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## ABSTRACT

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This selective bibliography for production and study of modern plays was compiled by the NCTE Liaison Committee with the Speech Communcation Association and the American Theatre Association.. The introduction, "a Guide to Play Production," discusses general criteria of play selection and provides an overview of the collaborative process of producing a play, focusing chiefly on the role of the director in giving conceptual unity to the production. Approximately 850 . plays are described and arranged according to playwright in the section entitled "Guide to play Selection." The appendixes include listifigs of publishers, distributors, or agents who control a mateur performance rights to plays described in the guide. Addresses of authors representing their own. works, if known, are also given. The bibliography of anthologies and collections list's over 400 volumes which contain plays listed in this guide. Included are autho and title indexes, as well as a topical index and an index arranged according to the number and sex of the players required in each play. (11)

Nearly. 850 plays are described, over 100 more than the second edition. To tend some structure to an otherwise formless list, these have been arranged accorxling to playwright The bibliography of anthologies and collections, gencrows provided by Christian H. Moe and Jay E.' Raphael, lists over 400 volumes containing plays described in this guide. Although this represent, a smaller number of works than were found in the second edtion. greater attention has been paid to the selection of in-print. frequently paperbound editions Morris Schreiber contributed to the final updating of the Guide by amplifying the section on televiston plays.

Of the NCTE Comnittee or Playlist who prepared the second edition of the Guide to Play Selection 11 1958, Francis Griffith, Marcus Konick, and M Jerry Weiss consented to serve on the liatson committee to prepare the thirtl, signfying their interest and devotion to the theater To the original commuttee there were many additions, including Richard L, Loughlin, Robert R Buseick, William E. Schlosser, and Juhhan R Hughes, but Profesior Hughes hafl to resign because of heavy commitments elsewhere However, when the bulk of the proposed work became apparent and it became clear that the Giude would have tio be shortened. the Edtorial Board recommended concentration on modern drama (roughly 1870 _present) to effect the least painful excisions of materal Regretfully: the splended sections prepared by Professor Criffith on ancient. Asiatuc, medieval, and Renassance drama, the excellent section on plays from $1650-1870$ prepared by Richard L. 6 to the omitted To all I wish to express'm.personal gratitude for their hard work, which could not be rewarded but which I hope will see publication in some other form

## A Guide to Play Production

Play proluction may be defined as a process that brings the playwright's words to life through the performance of the actors; the response and reaction to those words in movements devised by the director; the sense of time. place, and mood established by the sets, hights, and costumes; and. for a comparatively short time, the dramatization of a facet of life before a live audience Play production is theater. It is an all-inchusive evperience with a cast that includes the playwright, the producer, the actors. the director, the designers, the technicians, the accountant; the mestors, and the theatergoers. It is not limited, as some think, to the work of the designers and technicians. Rather, play production is a collaborative process that demands eooperation from all the theater's practitioners for the purpose of entertaining and enlightehng an audience.

## $=\quad$ Selectung the Play

Methods for selecting the play vary In the semmercial theater, the producer elects the play The election may represent a play chosen from weral recommended by professional play-readers hired by the profucer In the regional theater, the artastis director submits d list of plansto the board of director, for approval. The list usually recommends virious combuations for a season of plays. In a community theater, a commutiee of plar-readers make recommendations to an executive board that. in turn. offers a choice of one or more plays to a director-member In the umersity theiter, a theater department member inducate, d choice withn the framewofk of departmental polict and approval In the secondary school theater, the teacherdirector gate, the chome, generally with the tacit approval of the Gairperson and pruncupal, and sometimes in conjunction with a student play-reading commitlex Plas selection is an exacting task and responsibility beanse a good percentage of the success of the venture depends on finding a plav that will provide a meaningful play production and playgong experieme In electing a play, therefore, consideration hould be given to the phats dramatic values, artistic challenge. cast availabilry, production conts. and andience appeal.

