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## ABSTRACT

The Louisiana State Board of Regents' 1999-2000 Student Transfer Guide and General Education Articulation Matrix represents Louisiana public higher education's ongoing effort to improve the transfer process. The courses in this guide's matrix are typically referred to as "general education" or "core curriculum" courses. Students should note that this matrix is limited to those general education courses for which full credit would likely be granted by most other Louisiana colleges and universities. The student is urged to contact the institution to which he/she is transferring to determine if courses will count toward degree requirements in a specific major. This guide contains an introduction, a description of the current Board of Regents' general education requirements, listings of Louisiana's public higher education institutions, which includes Louisiana's public two-year and four-year colleges and universities, and the general education articulation matrix. The required general education coursework for baccalaureate degree program includes a total of 39 hours in English, mathematics, computer literacy, natural sciences, arts, humanities, and social sciences. Information is included on transfer contacts, financial aid office contacts, housing contacts (if available), 1999-2000 annual tuition rates, general guidelines for transfer students, and determination of degree credit and course equivalencies for transfer courses. ## INTRODUCTION

Educational policies and practices can no longer be predicated on the assumption that students will complete a degree program at the same institution in which they initially enrolled. Today, increasing numbers of students at Louisiana's colleges and universities are transfer students.

When students' courses do not transfer, they must often be repeated. This results in students having to pay additional tuition and fees, delays their graduation, and means that students lose potential income. It also requires an additional expenditure of taxpayers' money. Savings students may have realized by enrolling at a lower cost institution could be lost if the courses do not transfer.

The Louisiana Board of Regents and the higher education community recognize the importance of well designed transfer policies. Transfer policies should be practical, predictable, and fair. Over the past few years, the Board of Regents, the Management Boards (Louisiana State University, Southern University, University of Louisiana and the Louisiana Community and Technical College System Boards of Supervisors) and all their member institutions have worked together to make the transfer process easier to understand and to complete with a minimum loss of credit. As a result of these efforts, this guide includes a matrix of General Education college credit courses which (with few exceptions) can transfer between and among most of Louisiana's public colleges and universities.

This guide represents Louisiana public higher education's on-going effort to improve the transfer process. Although each of Louisiana's campuses is unique and serves a specific mission, the higher education community also recognizes that in order to better serve students, the process of transfer and evaluation of credit must be more easily understood. The courses in this guide's matrix are typically referred to as "general education" or "core curriculum" courses. While for the most part all of these courses will transfer for credit between and among Louisiana's institutions, *students must remember that these courses may or may not be applied to a particular degree program*. Students should note that this matrix is limited to those general education courses for which full credit would likely be granted by most other Louisiana colleges and universities. In addition to this statewide agreement, many institutions have entered into specific transfer/articulation agreements. *These institutional agreements often include far more extensive listings of courses which can be successfully transferred between those specific institutions.* **Therefore, the student is urged to contact the institution to which he/she is transferring to determine if courses will count toward degree requirements in a specific major.**

To make this process easier, this guide includes contact information for each campus. Additionally, information on tuition rates and office contacts for financial aid and housing are included for the student's use.

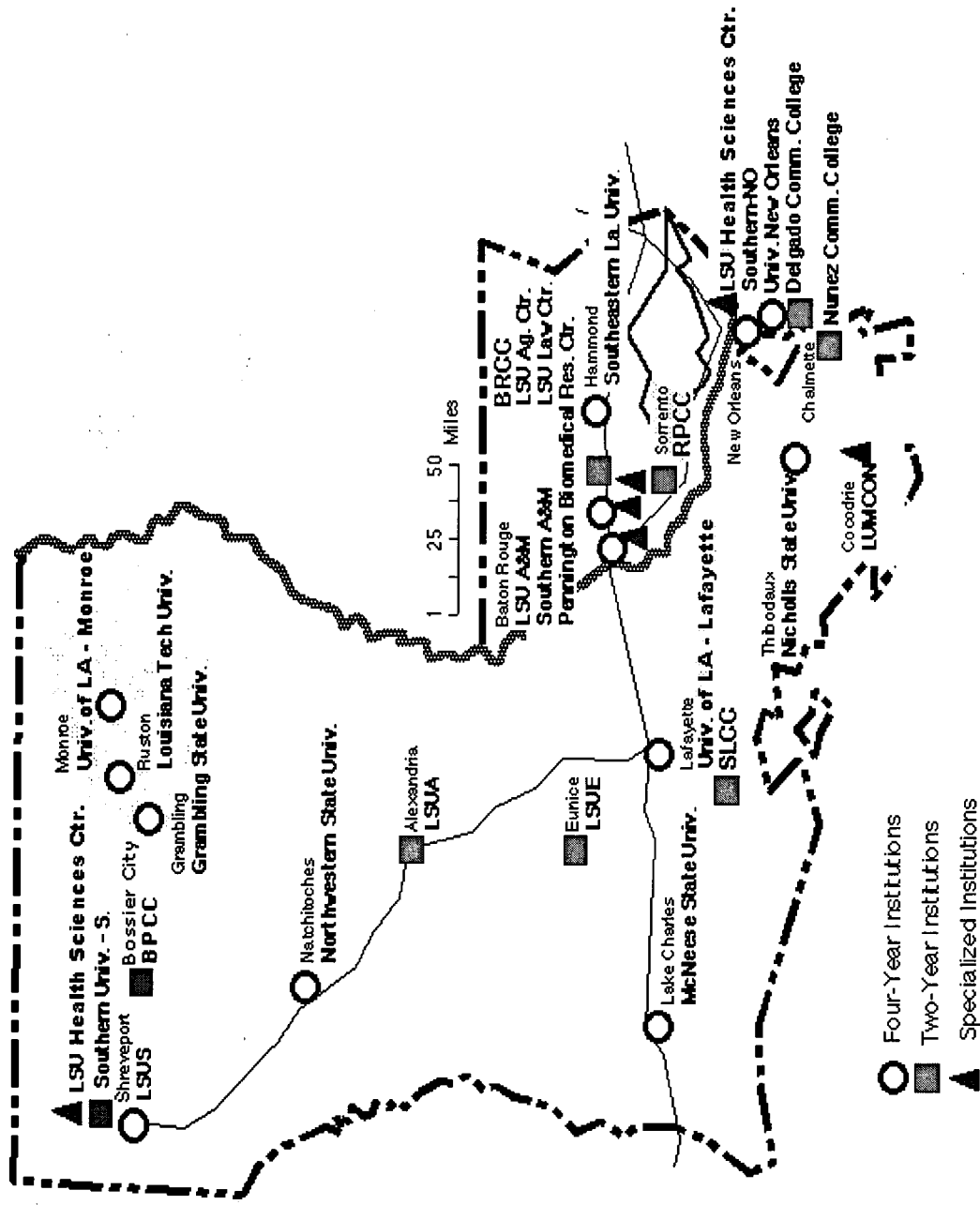
## CURRENT BOARD OF REGENTS' GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

The Board of Regents' General Education Requirements include 39 credit hours of college-level courses for a baccalaureate degree program (twelve hours for an associate degree program). These 39 hours are distributed across a number of disciplines and typically represent a total of thirteen courses. The enclosed matrix includes courses from which these thirteen can be chosen. However, since (1) the Regents' policy provides flexibility in how each institution meets these general education requirements and (2) some of Louisiana's institutions have supplemented the Regents' requirements with institutional requirements, students considering transferring are urged to contact the institution to which they are considering transferring in order to determine whether additional requirements exist.

The extent to which undesignated courses are used for degree credit is determined by the senior college.*
