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AESTRACT
The findings of the eighth annual study of the counselor-counselee ratio among the 92 California public community colleges, as based on Fall semester records of 1972-73, are provided. The seven preceding surveys were previously reported (see ED 059 712). In determining the ratios, all colleges were asked to include only that portion of counselor's time devoted to individual and group counseling, and all were asked to use the same criteria in reporting full- and part-time students enrolled in day graded classes. Of the 92 colleges, 75 operate on the semester plan and the remaining 17 are on the quarter system. The counselor-counselee $r$ ange for semester colleges is from 1:359 to 1:1045; for quarter colleges, the range is 1:307 to 1:926. The semester colleges employ 659. 33 full-time equivalent (FTE) day counselors to serve 397,086 day graded students, an average of 1:603, whereas the quarter colleges employ 105. 25 FTE counselors for 50,360 day graded students, an average of 1:531. The total number of students in day graded classes decreased by 5791 ( $1.28 \%$ ), The ratio of FTE counselors as compared with FTE day instructors for semester colleges was an average of 1:18.61, and for quarter colleges, the average was $1: 16.18$. of the colleges, 89 ( $97 \%$ ) indicated that there were now using or planned to use next year para-professionals in the student personnel area. The normal work week for full-time counselors ranged from 40 to $22-1 / 2$ hours, with an average of 33.8. The rank order of the colleges for 1972 and 1971, together with number of FTE counselors, students in day graded classes, ratio of counselors to day instructors and to counselees, is tabulated. (DE)

SUBJECT: RESULTS OF 1972-73 QUESTIONNAIRE ON GOUNSELOR-COUNSELEE RATIO, ETC.

1. Attached is a copy of the findings of the eighth annual study of the counselorcounselee ratio among the 92 California public community colleges. The study is based on fall semester records (1972-73).
2. In determining the ratios, all respondents were asked to include only that portion of a counselor's time devoted to individual and group counseling (time assigned to student activities, registration, placement, financial aids, health services, evening counseling, administration, etc., was excluded). All colleges were asked to use the same criteria in reporting full-time and part-time students enrolled in day graded classes as reported to the state in the fall report, 1972 (page 2, line 非189, form CCAF-130).
3. 75 of the 92 California communty colleges operate on the semester plan and the remaining 17 are on the quarter system. The counselor-counselee range for semester colleges is from 1:359 to 1:1045. For semester colleges, $Q_{1}$ is 513, the median is 583, and $Q_{3}$ is 684. The range for quarter colleges is $1: 307$ to $1: 926$ and the median is 1:473. (In 1971-72 the 74 California colleges on the semester system had $a Q_{1}$ of 487 , the median was 574 , and $Q_{3}$ was 682 ; on the quarter system the median was 505.)
4. The semester colleges employ 659.33 full-time equivalent day counselors to serve 397,086 day graded students resulting in an average of $1: 603$. (The 1971-72 average was 1:604; two years ago the average was 1:594. The 17 colleges on the quarter plan employ 105.25 FTE counselors for 50,360 day graded students resulting in an average of 1:531 (45 higher than the 1:486 average reported last year and 73 higher than the $1: 458$ reported two years ago).
5. The total number of students in day gr led classes decreased by 5791 students (from 453,237 in 1971-72 to 447,4461. $972-73$ ) - down 1.28\%. Last year the increase was $+7.84 \%$ and the previous year the increase was $+13.79 \%$.
6. A second ratio has been added to the study this year-- FIE counselors as compared with FTE day instructors. The range for semester colleges is from

7. Three "piggyback" questions were included and the findings are as follows:
a. $75(82 \%)$ of the 92 California public community colleges operate on the semester plan and 17 ( $18 \%$ ) are on the quarter plan. Last year there were 74 semester colleges and 18 quarter colleges for a total of 92.
b. In ascertaining the trend to employ para-professionals in the student personnel area, respondents were asked if they were now employing or considering employing classified personnel next year in the categories listed below. This was a repeat question from 1970-71 and 1971-72 and the $t$ tend is to employ even more para-professionals (non-certificated staff members) than reported in the previous studies. 89 colleges ( $97 \%$ ) indicated that they were using or next year planned to use para-professionals, as indicated below:

$r * T o$ ascertain the trend, only colleges not now employing para-professionals (in the categories listed) were tallied in these columns. Fy adding the two column together you can ascertain the contemplated use of paraprofessionals in 1973-74.
c. Another repeat question (included in the 1968-69 and 1971-72 studies) concerned the normal work week for full-time counselors. The 1.972-73 range is from 40 hours to $22 \frac{1}{2}$ hours a week with a state average of 33.8 . (Last year the average was 33.6 hours.) Several respondents indicated that committee assignments, in-service training and other extra curricular assignments were not included in the responses appearing in the bar graph below:
