ABSTRACT

A detailed statistical review of state support for health manpower training during 1973, 1974, and 1975 with an inventory of state expenditures for specific health occupations in 32 states are presented in Volume One of this two-volume study conducted for the Health Resources Administration. Objectives of the study included: investigation of the availability of data on state and local support for health manpower training and development of methods for obtaining these data; and utilization of these procedures to collect information for FY 1974 and FY 1975. The two-phase study methodology is explained and financial data and program statistics for all major health professions and allied health occupations are presented. Financial support categories include: institutional support, capital outlay, student aid, and direct support. For each of the 32 states examined in depth, state funds by institutions and program are tabulated for each financial support category. Total financial support for health manpower training for all 50 states was \$1.5 million during FY 1974, an increase of 23 percent over FY 1973. For 32 states the mean per capita higher education appropriation for health manpower training programs was \$46.35, with an average figure of \$5.29. Variations in program expenditures in different states ranged from a high of \$15.26 per capita for Oregon to a low of \$1.97 for Massachusetts. It is recommended that: the survey be repeated on a regular basis; the scope of the survey be increased; a mail survey be conducted; an index be developed and printed; and an in-depth analysis of state support be conducted that coordinates federal and state support indices. A glossary of related terms is provided.

INTRODUCTION

The technical background of this study by the Applied Management Sciences Inc., done under contract for the Manpower Analysis Branch of the Office of Program Development, Bureau of Health Manpower, is given in Chapter 1, "Overview".

However, some detailed description of the final report, as it was completed and issued in three parts, is necessary for an understanding of the length of the study, and is given below:

- (1) An executive summary (originally issued as Manpower Analysis Branch Staff Report No. 76-61) was published in 1977 as DHEW Pub. No. (HRA) 77-100, "An Inventory of State Support for Health Manpower Training Programs -- A Preliminary Report".
- (2) The full report, including the actual inventory of basic State tables, findings and analysis of data (by institutions receiving aid, and broken out into four categories: Institutional Support for Current Operations; Capital Outlay; Student Aid; and Direct Support) is now issued as DHEW Pub. No. (HRA) 78-34, "State Programs Supporting Health Manpower Training, An Inventory", Volume 1, "Report and Tables".
- (3) The methodology used in the study, including recommendations for future studies, sources of data, State site visits, highlights, and glossary, is now issued as DHEW Pub. No. (HRA) 78-35 "State Programs Supporting Health Manpower Training, An Inventory", Volume 2, "Methodology".

It should be borne in mind that, wherever data were available at the time of the study, they were incorporated into the final report and inventory, but not all 50 States had complete data for the years 1973, 1974, and 1975, nor are all the data from primary sources. However, in Volume 1, "Reports and Tables", and in Volume 2, "Methodology", as they are now issued, all the data sources have been carefully noted (eliminating names etc. as required by the Privacy Act regulations), and gaps are clearly marked. It may be that the gaps will be filled at a later date if Volumes 1 and 2 of the Inventory are found to be useful in meeting the need for information on types of financial support by State and local areas for the training of the Nation's health manpower.

The contract under which the Inventory of State Support for Health Manpower Training Programs was prepared has had a series of Project Directors under the contractor, Applied Management Sciences, Inc., and a series of Project Officers under the Bureau of Health Manpower and its predecessor, the Bureau of Health Resources Development. However, the latest and longest in duration in both categories has been Linda LeBlanc for AMS, and Lucy M. Kramer, of the Manpower Analysis Branch, Office of Program Development, in the Bureau of Health Manpower.

OVERVIEW

In July 1973, the Bureau of Health Resources Development ^{1/}, Health Resources Administration, contracted with Applied Management Sciences, Inc. for development of an inventory of State and local financial support for health manpower training programs.

This project was designed to fill an identified need for accurate, current information on scope and characteristics of such programs, in terms of specific disciplines, students and schools involved, funds expended, and other related data. Similar information on Federal Government programs supporting health manpower training is available for several years ^{2/} and data on support by private foundations for one year ^{3/}. However, lack of comprehensive information on the nature and funding of State and local programs hampered analyses of trends in national health expenditures ^{4/}.

BASIC OBJECTIVES of the study were twofold:

- (1) To investigate the availability of data on State and local government support for health manpower training and to develop ways of obtaining these data; and
- (2) To utilize these procedures to collect such information during FY 1974 and FY 1974.

Data collected represent the first detailed review of State support for the training of health manpower, providing an inventory of State expenditures for specific health occupations in 32 States.

In order to develop such an inventory, the study was conducted in two phases: Phase I was a feasibility study to examine the problems involved in developing the inventory, and to design standardized procedures for collecting needed data on a national basis. For this purpose, a sample of eight State and nine local governments was selected. Phase II involved implementation of techniques and procedures developed in Phase I. The inventory summarizes State financial support for health education programs in four categories:

- * Institutional Support
- * Capital Outlay
- * Student Aid
- * Direct Support

Although this study provides information on State expenditures for health training programs in all 50 States, it should be emphasized that only 32 of the States underwent intensive review through on-site visits.

Selection of States was based on level of contribution to the total health manpower training effort.

Of the 32 States, eight (the sample) were examined in early 1974, with expenditure and program data identified for FY 1973 and FY 1974. The other 24 States were enumerated using actual expenditures for FY 1973 and FY 1974 and appropriations for FY 1975. Data on the remaining 18 States for FY 1973, FY 1974, and FY 1975 were obtained by secondary source review only, and, as such, are not directly comparable to data from the 32 States included in the site visits. Figure 1 summarizes the methodology employed in each State.

