introduction

The U.S. Office of Education has maintained a continuing interest in stimulating research in the field of social science curriculum development. This directory represents an effort to keep abreast of current trends in the social and behavioral sciences with the objective of meeting the curriculum needs of the educational community. The approach has been to draw upon the vast resources of the various social science disciplines and the insights gained from scholarship to assist teachers, supervisors, and administrators in better understanding the complex societal factors which characterize modern life. The projects include studies in anthropology, sociology, political science, history, geography, foreign area studies, economics, international relations, and environmental education.

The directory is not intended to be exhaustive. Moreover, many of the most critical issues confronting American education today are treated within the context of dynamic social, political, economic, and technical change such as the impact of cultural and ethnic diversity and the changing pattern of race relations on current educational practices; the sociopolitical consequences of rapid urbanization, population growth, and social disorganization; the adaptation of new teaching strategies to social science curriculum; the conflict between alienation and the necessity of inculcating positive civic attitudes; the continuing challenge of totalitarianism to democracy and free societies in the international arena; and the role of the United States as a world leader.

Most of the documents listed in this directory are obtainable through the Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC), the Bureau of Research's national information network designed to serve the educational community by making available the latest educational research and related materials. ED (report) and EP (project) numbers are the accession/identification numbers assigned to the documents as they are processed by ERIC. The full texts of all final reports of the projects listed are available in either hard copy or microfiche from the ERIC Document Reproduction Service (EDRS).

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Those entries without ERIC accession numbers are either still ongoing or were not selected by the various ERIC clearinghouses throughout the country to be included in the document service. In these cases, direct contact with the principal investigators listed is recommended.
