ABSTRACT

The performance of Los Angeles City College (L.A.C.C.) students who transferred to the University of California during the 1972-1973 academic year was studied and compared with past performance data. The study data were obtained from a report of the performance of new L.A.C.C. transfer students by the University of California and previous L.A.C.C. research studies. The findings of the study are presented in tables and figures. These findings show that: (1) 182 students (11 percent more than the previous year) transferred to the University of California from L.A.C.C.; (2) average GPA of the students at the University was over one-tenth of a grade point below that of the previous year transfers, but was higher than any other group prior to 1969; (3) 87 percent of the transfers attended UCLA, while the remainder attended six other branches of the university; (4) 53 percent of the transfers were male; (5) of those attending UCLA, 80 percent chose a major in the College of Letters and Science, 15 percent chose fine arts, and 5 percent chose engineering; those in fine arts earned the highest GPA; (6) 57 percent of the grades earned at UCLA were A's and B's, with only 8 percent being D's and F's; the highest grades earned were in foreign language and fine arts, whereas the lowest were in economics and physical sciences; and (7) the largest enrollments were in history, art, English, and psychology. PURPOSE OF THE STUDY

To assess academic performance of Los Angeles City College transfers entering the University of California 1972-1973 and to compare with past performance.

PROCEDURE OF THE STUDY

The Office of Educational Relations of the University of California sends annually to L.A.C.C. a report of the performance of new L.A.C.C. transfers. The most recent report included individual grade reports for 1972-1973 entrants, a summary of performance of these students, and some comparative information regarding transfers from all California Community Colleges. The content and format of the report has undergone considerable change since the University inaugurated the "quarter system" in 1966. Comparison with earlier years is difficult for several reasons, among which are (1) different campuses of the University report statistics in different ways: (2) some figures include first quarter performance only, others include all work undertaken during the academic year; (3) some figures include Fall entrants only, others include all transfers through the year. For these reasons, some of the figures reported in the findings of the next section cannot be reconciled exactly with those of the UC report. Figures were obtained by a detailed analysis of that report and the accompanying grade reports. In spite of discrepancies indicated above, the overall conclusions of the report are believed reasonably

accurate and a true indication of current L.A.C.C. performance at the University of California. Findings in the next section were obtained by analysis of the materials sent by the University, and from previous L.A.C.C. Research Studies.

FINDINGS

Table 1 presents 1972-1973 comparative data for all California community college transfers and for L.A.C.C. transfers entering the University of California. Figures given are number of entrants, percent earning below a "C" average, percent earning a "B" average or above, grade point average at junior college (cumulative), grade point average at the University (all courses taken during the academic year), and the differential in grade point averages. Figures are given for students who were eligible for the University at the time of high school graduation, for those ineligible at that time, and for the total.

Table 2 presents a summary over the last fifteen years of the information described above. Prior to 1966-67 (the beginning of the quarter system at UCLA), U.C. grade point averages were based on first semester performance only. Since 1966-67, U.C. grade point averages have been based on all courses taken during any of the three quarters.