## Dramatic Vahes

An examınation of a play's dramatic values necessitates evalbutlong the relative theatrical, worth and srength of the dramatic elements that constitute a play. To begin, a play is a story meant to be performed by.actors in front of an andience Similar to a story, a play has a theme, plot, locale, and characters Dialogue is the chief means by which the theme is developed, the plot advanced, and the charaters explored The theme is the idea of the play, the reason for ths existence if is the playwright', statement of his view of the world in which he lives Thus, the thente is the heart of the drama that
unfolds. All elsě $1 s^{\circ}$ but additional dramati/ation of it. Consequently, a strong theme-and certamly in the case of tarce and nelodrama, a plausible one-is, a plus faitor in choosing a play because a strong idea will immedrately catch and hold the interest and attention of the audience. The plot of the play conspts of a number of related incidents and events that provide a course of ation for developing the theme and explonng the characters. A weak plot may endanger the development of a strong theme because the stary. line may leal nowhere, whereas a strong plot may enhance a weak theme for the very reason that a good story can be enjoyed even when the basic premise is inconsequential. Characters peromify the theme and are the prime movers in instigating what happens in the play Carefully delineated character引 provide portrats that reveal insight into human needs and behavior Too, characters in pursuit of a course of attion inyariably conflict with those who feel and think otherwise. The restult is a recognizable conteit of wills, a display of emotion, a gasp of surprise, a moment of suspense, a question of -outcome. Although all plays contan the same dramatic elements- theme, plot, characters, dalogue, ionflict, action, emótion, surprise, suspense-not all plays are equally strong in the theatrical value of each element When all the dramatic values are equally strong theatrically, the play is a-likely masterpiece When the elements are balanced in theatrual strengths and weaknesses, chances are that the play is at least stageworthy. In why case, athly/ing and evaluating the dianatic values of a play can help one make the most of a play strengths and suggest ways to minimuze the rieaknesses when directung, performing. and producing it

## Artistic Challenge

A play should challenge the creativity of the ators, the clirector, and the designers Too, a play should challenge the cultural sights of the community. The actor is the human instrument that brings the character to life on stage the actor', body give, the character form and shape. The actor's ipeech mechanism gives the character a voice to speak has thoughts and exclaim his emoteans The ator's intellent permits the character to think and respoind the actor's imagination creates a world on stage within whoh the charater can function. The director is the interpreter of the words written by the playwright. ${ }^{\circ}$ He must translate those words ifito movements devised for, and characteriations extratied from, the actor. He must convey his interpretation through a directorial concept tor the destgers The director mush orehestrate the flow of events and the exploration of eharacter to focus attention on the theme. The designers wstalise the concept and the interpretation through sets, light, and 'rostmmes If the actors, and the director, and the designers are to mature at creative theater artists, then the selected play mant challenge, their pepective talents, If the actors, and the director, and the designers are to develop range as. creative theater artists, then a varrety of plays inust be selected to
challenge their respective talents. Similarly; if a community aims to raise its cultural horizons. then the selected play, should stimufate commumu imagation and awaken support of theater in the communns Challenge is an important.factor in play selection because it recharges the creavity and the maginatoon of the theater's pracationers Moreover, chatlenge encourages growth through experimentaton with the new and dafferent, development throngh triat and error, and maturnty through experience and evaluation

## Production Costs

Once a plat begins to reccive sertous consideration for production. there is a need to determine whether or, not an adequate budget is aralable to aboorb the conts of royalty, set construction, Ghghtung eguipment, and contume rental. Unless specified otherwise, a playwight is entuled to a royalty He in piotected by law from a prodution of his play that ha-been monnted without prior arrangements with the plat-leasing company that controls the performance rights The roxath wale is often a graluated none, decreasing each mght, if there in more thin prie pertotmance Sometimes there is a llat fee for an eviended run Play copies mut be purchased from the plaveanng company (opes cannot be reproduced. and a notice of the permmsion granted mun be pronted in the program Usually, the royalty cont for a montal is higher than that for a legitmate play The popularat! of the mmegcal at the box office accounts for the differencer in rovalty wi if there in any question dbent the condition under which the play is being peitormed with respect to royalty payment, the playleang compant would be contalted mmednately. The Dramatic Publshing Compans makes the following distinction in the payment of rovalty when a pler in bemg rehearsed or performed in the classroom:

