 attended UNCF institutions.

#### Method

The statistical information on the member institutions included in this study was obtained from the annual UNCF Questionnaire. Enrollment data used in the report are based on the fall of each academic year in order to facilitate comparisons with other institutions. Data on freshmen at private black colleges is taken from <u>The American Freshman</u>: <u>National</u> <u>Norms, Fall 1986</u>, from The Higher Education Research Institute at the University of California at Los Angeles.

Fall enrollment data exclude summer school students and students who did not enroll until the spring semester. Total enrollment at UNCF institutions, including summer school and additional spring semester students, is approximately 45,000 students.

#### ENROLLMENT

Enrollment at the over 3,000 colleges and universities nationwide and at UNCF colleges changed little from 1985 to 1986. In the fall of 1986, UNCF institutions reported a total enrollment of 43,561, down 0.1% from the previous year (Appendix A). At all higher education institutions and at private colleges nationally, fall 1986 enrollment increased approximately 1% from the previous year.

Twenty-three UNCF member institutions reported enrollment increases, 19 experienced decreases, and one reported its enrollment remained the same. Enrollment data show that those UNCF institutions with fewer than 600 students reported an overall 7% increase in enrollment. This increase is largely due to the enrollment growth at one institution. Eight of the twelve schools in this category showed enrollment increases.

The UNCF institutions that enroll from 600 to 1,000 students reported an overall 9% enrollment rise. Eight of these fourteen colleges showed an increase in enrollment.

Seventeen UNCF colleges enroll over 1,000 students. Colleges in this category showed an overall 2% enrollment loss from 1985 to 1986, with eight institutions experiencing decreases.

#### Full-time and Part-time Enrollment

UNCF students were more likely to be enrolled full-time than their peers nationally. In the fall of 1986, 91% of all UNCF students (39,836) attended college full-time, and 9% (3,725) were enrolled on a part-time basis (Appendix B). Nationally, 70% of all private four-year college students were enrolled full-time and 30% were part-time students.<sup>2</sup>

#### Enrollment by Sex

In the fall of 1986, more women than men attended UNCF colleges, a trend that has remained stable over the past decade. Overall, 57% of UNCF students were female and 43% were male (Appendix C).

At the undergraduate level this breaks down to an enrollment that is 57% female and 43% male. At the graduate level, on the other hand, the proportion of men to women was reversed. In 1986, men represented 51% of the enrollment at this level, and women accounted for 49% of the total.

#### Non-black Enrollment

There has been a significant increase in non-black enrollment at UNCF colleges over the past five years, although the ratio of non-black to black enrollment remains small.

The number of non-black students at UNCF colleges rose by 26% from the fall of 1981 to the fall of 1986, as compared with the overall 1.1% growth in UNCF enrollment for the same period. The 1,037 non-black students enrolled in the fall of 1986 represented 2.4% of all UNCF students (Appendix E).

Within the category of non-blacks, both whites and Hispanics have been enrolling in growing numbers. The growth pattern in white enrollment has been steadier and more significant than that of Hispanic students. In the fall of 1986, there were 620 whites enrolled at UNCF colleges, a 17.2% increase over the previous year.

The enrollment of Hispanics at UNCF inst\_tutions has been on an overall rise, up 11% from 1981, although this upward trend has been characterized by sharp fluctuations. These fluctuations largely reflect the enrollment patterns of one member college, which enrolls over 70% of the Hispanic students at UNCF colleges. The 44% drop in Hispanic enrollment in the past year is largely attributable to several organizational changes made at that institution, including the closing of an outreach center that was located in an Hispanic suburb. There were 417 Hispanic students enrolled in UNCF institutions in fall 1986.

#### Transfer Students


In the fall of 1986, 1,969 students transferred to UNCF colleges, a 12% decrease from the previous year. Transfer students represented 5% of total UNCF enrollment (Appendix F).

Of the 1,889 transfer students for whom detailed information is available, 54% came to UNCF institutions from four-year colleges. Of that number, 611 (55%) students had attended institutions that were predominantly white, and 444 transferred from predominantly black colleges.

Of the 786 UNCF transfer students who had attended two-year colleges, 63% came from institutions that were predominantly white. Thirty-seven percent had attended predominantly black colleges.



