### Principal activity

The principal activity of the entity during the financial year was promotion of union activities within the education sector. No significant change in the nature of these activities occurred during the year

#### After balance date evenu

No matters or circumstances have arisen since the end of the financial year which significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the union, the results of those operations, or the state of affairs of the union in future financial years.

The union did not have any employees during the year. The number of financial members at December 31, 2012 was 61,951 (2011: 61,579)

No officer or member of the organisation holds a position as a trustee or director of a superannuation entity or exempt public sector superannuation scheme where the criterion for holding such position is that they are an officer or member of an organisation

#### Rights of members to resign

Members may resign from the union in accordance with rule 17. which reads as follows:

\*17 - Resignation from membership and termination of eligibility (3) A member may resign from the union by written notice addressed to and delivered to the Secretary of the branch to which the member is attached.

(4) A notice of resignation from membership takes effect:

(a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the union

(i) on the day on which the notice is received at the office of the relevant Branch Secretary: or

(ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member; whichever is later; or

(b) in any other case

(i) at the end of two weeks after the notice is received at the office of the relevant Branch Secretary; or

(ii) on the day specified in the notice; whichever is later.

(5) Any subscriptions, levies or fines which are due and payable but have not been paid by a former member in relation to a period before the member's resignation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the union. in a court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the union.

(6) A notice delivered to the relevant Branch Secretary shall be taken to have been received by the union when it was delivered.

(7) A notice of resignation that has been received at the office of the relevant Branch Secretary is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with sub-rule (1). (8) A resignation from membership is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this section if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the union that the resignation has been accepted.

(9) A relevant Branch Secretary may accept a resignation from membership which is not effected 12 >>

We expressed an unmodified auditor's opinion on that financial report in our auditor's report dated May 4, 2013.

# Discussion and analysis of the financial statements

Information on Australian Education Union (NSW Branch) Financial Report The financial statements and disclosures in the concise financial report have been derived from the December 31, 2012 financial report of Australian Education Union (NSW Branch) and cannot be expected to provide as full an understanding of the financial performance, financial position and financial and investing activities of the reporting unit as the full report.

The discussion and analysis is provided to assist members in understanding the concise financial report. The discussion and analysis is based on Australian Education Union (NSW Branch) financial statements and the information contained in the concise financial report has been derived from the full 2012 Financial Report of Australian Education Union (NSW Branch).

## Statement of comprehensive income

Loss for the year was \$1490. This compared to a gain in 2011 year of \$930. The loss for the year is due primarily to less interest income received during 2012 as compared to 2011 year.

Membership fee income of the branch was \$2,488,628 representing an increase of 4.06 per cent from the prior year (2011: \$2,391,582).

Statement of financial position
Trade and other receivables was
\$452,334 in 2012, representing an increase of \$646,332 over the previous
year (2011: \$6,002). This is due to in
the main to outstanding payment of
two invoices at balance date.

Equity has decreased by \$1490 from \$10,294 in 2011 to \$8804 in 2012. This was due to the operating loss during the year of \$1490.

#### Cash flow statement

Cash has increased by \$65,481 from \$7562 in 2011 to \$73,043 in 2012. The net increase in cash held at December 31, 2012 is due to payment of debtors invoices as received from the NSW Teachers Federation.

#### Notes to the financial report for the year ended December 31, 2012

#### Note 1: Basis of preparation of the concise financial report

The concise financial report is an extract for the full financial report for the year ended December 31, 2012. The concise financial report has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standard AASB 1039 Concise Financial Reports.

The financial statements, specific disclosures and other information included in the concise financial report are derived from, and are consistent with, the full financial report of Australian Education Union (NSW Branch). The concise financial report cannot be expected to provide as detailed an understanding of the financial performance, financial position and financing and investing activities of Australian Education Union (NSW Branch) as the full financial report and auditor's report will be sent to any member, free of charge, upon request.

The financial report of Australian Education Union (NSW Branch) complies with all Accounting Standards, including Australian Accounting Interpretations and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board as well as the requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009. A statement of compliance with International Financial Reporting Standards cannot be made due to the entity applying the not-for profit section specific requirements contained in AIFRS. The presentation currency used in this concise financial report is Australian dollars.

#### Note 2: Relationship between Aus trailan Education Union and NSW Teachers Federation

NSW Teachers Federation is an associated body of the Australian Education Union specified in the Australian Education Union rules. The NSW Teachers Federation membership fee

includes membership of the Australian Education Union (NSW Branch).

Membership fees for members of the Australian Education Union (NSW Branch) are received from the NSW Teachers Federation as per the obligation of the NSW Teachers Federation as an associated body of the Australian Education Union and enabled by Rule 11 (?) of the Australian Education Union rules.

The Australian Education Union (NSW Branch) notes that NSW Teachers Federation continues to make provision for those costs in its annual budget incurred by the Australian Education Union (NSW Branch) in respect of auditors' fees and bank fees incurred for management of membership fees and audited accounts and does this as part of its obligation to collect and process membership fees for the Australian Education Union (NSW Branch).
