

ABSTRACT

A brief, non-technical synopsis of computerized data tape files available from the library of survey data collected over the last 20 years by the U.S. Department of Education Office of Educational Research and Improvement's Center for Education Statistics is provided in this directory. The available data files are listed in the following broad areas: (1) elementary and secondary education; (2) higher education; (3) vocational and adult education; (4) libraries; and (5) longitudinal studies. Each entry includes the name of the survey data file, the years for which data tapes are available, and a brief description of the data. Ordering information is given for these tapes as well as for special tabulations and mailing labels, and ar order form is attached. (MES)

Introduction

This Directory is published by Information Services (IS), a component of the Office of Educational Research and Improvement (OERI). OERI supports and conducts research on education, collects and analyzes education statistics, administers grant and contract programs to improve libraries and library education, and disseminates information to parents, students, teachers, school administrators, policymakers, researchers, the media, and others. The Information Services (IS) program coordinates the agency's external liaison activities and serves as the support group for other OERI components.

A major function of IS is to sell computerized data tape files from the library of survey data which OERI's Center for Education Statistics (CES) has been collecting for over 20 years. The entire IS library of computer tape survey files is available for public sales distribution. This Directory is designed to give a brief, non-technical synopsis of the major files available.

In addition to supplying copies of data files, special tabulations and mailing labels are also provided Capabilities range from straightforward listings to complicated statistical analyses.

Price and Ordering Information

Tape Prices

Each survey is sold as a unique data file. The basic price for a data file is \$150. Additional files ordered at the same time are \$50 each. At his price, the files will be stacked on as few reels as possible. Some large files have separate pricing. These prices are given in the file descriptions. Each annual collection for a multi-year survey is counted as a separate file.

All necessary documentation is included with each file. This includes: file layout, block size, number of records, explanatory narratives, survey forms and related studies

Tape Technical Specifications

Standard copying procedures for these files produce 9track tapes in 1600 or 6250 BPI using extended binary coded decimal interchange code (EBCDIC) or American standard code for information interchange (ASCII), with IBM Standard Labels (SL) or unlabeled.

OERI has Statistical Analysis System (SAS) files available for most files produced since 1976.

Public School Universe	1969-72 (4-yr summary) 1977-78 through 1984-85	This file includes name, address, district, high grade, low grade, school type, number of teachers, and pupils enrolled in over 86,000 public schools. Most survey years lack some elements which were not submitted by certain States.
Private School Universe	1970-71 1976-77 1976-80 (4-yr summary)	This file includes name, mailing address, school district, type, affiliation, enrollment, graduates, and classroom teachers, for approximately 23,000 private schools.
School District Finance	1967-68 through 1979-80	This file includes revenues, by fiscal year, from local, State and Federal sources; non-revenue receipts; expenditures, by type; capital outlay; debt service; and average daily attendance. The early surveys sample approximately 6,000 school districts. The 1976-77 and 1978-79 surveys cover all LEAs (approximately 16,000)
Merged Federal Files	1976-77 1978-79	This file combines data from the CES school district universe; Census of Governments survey of local government's finances; Office for Civil Rights elementary/ secondary education civil rights compliance survey; Department of Education Section 437 State-administered Federal programs; Equal Employment Cpportunity Commission elementary/secondary staff survey; equalized property value; and the National Institute of Education special tabulations of 1970 census data for school districts. This data file includes financial, students, staff, and population characteristics for the more than 16,000 school districts in the United States.
Census of Population and Housing 1980: File 1F	1980	Data for all school districts in the country (approximately 16,000), including county components of school districts, are contained in this file. It has complete count data on population and housing characteristics. The price is \$250 for 1600 BPI tape and \$150 for 6250 BPI.