#### Geographical Distribution


Nearly two-thirds of the students attending UNCF colleges in the fall of 1986 were from the Southeastern states: 28,669 students in all. The proportion of students from the Central states has been rising steadily over the past five years, from 8% of total UNCF enrollment in 1981 to 11% in 1986. There were 4,703 students from the Central region attending member colleges in the fall of 1986. Students from the Northeast accounted for 10% of fall 1986 enrollment, and the 3,199 students from the Western states represented 7% of total UNCF enrollment (Appendix J).

In the fall of 1986, 59% of UNCF students attended college in their home states; 35% were from out-of-state, and 6% were foreign students (Appendix I). UNCF colleges enrolled 2,443 foreign students in the fall of 1986 (Appendix K).



#### Freshman Enrollment

The number of first-time freshmen at UNCF colleges increased 2% to 12,116 in the fall of 1986 (Appendix L). Nationally, freshman enrollment decreased 3% from 1985 to 1986. The number of freshmen at private colleges nationwide dropped 0.3%.

The number of completed applications to UNCF institutions in 1986 increased by 2% to 36,199; 20 colleges experienced an increase in the number of applications received. Forty-seven percent of those admitted actually enrolled, up slightly from last year's percentage.

> The number of UNCF first-time freshmen who graduated in the upper levels of their high school class is increasing. Fourteen percent of freshmen entering UNCF colleges graduated in the upper 10% of their high school class in 1986, up from 13% in 1985. First-time freshmen in the upper half of their graduating class represented 50% of all entering freshmen, as compared with 45% of entering freshmen in 1985 (Appendix M).

#### Reasons Why Students Attend College

Among the reasons most often given by a majority of freshmen responding to surveys' conducted by the Higher Education Research Institute were: to gain a general education, to learn more about things, to get a better job, to make more money and to prepare for graduate school. However, the proportion of students both at private black colleges and four-year colleges nationally who consider these reasons important or very important changed from 1981 to 1986. College freshmen surveyed in 1986 showed themselves to be more motivated by a desire for financial security than those responding to the 1981 survey.

For freshmen at private black colleges, most of whom came from low-income backgrounds, this trend was even more pronounced. In 1981, four out of five private black college freshmen stated that being very well-off financially was a very important objective, compared with 62% of freshmen nationally. Five years later, these figures had increased to 87% of private black college freshmen and 71% of freshmen at all four-year colleges.

With this change in the proportion of students who considered being financially well-off an essential or very important objective, it is not surprising that making more money and getting a better job became increasingly important reasons to attend college. This was true of private black college freshmen and freshmen at four-year colleges nationally, although a larger proportion of private black college freshmen cited these reasons. The percentage at private black college freshmen surveyed who said that they were attending college in order to get a better job rose significantly from 1981 to 1986. Eighty-one percent of private black college freshmen stated this was an important or very important reason in 1981; by 1986, this figure had grown to nearly 91%. Three-fourths of all four-year college freshmen reported this was a very important reason in 1981, growing to 81% in 1986. Making more money was also an important reason for attending college for a greater proportion of freshmen at private black colleges than for their counterparts at four-year colleges nationally. In 1981, over three-fourths of first-year students at private black colleges cited this as an important motivation for attending college, increasing to 82% of private black college freshmen in 1986. For freshmen at all four-year colleges, 62% responded that making more money was an important reason for going to college in 1981, rising to two-thirds of all four-year freshmen in 1986.

In contrast, "gaining a general education" and "learning more about things," while still cited as important factors by a majority of both private black college freshmen and all four-year college freshmen, declined in proportion from 1981 to 1986.

In 1981, 85% of freshmen at private black colleges said that gaining a general education was an important reason for attending college, and 82% stated that learning more about things was an important motivation. By 1986, the proportion of private black college freshmen citing these reasons as important dropped to 70% and 75%, respectively.

The proportion of private black college freshmen who were motivated to attend college in order to prepare for graduate school continued to be higher than for freshmen at all four-year colleges: in 1986, 73% of private black college freshmen cited this reason, compared with 47% of all four-year college freshmen.



#### FACULTY

In 1986, there were 2,949 faculty at the UNCF member colleges. The total number of faculty members at UNCF colleges increased 0.4% over the previous year. Twenty UNCF colleges increased the number of their faculty, an equal number reported a decrease, and three institutions showed no change in the number of their full-time equivalent faculty (Appendix N). New appointments were 13% of the total faculty, and separations (which exclude retirement) accounted for 12% of the total (Appendix O).