Summary of Major Findings

- * Total financial support for health manpower training for all 50 States reached the level of \$1.5 billion during FY 1974. This is an increase of \$306 million, or approximately 25 percent, over the FY 1973 level.
- * During the same period, increase in appropriations of State tax funds in all 50 States for operating expenses of institutions of higher education was 6.8 percent.
- * In FY 1973, expenditures for institutional support totalled over \$893.1 million, whereas in FY 1974, the same expenditures were nearly \$1.1 billion. In FY 1974, institutional support accounted for nearly 72 percent of total State expenditures for health manpower training and for approximately 12 percent of total State expenditures for all higher education.

Summary of Findings (continued)

- * The proportion of institutional support for health manpower training in relation to total higher education expenditures varies by State, ranging from a high of 27.0 percent in Oregon to a low of 5.3 percent in Delaware.
- * State involvement in institutional support of health manpower training was found not to be directly related to the State's overall support of higher education.
- * For the 32 reporting States, mean per capita higher education appropriation for institutional support was \$46.35. Of this figure, an average of \$5.29 was expended for health manpower training programs. However, across States, variation in program expenditures ranged from a high of \$15.26 per capita in Oregon to a low of \$1.97 in Massachusetts.

Summary of Findings (continued)

- * For FY 1974, the largest single portion of funds (44.2 percent of total State expenditures for health training programs) was allocated for training of physicians. Teaching hospitals accounted for an additional 20.3 percent. If teaching hospitals are viewed as part of physician training, since the major portion of these funds are allocated for intern and residency programs, then physician training accounted for 64.5 percent of all State expenditures for health training.
- * Of total State expenditures for institutional support, Allied Health programs accounted for the second highest percentage (14.4%), followed by Dentistry (7.2%), Nursing (6.1%), Veterinary Medicine (2.6%), Pharmacy (2.2%), Public Health (0.9%), Osteopathy (0.5%), and Optometry (0.4%).
- * Capital outlays attributable specifically to health manpower training programs totaled \$333.0 million in FY 1974, or 21.9 percent of the total health manpower training expenditures for that year.
- * Involvement of individual State government agencies and hospitals in health manpower training programs accounted for approximately 4 percent of total FY 1974 expenditures, or \$60.7 million.
- * State support to students enrolled in health training programs in educational institutions - through such mechanisms as scholarships, loans, grants, and out-of-State student exchange programs - totaled \$39.8 million during FY 1974.

Study Methodology

In the initial stages of the project, three methods for conducting the study were examined to determine their relative value in identifying and collecting data for the inventory. The first involved review of published materials (secondary sources) available at the national level. The second utilized both telephone and mail surveys of eight pretest States and nine local governments to expand the list of secondary source documents. The third combined a survey of data available at the national level with on-site follow-up visits to each of the pretest States and several local governments. This latter method proved highly successful in eliciting necessary data at the level of detail required for the inventory, whereas the earlier two approaches failed to produce adequate results.

Accordingly, the study was then extended to include data collection in an additional 24 States. Information was extracted from published documents (State executive budgets, State agency publications, association reports), on-site visits were made, and follow-up telephone calls were utilized to expand the information. Selection of States was based on level of contribution to the total health manpower training effort, and the 32 States included in this study represent 93 percent of all such State expenditures. Data for the remaining 18 States was drawn from published documents to provide approximate national representation of State support.

Recommendations

Information obtained as a result of the completed data collection effort is seen as invaluable to planners in the field of health manpower training. However, several additional activities would increase the usefulness of this information:

First, to repeat the survey on a regular basis, using procedures detailed in Volume II of this study.

Second, to increase the scope of the inventory to include all 50 States, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico in the basic data system. This could be accomplished through initial site visits to obtain requisite information and to identify appropriate contacts for later mail updates.

Third, to conduct a mail survey of the original eight States pretested in early 1974, to fill in data gaps, since FY 1975 data were not available at that time.

Fourth, to develop and print an Index to the published inventory, to facilitate access to its wealth of detailed information on specific expenditures for health training programs by supporting institutions.

Fifth, to develop an indepth analysis of the various States' support of health manpower training programs, bringing together related information now available to the Federal Government with various indices of State financing and the educational involvement of each, for legislators and administrators concerned with health manpower training.

FINDINGS AND ANALYSIS OF DATAIntroduction

To function effectively, legislators and administrators involved in decision-making that affects health manpower planning require accurate and current information on health manpower training programs. With the changing thrust of Federal involvement in health manpower training and the increasing importance of State responsibilities in this area, detailed data are required on specific disciplines trained, students and schools involved, funds expended, and related program information.

Such information has been readily available on Federal Government programs, and - to a limited extent - also on private support, but information at the State level has been lacking, thus limiting analyses of trends in national health expenditures.

For many years, as a major employer of health manpower, the Federal Government has supported education and training of health manpower personnel. However, until recently, this training was designed primarily to meet specific program needs of Federal agencies. Since 1962, Federal assistance programs have mushroomed, both in number and in variety of health occupations supported. Major enabling legislation includes the Manpower Development and Training Act of 1962, the Health Professions Educational Assistance Act of 1963 and subsequent amendments, the Vocational Education Act of 1963, the Nurse Training Act of 1964, the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964, the Allied Health Professions Personnel Training Act of 1966, the Health Manpower Act of 1968, the Health Training Improvement Act of 1970, the Nurse Training Act of 1971, and the Comprehensive Health Manpower Training Act of 1971.

