ELEPHANT WORKSHOPS AND SYMPOSIUM

Annual Elephant Workshops

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 8, 1982

Individuals and representatives of institutions involved with elephants in North America have rallied together to develop an annual meeting devoted to discussion of common interests in captive elephant management. The first four elephant workshops were supported by zoo organizations mainly and tended to be dominated by zoo representatives and private owners in order to bring their expertise and experiences to bear on problems. An effort has been made since 1983 to include a wider range of elephant handlers and to coordinate management techniques. It is hoped that the combined energies of all those who have initiated this enterprise will bring to fruition the goals of this loose organization of individuals devoted to the well being of elephants in captivity. A brief report on the first Elephant Workshop appeared in Elephant, 1(4):183-185, and an outline of the second Elephant Workshop was included in Elephant, 2(1):156-157. Following are the reports on the Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth and Seventh Elephant Workshops which convey the level of concern and the breadth of these sessions.

THIRD ANNUAL ELEPHANT SEMINAR DICKERSON PARK ZOO, SPRINGFIELD, MISSOURI USA by Jeff Glazier

The Third Annual Elephant Seminar was held at Dickerson Park Zoo in Springfield, Missouri, on October 8, 9, and 10, 1982. Attendance was much greater than expected with zoos, circuses, animal parks, private animal trainers and one university being represented. A total of 162 participants attended, representing 76 institutions from 24 states, plus Washington, D.C., and Canada.

The seminar was hosted by the Springfield Park Board, Dickerson Park Zoo, Friends of the Zoo (FOZ), Zoo Docents, and the local AAZK Chapter. The host committee consisted of Mike Crocker, senior keeper; Jeff Glazier, assistant senior keeper; Paul Price, zoological curator; Stephaie Rutan, commissary keeper; Terry Letterman, zookeeper; Dale Tuttle, zoo director; Mildred Hager and Blanche Jones, zoo secretaries; and Judy Tuttle, FOZ business manager. Papers and demonstrations were given at the Hilton Inn of the Ozarks and Dickerson Park Zoo.

FIFTH ANNUAL ELEPHANT WORKSHOP AUDUBON PARK AND ZOOLOGICAL GARDEN, NEW ORLEANS, LOUISIANA USA by Sandra Lash Shoshani

The Fifth Annual Elephant Workshop was hosted by Audubon Park and Zoological Garden from November 29 through December 1, 1984, in New Orleans, Louisiana. By vote the participants at the conference chose the Calgary Zoo, Calgary, Alberta, Canada, as the site of the Seventh Annual Elephant Workshop in 1986.

Editors' note: Several significant steps have been taken by groups of people working with elephants as a result of these meetings. Coordination of efforts to enhance propagation of both Asian and African elephants in captivity is the focal point. In order to support this goal, personnel from diverse institutions and organizations have discussed, argued and negotiated in formal groups and through informal meetings. Continuing support for the Annual Elephant Workshop is an outgrowth of awareness among participants of the need for dialogue.

One piece of tangible evidence of progress is a list of ten standard commands for working elephants which was accepted by participants at the Fort Worth meeting. It is particularly important that steps such as this one are being taken by <u>individuals</u> based on commitment to a common goal; administration or outside agencies are not imposing these requirements on elephant handlers. The benefits to come from such workshops must originate with those individuals directly involved with elephants.

It is hoped that interchange of information and ideas between elephant people will continue through such devices as these workshops. Although it is often difficult for private owners and those working with circus shows to be present, their participation has been welcomed and an effort to involve all points of view has been made in presentations, panel discussions and demonstrations. A very popular aspect of the program (the Hospitality Suite) has become the informal sessions in the evenings where space and equipment for showing slides and videotapes has been provided. An adjoining area for conversation has been well used also.

SEVENTH ANNUAL ELEPHANT WORKSHOP THE CALGARY ZOOLOGICAL SOCIETY, CALGARY, ALBERTA, CANADA by Sandra Lash Shoshani

The Seventh Annual Elephant Workshop was hosted by The Calgary Zoo and sessions were held at Marlborough Inn, Calgary, Alberta. About 115 individuals participated from 24 states and the District of Columbia, 3 provinces of Canada, and Kenya, East Africa. There were representatives from 37 zoos and 22 private institutions plus 7 individuals.

The program was expanded to three days: two days with presentations and panel discussions and one day at the zoo with demonstrations and participatory workshops as well as tours. The workshop was supported by. The Calgary Zoological Society, Northland Wildlife, International Animal Exchange, International Zoological Distributors, and Ken Chisholm. By vote the participants chose North Carolina Zoo, Asheboro, North Carolina, as the site for the Eighth Annual Elephant Workshop to be held in early November 1987.

Discussion on the structure of the Steering Committee and on suggestions for next year's Workshop was held. The membership of this committee for 1987 will be: Jim Small from North Carolina Zoo (host); John Lehnhardt from Calgary Zoo (previous host); Ron Ringer; Dave Blasko; Paul Marion from Santa Barbara Zoological Gardens, Santa Barbara, CA, Patty Stowbridge-Gough from Abilene Zoological Gardens, Abilene, TX; and Sandra Lash Shoshani.

A desire by the participants to recognize individuals who have contributed significantly to our knowledge of elephant management or otherwise, gave rise to a spontaneous award. Raymond ("Sabu") Moreau was recipient of the first Elephant Workshop Award. The Steering Committee will formalize this award in the future.

During the discussion following the report on the basic commands survey by Ron Ringer on the morning of the third (and last) day, the general mood of the group achieved a noteworthy level. Some lively exchanges took place regarding the addition of another command for the basic protocol; a proposal was made to use the keyword in the command and the vote to accept it was unanimous. This tone continued to pervade the afternoon session when four other proposals were accepted unanimously. There are still significant differences among the individuals and the groups represented at these meetings. Nonetheless, time has shown that it is worthwhile for all those involved with captive and wild elephants to get together for discussions and shared experiences in the interest of the future of elephants in captivity. In the words of some participants these meetings are "getting better and better." For those who have attended several workshops the Seventh Elephant Workshop may indeed have been a "landmark."
