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ABSTRACT

This annotated bibliography and library guide were developed for use by nursing students at the City University of New York, College of Staten Island library. The bibliography covers handbooks, dictionaries, encyclopedias, and other materials. The guide also includes information on locating relevant articles and how a researcher can obtain a database search from the library. A sample search for materials relating to aging and care of the aging is given as an example. Basic resources for locating books are described and catalog cards citing materials in the subject area are displayed. Instructions for using an index to locate journal articles concludes the guide. Appended material includes sample indexes and a sample periodicals/serials list. (KRN)

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INFORMATION BUILDING AND THE NURSING PROFESSIONAL Professor Karen Svenningsen

Not many of us would get through a day in teaching, in practice or just in daily life without our favorite reference sources. In the health and nursing practice, patient care changes so rapidly that the information stored on our bookshelves has a short life span. How does one find the information that would keep practitioners abreast of current trends and sources? Many reference sources are available to the nursing professional through university libraries, hospital libraries and articles in trade journals dispensing valued information. (1)

At the City University of New York, College of Staten Island library, references sources are maintained and selected with the nursing professional particular problems and concerns in mind. The issues that they face each day of the professional career are reflected in the sources available. Criteria for selection must meet the needs of the health care professional in a rapidly changing industry.

The mission of the library is to select material on relevancy, timeliness, the expertise of the writer, and suitability for the programs offered at the university. In "Information About Nursing" (2) a foundation is describe selecting the most appropriate reference sources available to the nursing professional. There is



a separate section on locating relevant articles and how a researcher can obtain a database search from the library. A sample teaching brochure is include which describes to a student the process of locating materials for a research project. The sample explains where one would find research materials relating to the topic of aging and care.(3)

The teaching faculty of the library encounters a rapid explosion of information on the health care industry, and it has become virtually impossible to keep abreast of all the technological advances. Information resources centers confront these problems everyday and compile, store, and disseminate information with their users concerns in mind. Indispensable sources are available to the researcher, if he or she understands the fundamentals of locating the materials.





RESOURCES FOR RESEARCH IN NURSING

Reference books and journal articles are two of the most important categories of resources utilized by researchers. Reference materials are consulted for background information, definitions, and the explanation of terminology. Journal articles, due to currency, are timely sources of information relating to a particular discipline.

The bibliography that follows includes a variety of reference sources such as handbooks, dictionaries and encyclopedias, directories, as well as other materials. To locate journal articles, consult the appropriate periodical indexes which are listed separately following the reference source materials.

Periodical Indexes and Abstracts

Periodical indexes and abstracts are valuable sources for current information on a wide variety of nursing and medical related subjects. The list below covers the most useful nursing and medical related indexes, noting coverage, and how to use the hard-copy indexes.

Periodical indexes should be consulted under the appropriate subject or author heading. This will enable the researcher to find an exact citation or location to the particular article of interest. The research should then consult the <u>CSI Periodical and Serials List</u> for the journal or newspaper title needed, noting format (paper or microfilm) coverage and the campus at which the journal is located.

International Nursing Index

Provides citations, with abstracts, to the literature in psychology and related disciplines. To determine the appropriate subject headings, consult the <u>Thesaurus of Psychological Index Terms</u>, which is shelved with the abstracts.

Computer Literature Searching Option

The College of Staten Island library offers a computerized database which can be used for literature searches. Searching <u>MEDLINE</u> is time-saving since the system allows for the combination of subjects.

MEDLINE is a compact laser disk system which allows individual searching of the <u>International Nursing Index</u>, <u>Index Medicus</u>, and the <u>Index to Dental Literature</u> from the years 1984 to present. The system is located at the Sunnyside campus library in the index area. It is also free-of-charge, and is available on a first-come, first-served basis. The Reference staff is available for instruction in the use of this system daily, or by appointment.

ACCESSING BOOKS

The Card Catalog - all of the books in a library's collection are listed on cards which are filed alphabetically and are contained in the library's card catalog. Library catalogs are designed so that you can find the book you want by knowing or of three things about the book --- the name of its author (last name first), its title or its subject (what or whom the book is about).

Sunnyside has 2 card catalogs:

- 1. Main Catalog includes author, title, and subject cards for books which the library acquired before 1981.
- 2. Current Catalog includes author, title and subject cards for books which the library acquired in 1981 and thereafter.

CUNY+ ONLINE CATALOG - is available through computer terminals located throughout the library and allows access to all City University book holdings. One can search CUNY+ by author, title, subject, and keyword (descriptive word). When searching do not include punctuation, accent marks, capitalizations, or articles (a, an, the). The symbol representing the College of Staten Island library's holdings is SI. Remember, always consult the librarian for assistance.

ACCESSING ARTICLES TO MAGAZINES AND JOURNALS

- 1) The Cumulative Index to Nursing & Allied Health Literature (CINAHL) is a comprehensive and authoritative index to current periodical literature for nurses, allied health professionals, and others interested in health care issues. Approximately 300 reviewed and indexed for inclusion in CINAHL's five bimonthly issues and cumulative bound volume. Indexing also includes pertinent articles from 2600 biomedical journals indexed in Index Medicus as well as relevant material from popular journals.
- 2) International Nursing Index (INI) is published quarterly in cooperation with the National Library of Medicine. INI indexes over 270 nursing journals received from all over the world, as well as all nursing articles in the 3000 allied health and biomedical journals currently indexed for Index Medicus. The index is arranged in two main sections (1) a Subject section (2) an Author/Name section. It also includes lists of nursing periodicals and serials indexed, current nursing publications of organization and agencies and nursing books published.
- 3) MEDLINE on CD-ROM is a major source of biomedical literature materials. Medline corresponds to the three printed indexes: Index Medicus, Index to Dental Literature, and International Nursing Index. Searching is performed via a computer terminal utilizing English vocabulary.

LOCATING PERIODICALS

Using the <u>College of Staten Island Periodical/Serials Listing</u> look up the title of the periodical alphabetically. VSIA indicates that the periodical is available at the St. George campus library; VSIB indicates that the periodical is available at the Sunnyside campus library. Note whether or not the periodical is on microfilm or in paper copy.

At the Sunnyside campus, ask for the paper copies of the periodicals at the Circulation Desk. Microfilm is stored at the rear of the library arranged alphabetically by title and date.