Over the years, efforts have been made to provide comprehensive inventories of Federal programs supporting health manpower training. In order of appearance, these were: 1) "Federal Aid Available for Education and Training of Health Service Personnel," appearing as an appendix to HEALTH MANPOWER PERSPECTIVE: 1967; 2) "Allied Health Manpower, 1950-80," a listing of FY 1968 programs, published as an appendix to HEALTH MANPOWER SOURCEBOOK, Section 21; 3) Part II of a comprehensive report prepared in 1970 in response to a request from

the Senate Appropriations Subcommittee on Labor and Health, Education, and Welfare; 4) INVENTORY OF FEDERAL PROGRAMS THAT SUPPORT HEALTH MANPOWER TRAINING - 1970, published in 1971 by the Division of Manpower Intelligence, Bureau of Health Manpower Education, National Institutes of Health (essentially, the Subcommittee Report with introductory material, summary tables, and an index added); and 5) INVENTORY OF FEDERAL PROGRAMS SUPPORTING HEALTH MANPOWER TRAINING: FY 1972, DHEW Publication No. (NIH) 73-146, published at the request of the Assistant Secretary for Health and Scientific Affairs by the Division of Manpower Intelligence, Bureau of Health Resources Development, Health Resources Administration, DHEW, in 1973.

In 1973, in an effort to broaden coverage of financial support for health manpower training to include contributions of State and local governments, endowments, or private foundations, BHRD's Division of Manpower Intelligence (dissolved as of March 1, 1974, in conjunction with a reorganization of the Bureau) initiated two studies: PRIVATE FOUNDATIONS SUPPORTING HEALTH EDUCATION AND TRAINING: An Inventory, 1971 (DHEW Publication No. (HRA) 74-40); and INVENTORY OF STATE APPROPRIATIONS SUPPORTING EDUCATION FOR THE HEALTH PROFESSIONS, FY 1971-72 (DHEW Publication No. (HRA) 75-31).

The review of the private sector provides summary information on the philanthropic activity of individual private foundations in the health manpower education field, indicating specific sources of funds, nature and purpose of financial support, and types of health occupations assisted. Most data was drawn from secondary sources, principally Internal Revenue Form 990 AR, which private foundations are required to submit, although files of the Foundation Center, located in Washington, D.C. and New York, were also utilized.

The State INVENTORY summarizes data on appropriations for health manpower training in 50 States and Puerto Rico for FY 1972. Appropriations figures were obtained from 1972 and 1973 budget documents and fiscal reports. To clarify specific items, State university financial statements were also reviewed. It should be noted that (1) available State budgetary documents varied markedly from State to State, particularly in regard to detailed institutional and programmatic break-downs; and (2) funds given were appropriations, which usually differ from actual expenditures; and (3) budget items that could not clearly be identified as relevant to health professions education were excluded.

Dependence upon secondary sources only yielded a distorted, and in many cases, an inadequate and incomplete picture of the States' role in support of health manpower training. For example, only major 4-year institutions, shown as line-items in State budgets, could be reported as receiving direct institutional support. Allied health professions, supported out of higher education budgets, were excluded. Consequently, community and junior college programs and certain hospital-based programs were omitted. Line-items usually tend to overestimate actual support, since figures given usually include not only instructional costs, but directed research and administrative charges as well. Also, the use of single-year figures can overemphasize the effect of unusual one-time expenditures and does not permit longitudinal comparisons.

In an effort to overcome these deficiencies, BHRD developed a revised inventory and systematic procedures for collection of data on State and local support. Results provide a unique view of the States' role in helping to provide the Nation with trained professionals to meet increasing demands for health services.

Scope of Study

Although this study presents detailed information on State expenditures for health manpower training programs in all 50 States, it should be emphasized that only 32 of the States underwent intensive review through on-site visits. Selection of these States was based on their level of contribution to the total health manpower training effort. Of the 32 States, eight (the sample) were examined in early 1974, with expenditure and program data identified for FY 1973 and FY 1974 only. The remaining 24 States were enumerated using actual expenditures for FY 1973 and FY 1974, and appropriations for FY 1975. Data on the remaining 18 States for FY 1973, FY 1974, and FY 1975, were obtained by secondary source review only, and as such are not directly comparable to data from the 32 States included in site visits.

The full-scale data collection system utilized various combinations of available data sources: (a) Primary sources - State and local budget offices, boards of higher education, State and regional coordinating bodies (e.g., Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education and Southern Regional Education Board), scholarship commissions, vocational education departments, and training offices within departments of health and mental

health; (b) Secondary sources - published documents obtained at State and/or local levels, such as executive budgets, State audit reports, boards of higher education annual reports and university financial reports, and national publications containing relevant information (e.g., MEDICAL EDUCATION IN THE UNITED STATES, ANNUAL REPORT, DENTAL EDUCATION: and ANNUAL REPORT, DENTAL AUXILIARY EDUCATION); and (c) Combined primary and secondary sources, as when expenditure data could be obtained through visit to a budget office (primary source contact) but a board of higher education annual report (secondary source document) was consulted for enrollment information.

