RULES and REGULATIONS

1 This Society shall be called The Francis Agricultural Society.

2 Membership tickets for the current year shall be one dollar. Entry Fee of 5% of first prize offered charged on all entries.

3 Exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor and entry ticket must be on every exhibit.

4 Brood mare must have foal at foot or owners will prove that the mare has had a foal or will foal in 1917.

5 Directors will take every precaution possible under circumstances to ensure the safety of animals and articles sent to the exhibition and should any article be accidentally injured, lost or stolen they will give all the assistance in their power toward the recovery of same, but will not make any payment for the value thereof

6 Protests must be made in writing to the Secretary within one hour after the decision of the judge.

7 The director in charge of any particular class has full power in the management of that class during the time of judgement.

8 All articles in the Domestic Manufacturers and Ladie's Work Department must have been made by a member of a family of the exhibitor and shall not have been previously exhibited in this class.

9 Except in case of animals exhibitor will be allowed only one entry in any class.

10 All animals or articles must be on the grounds not later than 8 o'clock and with the exception of horses must remain until 6 p. m. Exhibitors must be in charge.

The age of foals and calves must be stated upon the entry ticket.

12 Prizes will be paid after the books are properly made up, of which due notice shall be taken.

13 The first ticket shall be red, the second blue, and the third white.

14 Exhibits for which no prizes are offered may nevertheless be shown under the rules of the Society and may be recommended by the judges for the consideration of the directors for awards.

15 Judges shall not be exhibitors in the class they judge and their decision shall be final.

16 The Directors shall have power to postpone the show or any part thereof through stress of weather or any reason they may deem sufficient.

17 Entries are to be made to the Secretary before 6 p. m. on the day before the exhibition but may be taken at the discretion of and through a director up to 9 a. m. standard time on the day of the show, but an extra 25 cents will be charged on each entry.

18 Any exhibitor shall, if required by the Board make a statutory declaration that the exhibits made by him are shown in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Society.

19. Stallions may be shown in stallion classes only.

20. Animals or articles which may be considered by the Judge not worthy of a prize shall not receive a prize.

21 Judging in live classes shall commence at 9 a. m. excepting harness classes which will be judged at 1 o'clock p. m. and all animals must be brought into the ring to be judged.

22 A parade of all prize winning animals will be held at 5 o'clock p. m. Any exhibitor not taking part in the parade shall forfeit his prize.