The data are based on sample estimates covering population, income, employment, education attainment, and housing characteristics. The price is \$225 for 6250 BPI tape and \$500 for 1600 BPI.
Master Area Reference File, (MARF) 3	1980	Identification of each block group and enumeration district used for tabulating 1980 Census data, with the school district in which it is located, are contained in this file. This file also includes selected population and housing counts. There are approximately 400,000 block-group and enumeration-district records. The price is \$300 for 1600 BPI tape and \$150 for 6250 BPI.
Master Area Reference File, (MARF) 4	1980	This file identifies each city block and enumeration district used for tabulating 1980 Census data with the school district in which it is located. It also contains selected population and housing counts. Approximately 2.5 million city blocks and enumeration-district records are included. The price is \$450 for 6250 BPI tape. It is not available at 1600 BPI.
Table Print File	1980	This file contains approximately 40 pages of tabular summaries of all 1980 Census data for each local school district. The data is available only in printed form and by individual school district. Price is \$60 per school district.
School District Non-Fiscal Data	1981-82 1982-83 1983-84 1984-85	This file includes name, number of schools, students enrolled, teachers, instructional aides, and administrative support staff in FTE of assignment for approximately 16,000 school districts.

Opening Fall Enrollment	1967 through 1985-86	Covered in this file is full-time, part-time, and full-time-equivalent enrollment. by sex, for undergraduate, graduate, unclassified, and first-professional degree and first-time freshmen students for about 3,400 schools. The 1976, 1978, 1980, 1982, and 1984 surveys contain the Office for Civil Rights (OCR) Compliance Report data. The OCR data includes the biennial collection of racial/ethnic enrollment data, by major field of study. (Racial/ethnic data for 1982 by summary only.)
Financial Statistics	1965-66 through 1984-85	This file presents current fund revenues, by source; expenditures, by function; physical plant assets, by type and value; indebtedness on physical plant; endowment revenues; and changes in fund balance for about 3,400 schools.
Physical Facilities	1971-72 1974-75 1978-79	This file includes number of square feet of physical plant space, by type of room, function of room, organizational unit, and instructional program. The 1978 survey is a random sample of approximately 700 schools, and includes data pertaining to Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973—student housing for the mobility impaired, handicapped enrollment.
Residence and Migration	1972, 1975 1979, 1981 1984	This file covers first-time and new transfer student enrollment classifications, by residence status, home State, and sex, for about 3,400 schools.
Faculty Salaries	1971-72 through 1985-86 (No 1983-84)	Salary, tenure, and fringe benefits of full-time instructional faculty, by sex, rank, length of contract, and type of institutional unit for about 3,400 schools are covered in this file. The 1972-73 and 1976-77 surveys also collected the number of part-time, full-time, and non-faculty employees, by manpower resource category. The Privacy Act of 1974 forbids public dissemination of data on salary and fringe benefits for individuals and/or administrators. A suppression algorithm was used on data cells with fewer than 3 persons to create a public-use tape.

The number of sulject fields was greatly increased starting with the 1982-83 survey.
Institutional Characteristics	1969-70 through 1985-86	This file includes institution name, address, telephone number, congressional district, type of control, level of offerings, type of programs, accreditation, and previous year's enrollment for about 3,400 schools. Data are comparable with those found in the Education Directory, Colleges and Universities, available from the Government Printing Office.
College and University Libraries	1968-69, 1971-72 1873-74, 1975-76 1976-77, 1977-78 1979-80, 1982-83 1985-86	This file includes resources, physical facilities, staffing patterns, salaries and wages, number of employees, level of educational attainment, current expenditures, and number of learning resource centers, for about 3,400 schools. Salary data cells for fewer than 3 persons are suppressed.
Adult and Continuing Education	1977-78 1979-80	This file is a sample of 484 reporting units. It covers non-credit activities in higher education institutions, by major academic and/or administrative unit; and number of non-credit registrations, by field of instruction
Recent College Graduates	1974-75 1976-77 1979-80 1983-84	This file includes data from a national sample of about 16,000 bachelor's and 2,000 master's degree recipients a year after graduation. The emphasis is on the education and employment of graduates newly qualified to teach, and beginning teachers.

Postsecondary Student Aid Field Test	1985-86	This file provides data on financial aid and school costs on a sample of 3.774 students from 118 schools in the 1985-86 academic year. Records contain information from the student's school registrar's office records, the student financial aid office record, and the student questionnaire.
Directory of Postsecondary Institutions	1986	This file presents characteristics for 7.474 respondents of the 13,630 survey recipients. These characteristics include IPEDS identification control number, highest level of offering, enrollment, and tuition and required fees. Only the IPEDS identification number, name, address, and an assigned control code are available for the remaining 6,156 nonresponding institutions.

