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## ABSTRACT

This report discusses the characteristics of Miami-Dade Community College (M-DCC) (Florida) graduates for the 1999-2000 academic year. It includes statistics for the entire community college as well as individualized statistics for the separate campuses. The report also highlights changes in statistics from the previous year. The report shows that the community college had 4,938 graduates in 1999-2000. Of that total 59% were Hispanic, 22% were black, and 17% were white. Other results included: (1) 58% of the community college graduates were female; (2) only 49% reported English as their native language; (3) the mean age of college graduates was 28.5 years, but vocational graduates were older, with mean ages ranging from 32.9 for Associate in Science (AS) graduates to 34.6 for vocational credit certificate graduates; (4) the community college showed a rise in AS degrees, but a drop in vocational credit certificates; (5) Hispanic proportions are highest for the Associate in Arts (AA) degree (63% Hispanic), while black non-Hispanic proportions are highest for the AS degree (30% black); (6) males predominate in college credit certificates (69%), probably due to the paramedic program; and (7) there were 351 fewer AA graduates, due in part to the lack of automatic graduation during the implementation of the college's new degree audit system. 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## Graduate Profile, 1999-2000

*The purpose of this report is to describe characteristics of Miami-Dade Community College graduates during the academic year 1999-2000, and to highlight any changes from the previous report year.*

### COLLEGE-WIDE RESULTS (TABLES 1-2)

---

#### Demographics

Table 1 shows that Miami-Dade produced 4,938 graduates in 1999-2000.

- 59% were Hispanics; 22% Black non-Hispanics; and 17% White non-Hispanics.
- 58% were females.
- Only 49% reported a native language of English.
- The mean age of graduates was 28.48.

Some differences among degree/certificate categories include:

- Vocational graduates are older, with mean ages ranging from 32.83 for Associate in Science (A.S.) graduates to 34.57 for Vocational Credit Certificate graduates. This compares to 26.15 for Associate in Arts (A.A.) graduates.
- Hispanic proportions are highest for the A.A. degree (63% Hispanic), while Black non-Hispanic proportions are highest for the A.S. Degree (30% Black).
- Males predominate in College Credit Certificates (69%) probably due to the Paramedic program.

#### Historical Trends

Table 2 shows another drop in the total number of graduates this past year, with the decrease occurring for A.A. graduates (351 fewer) and Vocational Credit Certificate graduates (117 fewer).

- The increase in A.A. graduates for 1996-97 and 1997-98 was due in part to students who qualified for the CLAST alternative and/or were automatically graduated. The continued drop in A.A. graduates from 1998-99 to 1999-00 is due to the lack of automatic graduation while we finish implementation of the new degree audit system. Campus based efforts to manually graduate students helped to mitigate the loss.
- The drop in Vocational Credit Certificate graduates was offset in State data with our ability to report occupational completion points for students. Once automatic graduation begins, students will also be identified as program graduates.
- Campus based efforts to manually graduate students resulted in an increase in A.S. graduates.

## **NORTH CAMPUS (TABLES 3-4)**

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### **Demographics**

Table 3 shows that North Campus produced 1,381 graduates in 1999-2000. This was 27.9% of all Miami-Dade Community College graduates.

- 51% were Hispanics; 37% Black non-Hispanics; and 10% White non-Hispanics.
- 56% were females.
- Only 49% reported a native language of English.
- The mean age of graduates was 28.97, higher than the college-wide average.

### **Special Campus Highlights**

- North Campus had the highest proportion of Black non-Hispanic graduates of any campus (37%).
- North Campus awarded 60% of all Vocational Credit Certificates earned at Miami-Dade.

### **Historical Trends**

Table 4 shows relative stability in the total number of graduates this past year.

- Unlike the college-wide data, A.A. graduates have stabilized after the two 'boom years' where students first qualified for the CLAST alternative and/or were automatically graduated.
- The drop in Vocational Credit Certificate graduates was offset by a gain in A.S. graduates.

## **KENDALL CAMPUS (TABLES 5-6)**

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### **Demographics**

Table 5 shows that Kendall Campus produced 1,571 graduates in 1999-2000, 31.8% of all Miami-Dade Community College graduates.

- 71% were Hispanics; 8% Black non-Hispanics; and 19% White non-Hispanics.
- 57% were females.
- 52% reported a native language of English.
- The mean age was 26.69, the lowest of any campus.