## Audience Appeal

A play should be analyed for its appeal to an audience. Factors of audience appeal indude identification, with theme, plot, and characters.' partipation in the atuon: and response to the reputation of the plav and the playnroght. ludience interest is aroused and audhence identification with the theme orcurs when the odea of the play is exploced from a common expenence or universal truth An audience identifies with the theme of Arthum Miller's The Giurible because the rights of the mavidual and the freedon to belicie and worship a one chooses in the soriets of whoth one a a part are tumeral righs and belief, recognized and pranted in a free soricty An atudience identufies, with the plot of a plas when the plot or the course of artion follow, a recogitable pattern or ratuat that parallels life The course of acton of 'Thomon Wilder'; On Tom'n. for example, follows a life cycle that mefude datv hang, love and marriage. and death An atudence idenufies whth the diamatas persomar when the charatérs pobsess human suengils and weathesses. An aduence identifies with the cortired charmers in I ugene O'Netle, Long Day, Jouncry into Naght becaise the human fraitioe of the Tyrone famify are the human fralties of humamts •

The reputation of the play is a strong audience appeal that should not be overlooked when eelecting a play The sweet smelt of success spreads fast, and thegtergoer agre' attracted to the box office because the play has-prove d commertial success efsewhere. People want to see what others have seen and enjoyed, with or without the orginal cant. Similarls, the teputation of the playwright is an appeal factor There is no denymg that the play, of Arthur Miller, Tennessee Willhams, Edwated Alibee, and Neil Simon arolse and stimulate theatergoing Of course, the danger of always selecting the popular boxoffice play is limuted play production and theatergoing experience.

In summiary, the play is the toundation on which the theatrical experience ients. It is the catalyst that ets the dynamics of the theater in motion. Therefore, if the play production experience is to pfove a rewarding and sicesesful ome, it is important' o select a play that justifer, the ume and energy of the actors, director, and designers. It is equally mportant to select a play that will motivate an audience to give its tume andrits energy, as well as its money, to enjoy the playgoing experience

## Producing the Play

The producer initiates the production His choice mas be bated orr his behef in the strgemorthiness of the play He may be moved and mpmred by its literary and arnstic merits. His longtume asociation with the playwright may be another reason for choosng the sript. Too. lons, friendship with a star may result in selecting a partucular plav for proluction His commitment to the theater may lead him to select a play by an unknown playwright which has a pertinent theme but which may prove unpopular at the box office. Or, he may idéntify his choice as a certain success. The producer in today's theater contmues, to fill the responsibility of the actor-manager of the nincteenth century acting compaby, the patentee of the Restoratoon atung compant, the manager of the Fludbethan acting compary, and the Archoni in the freek theater

The producer in the mercal theater is responsible for taising moncy to finance the cost of the production. Part of the financung may cone from the producer's personal funds while the remander shellited from friends or "angels" In. regional and communty theaters, finanung is generally obtained'from theatergoers who enther purchase ticket, for a singleatration or who advance the cost of a subsaription ernes $t i$ is net unasual for an irganization torreceive a govermment grant or ubuidy In the unversity theater, a drama departinem is generally afloted a production budget by the university. In the secondary shool theater, the actuvity is either self-supporting through ticker sate, or fimaned all or in part through, general organizatonal funds The expéndtures of money require an inlministrative and business staff that indudes lawyer, to handle necessary contracts and
accountants to verify the payment of salaries, the purchase of equipment and materials, and the cost of advertising and publicity

Generally, the profucer is only indirectly involved with the artistic interpretation. and performance of the play. He usually selects $a^{"}$ director whose intëpretative concept agrees with bis own. He hires designers whose visual concepts represent an extension of the directorial concept L'nless he is obliged to exercise his prerogative to take issue with concepts and interpretations, or unless there is a need for him to reconcile differences in artistic concept, the producer remains in the background. keping a watchful eye on financial expenditures and the artistic development of the play.

## Directing the Play

The director reads, studies, and analyzes the play assiduôusly. He reads the play many times to cristalize his understanding of the theme and how it is organised and developed by the playwright through the plot and the characters The director-studies the play to determine uts structure: carefully noung the anitial incident that propels* the action forward, observing how stuations occur and how senes develop as the action approaches the climax The director examines the resolution to the play. pondering its relationship to the characters and earher siene, in the play He studef the episodio structure of another hind of play, contemplating. the probable impact its cumulative effect will have upon the audience He explores the play to determine its style in production and performance. Ife analyzes the characters to discover inner feelings that motivate outer actions and behavior He thinks of the charaters in terms of people he has known, friends he has observed, actors who can flesh out the solhouettes created by the playwright. The fust phase of directing the play finds the director
steeping himself in the work of the playwright in order to cast the play. plot and block the movement, rehearse the diors, confer and plan with the desgners.

