THE FUNCTIONS OF PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATIONS

Qualifications

Some associations qualify individuals to act in a certain professional capacity. They also try to safe-guard high standards of professional conduct. Few associations have complete control over the profession with which they are concerned. Some professions are regulated by the law, and their associations act as the central registration authority. Entry to others is directly controlled by associations that alone award the requisite qualifications. If a profession is required to be registered by the law and is controlled by the representative council, a practitioner found guilty by his or her council of misconduct may be

suspended from practice or completely debarred by the removal of his or her name from the register of qualified practitioners. In other professions the consequence of misdemeanour may not be so serious, because the profession does not exercise the same degree of control.

The professions registered by statute, and therefore subject to restrictions on entry and loss of either privileges or the right to practise on erasure, are listed in Table 5.1. Certain other professions are closed.

Study

Some associations give their members an opportunity to keep abreast of a particular discipline or to undertake further study in it. Such associations are especially numerous in medicine, science and applied science. Many qualifying associations also provide an

information and study service for their members. Some of the more famous learned societies confer added status upon distinguished practitioners by electing them to membership or honorary membership.

Protection of Members' Interests

Some associations exist mainly to look after the interests of individual practitioners and the group. A

small number are directly concerned with negotiations over salary and working conditions.

Qualifying associations

The principal function of qualifying associations is to examine and qualify people who wish to become practitioners in the field with which they are concerned. As already indicated, some regulate professional conduct and many offer opportunities for further study. Membership is divided into grades, usually classified as corporate and non-corporate. Non-corporate members are those not yet admitted

to full membership, mainly students; they are divided from corporate membership by barriers of age and levels of responsibility and experience. The principal requirement for admission to membership is the knowledge and ability to pass the association's exams; candidates may be exempted from the association's exams if they have acceptable alternative qualifications.

Non-corporate or affiliated members

Non-corporate members are those who are as yet unqualified or only partly qualified. They are accorded limited rights and privileges, but may not vote at meetings of the corporate body. Most associations have a student membership grade. Students are those who are preparing for the exams that qualify them for admission to corporate

membership. Some associations have licentiate and graduate membership grades, which are senior to the student grade. Graduates are those who have passed the qualifying exams but lack other requirements, such as age and experience, for admission to corporate membership.

Corporate or full members

Corporate members are the fully qualified constituent members of incorporated associations. They are accorded full rights and privileges and may vote at meetings of the corporate body. Corporate membership is often divided into two grades: a senior grade of members or fellows and a general grade of associate members or associates.

Honorary members

Some associations have a special class of honorary members or fellows for distinguished members or individuals who have made an outstanding contribution to the profession in question.

Examinations and requirements

Professionals normally become corporate members by exam or exemption, with or without additional requirements. Many final professional exams are of degree standard, and a number of professional qualifications are accepted by employers as evidence of competence at operational level. Ongoing professional development is encouraged by most associations to ensure members' skills and knowledge are up to date and relevant.

The transition from the general grade of membership to the senior can be automatic in some

associations (for instance, on reaching a prescribed age), but in others the higher grade is reached only after the submission of evidence of research or progress in the profession.

Qualifying exams are usually conducted in two or more stages. The first stage leads to an Intermediate or Part I qualification, the second leads to a Final or Part II or Part III qualification, which is about the standard of a degree.

Gaining professional qualifications

Prospective students can study by any of the following means:

 correspondence courses (distance learning and/or online support);

- personal attendance at the schools maintained by some associations (eg the Architectural Association School of Architecture);
- · further and higher education institutions.

Candidates for Diaconal or Presbyteral Ministry in the Methodist Church must have been members of the Methodist Church at least 2 years and are expected to offer at least 10 years of ministerial service. The first stage of preparation is Foundation Training, which requires 1 year (FT) or 2 years (PT) to complete, during which a person may apply to become a candidate for ordained ministry. The process of selection takes 6 months. To enter into training for Presbyteral Ministry, a candidate must be a trained Local Preacher, which involves taking the Methodist Local Preachers' Training Course, Faith &

Worship. Deacons become members of the Methodist Diaconal and are not required to be preachers. Accepted candidates for either order receive 1 or 2 years of further theological training, which in most cases leads to a degree or diploma in Theology or Ministry. The Certificate of Operational Competence in Occupational Hygiene is the qualification required to join the Faculty of Occupational Hygiene as a Licentiate, and demonstrates knowledge and competence in the broad principles and practice of occupational hygiene. This is a two-part written and oral examination. The Diploma of Professional Competence in Occupational Hygiene is the highest professional occupational hygiene qualification. Candidates must already hold the Certificate of Operational Competence, and be able to demonstrate 5 years' experience in the field of occupational hygiene. Award of the Diploma

qualifies the holder to become a Member of the Faculty, and demonstrates knowledge of, and competence in, assessment of health hazards and the extent of risk in various workplace circumstances, and an ability to advise on suitable control procedures. This is also a two-part, written and oral, examination. Practising members who hold the Diploma are awarded the title of Chartered Occupational Hygienist.