Financial data and program statistics for all major health professions and allied health occupations were included in the data collection system. In the context of this report, health manpower includes the following professions/occupations:

- * Medicine
- * Osteopathy
- * Dentistry
- * Pharmacy
- * Podiatry
- * Veterinary Medicine
- * Public Health
- * Optometry
- * Nursing
- * Allied Health

Programs most commonly reported under Allied Health include:

- Hospital and health care administration
- Dental assisting
- Dental hygiene
- Medical assisting,
- Medical technology
- Occupational therapy
- Physical therapy
- Medical records librarianship
- Speech pathology and audiology
- Medical laboratory technologies
- Radiologic technology
- Recreation therapy
- Respiration therapy
- Medical records secretary
- Ophthalmic technology
- Rehabilitation assisting,
- Mental health associate
- Surgical technician

In general, health manpower program data were tabulated only if the program involved training at post-high-school level in a formal structured curriculum of two years or more. In some instances, however, States

were found to spend a considerable amount of money for training licensed practical nurses (LPNs) and other allied health personnel in programs requiring less than two years, although formal, structured curricula were maintained. Therefore, complete delineation of State funds supporting health manpower training will undoubtedly require analysis of some programs of less than two years duration.

Specific guidelines were developed for data elements to be included in the inventory. Information categories and elements collected include:

INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT

- * Amount of State support, by program, by institution, by year, and total.
- * Types of health manpower training programs offered by the institutions
- * Number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students, by program, by institution, by year, and total

CAPITAL OUTLAY

- * Amount of State support by institution, by year, and total
- * Types of funds used (restricted vs. general)
- * Purpose of construction

STUDENT AID

- * Number of loans, scholarships, fellowships for persons enrolled in health programs, by year, by institution, and by program
- * Grants to student in out-of-State exchange programs, by year, by institution, and by program

DIRECT SUPPORT

- * Amounts of support by State agency, by program, by institution, and by year
- * Number of students, by program, by institution, and by year

Study Methodology

Development of the INVENTORY was conducted in two phases. Phase I was a feasibility study to examine the problems involved in developing the INVENTORY and to design standardized procedures for collecting data on a national basis. Phase II of the study involved implementation of data collection procedures developed in Phase I and compilation of data for the INVENTORY.

In Phase I, the initial step was to determine what data were available from secondary sources and whether these were relevant to the study. The previously-published BHRD inventory of State appropriations for health professions (based entirely upon secondary sources and without breakdown or analysis) was reviewed^{1/}, as were specific published documents from which this data had been taken. Each appropriation item was traced to its original source document, so that both the scope and the limitations of compiling a comprehensive inventory using only published documents could be evaluated.

Secondly, eight States and nine local governments were sampled in an effort to locate additional relevant published documents not available in centralized locations. These were:

Initially, an extensive telephone survey was conducted to locate other publications available from the States, with explanation of goals and data needs of the project being given. Referrals to the budget office or other State agencies usually resulted. Follow-ups were made until it was reasonably certain that all respondents and data sources had been checked out. Results of this approach clearly demonstrated its limitations. Difficulties in securing cooperation and in identifying knowledgeable individuals were common, due to misunderstandings about requests. It became apparent that personal interviews, on site, would be far more effective in conveying needs and in obtaining relevant data, especially for a first-time effort.

For the nine local governments sampled, data available from published documents at the Bureau of Census Library were inadequate, so survey letters were mailed to the respective local finance offices. Response was low and no additional data were received. Only larger local governments (e.g., Philadelphia, Boston, Cook County) operated and funded hospitals that conducted health training programs. Therefore, only five of the nine local governments were visited, since four reported no funds allocated for health manpower training.

Based on Phase I experience, a methodology was defined and the study was extended to include an in-depth analysis of State support in an additional 24 States. These 24 plus the original 8 covered in the pretest comprised approximately 92 percent of known State support for health manpower training programs in the United States.

Phase II included a preliminary review of secondary source material, followed by mail and telephone contact of personnel in selected offices in each of the 24 States. Site visits were arranged, knowledgeable individuals were interviewed, and unpublished detailed program and expenditure data were collected. Budget officers and examiners proved to be the most significant data source, being able to provide an overview of budgeting systems and procedures, the education system in general, and their own internal data and working documents. Other major sources of information were boards of higher education, community college boards, vocational education departments, and departments of public health and of mental health.

On-site visits confirmed that State governments could provide more detailed and more accurate information than that generally available in published documents, could identify additional programs not included in publications, and could clarify exact meanings and qualifications of data already published. In addition, site-visits provided a method for improving accuracy of secondary source data.

In a comparison of data collected exclusively through secondary sources versus that collected through additional on-site visits in 32 States, it was found that the overall increase in dollar amounts recorded through combined primary and secondary sources was 49.2 percent. Using this method, substantial increases were found in each category except direct support: capital outlay, an increase of 183.5 percent; student aid, 126.5 percent; and institutional support, 35.3 percent. Direct support reported decreased by 4.4 percent, possibly due to the "filtering out" of out-of-scope expenditures. Detailed comparison, by States, is given in Figure 2.

Data for the remaining 18 States were also compiled during Phase II. These data were abstracted from published documents; no contact was made with individual States. (Figure 1 summarizes data collection methodologies used in each State.) Detailed State data are presented in the Basic State Table section of this report.

Many of the 32 reporting States were not able to provide detailed expenditure data for specific programs or disciplines. Therefore, a procedure for allocating aggregate expenditures to obtain information by program was developed. This methodology was based upon parameters such as full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment by program area, instructional costs of programs such as nursing, medical technology, and the like, and administrative and other operating costs. This allocation methodology was utilized only when specific program expenditure data were not available, taking into account the underlying variables that exist within each individual State.