## Directorial Concept

Farly on, the director develops a directorial and production concept is a rewult of sudyng and analying the play The directorial concept is dersed fiom the director: undersianding and merpretation of the play as he embuons it in terms of the dyamich of the theater The directorial roniept becomes the baus for stagng the play as well as the directori, frante of reference when-motwating the actors and when conferring winh the devgner, 7 he director communicates his directorial and production (one ept to the designers in terms that are neither two general to misead nor too pectif to wifle the creatuvity of eath dengner Acrordingly, the director descrines how he visualizes the caviroment of the play whout encroathing upon the artistry of the sene desgner He depics how the sees the characters costumed whthout obtrudang upon the creativity of the costume designer He outhes the fechng of the dominam nood and its varidtons without impoung upon the vill of the light dengner. In time, the set designer furnithes the director with a ground plan and either a perspective weth or moxdel set. the contume dengher ubmits vetches and a contume - hart for the director', approval: the hight designer provides - alighung plot for his convederation Through discosson and conference during the rehcarsal period, the director and the designers exchange alea and rewolve problems in order to mount a production that reflects a collaborative effort to the audience

## Casting

Property catung detors whose talents can best serve the needs of the plar is i.difficult and complex procedure becruse it demands spending a relatively short peribed of ume on a cructal element of play proxluction In the commerad theater. the problem in resolved by hurng proferviond attors with establshed reputaons and by audition. mg actors recommented bs agents In regonad and summer theaters. artung is te dagnmeint, Generalls, the ator know the roles he will plat and comrats to jon the compans becanse of the expenence

test the imaginative powers of the actor by asking him to perform a pantomimic improviation that may or may not be related to the role. Too, in castug the play, directors take ińto constderation the actor's phwstal appearance, dge, wice, ductifn, and'sense of movęnent Casting is an unenviable directorial task because the presture of beginning rehearsals in order to meet a performance date and keep to a production schedule necessitates quick decisions that are sometimes regretted.

## Plotung the Movement

In addition to reading the play to determine its theme, studying the play to discover its structure, and analyzing the play to understand its characters, the director scrutinizes the play to discover its pattern of movement In, the developinent of the plot, the director finds the natural commg and going offcharacters as one incident ends and another begms or as one charactet enters and another leaves In what the charatiers sav and feel, he percenves a motivation for behavioral movement In what the charaters do; he detects an underlying ritual that prompts movement In shifting inferests and alliances, he beholds a change in fogus that drtuates movement Out of his experience with the ritual of everviay living, the director invents movement or business that is appropriate to the sene and the characters involved. When he can picture the movement of the play in his mind's eye, the director is ready to write down his directions. In the margin of his working script, the diretior record, his directions to the actors in stage shorthand: "I. xds sofa," meaning, "f,if. cross down (enter to the sofa." Frequently, the director draws " rough sheth of the ground. plan and marks the platement of charater, who are arranged in group positoons. It rehearsal, eath ator whtes the directions in his script The stage manager or his astistant inscribes the directions in the production book cop: Plolting the movement find the director alone in his most creative moment, a monent when the magmative stirfings in his mind find their wav to paper Bloching the plav finds the director testing his imagination br having the ator, phsically perform the created movements

## Rehearsing the Plat

Rehearsing the play includes bloking the movement, motivating and coachong the actors, Blocking the movement is the physical working out of the planned movement written bv the director in the margin of his orpt Blocking the movement puts the play on its feet through the physidal actoons of the actors as they make their entrances and exits and as thev engage in phratal attons that emanate from the charaters' behavior Blocking the movement requres patience from the director and the dor bedase the director must stage the plas at a tume when tife ator must aborb the movement as part of his charactermation and simultaneously vruggle to learn lines ànd identify with the personality of the role he is playing Novice directors are
cautioned to ablaze primed ditections These printed directions represent patterns of movement/devised bv the origmal odirector and recorded by the stage manager fometmes the recording is neither complete nor atcosate If the drectoon, are not analized and understood for concept, the now e director mas find that his staging is without focus, and meaning.

