ABSTRACT

This resource guide provides the user who is considering purchasing microfiche equipment with annotated citations of: (1) books which include general selection guidelines and criteria for the purchase of many types of audiovisual equipment, (2) directories and guides that are useful for descriptions of equipment and in the comparison of different types of equipment, (3) articles concerned with equipment evaluation, and (4) articles concerned with the training of equipment users. Also included are a list of associations whose memberships are interested in some aspect of micrographics, a list of titles of periodicals and newsletters whose articles may deal with micrographics, and a list of dealers of microform equipment. ## INTRODUCTION

This brief resource guide is intended to provide the user with the citations to the following types of information concerning the purchase of microfiche equipment: (1) GENERAL SELECTION GUIDELINES, which include criteria for the purchase of many types of audiovisual equipment; (2) DIRECTORIES AND GUIDES to be used for descriptions of equipment, and in the comparison of different types of equipment; (3) ARTICLES concerned with equipment evaluation; (4) articles concerned with TRAINING USERS to use equipment. There is also a list of ASSOCIATIONS whose memberships are concerned with some aspect of micrographics; a list of titles of PERIODICALS AND NEWSLETTERS whose articles may deal with micrographics; and a list of DEALERS of microform equipment.

### GENERAL SELECTION GUIDELINES

Brown, James W., Norberg, Kenneth D., and Srygley, Sara K. Administering Educational Media: Instructional Technology and Library Services, 2nd ed. New York: McGraw-Hill, 1972, pp. 223-249.

The chapter entitled "Administering Equipment" contains a systematic approach to 1) the purchase of essential, useful equipment to achieve instructional goals; 2) the selection of high quality items within budgetary constraints; 3) the distribution of equipment among users; and 4) the maintenance of equipment purchased.

Erickson, Carlton W.H. Administering Instructional Media Programs. New York: Macmillan, 1968, pp. 83-92.

Includes general and specific criteria for media equipment selection, efficient purchase procedures, and problem solving activities.

Rosenberg, Kenyon C. and Doskey, John S. Media Equipment: A Guide and Directory. Littleton, Colo.: Libraries Unlimited, Inc., 1976, pp. 15-19.

Includes general criteria for media equipment selection such as usefulness, cost, ease of operation, and quality of performance.

The Audio-Visual Equipment Directory, 1978-79, 24th ed. Fairfax, VA: National Audio-Visual Association, Inc., 1978. 482p. \$18.50 (prepaid), \$20.00 (billed), \$28.50 (to non-NAVA member firms commercially engaged in the audiovisual industry).

A comprehensive, fully-illustrated listing of audiovisual equipment designed to help buyers make practical cost-effective decisions on its purchase and use; includes price, model, weight, capacity, accessories, technical details, and dealer locations. Microform equipment on pp. 92-98.

AVMP 1979: Audiovisual Marketplace. A Multimedia Guide. New York: R.R. Bowker Company, 1979. 434p. \$23.50 (postpaid).

The ninth edition covers sources of audiovisual information and products--organizations, firms, activities, and personnel. Twenty-five sections are grouped under the headings AV Software, AV Hardware, and Reference, and include names of industry and related sources, product lines, producers and distributors, professional services, manufacturers, dealers, etc.

Auerbach Guide to Microform Readers and Reader Printers. Philadelphia, PA: Auerbach, Inc., 1975. \$19.95.

A report that includes advice on choosing equipment, a market overview, a tutorial section, and technical reports.

Ballou, Hubbard. Guide to Micrographic Equipment, 6th ed. Silver Spring, MD: National Micrographics Association, 1975. 552p. \$32.00.

Volume II of this three-volume set includes detailed information and specifications for user equipment such as readers, reader/printers, enlargers, and automatic retrieval equipment. It is 216 pages long and sells for \$15.00. 1976 Supplement also available from NMA.

Buyer's Guide to Micrographic Equipment, Products, and Services. Silver Spring, MD: National Micrographics Association, annual.

Designed to be a concise introduction and continuing reference to sources of currently available micrographic equipment, products, and services.

Dequin, Henry. A Guide to Selecting Learning Resource Materials and Equipment. Springfield, IL: State Board of Education, Illinois Office of Education, Department of Local Educational Agency Services, 1978. 55p. IR 007 060 (will be available from EDRS).

Gordon, Ronald F. Microfiche Viewing Equipment Guide, 3rd ed. Springfield, VA: National Technical Information Service, 1974. 98p. \$4.75.

Describes and illustrates microfiche readers and reader-printers manufactured or distributed in the United States, and gives viewer specifications and features.

Hawken, William R. Evaluating Microfiche Readers: A Handbook for Librarians. Washington, D.C.: Council on Library Resources, 1975. 64p.

Suggests desirable characteristics for readers to possess, and gives tests for resolution, evenness, and magnification; includes sample microfiche.

How to Select a Reader or a Reader-Printer. Silver Spring, MD: National Micrographics Association, 1974. 20p. \$2.00.

An illustrated and descriptive consumer guide.

The International File of Micrographics Equipment and Accessories, 1977/78. Weston, CT: Microform Review, 1977. \$125.00.

Provides the user with catalogs of every vendor of micrographics equipment and accessories worldwide, on microfiche.

International Microfilm Source Book 1976-77. New Rochelle, NY: Microfilm Publishing, Inc., 1976. 320p. \$32.50.

Gives the source for services and equipment related to micrographics, and includes indexes of products, sources, manufacturers, and trade names. Microform equipment on pp. 44-53.

Meckler, Alan M., Ed. Microform Market Place, 76-77: An International Directory of Micropublishing. Weston, CT: Microform Review, Inc., 1976. \$15.95.

Comprehensive information about micropublishers is provided, included indexes to subject areas covered and geographical location, a bibliography of primary sources, and a calendar of events.

Microfilm Source Book. New Rochelle, NY: Microfilm Publishing, Inc., 1972. \$32.50.

Contains information about products, and equipment manufacturers and dealers.

NRCd Evaluation Reports, 1967 - . United Kingdom: National Reprographic Center for documentation, Hatfield, Herts. \$75.00/year.

Five or six reports are published each year evaluating equipment.
