ABSTRACT

This manual provides teachers with abstracts of instructional materials intended for use with mildly handicapped students in language arts classes. The materials are correlated with the intended outcomes of each course as specified in the state curriculum guidelines for grades 9-12. The abstracts are organized by subject matter and level: applied English (levels 1-4), applied vocational English, applied reading skills, (levels 1-4), functional language arts (levels 1-4), functional vocational English, and functional reading skills (levels 1-4). Each materials item is abstracted on a single page and includes the following: (1) title; (2) author; (3) publisher's name; (4) publisher's address; (5) copyright date for the most recent edition; (6) price; (7) state adopted (yes or no); (8) date--period for which the item has been adopted; (9) media types; (10) consumable (yes or no)--indicates whether the item can be used repeatedly; (11) educational level; (12) readability level; (13) subject descriptors; (14) annotation--a brief narrative description of the format, content, or appropriate use of the material; (15) comments--specific recommendations that may be helpful to teachers in making decisions about purchase, instructional adaptation, or classroom use of the material; and (16) correlations with state-wide course guidelines. Presented in the four appendixes are criteria for inclusion of materials, a workscope and contact list, a booklet evaluation form, and a materials abstract form.

Commensurate with state and local initiatives for the improvement of instructional programs, curriculum frameworks for secondary education, and intended outcomes of courses for mildly handicapped students, this series has been developed as a cooperative activity of the Florida Diagnostic and Learning Resources System (FDLRS) and the Bureau of Education for Exceptional Students, Florida Department of Education, to assist teachers in the selection and effective use of instructional materials appropriate to the needs of exceptional students.

The Florida Diagnostic and Learning Resources System (FDLRS) is funded through EHA, Part B, and State General Revenue funds to provide diagnostic and instructional support services to district exceptional student education programs statewide (see Appendix II).

A major function of the FDLRS Associate Center Network, as prescribed by Section 229.832, *Florida Statutes*, is to assist districts in the identification, selection, acquisition, use, and evaluation of media and materials appropriate to the implementation of instructional programs based on individual educational plans for exceptional children.

Consistent with the FDLRS workscope and a network initiative in support of curriculum and instruction, this series describes student-use materials which may be used as part of the instructional program for mildly handicapped exceptional students at the secondary level in the subject areas of Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, and Life Management. It also correlates abstracted materials to the intended outcomes specified for each course in *Curriculum Frameworks for Grades 9-12, Exceptional Student Education Courses* (Tallahassee: Florida Department of Education, 1986). This activity has been implemented in consideration of Florida's Instructional Materials Adoption Program and the *Catalog of State Adopted Instructional Materials*. The compilation is not an exhaustive listing of materials appropriate for use in the designated courses, nor should inclusion of any item be considered as an endorsement by the Florida Department of Education.

Teachers of exceptional students are encouraged to use these documents as resources in their total planning effort toward improved instruction for exceptional students.

User input into the continuing development of this reference series is solicited, and teachers are requested to evaluate the usefulness of this resource and to share recommendations for its expansion and improvement (see Appendices III and IV).

INTRODUCTION

The series, *Instructional Materials for Exceptional Students: Secondary Education*, is comprised of booklets in the subject areas of Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, and Life Management. Each booklet provides abstracts of instructional materials, correlated with the intended outcomes of each course for mildly handicapped students specified in *Curriculum Frameworks for Grades 9-12, Exceptional Student Education Courses*.

Curriculum Frameworks

Curriculum frameworks have been developed by the Florida Department of Education to ensure instructional consistency within academic disciplines among Florida's schools.

A curriculum framework is a set of broad guidelines which aids educational personnel in producing specific instructional plans for a given subject area or area of study.

As described in *Curriculum Frameworks for Grades 9-12, Exceptional Student Education Courses*, each framework contains a header and four sections: major concepts/content, laboratory activities, special notes, and intended outcomes. Included in the curriculum frameworks header are descriptive elements including the major subject area of which the course is a part, the seven-digit course number, a full course title, the amount of credit generated by the course, and applicable grade levels.

The "Major Concepts/Content" section provides a concise summary of the course. The second section describes integral laboratory activities. Special notes about an individual course provide specific and unique information about the course. Intended outcomes are broad statements reflecting essential elements which student should demonstrate after successfully completing the course.

These curriculum frameworks for senior high courses represent the content of instruction and in no way indicate the variety of appropriate instructional strategies which should be used with different exceptional students. The student's individual educational plan (IEP) will determine the particular outcomes and student performance standards which a student must master in order to earn credit.

Courses listed under Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, and Life Management are designed for exceptional students functioning at mildly handicapped levels. Please note that "applied" courses are higher-level courses than the "functional" ones, and that "comprehensive" courses include the total range of outcomes for that series.

Selection of Materials for Inclusion

All materials included in this booklet have been reviewed and evaluated by classroom teachers and professional staff of the FDLRS Associate Center Network in accordance with the criteria and considerations listed in Appendix I. The items abstracted in this booklet represent only a sample of available materials which may

be appropriate; while the listing is not exhaustive, an effort was made to include diverse media types in a broad range of scope and sequence. The review process is a continuing activity and teachers are encouraged to participate by using the form included as Appendix IV to recommend additional items for inclusion in subsequent revisions of this series.

