

ABSTRACT

This report presents findings of the first national survey of U.S. library networks undertaken by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) from, 1977 through 1979. A definition of library networks as used in the survey is provided, as well as information on the organizational type, general characteristics, nature of participants, expenditures, funds, staff, computerized support, services and activities of library networks. The first section of the report provides a summary or explanatory material for the library network data which is more fully presented in 14 statistical tables comprising the second section. Selected report findings are listed as follows: (1) there were 608 library networks in the United States in 1978 with 32,148 participants; (2) participants included academic, public school, public and special libraries, and state library agencies; (3) 60 percent of library networks were publicly administered and 72 percent were regional in service; (4) 87 percent of network staff were paid, with 23 percent of paid staff being librarians; (5) networks received \$193.6 million in 1978; (6) the largest network expense was salaries and wages; (7) networks provided acquisitions, cataloging, reference, circulation and administrative services; and (8) 59 percent of library networks had computer, support. An appendix briefly discusses the survey methodology. (ESR)

Foreword

Statistics of Library Networks is the second¹ of two publications evolving from the first national survey of these types of organizations undertaken by the National Center for Education Statistics from 1977 through 1979. The very existence of these organizations bears witness to the economic problems and pressures faced by all types of libraries in procuring and providing for material resources, services, personnel, and equipment. The information explosion, which began in the 1960s, has made resource sharing a necessity, and computer technology, over the past two decades, has made networking a reality. These organizations provide services which range from regional to international efforts They include such services as acquisitions, cataloging, reference, circulation and various administrative functions. They run the gamut from manual to fully computerized systems and data bases.

Library networks were recently brought to national attention during the White House Conference on Libraries and Information Services. The conference called for "improved access to library information resources through interlibrary cooperation and network support and has proposed legislation to provide incentives for sharing information and resources through cooperative arrangements, to reduce disparities among regions, and make informational resources available to more people more economically."²

The networks in this report represent over 32,000 public, school, academic and special libraries, querying over 2,200 data bases representing over 144 million titles. Networks received over \$193 million per annum and expended over \$141 million. Their sources of income include national, State and local government, dues and fees, sale of products and services, grants, taxes, and investments to mention a few.

We would like to express our appreciation to the officials of the organizations whose responses made this publication possible and to the State Library Agencies who assisted in the data collection and in the resolution of inconsistencies.

Introduction

Recognizing the growing interest of the library community in cooperative library organizations, the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) conducted this first-time national survey of library networks. The survey was designed to determine the general characteristics, nature of participants, expenditures, funds, staff, computerization, and services provided by these organizations. During the first phase of this study "a universe was developed, and during the second phase a pretest of the survey instrument was conducted. Site visits proved invaluable in assessing the relevance of the questions asked and the -availability of data to answer these questions.

The third phase of the survey was the statistical data collection. A planning committee of experts was established to provide expertise and guidance throughout all phases of the survey. This group consisted of representatives from the National Commission on Libraries and Information Science (NCLIS), the American Library Association (ALA), the Special Libraries Association (SLA), the Association of Research Libraries (ARL), the Association of College and Research Libraries (ACRL), the Library of Medicine, the Federal Library Committee, the Chief Officers of State Library Agencies, the Council for Computerized Library Networks, the Consortium of Universities of the Washington. Metropolitan Area, the VSE Corporation Survey Staff, the Department of Education, and the National Center for Education Statistics.

This group established a set of criteria to be met for organizations participating in the survey. These criteria were:

- 1. The participants in the organization are primarily or exclusively libraries.
- 2. The organization and/or its participants engage in cooperative activities which are beyond the scope of traditional interlibrary loan services as stated by the ALA code.
- 3. The activities of the organization must extend beyond reciprocal borrowing.
- 4. The organization operates for the mutual benefit of participating libraries.

5. The scope of the organization is interinstitutional.

The data collection and follow-up efforts established that 608 library cooperative organizations met the criteria set by the planning committee. The response was considered 100 percent. Further details are given in the methodology section.

Two or more libraries and/or other organizations engaged in a common pattern of information exchange, through communications, for some functional purpose. A network usually consists of a formal arrangement whereby materials, information and services provided by a variety of types of libraries and/or other organizations are made available to all potential users. Libraries. may be in different jurisdictions but agree to serve one another on the same basis as each serves its own constituents. Computers and telecommunications may be among the tools used for facilitating communication among them.

Most of the basic tables prepared for this report show the organizational type of the library networks and the number of participants by range categories. A breakdown is given for (1) all organizations, (2) "Public" type, which are those under the control of Federal, State, and local government agencies, (3) "Private" type, which are independent nonprofit or organized as proprietary profitmaking, and (4) "Other" type, which are those networks having no formal administration. The "number of participants" refers to the number of libraries which directly participate in the activities of each cooperative library organization.

General Characteristics

Approximately 60 percent of the 608 library networks were administered by public agencies, 71 percent had a headquarters and 55 percent were independent of a parent agency. Almost 80 percent operated under a written agreement or charter and over 67 percent had multi-type membership. Almost 59 percent had computer support and almost 73 percent had daily operations.