LAW

ENGLAND AND WALES

MAGISTRATES

The President of the Courts of England and Wales, The Lord Chief Justice, is head of the Judiciary. He is responsible for the welfare, training and deployment of magistrates, for approving the names of the candidates recommended for appointment and for disciplinary action, short of removal. He also has responsibility for the protection of judicial independence and for working to ensure that the magistracy reflects the diversity of society as a whole.

There are six key qualities that a magistrate must possess: good character, understanding and communication, social awareness, maturity and sound temperament, sound judgement, commitment and reliability. Magistrates do not sit exams nor do they have to be legally qualified.

Before sitting in court, magistrates must undertake some basic training, which includes structured observations in court. This covers practice and procedure in court, structured decision making, sentencing, etc. New magistrates are assigned a mentor for the first year or so. Consolidation training takes place at the end of the first year; this is designed to help magistrates plan for their ongoing development and prepare for their first appraisal which takes place about 12 to 18 months after appointment. Magistrates only sit in adult courts when first appointed. Having got that experience they may apply to sit in youth courts and family courts and have to undertake more training before they can sit. The Magistrates Association has more information about magistrates (www.magistrates-association.org. uk).

IUDGES

All judicial office holders are Her Majesty s Judges and as such all appointments are made by the Queen or her Ministers. Since 2006 all candidates for judicial appointment in England and Wales have been selected by the independent Judicial Appointments Commission (JAC jac.judiciary.gov.uk), which passes its recommendations to the Lord Chancellor for approval. The key statutory responsibilities of the JAC are to select candidates solely on merit; to select only people of good character; to have regard to the need to encourage diversity in the range of people available for selection for appointments.

Once the IAC s selections have been received, the actual appointments are made in slightly different ways depending on the type of post. The Lord Chancellor himself appoints Deputy District Judges and most members of tribunals. He also appoints the 30,000 unpaid magistrates (who are selected by local Advisory Committees, not by the JAC). The Queen appoints High Court and Circuit Judges, Masters, Registrars and District Judges, District Judges (Magistrates Courts) and Recorders on the advice of the Lord Chancellor. A special panel convened by the JAC appoints Lord Chief Justice. The Queen appoints Heads of Division, Court of Appeal judges and senior judges with lengthy judicial experience, on the recommendation of a selection panel convened by the JAC. Scotland and Northern Ireland have their own separate court systems, with their own arrangements for appointing members of the judiciary.

The Supreme Court (http://supremecourt.uk) has jurisdiction over the whole of the UK, so its Justices are not selected by the JAC, which is an England and Wales body. Rather, a special committee is set up, which is made up of the three judicial appointments bodies from around the UK (England and Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland), who recommend a name to Ministers. The Queen appoints the Justices on the basis of advice from the Prime Minister.

Appointments to salaried or fee-paid judicial posts are made from among judges or practising lawyers. In general the requirement for appointment is that the candidate must have been a practising barrister or solicitor for at least 10 years (for appointment to the Circuit Bench or above) or for five years (appointments to the District Bench and to most tribunal posts). Most judicial posts will require a relevant legal qualification that has been held for either five or seven years. Certain posts are also open to legal executives, patent agents and trademark agents of the required seniority. Candidates for appointment as Justices of the Supreme Court must have held high judicial office for two years or must have been practising barristers or solicitors of the senior courts for at least 15 years (http://supremecourt.uk/about/ appointments-of-justices.html). OFFICERS OF THE COURT

Officers of the Court include judicial and administrative staff; the former include Masters and Registrars, the latter secretaries and clerks to the judges and the staff who administer the court service. Details are given in *The English Legal System*, 15th edition, 2014–15 (Routledge). Qualifications for the judicial offices vary somewhat, but most appointments are limited to established barristers and solicitors.

THE LEGAL PROFESSION

The legal profession consists of two branches. Each performs distinct duties, although there is a degree of overlap in some aspects of their work.

Solicitors undertake all ordinary legal business for their clients (with whom they are in direct contact). They may also appear on behalf of a client in the magistrates and county courts and tribunals, and with specialist training are able to represent them in the higher courts (Crown Court, High Court and Court of Appeal).

Barristers (known collectively as the Bar and collectively and individually as Counsel) advise on legal problems submitted by solicitors and conduct cases in court when instructed by a solicitor; only barristers or qualified solicitor advocates may represent clients in the higher courts.

LEGAL EXECUTIVES

Both graduates and non-graduates can work in a legal office with the option of qualifying as a solicitor through further vocational training.

CORONERS

Coroners must be barristers, solicitors or legally qualified medical practitioners of not less than five standing. They are appointed by local years authorities. There are approximately 110 coroners jurisdictions in England and Wales; each jurisdiction is locally funded and resourced by local authorities. Coroners are independent judicial officers. When not engaged in coronal duties, coroners (apart from coroners) continue in their legal or medical practices. The Chief Coroner is head of the coroner system, assuming overall responsibilty and providing national leadership for coroners in Engand and Wales. He oversees the implementation of the Coroner and Justice Act 2009. Further information from the Coroners Society of England and Wales, website: www.coronersociety.org.uk

BARRISTERS

Qualification as a barrister at the Bar of England and Wales

There are three stages that must be completed to qualify as a barrister. The academic stage consists of an undergraduate degree in law or in any other subject with a minimum of a 2:2. For those with an undergraduate degree in a subject other than law a one-year conversion course (CPE/GDL) must be completed.