Content and Organization of Booklets

The booklets in this series include a set of materials abstracts for each course appropriate to the subject area as specified in *Curriculum Frameworks for Grades 9-12, Exceptional Student Education Courses*. Each course constitutes a separate section and is comprised of a copy of the curriculum framework course description, followed by a set of abstracts of materials appropriate to the course. Courses are arranged in numerical order; within each section, materials abstracts are arranged alphabetically by title. This organization consolidates into one section for review by the user the abstracts of all materials appropriate to that course.

The "Materials Titles Index," arranged alphabetically by item title, lists all the courses for which the item has potential instructional use; this index allows the user to investigate a number of potential applications for a particular materials item.

Content of Materials Abstracts

Each materials item is abstracted on a single page and includes the following materials and correlation information:

- (1) Title
- (2) Author - if available
- (3) Publisher's name
- (4) Publisher's address
- (5) Copyright date for the most recent edition
- (6) Price - as of the date specified in parentheses
- (7) State Adopted - (Yes or No) - as listed in the *Catalog of State Adopted Materials*
- (8) Date - period for which the item has been adopted
- (9) * Media type(s) - up to four applicable descriptors indicating the primary format or mode of presentation of the item
- (10) Consumable - (Yes or No) - indication whether the item can be used repeatedly or whether a separate copy must be purchased for each student user
- (11)* Educational level(s) - up to two applicable descriptors indicating general student levels for which the item is appropriate
- (12) Readability level - specific grade level of materials requiring student reading, with the source of the information provided in parentheses (i.e., the publisher or an accepted readability scale)
- (13)* Subject descriptor(s) - up to three applicable descriptors indicating the content addressed by the item

*These descriptors are taken from the Florida Diagnostic and Learning Resources System (FDLRS) Media/Management System. This automated system, used by all Associate Centers, provides personnel with a standardized method of abstracting information about materials, and managing the preview/loan collections maintained by each Center.

- (14) Annotation - brief narrative description which provides additional information about the format, content, or appropriate use of the material
- (15) Comments - specific recommendations or cautions that may be helpful to teachers in making decisions about purchase, instructional adaptation, or classroom use of the material
- (16) Correlation with intended student outcomes - the number and title of each course with which the item is appropriately used and one or more of the intended outcomes for each course specifically addressed by the materials item

The user should note that materials have not yet been correlated to the "Comprehensive" courses. To find materials appropriate for these courses, teachers should review the materials abstracts for courses which have outcomes included in those for the "Comprehensive" courses. For example, to identify materials for 7910110, ESE-Applied English: Comprehensive, materials abstracts compiled under 7910010-7910040, ESE-Applied English I-IV, should be examined.

Use of the Booklets

Teachers are encouraged to use these booklets as resources in the materials selection process, with awareness that the instructional needs and abilities of the individual student are the major considerations in selecting from the extensive array of available materials and determining their appropriate use.

The materials included in the booklets are intended to supplement or enhance instruction. These items are not intended to replace materials chosen through the review, evaluation, and selection process of any individual district.

As part of the materials selection process, teachers are also encouraged to preview instructional materials prior to acquiring them for classroom use. For the most effective use of any materials item, teachers should carefully read the teacher's guide, supplementary materials, and other related information provided by the publisher. Use of some materials may require that teachers acquire additional training and skills. Knowledge of the material, its design, and its intended use will help to ensure its appropriate and effective use in the classroom.

Most of the items described in this document are available for loan from the local FDLRS Associate Centers, as listed in Appendix II. Center staff members can assist in securing additional information about the materials, in planning for the effective use of the materials, and in modifying or adapting materials to specific classroom situations. Inservice training on the evaluation, selection, and use of instructional materials is also available from local FDLRS Associate Centers.

Users of these booklets are requested to assist in the further development of the series by completing the evaluation included as Appendix III and returning it to the address on the reverse of the form. Part I lists criteria which should be met by all materials items. Part II lists considerations which could be used as applicable to various types of materials items.

Part I - Criteria

- A. The item clearly and directly addresses one or more of the intended outcomes for designated courses, as specified in *Curriculum Frameworks for Grades 9 - 12, Exceptional Student Education Courses*.
- B. The item is primarily a student-use material or contains student-use material.
- C. The content of the item is accurate and current.
- D. The instructional design of the item is appropriate for designated exceptional students.
- E. The material can be used in exceptional student education classrooms with a minimum of adaptation or modification.
- F. The material meets one or more of the following:
 1. Is rated good to excellent in educational materials review sources
 2. Has been used successfully by classroom teachers working with exceptional students
 3. Has been reviewed and evaluated by persons with experience in working with exceptional students.
- G. The item could be recommended for district adoption or acquisition for individual classroom use.

Part II - Considerations

- A. Scope and sequence of the program
- B. Effectiveness of the media type or format as a medium for presentation of content

C. Flexibility of use
