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ABSTRACT

This document, part of a series of reports on student flow in Hawaii's seven community colleges, analyzes patterns in student applications, acceptances, and registrations for fall 1976. New student applications for admission numbered 9,642 and transfer applications numbered 4,465. The application-acceptance-registration patterns for fall 1976 for new and transfer students were similar to those reported for fall 1975; the colleges accepted 91% of all new applicants and 86% of transfer applicants, and of those admitted, 72% and 63%, respectively, actually enrolled. Additional analysis showed slightly higher proportions of males than females were accepted in the new and transfer groups, at least 85% of new and transfer students were enrolled at the campus of their first choice, and slightly higher proportions of applicants in the new student group were accepted than in the transfer group. Of those accepted for the liberal arts program, 72% of new students accepted and 63% of transfer students accepted actually enrolled in the liberal arts program, while of those accepted for vocational education programs, 72% and 66%, respectively, actually enrolled in vocational education programs. Overall, the acceptance-registration rates were comparable to those of fall 1975 in terms of sex, program, and campus. 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APPLICATIONS, ACCEPTANCES AND REGISTRATIONS  
FALL 1976

New student applications for admission to the community colleges this fall numbered 9,642 and transfer student applications numbered 4,465.\* The application-acceptance-registration patterns for Fall 1976 for new and transfer students are similar to those reported for Fall 1975: the colleges accepted 91 percent of all new applicants and 86 percent of transfer applicants; of those admitted, 72 and 63 percent, respectively, enrolled. Comparative data for Fall 1975 applicants are given in Table I and Figure 1.

A. Students, by Sex and Campus

Details on applications, acceptances and registrations, by sex and campus, are found in Table II. For the community colleges as a whole, the application-acceptance-registration picture is generally similar to that of last fall.

1. Slightly higher proportions of males than females were accepted in the new and transfer groups.
2. Slightly higher proportions of applicants in the new student group were accepted than in the transfer student group.
3. The large majority (at least 85 percent) of entering new and transfer students enrolled at the campus of their first choice.
4. Unlike last fall, however, a higher proportion of new female students actually registered this fall. (73% compared to 70%)

Further examination of Table II in terms of campus statistics shows:

1. There was a range in the proportion of applicants accepted:
  - a. New students: 98% to 84%.
  - b. Transfer students: 96% to 74%.
2. The range in the proportion of accepted students actually enrolling in Fall 1976 was:
  - a. New students: 76% to 64%.
  - b. Transfer students: 69% to 55%.

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\*The data on applicants are as of the end of the semester. Percentages of new and transfer registrants are lower in Fall 1976. The results of next fall's analysis will be compared to those of Fall 1975 and Fall 1976.

## B. Students, by Program

Data on applications, acceptances and registrations, by program and campus, are found in Table III. They do not vary greatly from the pattern shown for the Fall 1975 semester. For the community colleges as a whole:

1. Acceptances: 93 percent of new student applicants and 89 percent of transfer student applicants were accepted for the liberal arts program; the respective percentages for vocational education programs were 89 and 80.
2. Registrations: 72 percent of new student acceptances and 63 percent of transfer student acceptances actually enrolled in the liberal arts program while 72 and 66 percent, respectively, did so in vocational education programs.
3. Choice: 87 percent of new and 91 percent of transfer students in the liberal arts program were enrolled at the campus of their first choice. In the vocational education programs 94 percent of new and 96 percent of transfer students were at the campus of their first choice.

An analysis of campus data shows:

1. New students:
  - a. Liberal arts program: The proportion of acceptances ranged from 98% to 88%. The proportion of acceptances actually enrolled ranged from 79% to 60%.
  - b. Vocational education program: The proportion of acceptances ranged from 98% to 78%. The proportion of acceptances actually enrolled ranged from 77% to 53%.
2. Transfer students:
  - a. Liberal arts program: The percentage of acceptances ranged from 97% to 82%. Proportions actually registering ranged from 70% to 53%.
  - b. Vocational education program: The percentage of acceptances ranged from 96% to 67%. Proportions actually registering ranged from 73% to 50%. \*\*

## C. Summary

This fall's applications to the community colleges numbered 14,107 (9,642 New; 4,465 Transfer). The acceptance-registration rates were generally comparable to last fall's rates in terms of sex, program and campus.