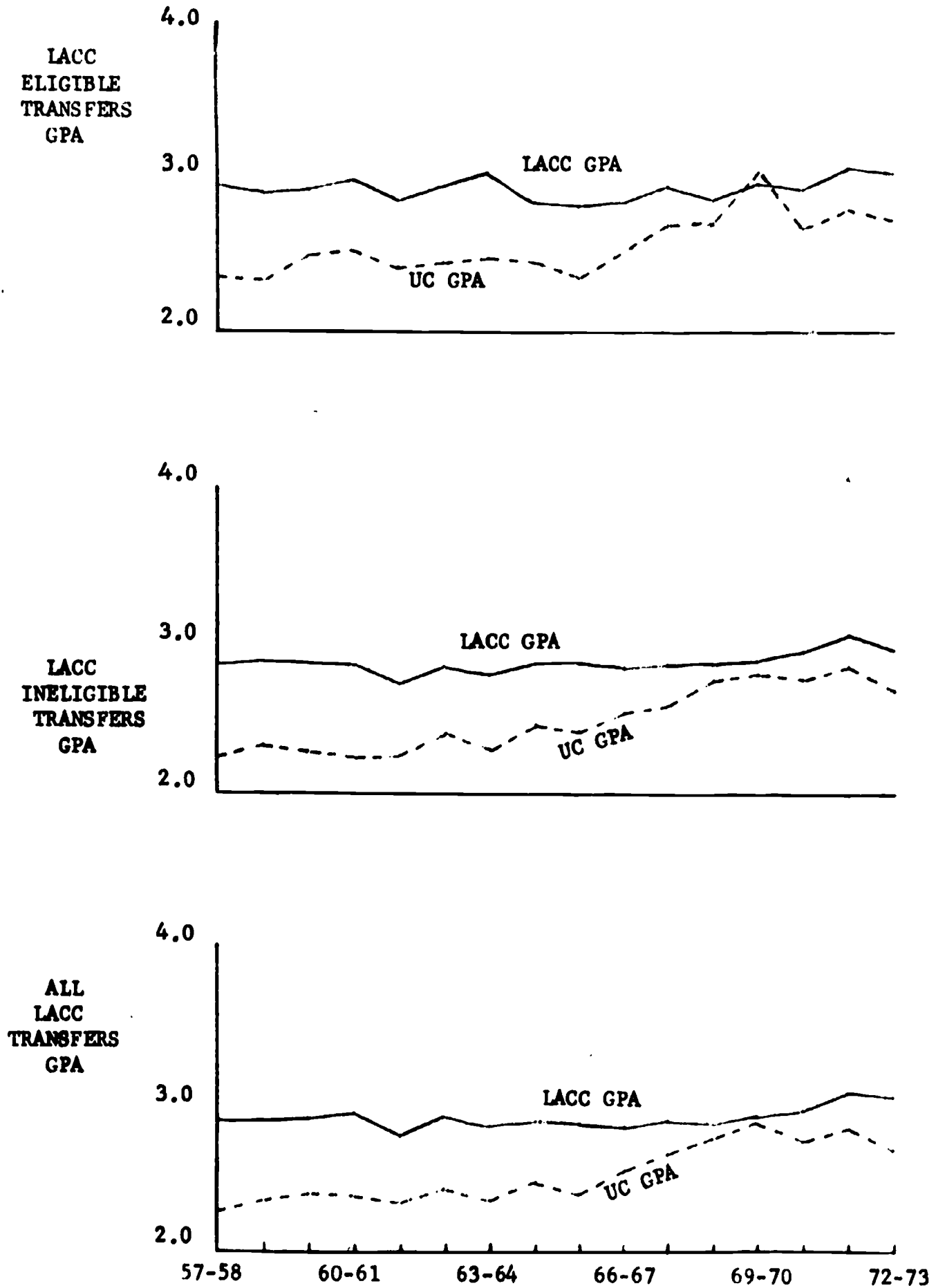
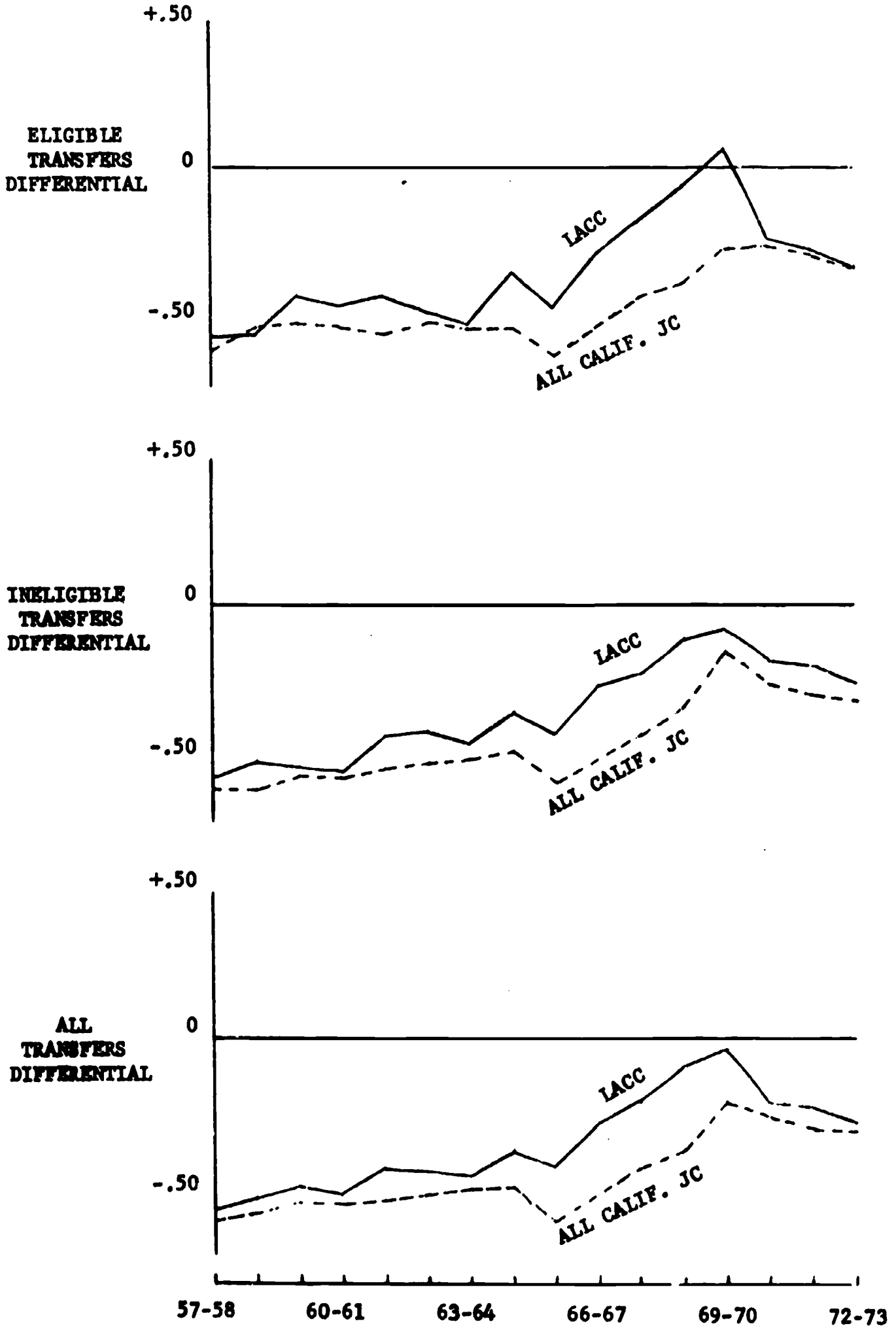