NOTE The Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS), which has been in place for 20 years, will be replaced by the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) IPEDS will cover all 13,600 post-secondary education institutions. Programs and Enrollments in Noncollegiate Postsecondary Schools	1980	This file contains data collected from 3 postsecondary education survey forms. It covers: (a) schools from the Postsecondary Career School Survey; (b) a sample of approximately 5,300 schools that includes program enrollment, charges, length and output, student racial/ethnic origins, age and sex, and staff, by sex and assignments; and (c) data for 62 correspondence schools.
Characteristics of Students in Noncollegiate Postsecondary Schools	197. / 1979 1981	This is a sample file of approximately 6,800 students drawn from the Postsecondary Career School universe of schools. It includes age, sex, race/ethnicity, military status, previous vocational training plans, previous and current work experience, and future work plans.
Participation in Adult Education	1969 1972 1975 1978 1984	This file is a national sample of 58,000 households, conducted for CES by the Bureau of the Census as part of the Current Population Survey. It includes data on adult education participants, courses, providers, and financing.

National Longitudinal Study (NLS) of the High School Class of 1972	1972 high school graduating class and 4 subsequent follow-ups through October 1979	Provides 3,524 variables on each of the sample 22,652 respondents. All data are contained in one data set. A 3-volume data user's guide serves as documentation and is sent with the tapes. The fifth follow-up was conducted during the spring of 1986 and should be available by summer 1987. The base-year segment contains: student personal family background; education and work experience; postsecondary plans, aspirations, attitudes; test results of verbal and nonverbal ability; and items from student high school records. Follow-up data (1973, 1974, 1976, and 1979) includes respondents' activity status, education and career plans, aspirations and attitudes. The price is \$450 for 1600 BPI tape and \$225 for 6250 BPI.
Student Codebook	Cumulat've for all follow-ups	This list of variables, with their tape file locations (a machine-readable copy of appendix "O" of the student file user's manual), can be used to prepare control cards of variable labels for many different statistical software packages. This file is included with the NLS student file at no additional cost.
High School and Counselor Data	1972	This data file contains 504 variables from the high school file and counselor questionnaire responses. The data from the high school file can be linked to the data for the students attending each school. The file contains approximately 1,300 records. The 1972 school questionnaire gathered information on school organization and enrollment, course offerings, special services and programs, library and other resources, time scheduling, and grading systems. Counselor variables include workloads, counseling practices and facilities, experience with student financial aid programs, age, sex, race/ethnicity, training, and counseling experience.
School and Counselor Codebook	1972	This variable list, with tape locations (a machine-readable copy of appendix "B" of the school file documentation), can be used to prepare control cards. This file is included with the school counselor file at no additional cost.

High School and Beyond (HS&B) base year	1980 (only)	This nationally representative data base contains data on sophomore and senior high school students from the class of 1980. All other HS&B data files (such as parent, school, teacher, transcript, twin, friends, offerings and enrollment, and local market indicators) can be easily merged with the student file. The base-year file contains information on 58,270 students, including personal backgrounds, education and work experience, postsecondary plans and aspirations, and verbal and non-verbal cognitive test scores. This file is \$225 on 1600 BPI tape and \$150 on 6250 BPI.
HS&B Sopnomere Class of 1980, 1st Follow-up	1980, plus 1982 follow-up	This file expands the base-year file t adding 1982 data for the approximately 30,000 sophomores only. First follow-up students included those who (1) remained in the same school since their sophomore years, (2) transferred to another high school, (3) graduated from high school, or (4) dropped out of high school before spring 1982. This file is \$225 on 1600 BPI tape and \$150 on 6250 BPI.
HS&B Sophomore Class of 1980, 2nd Follow-Up	1980, plus 1982 and 1984 follow-ups	This file expands on the base-year and first follow-up file by adding 1984 (second follow-up) questionnaire data and composite variables for approximately 15,000 sophomores (these 15,000 students have high school transcript data). Postsecondary and work history variables are included on this merged file. The file is \$225 on 1600 BPI tape and \$150 on 6250 BPI.

