#### ABSTRACT

In its annual report, the New Mexico State Library reviews its fiscal 1973 activities in pursuance of the state five-year program for library development. Despite cuts in rederal funding, several advances are reported: the foundation of NEMISYS, the state library's portion of the statewide information network, increased information outreach to rural citizens through Books-by-Mail and more bookmobile coverage, a testing of combined city/county library services by the Santa Fe Public Library, new programs for senior citizens and in hispanic resources, and increased funding for book purchase in academic libraries. Also in this report are the state library's financial report, statistics on New Mexico's public, academic, institutional and special libraries, and a statewide library directory. (SL)

Dear Governor King:

The Commission is pleased to apprise you of the headway made toward upgrading Information resources/services for New Mexicans In Fiscal 173. For the first time, data is included from academic and research libraries as well as public and institutional libraries.

Concerted action by librarians, legislators, and library users around the state resulted in the \$10 million college library bond issue and \$275,000 Public Library Financial Assistance Act. A State suit for release of impounded Library Service and Construction Act funds won a favorable judgment.

The State Library staff got a healthy start toward achieving objectives set forth in its Five-Year Program for Library Development in New Mexico.

> Operation of NEMISYS, the State Library's portion of the statewide information network, got underway.

Evaluation of library book collections resulted from statewide workshops.

information outreach to rural citizens increased via Books-by-Mail and more bookmobile coverage.

Library construction projects were approved in Deming, Clayton, Farmington, and Ruidoso.

Combined city/county library services were tested by Santa Fe Public Library, using LSCA seed money.

Senior citizen programs were started in Raton by the Arthur Johnson Memorial Library with a special project grant, and were continued with city funding.

Slashed federal funds crippled many active services and kept program budgets in a constant state of flux. Network planning was curtailed, library construction funds terminated, rural services were hampered by frequent bookmobile breakdowns, and demonstration projects in public and institutional libraries were cut 70%.

Setbacks notwithstanding, statewide library development did show signs of genuine progress.

"Where can I find a copy of New Mexico House Bill 81" "Are Mexican statutes available on early New Mexican history?" "What progress has Los Alamos Scientific Laboratory made in developing new forms of energy?" Librarians hope that one day the answer to such requests will be "In the nearest library."

in working toward such a goal, librarians designed a plan called the Coordinated Library Systems of New Mexico (CLS). Librarians agreed that all libraries are components of a state-wide information delivery system and designated the State Library as the "coordinating and administrative center of CLS." Subsequently the State Library staff began searching for systems support utilizing modern technology and set forth design objectives in the Five Year Program for Library Development, 1972-1977.

NEMISYS IS BORN

The ensuing search for systems design gave rise to NEMISYS, The New Mexico Information System, as a subsystem within CLS. In its beginning stages, NEMISYS concerns the accumulation and organization of locator information useful for interlibrary loan purposes; future potential includes full bibliographic records of monographs purchased by major libraries in the state.

NEMISYS came into existence under the aegis of the State Library staff working with the New Mexico Advisory Council and its ad hoc Task Force for Systems Development, key librarians around the state, and the Southwestern Library Interstate Cooperative Endeavor (SLICE). SLICE, the action arm of the Southwest Library Association, submitted the written proposal for NEMISYS to



the Council on Library Resources in an unsuccessful bid for funds. Undaunted by limited financial means and boistered by the voluntary participation of major libraries, NEMISYS Operations Center located in the State Library. The staff proceeded to develop a numerical acquisitions list containing the Library of Congress identification numbers for books in New Mexico libraries. The NEMISYS Acquisitions index lists, in code, new books added by the eleven largest libraries in the state: the academic libraries at the University of New Mexico, New Mexico State University, and Eastern New Mexclo University; the special libraries of Sandia Laboratories and the Los Alamos Scientific Laboratory; the public libraries in Albuquerque, Santa Fe, and Los Alamos; the Albuquerque public school libraries; and the State Library. The libraries in the Museum of New Mexico were added later in the year. By June 8, 1973, the index showed locations of 31,297 books in New Mexico.

Further development in systems was delayed after the systems coordinator accepted a position in another stata. The position was left vacant most of the year because of funding uncertainties. When the position was filled in June, ilaison was resumed with the Council of New Mexico Academic Librarians, SLICE, and other regional library groups concerned with defining future directions for the New Mexico Information Systems and regional network design.

Operations Center

NEMISYS Operations Center operates as a switching and referral center, providing librarians with information and materials not available in their own libraries. The conversion to an information systems operation center entailed significant preparations; reference and technical services were merged. Though public libraries are the major users, interlibrary loan and reference services are available to all libraries in the state. The Center loaned 5,515 resources and arranged for 5,486 additional loans from other libraries, both in and out of state. Rapid communications, so essential in linking libraries to the Center, were made possible through the instate Wide Area Telephone Service (IN-WATS), funded since 1967 with LSCA Title III funds, and the newly installed teletype (TWX).

Systems Resources

The State Library's collections of books, periodicals, newspapers, government documents, films, and microfice also serve as resources for the system. The government publications include: a depository collection of 277,00 federal publications complete with indexes to reports

and documents on specialized subjects; the depository collection (the only one in the state) of New Mexico documents which was increased by 8,500 publications; and an annual addition of 2,000 out-of-state government documents. The book resources, in the process of being inventoried and weeded, were increased by 1,826 cataloged volumes; 6,263 volumes were cataloged and sent to the six regional libraries. Special resources include: materials on the Southwest and on professional librarianship; ERIC reports on microfiche; and 16 mm films. Flims loaned to library and civic groups in the state were shown to a total of 1,997,343 viewers in 51,933 showings.

#### Collection Coordination

Bibliographic coordination was a new dimension added in systems development. Using data and techniques developed by the systems coordinator, the bibliographer explored methods for measuring and evaluating library book collections in the state. An in-house inventory was begun, with weeding (which resulted in the withdrawal of 5,196 books) and an evaluation of the collections usage taking place at the same time. The findings will be used to influence future book selections.

#### BUCKS FOR BOOKS IN COLLEGES

Universities and college libraries, which contribute major resources to the network, will soon be able to offer students mor. adequate printed and audiovisual resources. Following an academic library review, the Legislative University Study Committee disclosed the substandard status of library holdings in state supported colleges and universities.

Legislators, librarians from all types of libraries, and voters railied to their support, and in the November 1972 elections passed a \$10 million bond



issue that will enable academic institutions to update their library materials. The money will be distributed to the institutions according to formulas provided by the Bureau of Educational Finance at the rate of \$2 million annually for the next five years. The influx of books and audiovisuals will greatly enrich the total information resources available in New Mexico.

### ADVANCES IN PUBLIC LIBRARIES

Fundina

During the year, the staff distributed \$22,700 in state grants-in-aid to thirty-four public libraries. Requests exceeded the \$20,000 amount appropriated in the general budget for public libraries, so the Commission authorized the transfer of funds from programs carrying lower priorities.

The financial picture brightened considerably when the 1973 State Legislature appropriated \$275,000 in the Public Library Financial Assistance Act for the coming year. An evaluation of public library collections had been spearheaded by the State Library staff in area workshops around the state. Subsequent studies pointed up the inadequacy of information resources in the public libraries. Once again, concerted action taken by librarians and library users prompted state legislators to appropriate the much needed funds, earmarked almost exclusively for strengthening information resources. The State Legislature authorized the State L!brary Commission to administer the funds. Members of the staff, assisted by a representative of the New Mexico Library Association, drafted rules and developed formulas governing the allocation of this special appropriation. The instructions were mailed with the annual report forms to the public libraries.

Anticipated federal support fell short of the congressional appropriation by \$339,000 due to the administration's impoundment of LSCA funds. Title I was cut back and seriously weakened the successful Special Project Grants Program. No money was released for library construction. The Commission sued for recovery of impounded revenue and won the decision in District Court. However, no money has been released, pending appeal.

#### Construction

The last of the fiscal '72 LSCA Title II money was obligated. The new construction will provide a total of 11,571 square feet of additional floor space in public libraries. Deming Public Library, granted \$30,800, will add a children's





room; rarmingtoh Public Library (\$25,000) plans to enlarge present facilities; Ruidoso Public Library (\$32,307) and the Albert W. Thompson Memorial Library in Clayton (\$30,000) will build new libraries. Grants were awarded to the libraries that met first priorities, exhibited evidence of broad community planning, and met requirements for the 45% matching funds.

### Demonstration Projects

The seven demonstration projects attempted last year as part of the Special Projects Grants Program proved so valuable to their communities that local governments picked up the tab to support their continuation. This year federal funds were available for only two pilot projects.

### ... city-county system

Santa Fo Public Library received a \$1,000 special project grant to test the first city-county library system in the state by extending book van services to the entire county. The book van doubled the number of community stops and tripled the time spent in serving the county. By midsummer, residents of sixteen communities in Santa Fo County were visited by a mobile library on a biweekly schedule. As the end of the demonstration period approached, the library entered negotiations with the county government to request full county support.

#### ... senior citizens

In Raton, a \$1,000 grant helped the Arthur Johnson Memorial Library start a weekly "Leisure Hour" for retired persons. Each week capacity crowds met to exchange ideas and induige in mind-stretching activities such as listening to lectures, watching movies, and reading. After the program completed a popular first year, the city budgeted support to continue the "Leisure Hour" for another year.

