ABSTRACT

This document presents a module on learning library resources by researching Latin American topics to be used in the Use of Library Resources course at St. Louis Community College at Meramec (Missouri). The goal of the module (to give students a basic knowledge of library resources and to introduce them to Latin America by researching Latin American topics), objectives, instructor's introduction, student learning activities, and sharing of the module are outlined. Also included are: a list of Latin American countries; worksheets for a library catalog assignment, atlases assignment, Internet exercise, and periodical indexes assignment; and a bibliography of recently-acquired books and videos that lists author, title, Dewey Decimal call number, and price. 1. Goal:

- To give students a basic knowledge of library resources and to introduce them to Latin America by researching Latin American topics.

2. Objectives:

Students will demonstrate a basic knowledge of:

- the library catalog by locating a book on Latin America
- two general online periodical databases by locating an article on Latin America in each database
- how to use a general world atlas and an historical atlas by locating two Latin American cities in each source
- how to use the Dewey Decimal System to locate library materials by browsing the shelves for Latin American titles
- how to search the Internet by keyword and URL by locating information on Latin America

3. Instructor's Introduction

The instructor will give students a list of Latin American countries and introduce them to the semester-long research process they will use. Each student may choose one or more Latin American countries and topics as a focus for their assignments. Each assignment is designed to give "hands-on" experience at an introductory level, with one or more library resources.

4. Student Learning Activities

The student will be given the attached library assignments. Each assignment will be introduced in class and fully explained. The instructor will also be available in the library to work with students on an individualized basis.

The assignments are:

- LCAT ASSIGNMENT
- ATLASES ASSIGNMENT
- INTERNET ASSIGNMENT
- PERIODICAL INDEXES ASSIGNMENT

5. Sharing of Module

The assignments included here may be used by faculty in other disciplines to introduce a Latin American research element to their classes through the use of library assignments.