Summary of Findings

Although every effort was made to minimize discrepancies in the data to afford greater comparability between States, variations do exist as the result of using three data collection methodologies and of underreporting due to unavailability of data at the State level.

Total support for health manpower training for all 50 States reached a level of \$1.5 billion ^{1/} during FY 1974 (Table A), an increase of \$306 million, or approximately 25 percent, over FY 1973 levels. This

percentage increase is significant when compared to the increase in appropriations for operating expenses of institutions of higher education, which was 6.8 percent for the same period ^{2/}. Operating support accounts for the major portion - more than 70 percent - of total State expenditures in both FY 1973 and FY 1974. Remaining categories also showed relatively stable proportions, with student aid at 2.6 percent, direct support at close to 4 percent, and capital outlay at approximately 20 percent. (See Tables E.1 - E.3 for detailed State data.)

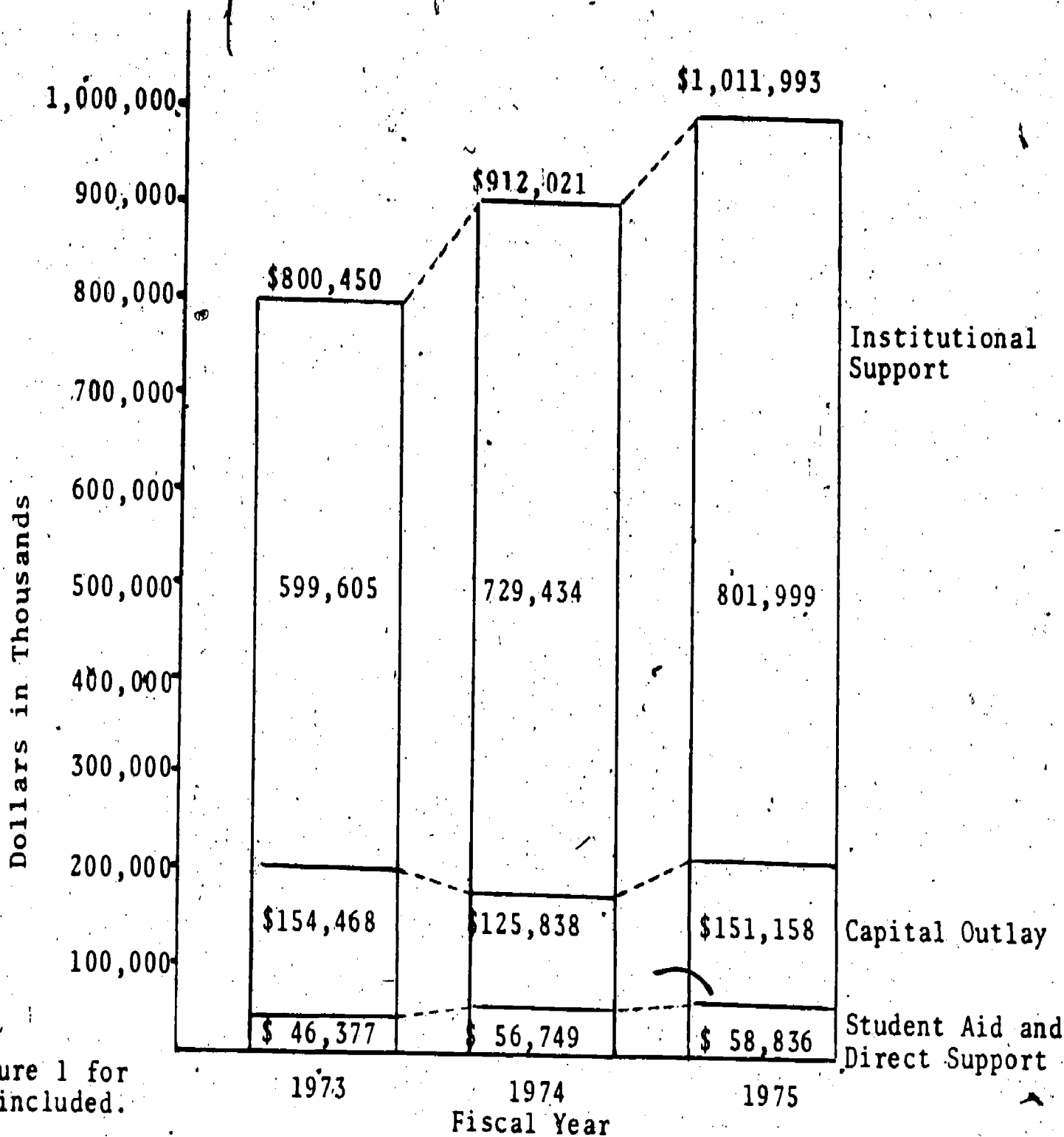

Changes in expenditures for the four categories of support across fiscal years 1973, 1974, and 1975 are illustrated in Figure 3. These expenditures are based on the 24 States for which primary source data for all three years are available, and thus represent a more accurate description of trends than can be determined from Table A.

State support for health training is concentrated in a small number of States. Of the 32 States for which comprehensive data were collected, five States (California, Illinois, Pennsylvania, Texas, and New

York) account for 36 percent of total State expenditures in FY 1974. (See Table B.) These States are also among the leaders in State support for total higher education; together, they comprise 41.1 percent of total funds appropriated.