Seventy one percent of these organizations were classed as regional, i.e., area of service less than Statewide. Seventeen percent were Statewide, serving most of the libraries in a State. Nine percent served more than one State but not all 50 States. Nationwide and international categories had only 1.2 percent each of the 608 organizations reporting. Sixteen percent reported that their only activity was holding meetings. For further details see-table 1.

Categories of Participants

These 608 library networks had 32,148 participating members. The following chart shows the different types of participating libraries by number and percent. For further details see table 2.

Some of these totals for types of participants indicate memberships in several library networks. The most obvious are the State Library Agencies, which participated in a total of 405 networks. Multiple memberships occur in all other categories to some extent. On the average, there are approximately 53 participants per network.

The total paid staff (FTE) was 5,100 of which 8.8 percent were administrators, 23 percent were professional librarians, 3.1 percent were computer related staff, 3.3 percent were other professionals, 18 percent were library technicians and paraprofessionals, and 44 percent were clerical and support staff. Those networks which are administered privately, have 31 percent of their professional staff computer oriented, whereas in the public networks this group constitutes only 2 percent of the total. The professional staff in privately administered networks is divided approximately equally between librarians and computer oriented professionals.

There were approximately 768 volunteers (non-paid staff) working in networks in 1978. Among this group 65 percent or approximately 500 professionals were librarians.

Ninety percent of all network organizations have less than three full-time equivalent (FTE) paid staff, and 73 percent have less than 1 (FTE) paid staff. Of the 448 organizations with less than 1 (FTE) paid staff, 30 percent are organizations with 10 - 19 participants, and 27.5 percent are organizations with 40 or more participants. Networks received 193.6 million dollars during 1978 which included 12.2 million dollars in pass-through funds. The major source of funds was grants from State and local government (29.13 percent), Federal grants (26.66 percent), sale of products and services (12.77 percent), and State and local taxes (10.48 percent).

Almost 73, percent of total network funds were for public networks, 22 percent for private networks, and 4.7 percent for those with no administration ties. The major source of funds for public networks was Federal, State, and local grants, and for private networks, the sale of products and services and dues and fees. Those networks having no formal administration of the organization received the major part of their funds (47 percent) from State and local grants.

In 1977-1978 public networks received 140.9 million dollars, private networks 43.4 million dollars, and those with no formal administration 9.2 million dollars. The following table compares key components of these funds.



Pass Through Funds -

Pass-through funds amounted to 6.3 percent or 122 million dollars of the total funds received by library networks nationally. Library networks receive these funds from their participants and pass them on to other library organizations for services.

Funds From Federal Government

All grants awarded directly to library networks by the Federal government including Federal funds distributed by the State, such as LSCA Title III funds, totaled 51.6 million dollars. Over 95 percent of these Federal funds (49.2 million dollars) were received by publicly administered library networks.

Funds From State and Local Government

All grants awarded by State and local governments, excluding Federal funds distributed by the State exceeded 56A million dollars. Ninety-one percent of these funds were awarded to public library networks.

State and Local Tax Support

Over 10 percent of the total funds, 20.3 million dollars, were received from State and local taxes with 85 percent of this tax money going to public library networks and only 11 percent to private networks.

Investments and Assessments

Library networks received a gross investment income of 1.8 million dollars. This represented income from assets, such as bank interest and dividends, and income from stocks, bonds, and endowments. Forty-nine percent of this investment income was received by public networks and 42 percent by private networks. The funds collected from participants by networks in the form of assessments (i.e. special payments to cover the costs of specific projects or to cover specific losses), were 2.2 million dollars nationally. Over 63 percent were in the public sector and 32 percent in privately run networks (see table 6).

Expenditures

Library networks expended over 141 million dollars during the fiscal year that ended between July 1, 1977, and June 30, 1978. These expenditures include only monies paid out directly by these organizations through their budgets.

Of the 608 library networks, 53 had operating expenditures of \$500,000 or more, and 74 percent of those networks were public. Seventy-seven percent of the 349 library networks spending \$25,000 per year or more were public networks. Fifty-seven percent of all (608) library networks expend over \$25,000 per year.

The largest expense to all library networks was salaries and wages. Nationally 51.9 million dollars in salaries and wages was paid to the staff of these organizations. Of this figure 38.5 million dollars (74 percent) was spent in public networks, 9.9 million dollars (19 percent) in private networks, and 3.5 million dollars (7, percent) in "other" networks. Salaries and wages represent 36.8 percent of the national total expenditures. The wages and salary figures contain no fringe benefit figures and do not include salaries and wages paid by other organizations.

The average salary (not distinguishing level of expertise or duties of paid staff) seems to be higher in privately controlled library networks. The table below compares the national totals with only the largest library networks. For further details see tables 8 and 13.

Supplies and materials cost over 15.9 million dollars. Public networks spent 12.1 million dollars or 75.8 percent of this total, while private networks spent 2.8 million dollars (17.5 percent), and "other" networks I million dollars (6.6 percent). These figures included money spent for the organization itself and for supplies and materials the headquarters buys for its members, i.e., costs for books, periodicals, microforms, audiovisual materials, book jackets, literature boxes, etc.