Before commencing the vocational stage candidates must join one of the four Inns and then undertake the Bar Professional Training Course (BPTC), which is either one year full time or two years part time. The main skills taught on the BPTC are: case work skills, legal research, general written skills including opinion-writing (that is, giving written advice), interpersonal skills including conference skills (interviewing clients), resolution of disputes out of court (ReDOC) and advocacy (court or tribunal appearances). The main areas of legal knowledge taught on the BPTC are: civil litigation and remedies, criminal litigation and sentencing, evidence, professional ethics, and two optional subjects selected from a choice of at least six.

Three examinations are set by a Central Examinations Board comprised of experienced legal practitioners and academics appointed by the Bar Standards Board (BSB). The examinations are Civil Litigation, Criminal Litigation and Ethics. Applicants will also have to take the Bar Course Aptitude Test. It aims to test critical thinking and reasoning, but does not test legal knowledge. Practice tests are available on the BSB website. The Aptitude Test will ensure that those undertaking the BPTC have the required skills to succeed.

Once the BPCT has been successfully completed candidates are Called to the Bar by their Inn. The Pupillage Stage consists of one year spent in an authorized pupillage training organization. Pupillage is divided into two parts: the non-practising six months (also known as the first six) and the practising six months (also known as the second six).

SOLICITORS

Qualification as a solicitor in England and Wales

To practise as a solicitor in England and Wales a person must have been admitted as a solicitor, his or her name having been entered on the Roll of



Solicitors, and must hold a practising certificate issued by The Solicitors Regulation Authority (SRA) (Solicitors Regulation Authority, The Cube, 199 Wharfside Street, Birmingham B1 1RN; Tel: 0370 606 2555; www.sra.org.uk).

The SRA is the independent regulatory body of the Law Society of England and Wales. People will be admitted as solicitors only if they have passed the appropriate academic and vocational course and have completed a training contract and Professional Skills course, or have transferred from another jurisdiction or the Bar. The SRA controls the training of solicitors. Most solicitors become members of the Law Society, but membership is not compulsory. Intending solicitors other than Fellows of the Institute of Legal Executives and Justices Clerk's Assistants, and qualified lawyers from other jurisdictions, are required to serve a period of training with a practising solicitor after they have completed the legal practice course.

All new entrants to the profession are required to complete a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) standard disclosure prior to admission. Candidates wishing to start training must enrol as a student with the SRA and satisfy it that they have successfully completed the academic stage of training and there are no issues that may call their character and suitability into question.

It is not necessary for the first degree to be in law as about 20 per cent of solicitors qualify via the non-law graduate route. The key stages of this are:

- · degree in any subject;
- Common Professional Examination/Graduate Diploma in Law;
- · Legal Practice course;
- practice-based training incorporating the Professional Skills course;
- admission to the roll of solicitors.

THE COMMON PROFESSIONAL EXAMINATION (CPE) OR GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN LAW (GDL)

The seven taught modules are the foundation subjects prescribed by the Joint Academic Stage Board on behalf of the Law Society and General Council of the Bar: Criminal Law, Contract Law, The Law of Tort, Equity and Trusts, Public Law, European Union Law and Property Law. THE LEGAL PRACTICE COURSE

Stage 1 covers core practice areas: Litigation, Property Law and Practice (PLP), Business Law and Practice (BLP); Course Skills: Research, Writing, Drafting, Interviewing and Advising, and Advocacy – these skills form an integral part of the compulsory and elective subjects; Solicitors Accounts and Professional Conduct and Regulation; Taxation, and Wills and Administration of Estates. Stage 2 covers three vocational electives: from a range of corporate client or private client topics (the range of elective available can differ from institution to institution). TRAINING CONTRACT

The training contract to be served by all intending solicitors, other than Fellows of the Institute of Legal Executives and Justices Clerk's Assistants, is two years full time or a maximum of four years part time. The training contract can also be a part-time-study training contract that normally lasts between three and four years. During this period the trainee works and is studying the last two years of a part-time qualifying law degree, the part-time Common Professional Examination course and/or the part-time Legal Practice course.

The law graduate who holds a qualifying law degree must complete the Legal Practice course at a recognized institution, and then serve under the training contract for two years. The non-law graduate must first pass the Common Professional Exam (CPE) or the Postgraduate Diploma in Law, having attended either a one-year full-time or two-year part-time preparatory course. He or she may then serve under the training contract for two years after completion of a Legal Practice course. A Professional Skills course must be attended and successfully completed during the training contract.