#### Faculty by Race

Approximately 64% of the 2,949 UNCF faculty were black and about 36% were non-black. In 1986-87, there were 1,899 black faculty members and 1,050 non-black faculty. The number of black faculty at UNCF institutions remained relatively unchanged; however, non-black faculty increased their number by 2% in 1986 (Appendix N).

#### Faculty with Doctorates

The percentage of UNCF faculty members with doctoral degrees has increased over the past five years. In 1986-87, 46.2% of faculty at the member colleges held doctorates (Appendix N), compared with 44.4% of UNCF faculty in 1981-82.

#### Faculty Distribution by Academic Area


The percentage of faculty in the humanities and languages, the largest division, has remained stable over the past three years.


About 23% of UNCF faculty taught courses in the humanities and languages in 1986-87 (Appendix P). The science and mathematics division accounted for 21% of all member college faculty in 1986-87, compared with 19% of all UNCF faculty in 1983-84.

The percentage of faculty teaching in the social sciences has declined over this same period, from 16% in 1983-84 to 14% in 1986-87. Faculty in the education division accounted for 15% of all UNCF faculty in 1986-87, virtually unchanged over a three-year period. The percentage of UNCF faculty teaching business courses rose to 12% in 1986-87, from 11% three years previously. Eight percent of UNCF faculty gave instruction in the fine and applied arts division, and 4% taught in the vocational education and health category. Three percent of faculty at UNCF institutions gave instruction in computer science and engineering in 1986-87, up from 2% in 1983-84.


#### Salaries by Rank

Overall, UNCF faculty salaries increased 4.4% from 1985 to 1986, ranging from a high of 5.2% for faculty at the associate professor level to a low of 3.5% for instructors.

In 1986-87, UNCF full professors earned an average \$25,138, up 4.3% over the previous year (Appendix Q). Associate professors at UNCF colleges averaged a \$21,621 annual salary, and assistant professors had an average salary of \$18,930 (a 4.4% increase). UNCF faculty at the instructor level earned, on the average, \$16,703 in 1986-87.

UNCF faculty earned, overall, only two-thirds (66.9%) the salaries of their peers nationally.<sup>2</sup> Full professors at UNCF colleges earned the least in comparison with their national counterparts. Salaries for full professors were 62.1% those of full professors at private baccalaureate institutions nationally. Instructors at UNCF colleges earned about 85.6% of what their peers at colleges nationally earned.

#### Employee Composition

UNCF colleges employed 9,266 persons in 1986-87 (Appendix R). Faculty members accounted for 37% of the total, 12% were administrators and 51% were general service workers (this category includes clerical, technical and other non-academic and nonprofessional workers).

#### DEGREES GRANTED

UNCF colleges awarded 5,942 degrees in the 1985-86 academic year, down 6.5% from the previous year (Appendix S). Most of this decline can be attributed to an 8.2% drop in the total number of baccalaureate degrees awarded. Twenty-seven member colleges reported a decrease in the total number of degrees awarded in 1985-86. Of that number, 22 experienced decreases of more than ten percent. UNCF colleges at all enrollment levels were equally affected.


A total of 5,225 students earned bachelor's degrees in 1985-86. UNCF colleges awarded 514 master's degrees (an 11.3% increase), 149 professional degrees and 54 doctorates.

#### Degrees Awarded by Subject Area

Business continues to be the most popular major field for UNCF students, although the percentage and number of degrees earned in this field declined for the first time since 1981. UNCF colleges awarded 1,734 business degrees in 1985-86, representing 29.2% of all UNCF degrees. Nearly half of those receiving business degrees majored in business administration (Appendix T).

In 1985-86, education ranked as the second most popular major at UNCF colleges, surpassing the social sciences for the first time since 1982-83. Nearly 14% of UNCF graduating seniors, or 799 students, received degrees in this field. This represents the first upswing in the proportion of UNCF graduates awarded education degrees (although a decline in absolute numbers) since the mid-1970s, when students began to show decreasing interest in this field both at UNCF colleges and nationally. UNCF institutions awarded 751 degrees in the social sciences in 1985-86, representing 12.6% of all UNCF graduates.

Over the past five years, UNCF colleges have been awarding more degrees in the sciences and technical fields such as computer science, mathematics, engineering, and the health professions. In all these areas (excluding biological science, which has remained stable), the percentage of degrees awarded to UNCF students has risen significantly.

