"The Members of the Agricultural Societies of the several Townships withln the County or Uaited Countien wherela the $\Delta$ nnaul Exibibition may be held, and the members of the anld Connty or United Counties, shall be also members of the Association for that jear, and have badgea accordingly : provided the Agricultural Sooietien of the said Townahips, or the Societies of the sald County or United Countles, shall devote their whole funde for the jear lacluding the Governifent Grant, in aid of the Association. The Oflice-bearers of all County Socletles shall have badgea of free entrance durlog the Show."-By-Law.

1. The payment of Se . and apwards constilatea a person a member of the Agricultural Aesociation of Upper Canada for one year; and $\mathbf{x 2} \mathbf{1 0 3}$ for life, when given for that specific objest, and not an a contribution to the local fands.
2. No one bat a member will be allowid to compete for prizes except in olasses 30, 32, 34 and 35.
3. All Eutries must be made on printed forms, which may be obtained of the Secretariea of Agricultural Societles, free of charge. These forms are to be filled ap and signed by the exhibitor, eaclooing a dollar for membership, aod sent to the Secretary of the Association, Board of Agricultare, Toronto, on or before Saturday, Sept. 22., after which time a eharge of $5 s$ will be imposed on each article.

Exhibitors in the Horticaltural and Ladies' Department may enter articlea up to Tuetday Evening, Oct. 9th., when the Books will be finally closed.
Blood Horses and Thorough-bred Cattle muat be entered, and bave their full Pedigrees properly attested and sent to the Secretary in Toronto, not later than Saturday, Sept. 22nd. No animals will be allowed to compete as pare bred, unless they possess regular Stud and Herd Book pedigrees, or eatisfactory evidence be produced that they are directly descended from such stock.
4. Badges from the Treasurer's Office will be furnlshed each member, whlch will admit himself only, free to every department of the Exhibition, during the Show. Life members admitted free.
5. Tickets of admission to those who are not members, 7 dd each time of admission. Carriages, ineluding drivera, 5 s ; passengera to pay 7hd each. Horsemen to pay 1 s 3 d each admiesion.
6. Every article exhibted for competition must be the growth, produce, or manufacture of Canada, except Classes 34 and 35. Live Stock for breeding mast be the property of perions residing in Canada. All premiums for articles, except Stock, are to be awarded to the monufacturers or producers only.
7. Diecretionary Premiums will be awarded for such articles as may be considered worthy by the

Jadges, although not enumerated in the Liat, and the Directors will determine the amount of preminm.
8. In the absence of competition in any of the Classen, or if the Stock or artioles exhiblted ba of inferior quality, the Judges will exercise their discretion as to the value of the premiams they recommend
9. The Jadges, Competitore, and Officorm of the Association only will be permitted to enter the Show Grounds untill 12 o'clock, on Wednesday Oct. 10th, at which hour Sembers will be admitted. Non members will be admitted on Thursday and Friday morninge after 8 o'clock.
10. No Articles or Stock exbibited will be allowed to be removed from the grounds, till the awards are made, without the permiesion of the President, under the penalty oi losing the premiams. An Auctioneer will be on the epot after the premlums are anuounced and every facility afforded for the transaction of bueiness.
11. Delegates, Judges and Members of the Press, are requested and expeoted to report themselves at the Secretary's Office immediately on their arrival.
12. The Judges are to meet at the Secretary's office on the Grounds, on Wednesday morning, at 9 o'clock prciseely, to make arringements for entering immediately npon their duties.
13. Arrangements will be made lor Agricultural Lectures or Diecussions during the evenlaga of Wednegday and Thusrday of the Show week.
14. Whilo the Directors will take every possiblo precantion under the circumstances, to ensure the safety of articles sent to the exhibition, yet they wish it to be distinctly understood that the owners of the articles must themselves take the risk of exhibiting them; and that should any article be accidently injured, lost or atolen, the Directors will give all the assistance in their power towards the recovery of the same, but will not make noy payment for the value thereof.
15. The Treasurer will be prepared to commetce pajing the premiums immediately after the successful competitors bave been declared, and parties who shall have prizes awarded them are particularly requested to apply for tnem before leaviog Cobourg, or leave a written order with some person to receive them, stating the articies for which prizes are claimed.

The Local Committeo will maist ariangements with Steamboat and Railwav proprietors for carrying the passengers at redaced rates; al-o with the Hotel and Boarding-house Keepere, for accommodating visitors at their ordinary fixed charges. Full particulars will be pubilshed hercafter in Show Bills.