Fellows of the Institute of Chartered Legal Executives may obtain partial or full exemptions from the CPE and Justices Clerk's Assistants courses by virtue of similar subjects passed in their Fellowship exams or the Diploma in Magisterial Law. After passing or being exempted from the CPE, the Fellow/Justices Clerk's Assistant may be exempt from serving under a training contract following successful completion of an LPC. A Professional Skills course must be taken prior to application for admission.

THE PROFESSIONAL SKILLS COURSE

The aim of the Professional Skills course is to build on the foundations laid in the LPC so as to develop a trainee s professional skills. Providers of the course, trainees and their employers are encouraged to regard the course as the first stage of a trainee s lifetime professional development.

Built upon the LPC, the course provides training in three subject areas: financial and business skills; advocacy and communication skills; client care and professional standards. Elective topics will also be chosen, which fall within one or more of these three core areas. All trainees have to complete all sections of the course satisfactorily before being admitted. The course consists of face-to-face instruction on the core subjects, for a minimum of 18 hours each for financial and business skills and advocacy and communication skills, and a minimum of 12 hours for client care and professional standards. The elective topics require a minimum total of 24 hours, of which a minimum of 12 hours must be face to face. The instruction must be completed during the training contract. The PSC is offered by accredited external course providers.

QUALIFIED LAWYERS FROM OTHER JURISDICTIONS

UK and EU lawyers together with lawyers from certain foreign jurisdictions can apply for admission under the Qualified Lawyers Transfer Scheme Regulations 2011. They need to obtain a QLTS Certificate of Eligibility.

Under the European Communities Directive No 2005/36/EC, lawyers from EU jurisdictions may apply for admission if they can prove they have met the requirements of the Directive and implementing legislation. EU, Northern Irish and Scottish lawyers and barristers qualified in England and Wales follow a different transfer process and should get in touch with the SRA Contact Centre for further information. All international applicants must satisfy the requirements and pass the QLTS Assessments. The Assessments are in two parts: Part 1 is a multiple-choice test designed to test Part A of the SRA s Day One Outcomes, namely the knowledge of law expected of a newly qualified solicitor of England and Wales; Part 2, is an Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE). For the OSCE, candidates are examined in the 3 practice areas of: • Business

- · Property and probate
- · Civil and criminal litigation

In each of these practice areas candidates do each of the following exercises once:

- Client interview and completion of attendance note/case analysis
- · Advocacy/oral presentation
- · Legal research
- Legal writing
- Legal drafting

In total therefore candidates undertake 15 assessed exercises: 5 in business, 5 in property and probate, and 5 in civil and criminal litigation.

The Solicitors Regulation Authority has appointed Kaplan QLTS as the sole assessment organization for the first three years of the operation of the assessments (http://qlts.kaplan.co.uk).

EEA, Northern Irish and Scottish lawyers, and barristers qualified in England and Wales will be individually assessed against the Day One Outcomes. All transferees are required to prove their character and suitability to be a solicitor by taking the SRA Suitability Test. Candidates who have passed the LPC can get exemption from the Part 1 (MCT) assessment.

The Legal Profession

The profession consists of solicitors and advocates.

Qualification as a Solicitor in Scotland

Solicitors in Scotland have their names inserted in a Roll of Solicitors and are granted annual Certificates entitling them to practise by The Law Society of Scotland (26 Drumsheugh Gardens, Edinburgh EH3 7YR; Tel: 0131 226 7411; Fax: 0131 225 2934; e-mail:



lawscot@lawscot.org.uk; website: www.lawscot.org.uk; Education and Careers Helpline: Heather McKendrick; Tel: 0131 476 8203; careers@lawscot.org.uk). A Certificate is granted to candidates who have passed approved exams, completed a term of practical training and been admitted as solicitors. (The Law Society can provide copies of its Careers Information leaflet on request.)

THE QUALIFYING EXAMINATIONS

The standard route to qualification is the LLB (the Ordinary degree is a three-year course, the Honours is four years) followed by the Diploma in Professional Legal Practice (Professional Education and Training Stage 1: PEAT 1) and then the traineeship, the period of paid in-office training working towards the standard of the qualified solicitor (Professional Education and Training Stage 2: PEAT 2). Outcomes in professionalism, professional ethics and standards, professional communication and business, commercial, financial and practice awareness apply across both PEAT 1 and 2, linking them and providing real clarity across the two stages.

All trainees are required to undertake trainee Continuing Professional Development (CPD). All solicitors are required to undertake CPD for a minimum of 20 hours each year. To support solicitors in their CPD activities, the Society provides basic templates, which can be completed online, to assist with identifying training needs, recording CPD undertaken and evaluating the outcome of the training. A wide range of activities are acceptable as CPD, including structured and formalized one-to-one training, coaching and online training.

An alternate route to qualifying as a solicitor in Scotland is by a combination of the Law Society s own examinations and three years pre-Diploma training. To be eligible to sit the Law Society s examinations, non-law graduates must find full-time employment as a pre-Diploma trainee with a qualified solicitor practising in Scotland. A pre-Diploma training contract lasts for three years. During the period of the training contract, a pre-Diploma trainee will study for the Law Society s examinations. European Law must be passed prior to admission as a solicitor, but can be obtained during post-Diploma training. The two routes to qualification (degree and Law Society exams) merge at this point as all intending solicitors are required to complete the Diploma in Professional Legal Practice. Upon successful completion of the Diploma the graduate will enter into a two-year post-Diploma

training contract with a qualified solicitor practising in Scotland.