#### Hispanic Resources

A research group dedicated to the preservation of Spanish culture was given quarters in the State Library. The Cultural Research Information Clearinghouse (CRIC) produced several publications on Hispanic culture: "Hispanic Yuletide Traditions", "New Mexico Hispanic Resources Site Catalogue", and "Bibliography of Unpublished Materials Pertaining to Hispanic Culture in New Mexico's WPA Writers' Files". One CRIC researcher gave a talk on "Preserving Hispanic Materials in New Mexico" to members of the American Library Association attending the summer conference in Las Vegas.



#### Continuing Education

Workshops and consulting continued as favorite favored methods for advancing statewide education in librarianship. Members of the staff spomsored and/or conducted twelve workshops in management by objectives, MARC cataloging, collection evaluation, and material selection for minority groups and for preschool children.

Heaviest attention was given to early childhood groups. Books were supplied for four Headstart programs through the Eastern Plains Community Action Agency. For Headstart and Homestart programs located mainly on Indian reservations, three workshops were given concerning the use of books media, stories, and games with young children for parents who have pre-schoolers in the home. Three workshops on the selection of materials for children of minority groups were given in Albuquer-que and Las Cruces.

The Examination Center for Children's Books provided monthly collections to the UNM Learning Materials Center. The Center also published for public libraries an annotated and graded list of "Children's Books about the Southwest," which the State Department of Education reprinted for school libraries.

Evaluation and dissemination to New Mexico's librarians and decision makers of new techniques for delivering library services were accomplished through newsletters. The <u>Hitchhiker</u>, a new weekly publication, carried news stories of notable library activities generated in libraries around the state, whereas the long established New Mexico State Library Reports... contained descriptive and evaluative summaries of Special Project Grants Programs demonstrating new kinds of library services.

### INSTITUTIONAL LIBRARIES


One of the programs hardest hit by the reduction in LSCA appropriations was library service to the institutionalized. Grants which have served as incentive to administrators of institutions to support library staff and programs were cut back. Twelve institutions submitted proposals totaling \$15,964, and ten were approved. After the budget cut, only four programs were funded for a total of \$4,507. Moreover, consulting services were hampered by cuts in travel funds, and institutional library programs were left largely to the individual institutions.



One librarian wrote, "Fiscal 173 was disastrous as far as the operation of bookmobiles was concerned. Cost of repair maintenance was astronomical; as soon as one thing was repaired another would fall apart." Another librarian, who broke his thumb trying to change a tire, had this to say about the bookmobile, "We pushed it, pulled it, jumped it, and twice left it on the road. The old beast's timing chain broke, a piston collapsed, the muffler fell off, the alternator burned up, the starter gave out, the battery died... Towing costs rivated repair charges." Even with the newest vehicle, "the electrical wiring was wired wrong, the clutch would hang when it was depressed, the power steering unit wouldn't work, the front wheels were out of alignment and shimmled so badly we had to stop and cancel many runs,"

Echoes of similar malfunctions came from the other regions whose vehicles, having racked up well over 100,000 miles traveling mountain and country roads, were plagued with breakdowns symptomatic of antiquity. These costly inconveniences happened at a time when regions were feeling the pinch of impounded federal funds.

...but kept rolling

Despite threadbare budgets and troubles with equipment, regional librarians intensified service to their rural clientele. In countles where monthly stops proved inadequate, bookmobiles converted to bi-weekly runs and when feasible, increased stop-





#### Territorial Changes

Geographical re-alignment of regions, following the retirement of the Northern Regional Librarian, paved the way for Intensified services in the four counties formerly served by this staff. Operations continued out of Espanola under the direction of the Northeastern Regional Librarian, and concentrated on Taos and Rio Arriba Counties. Torrance County became part of Eastern Plains Region and ten new stops were added in the county. The Santa Fe Public Library book van delivered Library services to Santa Fe County on a one-year contractual agreement with the State Library.


#### Meeting Needs

Assessment of Information needs in each county was begun. New and ongoing programs were tailored to fit the needs. . . . Bookmobile service was established for migrant construction workers employed in building a town around a smelter in Animas. As new families move into the area, more stops will be scheduled. . . . Support was given to an indian history and cultural awareness program sponsored by the Mescalero Apaches. . . . Materials were supplied for a school bilingual project and for Headstart classes. . . . a joint regional/public library outreach program was carried out. . . Audiovisual programing, though limited in scale, garnered enthuslastic responses.

Books-by-Mail, which emphasizes services to exceeedingly remote and previously unserved rural families, is gaining new impetus with the arrival of the new mail order book catalog. . . The job information program that helped 43 persons find jobs last year phased out. . . The bookmobiles continued to serve rural community schools. . . The staff planned to continue to look for new ways of serving the rural population.

#### SERVING STATE GOVERNMENT

The State Library serves as a library for State Government, filling administrative and research information needs.