California expended the largest amount of funds for higher education (\$1.1 billion), whereas Texas expended the largest amount for institutional support of health manpower training (\$91.6 million). (See Table C). However, institutional support in California accounted for 7.7 percent of the State's total higher education expenditures, in contrast to 17.4 percent in Texas. Consequently, California ranked 29th (of 32 States) in the proportion of health institution support dollars, while Texas ranked fifth. In New York, which ranked second in total higher education expenditures, 7.7 percent of those expenditures was marked for support of

health training institutions, giving the State a rank of 27th. Delaware, which ranked lowest in total appropriations for higher education, reported that 5.3 percent of these funds were directed to support of health training institutions. Data suggest that institutional support of health manpower training programs within States is not directly related to the State's overall support of higher education. ^{3/}

For the 32 reporting States, the mean per capita appropriations for support of all institutions of higher education was \$46.35. Of this figure, an average of \$5.29 was expended for health manpower training programs. However, across States, program expenditures ranged from a high of \$15.26 per capital in Oregon to a low of \$1.97 in Massachusetts. (Table D and Figure 4). Those States which expended a lesser total amount for higher education may have a higher per capita commitment for training health professionals. For example, Arkansas, Colorado, Nebraska, and Kentucky each exhibit relatively high per capita expenditures for health training, despite comparatively low levels of total higher education expenditures. Without further analysis, it is difficult to discern causes for these differences in funding level. Varying degrees of interest in promoting health manpower training programs, as well as differences in the distribution of Federal, local, and private revenue sources, in the level of tuition charges, in the availability of education resources in neighboring States, and in the State's taxing policies can all affect per capita expenditures.

Institutional Support

In this study, institutional support is limited to unrestricted funds allocated for instruction-related expenses and to restricted funds earmarked for health-related purposes, such as intern and residency programs at teaching hospitals.

Appropriations for institutional support may be apportioned either as a lump-sum subsidy for operation of individual universities or colleges, as in Kentucky or Michigan, or as a program budgeted line-item, as in Florida.

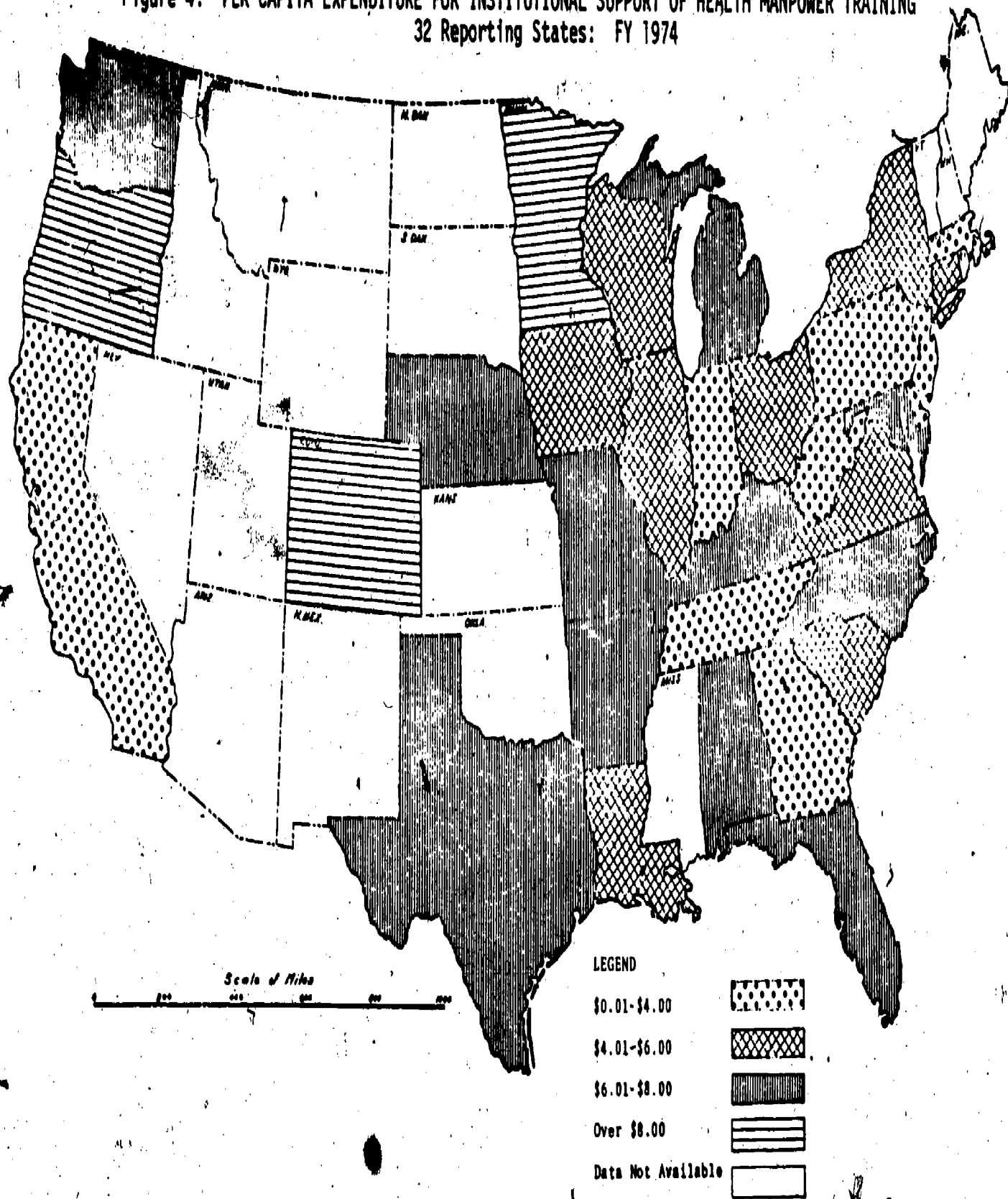

In FY 1973, expenditures for institutional support totaled over \$893.1 million; in FY 1974, the same expenditures amounted to nearly \$1.1 billion. Institutional support accounted for nearly 72 percent of total State expenditures for health manpower training and for approximately 12 percent of total State expenditures for higher education. Because these costs are incurred annually for continuation of ongoing programs, the amount of institutional support provides an effective gauge of State involvement in health manpower training. Institutional support for health manpower training, as a proportion of all expenditures for higher education, varies by State, ranging from a high of 27.0 percent in Oregon to a low of 5.3 percent in Delaware. (For detailed State data, see Table C).