## Destgning the Set

## Plays by Afro－Americans

The following annotated list is a selective but representative sampling of the kinds of playp created by black Americans from 1821. the year of production of the Grst play Enoun to have been written by an AfroAmerican，to 1900．The list limited partly by a dearth of published scripts which can bee supplied to actung groups．Many blacks whose plays have been＂prodtred by cotnmunity or college thepatrical ．groups have been unable to publish the plays in books or in acting scripts U＇nul recently．publisbiers presumed a limited reading audience． for plavs about blacks，consequently，they rarely sought or accepted the work of black plavwrights exceps when those plays were scheduled for production in the downtown theaters of New York or when the dramas already had earned national riputanotis for this reason．many poten－ ually useful plass extst only in manuscript form or in the pages of periodisals which are not widely krown Since this guide is intended primarily to assist actung groups，it seems useless to include plays which are not available in script＇fofini．

Conspicuously absent from the following list are pageants and musical tramas，whirch constifter an important contribution of black artists to rie theater The problems of publication seem to be compounded when musical score and choreographic directions must be included Hence，few pageant musicals are avalable in print

Despite these limitations．the list is representatuve It includes dramas intended for audienc；s in black communties as well as plays designed for presentanon to predominantly white audiences in the com－ mercial theater；it includes one－act and full－length dramas；it includes dramas witten in the 1920s $\dot{\text { mind }}$ those of the 1960 s ．

It is important to obserse that the protagonists of these dramas are black（African，AfroAaxierican，troCarıbean）Whereas many black authors have written trovels and even radio．film，and teevistont scripts about white protagonists，most black playurights have chosen or have been compelled to restigit themselves to black protagomsts If a playwright has aimed for a ceñiticial proluction．preferably on Broad－ way，he has constdered the fedigent of producers that the value of a black playwright is limitethatichotic or sensational presentations of blacks If the dramatist hath ting specifically for a black commumity group，he has recognized thent dity of deliberately creating＂white＂ roles for a cast of black act ${ }^{\text {titan}}$ actresses when such roles are readily
 some black playwights have written dramas about black peopletingily to educate or instill pride in the black community Regardate of the reason，the general topic of the black playwnght has been 在都k person

One should not as meftowever．that all dramas by blacks are severely restricted to one 量虎角 or one style Dramatists have not limited themselves to issues fighe to black Americans；they have also
explored the winds of problems common to people of various races and a arious natuons Black dramatusts have created characters from the professtonal classes as well as slaves, peasants, and ghetto dwellers. They have written fantar m! farce as wcll as melodrama, social commentary, and problem plars' Iher have winten for entertanment and for instrucuon Ther have used experimental techniques of expressionism and construcuvism as well as the more common techmques of realism.

Television, the major sowrce of, entertaiment and news in formation for mont binericall famber has had a major impate oin most American heses, greatly affectung attendance at motion pictures and other theatrical events. The teleration industry is constantls searching for writer, to meet the pressures, and to fulfill the promises of ongoing dally progranming

In the late 1946 and through the mid-1950s, a series of prograns broke on the networks, whoh were to sugle out some new and exciting dramatusts These sriters demonstrated exceptional talents in coping witl the dimutations of the smalescreen, the use of small casts, problems of plankrig for regular counnercial breaks, specific time handicaps, etc Shows such as-Ommbus', Studıo One, Kraft- Theatre, PhilcoGoodyear Playhouse, Playhouse 90. Hallmark Hall of Fame, among others. offered a format and great opportunities for writers such as Tad Mosel. Horton Foote, Alvin Sapinsley, Rod Serling. Reginald Rose, and Paddy (hayefshy For the most part, television writers were adapting classics, contemporary novels, and short stories into television scripts; however, several writers, inclading those histed above, saw new possibilatues for conveyug dramatic stuations by means of television to mass dudiences

Although very feu articles can be found which-deal with the deselopment of televiston drama, publishers are printing scripue of television plays These are available for personal reading and for study, More and more schools are offering courses dealing with media, and television drama is a mayor section of any such currictulum.

As the years have gone by, television has contunued whsplay new possibilities, new dimensons, new talents Each year's Emmy Atards presentations pay recogntion to the many writers and sktlled artist, and technicians who are attempting to make television better. Masterptece Theatre is one of the recent rewards of such efforts.

It is therefore only natural that some of the outstanding plays of television be included in his guide It is hoped that the list will grow in quality as well as puantity.