Qualification as an advocate in Scotland

Barristers in Scotland are called Advocates. Scottish Advocates are not only members of the Faculty of Advocates but also members of the College of Justice and officers of the Court. The procedure for the admission of Intrants is subject in part to the control of the Court and in part to the control of the Faculty; the Court is responsible for most of the formal procedures and the Faculty for the exams and periods of professional training. To become an Intrant, applicants must produce evidence that they hold one of the following standard of degree: a degree with Honours, Second Class (Division 2) or above, in Scottish Law at a Scottish university, or a degree in Scottish Law at a Scottish university together with a degree with Honours, Second Class (Division 2) or above, in another subject at a UK university or an ordinary degree with distinction in Scottish Law at a Scottish university. A Diploma in Legal Practice from a Scottish University is also required, although in exceptional cases this requirement may be waived.

Once this evidence is provided and the relevant references obtained, a notice is posted outside Parliament House for a period of 21 days declaring the candidate s intention to present a Petition. At the end of this period the Petition is presented to the Court. After the Petition has been remitted by the Court to the Faculty and signed off by the Clerk of Faculty and Dean of Faculty the candidate is considered to have matriculated as an Intrant.

An Intrant must also comply with the professional training required by the Faculty, which consists of a period of 21 months training in a solicitors office (in some cases 12 months). Subject-for-subject exemptions are granted to Intrants who have passed exams at this standard in the course of a curriculum for a law degree at a Scottish university. Every Intrant must pass or be exempted from exams in nine compulsory subjects and two optional subjects. The compulsory subjects include Roman Law of Property and Obligations, Jurisprudence, Constitutional and Administrative Law, Scottish Criminal Law, Scottish Private Law, Commercial Law and Business Institutions, Evidence, International Private Law and European Law and Institutions. In addition, and prior to the commencement of pupillage (also known as devilling) every Intrant must sit the Faculty s entrant examination in Evidence, Practice and Procedure. If successfully passed, the Intrant can then commence his or her pupillage.

During the first five or six weeks of pupillage pupils undertake the Foundation course. After about three months of work with their devil master , the pupils will participate in the February Skills course, comprising a series of performance workshops involving the use of documents in evidence, the conduct of a procedure roll discussion, workshops on judicial review, section 275 applications and working with expert evidence. Shortly before admission, the pupils attend the May Preparation for Practice course, covering workshops on vulnerable witnesses, longer motions, reclaiming motions, negotiation and mediation, as well as carrying out civil and criminal appeals before a serving judge.

Intrants who have passed all the necessary exams and undergone the necessary professional training as well as successfully completing their pupillage may apply to be admitted to membership of the Faculty and are admitted at a public meeting of the Faculty. Once admitted, Intrants are introduced to the Court by the Dean of Faculty, make a Declaration of Allegiance to the Sovereign in open Court and are then admitted by the Court to the public office of Advocate. NORTHERN IRELAND

As in England and Wales, the superior courts are the Court of Appeal, the High Court and the Crown Court. The latter is an exclusively criminal court. The Court of Appeal hears appeals in civil cases from the High Court and in criminal cases from the Crown Court, and cases stated on a point of law from, inter alia, the County Court and the Magistrates Courts. Appeals lie from the Court of Appeal to the House of Lords.

Inferior Courts: as in England and Wales, the county courts are principally civil courts, but in Northern Ireland they also hear appeals from conviction in the Magistrates Courts for summary offences.

Magistrates Courts: these deal principally with minor criminal offences (summary offences) and are presided over by Resident Magistrates (stipendiaries). Resident Magistrates are appointed by the Crown on the advice of the Lord Chancellor.

Coroners: coroners in Northern Ireland must be barristers or solicitors who have practised for not less than five years. They are appointed by the Lord Chancellor.

The legal profession

The legal profession in Northern Ireland consists of barristers and solicitors belonging to professional bodies organized on similar lines to those in England and Wales.

Qualification as a barrister in Northern Ireland

The path to becoming a barrister in Northern Ireland will differ depending on where you study, qualify and complete your pupillage training. There are different pathways for those who have trained as barristers in Northern Ireland, the Republic of Ireland or England and Wales. A different procedure exists for solicitors who wish to re-qualify as barristers or those who wish to transfer from European jurisdictions. To qualify to practise as a barrister in Northern Ireland a candidate who has trained in Northern Ireland must have a recognized law degree of 2.1 honours standard or higher, or equivalent (the list of recognized law degrees for admission to the IPLS can be found at www.qub.ac.uk/schools/InstituteofProfessionalLegalStudies/Admissions/RecognisedLaw-Degrees). The candidate must then complete the Bar Post-Graduate Diploma in Professional Legal Studies at the Institute of Professional Legal Studies, Queen s University, Belfast (IPLS). Finally the candidate must call to the Bar of Northern Ireland and complete a 12month pupillage. Enquiries about the Bar can be made to the Bar Council Office, The Bar Library, 91 Chichester Street, Belfast BT1 3JQ; Tel: 028 9024 1523; website: www.barofni.com).