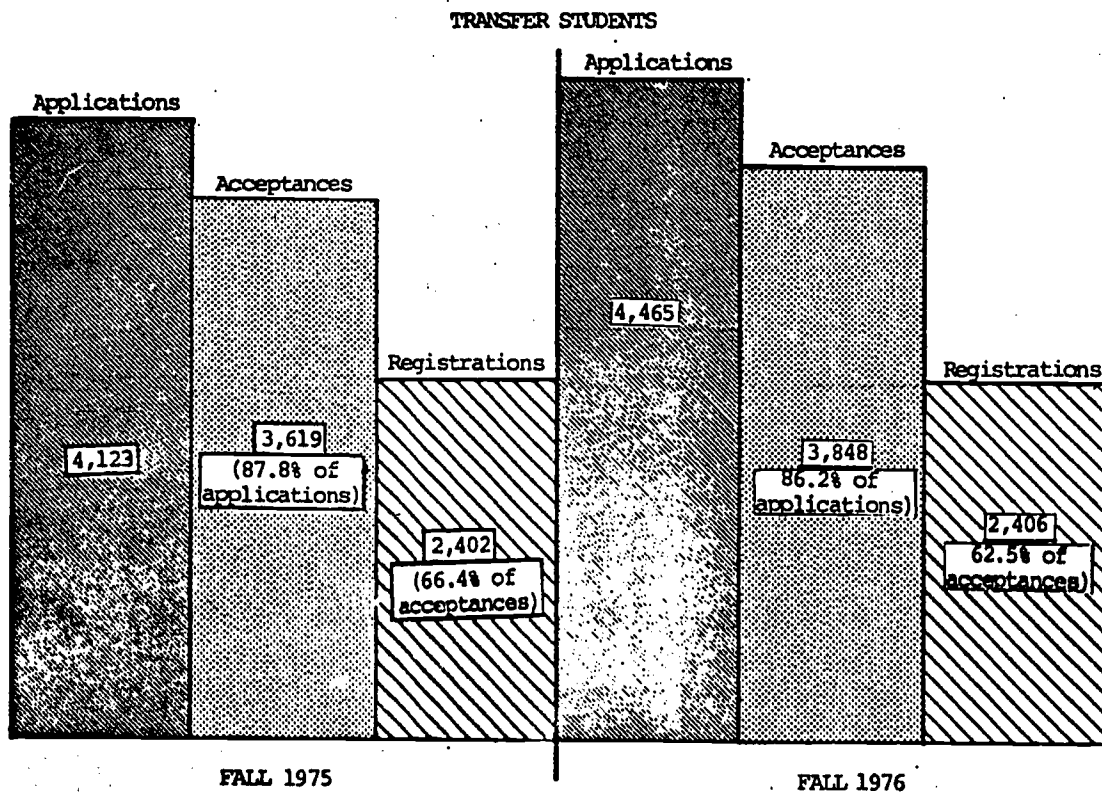
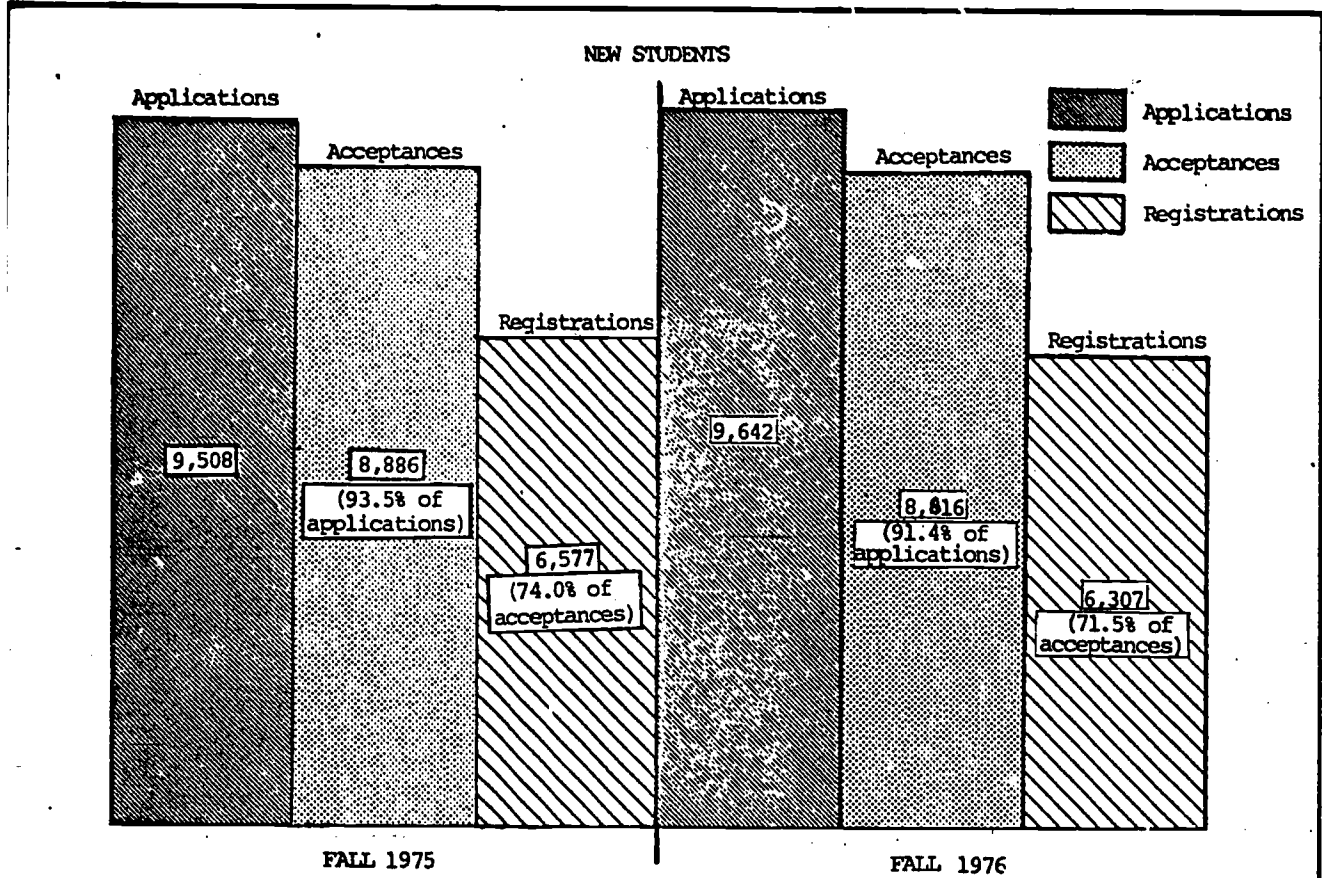
