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## Exec utive Summary

The Iowa Department of Education collects information on joint enrollment from Iowa's 15 community colleges. Jointly enrolled students are high school students enrolled in community college credit coursework. Most jointly enrolled students enroll through Senior Year Plus programs such as Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) and concurrent enrollment. Other students enroll independently as tuition-paying students, or enroll in courses delivered through contractual agreements that do not meet the definition of concurrent enrollment. For more information about Senior Year Plus programs, please refer to the Department's website.

This report consists of fiscal year (FY) and trend data on joint enrollment, including headcount enrollment, credit hours taken, student demographics, and enrollment by program type and offering arrangement. All data included in this report is taken from the Community College Management Information System (MIS) and confirmed by each college, unless otherwise noted.

Some of the highlights of this Academic Year (AY) 2017-18 report include:

- Enrollment increased from 49,868 students last year to 50,001 this year, a 2.3 percent increase. Seven (7) community colleges experienced increased enrollments; nine (9) colleges experienced a increase in the number of credits taken by high school students.
- Average annual growth over the last five has been 3.5 percent.
- High school students participating in joint enrollment programs accounted for 38.9 percent of total community college enrollment. Approximately 55 percent of the participants were high school seniors and 41.5 percent were juniors.
- Joint enrollment programs account for 24.1 percent of total credit hours.
- Among high school students, 96.6 percent participated in joint enrollment courses delivered through a contractual agreement between a community college and school district. PSEO and tuition-paid courses accounted for the remaining 3.4 percent of total joint enrollment.
- Slightly more than 50 percent of participants in joint enrollment programs were female, compared to 54 percent for total credit student enrollment.
- Just over 15.5 percent of participants in joint enrollment programs reported a minority racial or ethnic background compared to 21 percent of total credit student enrollment.
- The most common subject areas in which students jointly enrolled were English, social science and history, mathematics, healthcare, and life and physical sciences.


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## J oint Enrollment

Each year, tens of thousands of Iowa high school students enroll in community college credit coursework. The Department of Education refers to these students as "jointly enrolled."

In Iowa, high school students enroll in community college credit courses in a variety of ways, including through Postsecondary Enrollment Option (PSEO) courses, college courses offered through a contract between a local school district and a community college, and enrollment in a college course independently as a tuition-paying student. While sometimes referred to as "dual credit," joint enrollment does not necessarily entail credit being issued at both the secondary and postsecondary levels. Some programs, such as PSEO and concurrent enrollment, require that credit be issued at each level, while other joint enrollment opportunities have no such requirement.

Most joint enrollment opportunities fall under the purview of Senior Year Plus. This legislation, passed in 2008, consolidated and standardized several existing programs involving college credit opportunities for high school students including PSEO, concurrent enrollment (which

entails supplementary weighting for local school districts), career and regional academies, Advanced Placement ${ }^{\circledR}$, and Project Lead the Way®.

Joint enrollment in Iowa community colleges continues to reach new record highs, with a total of 51,001 unduplicated students enrolling in academic year (AY) 2017-18, which represents a 2.3 percent increase from the previous year. In this year, jointly enrolled students accounted for 38.9 percent of total enrollment. Headcount enrollment increased at seven community colleges (Table 1), while the number of credits taken by high school students increased at nine colleges and statewide by 3.7 percent (Table 2).

## J OINTENROUMENT

Joint enrollment is defined as a high school student enrolled in one ormore community college courses. The Community College Management Information System (MIS) captures joint enrollment in three categories: PSEO, contra cted courses, a nd tuition-paying.

## PO STSEC ONDARY ENRO LMENT OPTIONS (PSEO)

The Postsecondary Enrollment Options Act was enacted in 1987 to promote rigorous academic pursuits by providing high school students access to enroll parttime in nonsectarian courses at eligible postsecondary institutions. Now offered through Senior Year Plus, the program is available to eligible juniors and seniors, as well as freshmen and sophomores who are identified as gifted and talented, according to the school district's criteria and procedures.

## CONCURRENTENROШMENT

The concurent enrollment program, also known as district-to-community college sha ring, promotes rigorous a cademic and career and tec hnic al pursuits by providing opportunities for high school students to enroll part-time in eligible nonsectarian courses at or through community colleges. Courses which meet all eligibility criterion generate supplementary weighting.

Because high school students generally enroll part-time at community colleges, they account for a higher percentage of enrollment at each college (Figure 1) than credit hours (Figure 2). Statewide, in AY 2017-18, joint enrollment accounted for 24.1 percent of total credit hours (Table 3). Also, the rate at which high school students enroll in college coursework varies by local school districts and community college regions (see map insert).