To be called to the Bar of Northern Ireland the candidate needs to have obtained his or her Certificate of Professional Legal Studies or otherwise be qualified, to have completed and signed a Memorial and Undertaking, and to have submitted two certificates of good character.

Qualification as a solicitor in Northern Ireland

Admission to training is generally dependent upon possession of a recognized law degree from a university. Details of the recognized law degrees are available on the website of the Institute of Professional Legal Studies (www.qub.ac.uk/schools/InstituteofProfessionalLegalStudies/Admissions/RecognisedLawDegrees/). Admissions. Law graduates must attend a two-year vocational apprenticeship course at the Institute of Professional Legal Studies, The Queen's University of Belfast, or the Graduate School of Professional Legal Education at the University of Ulster s Magee

Campus. On completion of the two-year apprenticeship newly qualified solicitors receive restricted practising certificates, which means that although they are fully qualified they cannot practise on their own account or in partnership for at least two more vears.

Non-law graduates must satisfy the Society that they possess an acceptable degree in a discipline other than law and have attained a satisfactory level of knowledge of the following subjects: Constitutional Law, Law of Tort, Law of Contract, Criminal Law, Equity, European Law, Land Law, Law of Evidence; that they have been offered a place in the Institute; and that they have obtained a Master (a solicitor with whom the applicant proposes to serve his or her apprenticeship).

MEDICINE

A student who wishes to qualify as a doctor in the UK must first obtain a primary qualification. Medical students in the UK typically study for five years to receive their medical degrees (or four years for a graduate entry programme). After graduation, a trainee doctor will enter the two-year Foundation Programme. The trainee is provisionally registered with a licence to practise with the General Medical Council (GMC) while completing the first year and

full registration is awarded upon completion of year one.

The GMC is charged with the responsibility under the Medical Act 1983 of keeping a register of all duly qualified medical practitioners. PRIMARY QUALIFICATIONS

A qualifying examination for the purposes of Part II of the Medical Act is an examination held for the granting of one or more primary medical qualifications (PMQs) by any one of the bodies or

combinations of bodies in the United Kingdom that are included in a list maintained by the GMC and published on the GMC's website (www.gmc-uk.org/education/undergraduate/awarding_bodies.asp).

LICENSING AND REVALIDATION

Licensing was introduced on 16 November 2009 and revalidation on 3 December 2012. Doctors must be registered with a licence to practise with the General Medical Council (GMC) to practise medicine in the UK. Any person whose fitness to practise is not impaired and who a) holds one or more primary United Kingdom qualifications and has satisfactorily completed an acceptable programme for provisionally registered doctors; or b) being a national of any relevant European State, holds one or more primary

European qualifications, is entitled to be registered as a fully registered medical practitioner.

Revalidation is a new way of regulating licensed doctors that will give extra confidence to patients that their doctors are up to date and fit to practise. Licensed doctors will have to revalidate, usually every five years, by having regular appraisals based on the GMC's core guidance for doctors, *Good Medical Practice*. It is planned that the majority of licensed doctors will be revalidated for the first time by the end of March 2016.

There are three components to the MRCP(UK) Diploma. The part 1 examination has a two-paper format. Each paper is 3 hours in duration and contains 100 multiple choice questions in one from five (best of five) format, where a candidate chooses the best answer from five possible answers. The part 2 written examination has a three-paper format. All papers in the MRCP(UK) part 2 written examination are 3 hours in duration and contain up to 100 multiple choice questions. The questions will usually have a clinical scenario, may include the results of investigations and may be illustrated. The part 2 clinical examination (PACES) consists of five clinical stations, each assessed by two independent examiners. Candidates will start at any one of the five stations, and then move round the carousel of stations at 20-minute intervals until they have completed the cycle. There is a 5-minute period between each station. Candidates may apply to sit the MRCP(UK) part 1 examination provided they graduated at least 12 months in advance of the examinations date (and have had at least 12 months' experience in medical employment). Candidates who have passed the part 1 examination can proceed to complete the remaining components. The MRCP(UK) Examination provides valid, reliable evidence of attainment in knowledge, clinical skills and behaviour, and is a mandatory component of assessment for Core Medical Training (CMT). The Specialty Certificate Examinations (SCEs): The Federation of Royal Colleges of Physicians of the UK, in association with the Specialist Societies, has developed a programme to deliver Specialty Certificate Examinations within the new specialist training structure. The aim of these national assessments is to ensure that trainees have sufficient knowledge of their specialty to practise safely and competently as consultants. The Specialty Certificate Examination is delivered in computer-based format (referred to as CBT) at a Pearson VUE test centre. Each paper is based on the MRCP(UK) written paper format and contains 100 multiple choice questions in 'best of five' format. A Specialty Certificate Examination is a compulsory component of assessment for Certificate of Completion of Training (CCT) for all UK trainees whose specialist training began in or after August 2007 and is in one of the following specialties: Dermatology; Endocrinology and Diabetes; Gastroenterology; Geriatric Medicine; Infectious Diseases; Medical Oncology; Nephrology; Neurology; Palliative Medicine; Respiratory Medicine and Rheumatology.