HS&B Senior Class of 1980	1980 plus 1982 and 1984 follow-ups	This file expands on the base-year file by adding 1982 and 1984 follow-up data on approximately 12,000 seniors. It is similar to the Merged Sophomore file and includes post-secondary education and work history. This file is \$225 on 1600 BPI tape and \$150 on 6250 BPI.
HS&B School File	1980 plus 1982 follow-up	The School File contains school questionnaire responses that were provided by administrators in 1,015 public, Catholic, and other private schools. The questionnaire focused on a number of school characteristics including type and organization, enrollment, faculty composition, instructional programs, course offerings, specialized programs, participation in Federal programs, faculty characteristics, funding sources, discipline problems, teacher organizations (e.g., unions), and grading systems. This file contains the 1980 data and the 1982 update.
HS&B Language File	1980	The Language File contains information on each student who said he or she had experience in a language other than English. This file contains 11,303 records (sophomores and seniors combined), 42 variables for each student.
HS&B Teacher Comments File	1980	The Sophomore Teacher File contains responses from 14, 103 teachers on 18,291 students from 616 schools. The Senior Teacher File contains responses from 13,683 teachers on 17,056 students from 611 schools. At each grade level, teachers had the opportunity to answer questions about HS&B-sampled students who had been in their classes. The typical student in the sample was rated by an average of 4 different teachers. Preliminary analyses by CES indicate that the files contain approximately 76,000 teacher observations of sophomores and about 67,000 teacher observations of seniors.

HS&B Friend File	1980	The Friend File contains identification numbers of students in the HS&B sample who were named as being friends of other HS&B sample students. Each record contains the ID of sampled students and IDs of up to 3 friends. Linkages among friends can be used to investigate the sociometry of friendship structures, including reciprocity of choices among students in the sample, and for tracing friendship networks.
HS&B Local Labor Market Indicator	1980	The Local Labor Market Indicator File contains information on county, SMSA, and State indicators of labor market activity for the 1,015 high schools in the HS&B sample.
HS&B Offerings and Enrollment File	1982	The Offerings and Enrollment File contains information on course offerings and enrollment for most of the schools in the HS&B sample.
HS&B Secondary School Transcript File	1982	The Transcript File contains complete high school transcript information (including specific course information, such as: course name, grade received, year taken, and credits earned) for 15,941 students from the sophomore file
HS&B Pell Grant File	1982	The Pell Grant File contains data for 2,916 HS&B seniors who were Pell Grant recipients between high school graduation in 1980 and the first follow-up survey in 1982. These data were derived from the Recipient History and Roster Master Files for school years 1980-81 and 1981-82 in the Pell Grant Information System. Only available in Statistical Analysis System (SAS) format.
HS&B Postsecondary School Transcript File	1984	This file contains data on transcripts from HS&B senior cohort members who reported attending a postsecondary institution after leaving high school. A total of 9,385 transcripts reflecting the postsecondary education activities of 7,776 samp! members were obtained and included in the transcript data file (some students had transcripts from more than one institution). The information recorded in the file

Revised HS&B Parent File	1980 (Revised in 1984)	The revised Parent File contains questionnaire responses from the parents of about 3,600 sophomores and 3,600 seniors who are in the Student File. Each record on the Parent File contains a total of 307 variables. Data in this file include parents' aspirations and plans for their children's postsecondary education. The revised Parent File augments the original file with the addition of 22 analytically constructed variables, half of which are new measures of income and wealth. The remaining new variables enable analysts to delete observations which are out of range for one or more reasons. This replaces the file released in 1980.
HS&B Twin and Sibling File	1980	The Twin and Sibling File contains responses from sampled twins and triplets; augmented data on twins and triplets of sample members; and responses from siblings in the sample. This file (2,718 records) includes the same variables that are in the HS&B Student Base-Year File, plus 2 additional variables (family ID and SETTYPE-type of twin or siblings).

These data were collected from a nationally representative sample of 1,174 private schools, and 5,295 private school teachers in winter and spring of 1986. Classification System for 1986 Postsecondary Education Courses

This classification system was developed in conjunction with CES's Longitudinal Studies Program. It is based on course listings in college catalogues from a sample of 60 postsecondary undergraduate and noncollegiate institutions. It expands upon the Classification of Instructional Programs, (CIP), which divided courses into 50 major categories. This system uses an 8-digit code to differentiate between similar yet unique courses, whereas the CIP used a 6-digit code. There are about 21,500 courses in the file.