#### Dual-degree Engineering

There were 1,180 students enrolled in the dual-degree engineering programs at the 26 participating UNCF colleges (Appendix U). Over 1,000 students were enrolled at the undergraduate level, and 130 were full-time students in the 33 cooperating engineering schools. Seventy percent of the students in this program were male, 30% female.

#### STUDENT FINANCIAL AID

With the decline in the availability and purchasing power of federal grant and work-study programs, college students across the nation have been forced to rely increasingly on loans to finance their education. This means decreased access to higher education for poorer students, who make up the majority of UNCF students. Students must now weigh even more carefully than before the pros and cons of taking on a large burden of debt in order to go to college. As a result, many students at the lower end of the income scale may decide not to go to college at all rather than take on this debt.

The proportion of private black college freshmen with family incomes under \$10,000 decreased significantly from 1981 to 1986. In 1981, 36% of private black college freshmen reported family incomes under \$10,000 (with 19% earning less than \$6,000 annually). Five years later, only 17% of private black college students were in this category.<sup>2</sup> By the same token, the proportion of freshmen with incomes over \$25,000 rose from one-fourth of all private black college freshmen in 1981, to over half in 1986. These figures may be, in part, a reflection of the lowest income students opting out of higher education altogether.

In addition, the shift away from grants and toward loans has a negative effect on rates of persistence in college. According to a study by the U.S. Department of Education, college students stay in school at higher rates when they receive grants or scholarships. Heavy reliance on loans may contribute to the decision to drop out of college.

At UNCF colleges in 1980, loans accounted for 13% of all financial aid. By 1985, this figure had risen to 29%. Monies awarded under the Pell Grant and Supplementary Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG) programs, which were nearly half of all financial assistance to UNCF students in 1980, had declined to 37% of the total by 1985. During this same five-year period, funds allocated under the College Work-Study program, also a significant source of aid to UNCF students, dropped to 11% of all financial aid in 1985, down from more than 15% in 1980.




Figure 6 Financial Ald by Category 1980-81 and 1985-86

In 1985-86, about 89% of all UNCF students received financial aid totalling \$161,864,749 from all sources. This represents an 8.4% increase over the previous year's total (Appendix W).

#### Pell Grants

Although loans have been increasing in importance over the past five years, the Pell Grant is still the largest single source of aid to students attending the member colleges. In 1985-86, 63% of all UNCF students, or 27,952 students, received Pell Grants. The total Pell Grant allocation increased 10.6% to \$45,592,383. The size of the average grant increased 11.6% to \$1,631.

#### Supplementary Educational Opportunity Grants

UNCF students received \$14,134,542 in Supplementary Educational Opportunity Grants (SEOG) in 1985-86, a 2.6% increase over the previous year's total. The 16,721 students who received this grant represented 38% of all UNCF students. The average grant size increased just over 2% to \$845.

#### College Work-Study

The \$17,110,718 in College Work-Study allocations was awarded to 17,528 students, or 40% of all UNCF students. The total Work-Study award increased 1.1% from 1984-85 to 1985-86. UNCF students received an average grant of \$976, up 2.4% from the previous year.

#### Guaranteed Student Loans

Nearly half of all UNCF students, or 21,666 in total, received \$41,717,361 in loans through the Guaranteed Student Loan (GSL) program. The total allocation rose 6.2% in 1985-86. The size of the average loan fell 2.4% to \$1,925.

#### National Direct Student Loans

Student borrowing under the National Direct Student Loan (NDSL) program decreased nearly 5% in 1985-86. Twelve percent of all UNCF students, or 5,304 students, took out loans totalling \$4,971,809. The size of the average loan was \$948.

#### State Scholarships

State scholarships to UNCF students rose 14.1% in 1985-86, to \$17,536,888. Forty-two percent of all UNCF students, or 18,502 students, received an average grant of \$948 during the academic year.

#### Institutional Scholarships

UNCF colleges awarded \$15,633,337 in institutional scholarships in 1985-86, up nearly 20% over the previous year. One-fifth of all UNCF students, or 8,907 students, were awarded an average \$1,755 grant in 1985-86.

#### COLLEGE COSTS

In 1986-87, the average cost of attending a UNCF institution was \$6,108, a 6.9% increase over the previous year. At private colleges nationally, students paid an average of \$9,089<sup>1</sup> to attend college, a 5.9% rise. The cost of attending a UNCF institution was two-thirds the amount charged by private four-year colleges nationally.