Diploma in Geriatric Medicine The Diploma in Geriatric Medicine is designed to give recognition of competence in the provision of care of older people to General Practitioner vocational trainees, staff physicians and others working in non-consultant career posts in Departments of Geriatric Medicine, and other doctors with interests in or responsibilities for the care of older people.

The Diploma in Geriatric Medicine is available to all registered doctors. It is not primarily directed towards career geriatricians, but is generally to family doctors, psycho-geriatricians and indeed any doctor involved in the care of older people.

The Diploma in Geriatric Medicine is in two parts, the first of which is a written examination of multiple choice (best of 5) questions, lasting 2 hours and 30 minutes normally held twice a year at the Royal College of Physicians of London.

The second part is a Clinical Examination also held twice a year at various clinical centres in England and Wales. The clinical examination is a four-station standardized examination similar to an Objective Standard Clinical Examination (OSCE).

Diploma in Tropical Medicine and Hygiene The Diploma in Tropical Medicine and Hygiene is intended to test the knowledge required of physicians who wish to practise medicine effectively in developing countries.

Candidates for the Diploma in Tropical Medicine & Hygiene must hold a primary medical qualification recognized by the Royal College of Physicians of London.

The Royal College of Physicians of London will accept applications from candidates who are in the process of completing, or have completed within the last 5 years, the Tropical Medicine courses in London, Liverpool, Sheffield and Glasgow, which are recognized as appropriate training centres for the examination. The examination is held once a year over 2

days (unless required for a viva) and is conducted in the following sections: A Practical Section lasting 2 hours and 30 minutes consists of a mixture of microscopy specimens, including 20 'spot' questions that are set up on a microscope for identification. Other specimens require the candidate to use the microscopes themself. They are mainly parasitological and may include faecal, blood and haematological preparations together with some entomological specimens. A Written Section (3 hours and 20 minutes in total) consists of three papers. The Clinical Paper (1 hour) contains 18 compulsory questions. The first 16 are based on clinical pictures usually of patients with abnormal physical signs; but occasionally laboratory slides, X-rays, or epidemiological data may be shown. There will be two or three questions on each, asking (for example) identification, diagnosis, further investigation, treatment etc. Each of these 16 questions is worth a maximum of 5 marks. The last 2 questions (17 and 18) are brief clinical cases, with 2 or 3 questions (again concentrating on diagnosis or differential diagnosis, investigation and treatment). The Multiple Choice Question Paper (1 hour and 20 minutes) consists of 40 multiple choice questions designed to test the knowledge of tropical medicine and hygiene over a wide area. The **Preventative Medicine Paper** (1 hour including 5 minutes reading time) consists of 10 questions of which the candidate must choose 5. Each question may have several parts, covering all aspects of preventative medicine and international community health in a tropical context.

There is also an **Oral ('Viva') Examination** for borderline candidates. The examination is conducted by two examiners. The first part of the examination (10 minutes) is a discussion of an illustrated clinical case history, which candidates are allowed to study for 10 minutes before the examination. The second part of the examination (10 minutes) consists of more general questions.

Dispensing opticians must be registered with the General Optical Council (GOC, 41 Harley Street, London W1G 8DJ; Tel: 020 7580 3898; e-mail: goc@optical.org; website: www.optical.org). The GOC publishes registers of all optometrists, dispensing opticians, student opticians and optical businesses that are qualified and fit to practise, train or carry on business (www.optical.org/en/utilities/online-registers.cfm).

Qualification takes three years in total, and can be completed by combining a distance learning course or day release while working as a trainee under the supervision of a qualified and GOC-registered optician. Alternatively students can do a two-year full-time course followed by one year of supervised practice with a qualified and registered optician. The GOC has approved training courses in dispensing optics at the following six institutions in the UK: Anglia Ruskin University, Association of British Dispensing Opticians (ABDO) College, Bradford College, City University, City and Islington College, and Glasgow Caledonian University. All routes are

assessed by final ABDO examinations. On successful completion of training you must register with the GOC in order to practise in the UK. Once qualified, you will need to undertake a minimum amount of continuing education and training to remain on the register.

The approved training course for the contact lens specialty is run by ABDO College and City and Islington College. If you qualify as a dispensing optician and have worked in practice as a qualified dispensing optician for at least two years, the University of Bradford offers a career progression course that enables you to graduate with a degree in optometry in one calendar year (Tel: 01274 234290; e-mail: lifesciences-ug@bradford.ac.uk).

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You will normally need to have five GCSEs (or equivalent) at grades C or above, including English, maths and science. For mature and overseas students, alternative and vocational courses, admission requirements will vary and may be more flexible.