Library networks expended 14.8 million dollars in staff travel expenses. These expenses were for staff enrichment, training, and consultation. Over 95 percent of these costs were in library networks in the public sector.

Nationally library networks spent 6.6 million on fringe benefits, 1.2 million on reproduction services which excludes reproduction equipment, 3.9 million on equipment other than computers, 4.8 million on plant and vehicles operation and maintenance, and 2.8 million on capital outlay.

Over 5.2 million was spent on telecommunications. These costs included teletype (TWX and telex), coaxial cable, WATS, telephone, leased lines, and telefacsimile. Costs paid to other cooperative library organizations for

these services are not included.

The expenditure of pass-through funds accounted for 11.8 million dollars in fiscal year 1977. These funds were passed on by library networks to other library organizations for services rendered. These funds represented 8.4 percent of the total expenditures for fiscal year 1977. Other expenditures amounted to 17.3 million dollars. This category included a wide array of organizational costs, not separately tabulated in the national statistics. Sixty-four percent of these costs were in the public networks, 31 percent in the private networks, and 5 percent in "other" networks.

The category of "equipment other than computers" consisted of all costs for purchase and leasing for office furniture and machines, calculators, and reproduction equipment. Nationally library networks, expended 3.9 million dollars for these items.

The total computer costs, both hardware and software, were over 4.2 million dollars, of which 3.7 million dollars was for hardware. Eighty percent of the hardware costs were incurred by private library networks. For further details see table 8.

Automated Support

For the purposes of this survey, a computer was defined as any central processing unit, with either online or offlue operations, and its related peripheral equipment (e.g. terminals, printers, etc). If the library used a computer, it was asked to affirm regardless of the location of the computer. However, if the computer was used only for administrative purposes such as bookkeeping, billing, or payroll, then the network was not considered computerized.

Three hundred and nine library networks (50.8 percent) reported using computers. Two hundred ninety-one networks (47.9 percent) reported that computer terminals were used for organizational business by participants in their networks' organizations. Two hundred and sixty-two library networks reported accessing a total number of 2,246 data bases representing over 144 million titles.

The 309 library networks with computer equipment for library services are providing 75 percent of their automated service to such things as authority control, books for the blind, literature searches, copy selection, community services, bibliographic verification, ILL locator, photocopy service, label production, COM production, Online catalog/ demo, community/user data, info/file service, talking books, publications, business services, periodical claims, film booking, needs assessment, and printout index. The following table shows the percentages of the total number of automated services provided in relation to the major library functions.

Sixty percent of the total automated services provided were by public networks, 26 percent by private and 14 percent by "other." Twenty-four percent of the automated support activity was on standard on-line computers. For further details see tables 10 and 11.

Service's and Activities

There were five major areas of services and activities. identified in this survey: acquisitions, cataloging, reference, circulation and administrative functions. The functions are presented in the basic table for services and activities provided and engaged in (1) only at headquarters, (2) by headquarters and participants, and (3) only by participants. The activities and services for each function are listed below.

The 32,148 participants in library networks include all types of libraries: academic, public school, public, special and State Library Agencies. They are staffed by professional librarians, library technicians and paraprofessionals, computer professionals and staff. Some of this staff is volunteer and some paid. Networks received 193.6 million dollars and expended over 141 million dollars. The largest expense to library networks was salaries and wages. Networks provided services in acquisitions, cataloging, reference, circulation and administrative functions. Over half the library networks are using computers in providing service to their participants. Library networks provide a partial crossover to libraries whose budget and staff are remaining static while costs are increasing rapidly. As technology advances in this decade, cooperative library organizations will undoubtedly expand their services and activities to all types of information handling and will align themselves to commercial as well as public sources of information. This survey gives a glimpse of what library networks and cooperative organizations have contributed since their advent in the 1950s.

In the first phase of the Survey of Library Networks and Cooperative Library Organizations, the universe was established through extensive research of available publications on library cooperative organizations within the 50 States and the District of Columbia. These organizations were incorporated into a computer data base and printed on computerized universe survey forms. The universe survey forms were then sent to the state librarians, who assisted in establishing lists of library networks known to them. The second phase began with nine on-site visits made to test the proposed survey form. As a result of the on-site visits, the proposed survey form was revised and further tested by surveying five percent of the universe (50 organizations). The following determinations were made at the end of the 5 percent sample survey:

- a. The Universe File would have to be updated throughout the survey due to frequent changes in the universe.
- b. The universe of 945 organizations would decrease when the actual survey was conducted. This decision was made due to the fact that approximately 30 percent of the organizations surveyed were found to be ineligible because they did not meet the criteria for classification as cooperative library organizations.

The final survey form was developed incorporating the knowledge gained during the on-site visits and the 5 percent sample survey. Forms were sent to 1,174 organizations. It was discovered during followup that many of these organizations did not meet all the criteria established for inclusion in the survey. As a result 608 qualifying library organizations were surveyed. The period of effort for this study was 1976 through 1979. The response rate was 100 percent.