#### Tuition

Tuition and fees at UNCF colleges rose 7.1% to \$3,453, keeping pace with the average 6.9\% gain at private colleges nationally. However, UNCF charges as a percentage of private college tuitions nationally have been decreasing over the past five years, from 66% in 1981-1982 to 60% in 1986-87.


Tuition at UNCF institutions is expected to rise by 5.7% to \$3,650 in the 1987-88 academic year.

#### Room and Board

The average charge for room and board was \$2,256 at UNCF colleges in 1986-87, a 5.3% increase over the previous year. At independent colleges nationally, room and board costs were \$2,899, one-fourth higher than at UNCF colleges.

#### Books and Supplies

The cost of books and supplies increased 14% to \$399 in 1986-87. This was roughly the same as the \$397 average cost at private four-year colleges nationally.

#### INSTITUTIONAL FINANCES

Total revenues at UNCF institutions rose 1.7% in 1985-86, to \$394,603,384; total expenditures were \$394,370,656, up 2.9%. About onethird of UNCF institutions operated at a deficit during this period, 16 in all (Appendix Y).

In 1985-86, revenues at UNCF colleges averaged \$9,176,822. Average revenues per student rose 1.7% to \$9,049. UNCF member colleges spent an average \$9,171,410; average expenditures per student was \$9,044.

#### **Current Fund Revenues**

The largest single source of current fund revenues is tuition and fees. Since 1982, UNCF institutions have received a moderately increased proportion of their income from this source. In 1985-86, 39% of all member college revenues came from this source (Appendix Z). In 1982-83, this figure was 36%. Because UNCF college tuitions must be kept low in light of the low-income backgrounds of most of their students, UNCF colleges still receive a smaller percentage of their income from tuition revenues than private colleges nationally. About half of the total revenues at private four-year colleges nationally come from tuition.<sup>1</sup>

The federal government is the second largest source of revenue at UNCF colleges. This category includes all campus-based student aid such as the SEOG, College Work-Study and NDSL programs. In the wake of federal student aid cutbacks, it is not surprising that the percentage of income received from the federal government decreased significantly from 1982. In that year, UNCF institutions received 23% of their revenues from this source; by 1985, this figure had shrunk to 19%.

Monies from state governments accounted for 1% of all UNCF college revenues (this category includes all funds received from the state excluding student aid awarded to individual students).

Endowment income accounted for four percent of total UNCF college revenues in 1985-86. Private gifts were 17% of total UNCF income.

UNCF colleges received 16% of their income from auxiliary enterprises and 3% from miscellaneous sources.


#### Current Fund Expenditures


The percentage distribution of expenditures in each category remained fairly constant from 1982 to 1985. Instruction, the largest single expense item, accounted for 23% of all UNCF college expenditures in 1985-86 (Appendix AA). Nineteen percent of total UNCF college monies was spent on institutional support. This category includes executive office expenses as well as support for the public relations, alumni relations, development departments and other general administrative offices.

Twelve percent of UNCF college funds was spent on scholarships in 1985-86. Student services, which includes admissions, financial aid, counseling, etc., accounted for 8% of expenditures at UNCF institutions. Member colleges allocated 5% of their total expenditures for academic support (e.g., libraries, academic administration, etc).

Research accounted for 2% of total member college expenditures in 1985-86. Another two percent of UNCF college monies went to public service (these are funds and services to groups and individuals external to the institution).

The costs of operating and maintaining the physical plant accounted for 10% of expenditures at UNCF colleges. UNCF colleges allocated 13% of their expenditures for auxiliary enterprises (residence halls, food service, college stores, etc.) and 5% for miscellaneous expenses.

#### Endownent

The total endowment at UNCF institutions rose 18.6% to \$263,458,077 in the 1985-86 academic year (Appendix BB). Nationally, endowments rose 26.9% overall.<sup>3</sup> Six colleges accounted for about half of the total UNCF college endowment.

The average UNCF college endowment, \$6,126,932, was just over half the average endowment for private four-year colleges nationally, \$11,515,625.<sup>4</sup> Average endowment per FTE UNCF college student was \$6,414 in 1985-86, compared with a \$7,377 average at private baccalaureate colleges nationally.




Figure 9 Average Endowment, 1985–86 & Private 4—Yr Colleges Nationally
