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ABSTRACT
A study was performed in the Fall of 1992 at
Evergreen Valley College, in San Jose, California, to measure the effectiveness of the college's Enlace program, a combination of instructional, counseling and tutorial services designed to help Chicano/Latino students successfully complete the cognitive core areas of general/transfer education. The core areas/courses in the Enlace program include Basic Writing (English 330/104), College Composition (English 1A), Algebra (Math 12 and 13) and Natural Science 10A. The survey focused on outcomes of 136 Hispanic Enlace students enrolled in core courses in fall 1992 and defined success as the receipt of a grade of "A," "B," or "C" or credit. Results of the survey included the following: (1) the overall success rate for Enlace students was $65 \%$, while all other Hispanic students had a success rate of $49 \%$; (2) Hispanic Enlace students in English 330 had a success rate of $80 \%$, higher than all other Hispanics ( $53 \%$ ) and all other English 330 students ( $62 \%$ ); (3) the success rate of $72 \%$ for Enlace students in English 104 compared favorably to the rate of $54 \%$ for other Hispanic students and $60 \%$ for all other students; (4) Enlace students in English 1 A also had a higher success rate (76\%) than all other Hispanics (58\%) and ali other students (64\%) ; (5) while Enlace students performed better than other Hispanics in Math 12 ( $47 \%$ compared to $35 \%$ ), they did not perform as well as all other students, who registered a $52 \%$ success rate; and (6) in Natural Science 10 A , Enlace students had a $56 \%$ success rate, compared to $34 \%$ for all other Hispanics and $39 \%$ for all other students. A brief description of the program is given and data tables are included. (MAB)

Comment: The overall success rate of Hispanic Enlace students in Enlace sections of five different courses was $65 \%$ compared to $49 \%$ for Hispanics in non-Enlace comparison sections. This is very similar to Spring 1992 results, at $69 \%$ for Enlace students and $46 \%$ in non-Enlace comparison sections. These are encouraging results.

In all cases, Hispanics in Enlace groups had higher success rates than other Hispanics in non-Enlace comparison groups.

Hispanic Enlace students in Math 12 had a 47\% success rate, an impressive 12 percentage points higher than other Hispanics in non-Enlace sections at 35\%. English 104 Hispanic Enlace students had a $72 \%$ success rate, an even more impressive 18 percentage points above other Hispanics in non-Enlace comparison sections at $54 \%$. It appears that the Eniace program is having a positive effect on the success rate of Hispanic students. The results are gaining stability in that they have been found in two consecuiive semesters.

## Mission

The mission of the Enlace Program is to increase the educational success, including retention and transfer rates, of Chicano/Latino students.

## History

Enlace was launched at Evergreen Valley College in 1983 and is approaching its 10th year. Enlace is an academic program which emphasizes - the successtul completion of what is called the "cognitive core areas of general/rransfer education. Specific courses include Basic Writing (English 330/104), College Composition (English 1A). Algebra (Math 12 and 13), anc' Natural Science 10A.

The program currently links 136 Chicano/Latino students per somester through an instructional/counseling/mentoring model which has shown significant results and promises even greater success.

## The Program

Enlace includes but is not limited to the following elements:

## Success Story

The Enlace classes that were offered in Spring 1992 we:- ENGL 330 (two levels below English 1A), ENGL 92 (one level below English 1A). ENGL 1 A (transfer composition). MATH 12 (Algebra), and NATURAL SCIENCE 10A. The Enlace sections were compared to all other Hispanic students in the same courses, as well as all other nen-Enlace students in the same courses

- 136 Hispanic Enlace students had.
$\rightarrow$ a $65 \%$ overall success rate. 516 other Hispanic students in the same courses had a $49 \%$ success rate.
$\rightarrow$ an impressive range from 18-27 percentage points higher than other Hispanics in four of the five comparisons.
$\rightarrow$ a $69 \%$ overall success rate. 1948 other non-Enlace students in the same courses had a $58 \%$ success rate.


## Conclusion

The Enlace program continues to show great success. This is very impressive given that there was a commonly graded fin al in English writing classes for Fall 1992 to help stabilize grading variations. These results are encouraging and support the kinds of inierventions that are being used in the program on behalf of the Hispanic students

Hispanics in the Eniace Englis'1 330 (two levels below English Composition) section had a success rate of $80 \%$, significantly higher than the success rate for all other Hispanics in English 330 at $53 \%$ and significantly higher than the success rate of all other English 330 students at $62 \%$.

Given that there was a commonly graded final for Fall 1992, thus heiping to stabilize grading variation, the results are encouraging. Because the number of students involved was small, continued research will be needed to monitor the impact of the Enlace program at the English 330 level.

Comment: Hispanics in the Enlace English 104 (one level beiow English Composition) section had a very high success rate of $72 \%$, much higher than the success rate for all other Hispanics in English 104 at 54\% and higher than the success rate of all other English 104 students at $60 \%$.

Given that there was a commonly graded final for Fall 1992, thus heiping to stabilize grading variation, the results are extremely encouraging. Besause the number of students involved was small, continued research will be needed to monitor the impact of the Enlace program at the English 104 level.

Comment: Hispanics in the Enlace English 1 (English Composition) sections had a high combined success rate of $76 \%$, higher than the success rate for all other Hispanics in English 1A. at $58 \%$ and higher than the success tate of all other English 1 A siudents at $64 \%$.

The fact that the combined class size was relatively large at 46 lends stability to the results. Assuming that grading practices were not a variable due to the institution of a common English 1A final, these results are encouragir $\exists$ and support the kinds of interventions that are being used in this program on ber. alf of Hispanic students.

Comment: Three sections of Math 12 with Program Aides were excluded from this study in order to avoid comparing sections using two different intervention strategies. Hispanics in the Enlace Math 12 (Algebra) section had a success rate of $47 \%$, a higher success rate than for all other Hispanics in Math 12 at $35 \%$, but lower than the success rate of other Math 12 students at $52 \%$.

The results are encouraging in that the Enlace program seemed to definitely help Hispanic students in Math. It appears that some efforts still need to be done to increase the success rates of Enlace Hispanics to reach the level of other Math 12 students.

Comment: Hispanics in the Enlace Natural Science 10A section had a success rate of $56 \%$, much higher than the success rate for all other Hispanics in Natura! Science 10A at $34 \%$ and higher than the success rate of other Natural Science 10A students at $39 \%$.

The results are especially encouraging since this is the first semester that science has been added to the Enlace "cognitive core" offerings.