Current awareness program provides state agencies with announcements of information available in different publications, particularly periodicals. The staff started to complie agency profiles that will show: kinds of services used orneeded to yield information; resources on hand for agency use as well as those available to the public; data such as agency location, objectives, programs in progress, and basis for funding. Agencies on the initial profile list were: Automaded Data Processing, Archives and Records Center, Bureau of Revenue, Criminal Justice Planning Department, Department of Development, Education Department, Health and Social Services, Legislative Council, Personnel Department, Planning Office.

Advisory services on organizing and maintaining special information collections were available. This year the Criminal Justice Planning Department got help in organizing material received from its federal offices.

Research back-up is provided for the Legislative Council and legislative aides. While the State Legislature is in session, a ready reference service about current legislation is available.

The staff handled an average of 800 information requests monthly for both government agencies and libraries.

### SERVING BLIND & PHYSICALLY DISABLED PERSONS

Despite the shortage of funds and staff, blind and physically handicapped patronage increased to 1,405 with the circulation of 34,900 talking books and cassettes from the State Library. The pressure of work has quadrupted in the six years of BBPH existence, yet only one employee has been added. The circulation staff consists of four persons. Even 50, 88% of the responders to a recent survey reported satisfaction with the service.



### STATISTICS OF LIBRARIES

### IN NEW MEXICO

INTRODUCTION

State Library

At the end of the 61st fiscal year (June 30, 1973), the State Library had total assets valued at \$1,217,149.43. Assets consisted of cash, furniture, fixtures, equipment, automotive vehicles, and library acquisitions. Total revenue of \$875,558.59 was derived from three sources: LSCA funds amounting to \$477,030; state appropriations of \$330,000, and \$19,680 in city and county contributions. \$48,848 was carried over from the 60th fiscal year. The financial report appears on pages 22-27.

#### Public Libraries

The statistical reporting for legally constituted public libraries has been substantially expanded for fiscal year 1972/73. Not only are more figures reported, but in addition more interpretive data (such as circulations per volume) have been computed and printed. This expansion of coverage is the first step in moving toward a computer based management information system for New Mexico Libraries. Experimentation with computer operations for data collection and analysis is now underway and it is hoped that such work will assist libraries in managing their own operations and in coordinating with other libraries in the state. It would be appreciated if advice could come from librarians concerning the kinds and amounts of information they could use as results of such a management system.

Some general comments concerning the public library statistics will be useful in using the data. First, the primary sources for the basic information were the annual reports submitted to the State Library. In all cases the data have been taken directly from those reports without change. Only in cases of obvious inconsistency have there been any alterations and those were made in consultation with the librarian concerned.

Second, in order to consider the actual area which a public library serves, this year for the first time, a population figure for a logical service area is reported in addition to the 1970 census figure for the town or city in which the library is located.

Finally, all per capita figures are calculated using the potential service population. The justification for using that rather than the town or city population is that the potential service population is a more accurate indicator of the number of possible patrons.

The service area was determined as follows. The unit of area in all cases was one or more county census divisions (CCD's) as defined and reported by the U.S. Bureau of the

Census. An attempt was made to include the area within approximately 25 airline miles of the center of the town or city. If the county census division available for use extended outside this circle to any great degree, only the division which includes the municipality is reported. some cases this means that the "Census Population 1970" and the "Potential Service Population" are the same, e.g., Lovington. The other major exception is Albuquerque where the potential service area is based on the standard metropolitan statistical area which is of Bernaillio county.

### College/University & Special Libraries

The New Mexico Library Laws require the State Library Commission "to obtain each year from all libraries in the state reports on the condition, growth and development, together with such facts and statistics regarding the same as may be deemed of public interest and to incorporate the same in an annual report." Beginnings were made this year in gathering some data about academic and special libraries.

The Bureau of Educational Finance made available "The State of New Mexico Budget Estimate of State Educational Institutions: Legislative Budget for 1974/75" from which "actual expenditures for 1972/73" were taken. Data for non-state supported colleges were complied from questionnaires. Only financial statistics were acquired this year.

Questionnaires were also used to obtain data from all special libraries that could be tracked down; Bowker's Library Directory was used as a guide. Statistics on resources were included with financial data for special libraries. Seventy percent of the libraries responded.

No analysis was attempted. Information recorded was not uniform, and some data was not available. The statistics gathered represent only a beginning, subject to future refinements.

#### DIRECTORY OF LIBRARIES

Another innovation is the classified Directory of Libraries included in the back of this annual report. The directory lists the name, address, telephone and teletype numbers, and subject specialties of the libraries. It also includes the names of the library directors and of the staff members responsible for specific services. The subject specialties were obtained from a list compiled by the Public Library Division of the New Mexico Library Association in March 1973, entitled "Special Collections in New Mexico" and from questionnaires. The directory is current through December 1973, whereas the statistical data is for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1973.