TEACHING/EDUCATION

Initial qualifications in the UK Qualified Teacher Status

To obtain a teaching appointment as a qualified teacher in maintained schools in England and Wales, it is necessary to have Qualified Teacher Status (QTS). To be qualified, teachers must have satisfactorily completed an approved course of initial teacher training (ITT), and to be able to teach in maintained schools in England must have successfully completed their induction period (there are similar arrangements for teaching in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland).

Teacher training courses

Initial teacher training courses in England and Wales are provided by accredited training providers mainly through university departments of education. Courses available include Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science with QTS, Bachelor of Education

(BEd) for undergraduates, and Postgraduate Certificates of Education (PGCEs) for graduates.

Undergraduate training courses generally take three or four years full time, or four to six years part time. However, if you have undergraduate credits from previous study you may be able to complete a course in two years. A PGCE generally lasts one year full time, or up to two years part time.

There are also some employment-based routes into teaching. The School Direct Programme allows schools to recruit trainees with the expectation that they will go on to work in the school or group of schools in which they have been trained, though there is no guarantee of employment. There are more than 100 schools offering places. Courses generally last for one year full time.

School Direct offers two separate training options: the School Direct Training Programme and the



School Direct Training Programme (salaried). The School Direct Training Programme (salaried) is open to graduates with three or more years' career experience. Trainees will be employed as unqualified teachers with a salary subsidized by The National College for Teaching and Leadership. Trainees on a School Direct course will have to pay tuition fees to cover the cost of the course, but home and EU trainees will be eligible for a tuition fee loan to cover these costs. For more information, see The National College for Teaching and Leadership, School Direct (www.education.gov.uk).

School-centred initial teacher training (SCITT) is training in a school environment for those with a UK degree or an equivalent qualification. SCITT programmes are designed and delivered by groups of neighbouring schools and colleges; they are usually full time for one year. Taught by experienced, practising teachers, and often tailored towards local teaching needs, all SCITT courses lead to QTS. Many, though not all, will also award you a PGCE validated by a higher education institution. There are consortia of schools and colleges running SCITT courses all over England. These groups provide all kinds of SCITT, covering primary, middle years and the full range of secondary subjects. Application for SCITT courses is usually through the Graduate Teacher Training Registry (www.gttr.ac.uk), although some SCITT providers require direct applications.

Teach First offers a two-year Leadership Development Programme for those interested in an employment-based route into teaching. Teach First enables graduates to spend two years working in secondary and primary schools in low-income communities while earning a full-time salary. It offers the programme in ten regions: East Midlands, Kent and Medway, Greater London, North East, North West, South Coast, South West, West Midlands, Wales (South) and Yorkshire and the Humber. A PGCE is awarded on completion of the course.

The qualification of Professional Graduate Diploma in Education (PGDE) is a one-year post-graduate degree course leading to registration as a primary or secondary school teacher in Scotland (see www.teachinginscotland.com). Alternatively it is possible to undertake a four-year undergraduate degree course in education. In Scotland there are eight universities that offer teacher training courses: University of Aberdeen, University of Dundee, University of Edinburgh, University of Strathclyde, University of the West of Scotland and the Open

University in Scotland. For more information on how to apply for a teaching course in Scotland contact Graduate Teacher Training Registry (GTTR), Tel: 0871 468 0469, www.gttr.ac.uk; and Universities and Colleges Admissions System (UCAS), Tel: 0871 468 0468, www.ucas.com

GTCW is responsible for the notification of award of QTS in Wales, on behalf of the Welsh Government. The main ways to gain QTS in Wales are completion of a course of teacher training at an accredited institution in Wales (see www.teachertrainingcymru. org/home) or completion of employment-based training under the Graduate Teacher Programme (GTP). GTP programmes in Wales are managed and delivered by three regional centres of teacher training and education on behalf of the Welsh Government. Their contact details can be found at www.teachertrainingcymru.org/node/4

The Postgraduate Certificate of Education course, approved by the Department of Education Northern Ireland, or a four-year BEd (Hons) course, leads to recognition as a schoolteacher in Northern Ireland (see www.deni.gov.uk).

Qualifications for admission to training

Higher education institutions offering undergraduate ITT courses will set admissions criteria, typically two good A levels (or equivalent qualifications). Entrants to PGCE and other graduate training courses will require a relevant UK Bachelor's degree or a recognized equivalent and be expected to demonstrate a standard equivalent to GCSE grade C in English and mathematics, and additionally a standard equivalent to GCSE grade C in a science subject for those wishing to train to teach primary school children. Trainees who have undertaken their initial teacher training in England must pass professional skills tests in numeracy and literacy before starting the course. These tests cover core skills that teachers need in their jobs and QTS cannot be awarded until they are passed. If you are undertaking initial teacher training in Wales, you are not required to complete the skills tests in order to be awarded QTS.

The National College for Teaching and Leadership is the executive agency of the Department for Education (DfE). It is the body responsible for ITT in England and the award of QTS. It has two key aims: improving the quality of the education workforce; and helping schools to help each other to improve. There is no requirement to register with The National College for Teaching and Leadership and no

registration fee. For information about the College, visit www.education.gov.uk