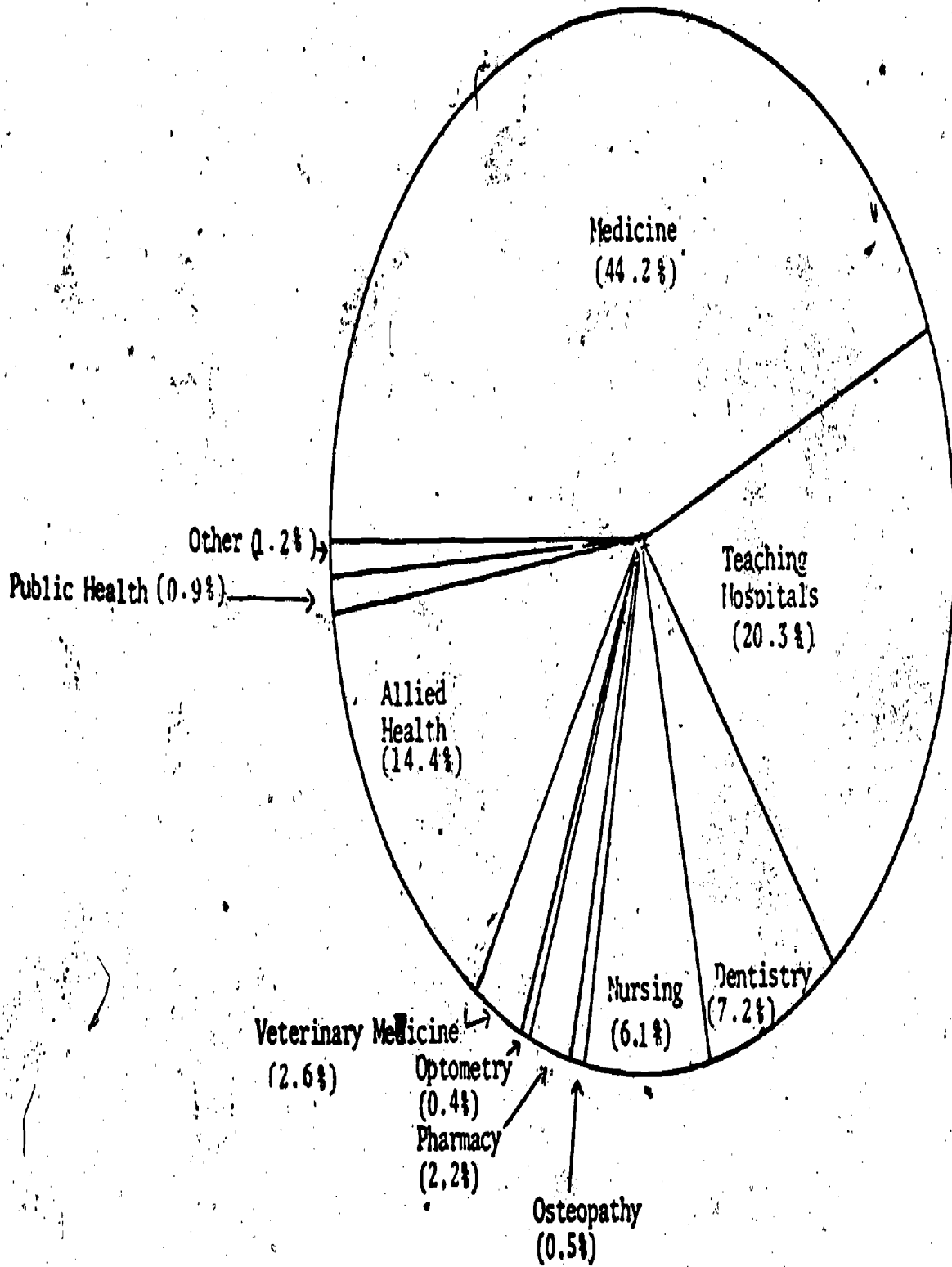
Figure 5 illustrates the percentage distribution of each health discipline in relation to total State expenditures for support of health manpower training institutions in FY 1974. The largest single portion of funds, 44.2 percent, was allocated for training of physicians. Teaching hospitals accounted for an additional 20.3 percent. If teaching hospitals are viewed as part of physician training (since the major portion of these funds support intern and residency programs in teaching hospitals, which are often funded as part of medical centers), then a much larger proportion - over three-fifths, or 64.5 percent - was allocated to physician training. Allied health programs accounted for the next highest percentage (14.4%), followed by Dentistry (7.2%), Nursing (6.1%), Veterinary Medicine (2.6%), Pharmacy (2.2%), Public Health (0.9%), Osteopathy (0.5%), and Optometry (0.4%). (See Tables F.1 - F.3 for detailed State data).