The number of credit hours taken by each jointly enrolled student increased slightly from the previous year, with each student enrolling in an average of 8.3 credit hours (Figure 3). Interestingly, the number of credit hours taken per student has only increased 0.9 credit hour since FY 2008.

## J oint Enrollment Offering Arrangements

Contracted courses had the largest enrollment of the three types of joint enrollment arrangements, accounting for approximately 96.6 percent of jointly enrolled students in AY 2017-18 (Figure 4). Enrollment in contracted courses rose seven percent from the previous year to 50,082 students. Enrollments through PSEO significantly decreased to total enrollment of 107 from the previous year total of 4,123 students. This is attributed to a change in enrollment practices stemming from statute passed by the Iowa Legislature in 2016. Enrollment of tuition-paying students increased 38 percent from the previous year to a total of 1,653 students (Table 4).

## J oint Enrollment Student Demographics

In AY 2017-18, the profile of a jointly enrolled student was Caucasian, and a high school senior. Approximately 50 percent of joint enrollees were female compared with 54 percent of the overall community college student body (Figure 5), and 15.5 percent of joint enrollees reported having a minority racial or ethnic background. Within those reporting minority status, Hispanics were the largest group at 45.6 percent, followed by Black and Asian/ Pacific Islander at 19.5 percent and 17.3 percent, respectively (Figure 6). In comparison, in that same year, 22.4 percent of all community college students reported having a minority racial or ethnic background, with 36 percent Hispanic and 34 percent Black.

As expected, jointly enrolled students are younger than the overall community college student body. In AY 2017-18, 15.1 percent of jointly enrolled students were 15 years old or younger; 24.2 percent were 16; 39.9 percent were 17, and 20.7 percent were 18 or older. Also, not surprisingly, jointly enrolled students are almost exclusively residents of Iowa. In AY 2017-18, 99.4 percent of these students were Iowa residents.

## Grade Level of J oint Enrollment Students

Data on grade level is derived through a match between the state's K-12 data repository and the Community College Management Information System (MIS). Figure 7 displays the distribution of high school students enrolled in Iowa community colleges during AY 2017-18. Jointly enrolled students tend to be high school juniors and seniors, with 78 percent being in their last two years of high school. Approximately 14.5
percent of jointly enrolled students were in grade 10 and seven percent were in grade 9.

In total, 31 percent of public school students in grades 9 through 12 enrolled in community college credit courses, including more than half (55 percent) of all high school seniors.

## Concurrent Enrollment and PSEO by Subject Area

Unlike other sections of this report that utilize Community College MIS data, this section is based on Student Reporting in Iowa data submitted by Iowa public school districts. The department analyzed data on the instances of concurrent enrollment and PSEO courses taken by subject area (Table 5). Courses taken by tuition-paying students enrolling independent of the district were not included.

Of instances of PSEO courses taken, 42.3 percent were in the subject area of social sciences and history. English language and literature courses accounted for an additional 11.4 percent of courses taken. Of concurrent
enrollment courses taken, the subject area with the greatest instances of courses taken was English language and literature ( 21.6 percent), followed by social sciences and history (16.3 percent), healthcare sciences ( 7.9 percent), and math (7.9 percent).

Table 6 presents the instances of community college career and technical education (CTE) and arts and sciences courses taken by Iowa high school students through contractual agreements in AY 2017-18. Of courses taken in AY 2017-18, 37.6 percent were classified as CTE, 62.4 percent arts and science.

## Revenue from Conc urent Enrollment and PSEO

Concurrent enrollment offerings are one of several sharing opportunities incentivized by state policy. School districts may be eligible for additional funding in the form of a supplemental weighting in the school foundation funding formula for students participating in certain programs, including concurrent enrollment. In this case, the supplementary weighting provides districts with funding to pay community colleges for delivery of concurrent enrollment courses.

In AY 2017-18, community colleges generated more than $\$ 30$ million in revenue from concurrent enrollment courses. In total, 367 high schools (duplicated) enrolled 50,450 students (unduplicated) in concurrent enrollment courses (Table 7).

Students also have the opportunity to enroll in college courses through PSEO, provided the school district does not offer a comparable course (including concurrent enrollment offerings). The school district pays the eligible postsecondary institution the cost of the course or $\$ 250$, whichever is lower.

In AY 2017-18, community colleges generated about $\$ 73,509$ in revenue from PSEO enrollment. Over the past year, seven high schools (duplicated) sent just over 100 students (unduplicated) to a community college for postsecondary coursework through PSEO (Table 8). As noted earlier, there was a significant decline in the number of students enrolling in community college coursework through PSEO due to statutory changes.