### **Special Campus Highlights**

- Kendall Campus had the highest proportion (89%) and absolute number (1,394) of Associate in Arts degree graduates of any campus.
- Kendall Campus had the most Hispanic graduates (1,112).

### **Historical Trends**

Table 6 shows another decline (-19.6%) in the number of Kendall Campus graduates.

- The initial drop in A.A. graduates for 1998-99 may signal the end of a "catch-up" in students who were automatically graduated or who qualified for the CLAST alternative. The continued decline is due to the lack of automatic graduation while we finish implementation of the new degree audit system. Campus based efforts to manually graduate students helped to mitigate the loss.
- The stability in A.S. graduates is due to campus based efforts to manually graduate students.

## **WOLFSON CAMPUS (TABLES 7-8)**

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### **Demographics**

Table 7 shows that Wolfson Campus produced 681 graduates in 1999-2000, 13.8% of all Miami-Dade Community College graduates.

- ❑ 63% were Hispanics; 18% Black non-Hispanics; and 16% White non-Hispanics.
- ❑ 60% were females.
- ❑ Only 37% reported a native language of English.
- ❑ The mean age was 27.50.

### **Special Campus Highlights**

- ❑ Wolfson Campus had the second lowest proportion of graduates with a native language of English (37%).

### **Historical Trends**

Table 8 shows that the number of Wolfson Campus graduates decreased by 18.3% in 1999-2000.

- ❑ This drop is primarily due to the separation of InterAmerican Campus data from Wolfson. The combined total for the two campuses is 817 graduates, almost stable with 1998-99.

## **MEDICAL CENTER CAMPUS (TABLES 9-10)**

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### **Demographics**

Table 9 shows that Medical Center Campus produced 924 graduates in 1999-2000, 18.7% of all Miami-Dade Community College graduates.

- ❑ 47% were Hispanics; 30% Black non-Hispanics; and 21% White non-Hispanics.
- ❑ 60% were females.
- ❑ 54% reported a native language of English.
- ❑ The mean age was 31.34.

### **Special Campus Highlights**

- ❑ Medical Center Campus reported the highest proportion (70%) and absolute number (647) of Associate in Science graduates of any campus. Medical Center awarded 54% of all A.S. degrees conferred at Miami-Dade in 1999-2000.
- ❑ Medical Center Campus graduates had the highest mean age of any campus (31.34).

### **Historical Trends**

Table 10 shows relative stability in the number of Medical Center graduates.

- ❑ 647 A.S. degrees were granted in 1999-2000, identical to the previous year.
- ❑ The number of College Credit Certificates increased to 194.



## **HOMESTEAD CAMPUS (TABLES 11-12)**

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### **Demographics**

Table 11 shows that Homestead Campus produced 245 graduates in 1999-2000, 4.9% of all Miami-Dade Community College graduates.

- 47% were Hispanics; 18% Black non-Hispanics; and 31% White non-Hispanics.
- 63% were females.
- 58% reported a native language of English.
- The mean age was 28.12.

### **Special Campus Highlights**

- Homestead Campus had the highest proportion of White non-Hispanic graduates (31%).
- It also had the highest proportion of graduates with a native language of English (58%).

### **Historical Trends**

Table 12 shows that the number of Homestead Campus graduates increased by 43% in 1999-2000. This was the only campus that showed such an increase.

- 148 A.A. degrees were granted in 1999-2000, a 24% increase from the previous year.
- The number of A.S. degrees awarded was virtually identical to the previous year.
- College Credit Certificates increased to 50, surpassing the number of A.S. degrees.

## **INTERAMERICAN CAMPUS (TABLES 13-14)**

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### **Demographics**

Table 13 shows that InterAmerican Campus produced 136 graduates in 1999-2000, 2.7% of all Miami-Dade Community College graduates.

- 95% were Hispanics; 1% Black non-Hispanics; and 4% White non-Hispanics.
- 65% were females.
- Only 10% reported a native language of English.
- The mean age was 30.39.

### **Special Campus Highlights**

- InterAmerican Campus had the highest proportion of Hispanic graduates (95%).
- It also had the lowest proportion of graduates with a native language of English (10%).

### **Historical Trends**

Table 14 contains only one year of separated data for InterAmerican Campus graduates. Therefore, no comments on trends are possible.

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
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