Capital Outlay

State expenditures for capital outlay totaled \$333.0 million, accounting for nearly 22 percent of all expenditures in FY 1974. Only those expenditures that could be specifically linked to health manpower training, such as construction of teaching hospitals or medical centers, were included in this category.

Difficulties arise in differentiating between appropriated and encumbered capital outlay funds. Although an appropriation for construction or improvement of a medical school, for example, may be included in an annual budget, the total amount may not always be expended during that fiscal year. Consequently, States are not al-

ways able to provide adequate breakdowns. Also, care must be taken in making comparative analyses from resulting tabulations, since inclusion of capital outlay tends to inflate total amounts expended for any single fiscal year. Data spanning a larger time frame, perhaps 4 to 6 years, would permit more accurate assessment of State capital expenditures and determination of capital outlay patterns. As a case in point, capital outlay in Wisconsin for FY 1973 accounted for 48 percent of total State expenditures, since at that time the State was involved with construction of a new medical complex for the training of health professionals. Other States with particularly high expenditures for construction in FY 1973 included Georgia (\$20.4 million, 56.6 percent of all expenditures) and Arkansas (\$12.1 million, 50 percent of the total). In FY 1974, Arkansas continued to report a similarly high expenditure, while that in Georgia decreased considerably.

Student Aid

Concern for promotion of equal educational opportunity and for increasing manpower supply in specific disciplines has led to increased Federal and State assistance to students. Such funds are not usually channeled through institutions of higher education but are provided directly to individuals. When institution-based financial aid is provided, it is seldom possible to differentiate State funds from Federal, private, and tuition revenues. Therefore, unless specifically designated by program and funding source, institution-based financial aid programs have not been included in this study.

For FY 1974, identifiable student aid for all 50 States totaled \$39.8 million, or 2.6 percent of total States' expenditures. Because of the difficulty of obtaining specific allocations of scholarship funds to health manpower programs, however, these figures must be qualified. For example, while California, Massachusetts, and Colorado do have scholarship funds and grants earmarked specifically for students in the health professions, other States, such as Kentucky and Missouri, do not have such information available. In some States, such as Ohio, it was possible to identify total appropriations for student aid, as well as distribution of funds by school and by students' socio-economic and demographic data, and expenditures were allocated on the basis of health professions as a percentage of total enrollment.

Montana, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, and Wyoming are shown in this study as expending all State funds for health manpower training through student aid. It should be noted, however, that data for these States were obtained from secondary sources only and that no site-visits were made. These States do not operate medical schools (which is a line-item in most State budgets), but rather provide funding for such training through payment to interstate student exchange programs, such as the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE) or the New England Board of Higher Education (NEBHE).

Direct Support

Funds for direct State support remained at approximately 4 percent for fiscal years 1973, 1974, and 1975. Data from the 32 reporting States indicate that six States reduced or eliminated departmental training programs, while the remaining States planned increased in support for FY 1975. Some form of direct support was identified in almost every State visited. Psychiatric Residency Programs of Departments of Mental Health were the most universal category of support, followed by some form of tuition reimbursement program. Only Minnesota and Washington failed to identify direct support programs within the scope of this study. However, absence of State funding does not imply a lack of such programs. Many State agencies, such as the Ohio Department of Health, completely finance health training programs with Federal grants, while most post-secondary vocational programs are to some degree financed through the Federal Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA). In addition, a large number of State agencies sponsor short-term, unstructured programs, such as professional workshops and seminars, which, although outside the scope of this study, contribute to the education of health professionals.

Detailed findings for each of the 50 States are given in the following tables. Since data were collected using three different techniques, some variation in information reported may be expected.

GLOSSARY

Actual Expenditures - Charges incurred, whether paid or unpaid.

Budgeted Expenditures - An authorization granted by a legislative body to make expenditures and to incur obligations for specific purposes.

Capital Outlay - Expenditure that results in the acquisition of fixed assets or of additions to fixed assets: land, existing buildings; improvements, construction or additions to buildings; or initial purchase, addition to or replacement of equipment.

Direct Support - Any health manpower training programs conducted or supported directly by any government agency. Included are agency-operated programs (e.g., tuition reimbursement programs) and funds allocated to health training programs and administered by the government-operated health institutions (e.g., State hospitals, clinics, etc.)

Fiscal Year (FY) - The 12-month period at the end of which the State or agency determines its financial condition, the results of its operations, and closes its books. The fiscal year varies from State to State. *(Citations in this report reflect the end date for the fiscal year.)*

Full-Time Equivalency (FTE) - An index of the number of students enrolled in a program. A full-time student is counted as one FTE, and part-time students are pro-rated on that basis.

Institutional Support - State support to institutions of higher education training students in the health professions. Included are funds appropriated and expended by State governments for support of current operations of institutions: instruction and related activities, administration, and routine maintenance.

Primary Sources of Data - Information obtained through personal interviews with selected individuals, primarily State officials or officers of educational institutions.

Restricted Funds - Those funds earmarked for specific program use.

Secondary Sources of Data - Existing documents and published reports such as State budget documents, university financial reports, or national inventories of expenditures. Information not obtained through personal interviews and on-site visits.

Student Aid - State appropriations and expenditures for student aid related to health manpower training, including dedicated scholarship programs, loans, and out-of-State student exchange programs.

Student Contact Hour - A measure of total time a student is actually participating in classroom work with an instructor. Several States utilize this figure in determining allocations for specific programs.