FIGURE 2 - Differential Between Junior College GPA and University of California GPA, 1957-58 to 1972-73 (UC GPA - JC GPA)

Figures 1 and 2 present in graphical form some of the fifteen year summary data, including some comparable information of all California junior college transfers.

Table 3 presents data on 1972-73 L.A.C.C. transfers analyzed by campus of transfer. Table 4 analyzes the transfers to UCLA (87% of the total) according to sex and college major.

Findings (continued)

Table 5 presents a detailed breakdown by departments of grades earned by transfers to UCLA. Table 6 shows, in rank order, grade point averages, earned in the departments with 15 or more enrollments and also shows performance for males, females, eligibles, and ineligibles in these departments.

FIGURE 1 - Grade Point Averages at L.A.C.C. and UC of LACC Transfers to the University of California, 1957-58 to 1972-73

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

This study reports on performance of L.A.C.C. students who transferred to the University of California during the 1972-1973 academic year. Following are some conclusions from the findings of the study:

- (1) 182 students (11% more than the 1971-1972 total) transferred to the University of California from L.A.C.C. during the 1972-1973 academic year. Of these, 75 (41%) were eligible to have entered the University directly from high school, and 107 (59%) were ineligible.
- (2) Not included in the above totals (or in the study analysis) are 166 additional transfers "not charged" by the University to L.A.C.C. These include 153 admissions by "special action," (i.e., students not normally eligible for admission but admitted because of special conditions or, more generally, as part of a special group such as EOP), 6 to Santa Cruz (no grades), and 7 who completed no work at the University. This number has increased markedly in recent years, due to the special admission programs for the "disadvantaged" student.
- (3) Average GPA at the University was over one-tenth (of a grade point) below that for 1971-1972 transfers for both eligibles and ineligibles but still higher than any other entering group prior to 1969. Apparently the upward trend in GPA earned by junior college transfers throughout the state that was monotonic and significant in the late 1960's has reversed (Figure 2). L.A.C.C. transfers differential performance (i.e., U.C. GPA-L.A.C.C. GPA) remains smaller than the statewide average as it has for over fifteen years.
- (4) 87% of the L.A.C.C. transfers attended UCLA with the remainder going to six other branches of the University.
- (5) 53% of the transfers were male. Female GPA was higher than male for both eligibles and ineligibles.
- (6) Of those attending UCLA, 80% chose a major in the College of Letters and Science, 15% in Fine Arts, and 5% in Engineering. Those in Fine Arts earned the highest GPA.
- (7) 57% of grades earned at UCLA were A's and B's, while only 8% were D's or F's.
- (8) Comparison of grades earned in various departments at UCLA reveals highest grades were earned in foreign languages and fine arts, lowest in economics and physical sciences. Largest enrollments were in history, art, English and psychology.
