AESTRACT

The Japan Documentation Center was formally established in 1970 by the East Asian Institute of Columbia University with the support of the Yoshida International Education Foundation. The Center is designed to perform a radically new and unique service in the United States: to make available in one convenient location the latest information on contemporary Japanese domestic and foreign affairs. The Center collection consists largely of current Japanese government documents, political party reports, the publications of private organizations (such as banks, business and economic organizations, and private research groups), and selected magazines and newspapers. These materials are being assembled for the use of the scholar and other persons concerned with issues related to today's Japan. In general, the Center seeks to appeal to as many research interests as possible within, of course, certain limitations of time, space and financing. Its goal is to concentrate upon the systematic collection of current materials on Japan which deal with political, economic and social developments of relevance and significance and which are not ordinarily included in regular library acquisitions. Objectives of the Japan Documentation Center

The Japan Documentation Center was formally established in 1970 by the East Asian Institute of Columbia University with the support of the Yoshida International Education Foundation. The Center is designed to perform a radically new and unique service in the United States: to make available in one convenient location the latest information on contemporary Japanese domestic and foreign affairs. The Center collection consists largely of current Japanese government documents, political party reports, the publications of private organizations (such as banks, business and economic organizations, and private research groups), and selected magazines and newspapers. These materials are being assembled for the use of the scholar and other persons concerned with issues related to today's Japan.

In general, the Center seeks to appeal to as many research interests as possible within, of course, certain limitations of time, space and financing. Its goal is to concentrate upon the systematic collection of current materials on Japan which deal with political, economic and social developments of relevance and significance and which are not ordinarily included in regular library acquisitions.

Staff of the Japan Documentation Center

The Center employs a staff in Tokyo to collect and ship materials and another in New York for processing and filing. The Center's representa-



tive in Tokyo is Mr. Tadashi Yamamoto, Executive Director of the Japan Center for International Exchange. Mr. Yamamoto has extensive contacts which greatly facilitate the collection of materials usually difficult to obtain and has a staff that has expended considerable time and imagination in building the basic collection of the Center.

The Bibliographer of the Center is Miss Fumiko Mori. Miss Mori received her B. A. degree from Kyoto University and her M. I. A. degree from Columbia University and is fluent in Japanese and English. She exercises overall responsibility for the Center in consultation with a committee of Professors James Morley, Gerald Curtis, Herbert Passin and James Nakamura.

Current Status of the Japan Documentation Center

The Tokyo office of the Center began in the summer of 1970 to contact a large number of organizations for providing materials to the Center. During this period, emphasis was placed on having the Tokyo office collect materials on a non-selective basis. Our purpose was to establish contact with as many organizations as possible without concern in this early stage for judging the value of materials received. The materials began to arrive at Columbia in late November 1970. Additional documents, reports, and other publications have been received regularly since that time. The Center was located temporarily at the East Asian Institute in Kent Hall up to September 1971 when it moved to the Herbert Lehman Library in the new International Affairs Building. From September, due to the continuous dock strikes on the west coast, the pace of receiving materials from Japan slowed down but it recovered in December 1971. Meanwhile, in late October, the Bibliographer of the Center visited the Tokyo office and had extensive



discussions about our activities, research interests and future plans.

The New York office and the Tokyo office have establihed good communications not only with regard to general guidelines but also with regard to detailed information.

The New York office does extensive research on current topics in Japan through magazines, newspapers and academic papers in order to search for the latest materials which should be obtained. By frequently corresponding with the Tokyo office we obtain them efficiently and quickly. The Center in New York also pays close attention to the publication of materials in English both in the United States and Japan and if necessary purchases them for the use of students and scholars. We concentrate, however, on current materials in the Japanese language.

Other than collecting and sorting materials, the Center also maintains a clipping service. Since October 1, 1970, the Center has been subscribing to two Japanese newspapers: the Asahi Shimbun and the Japan Times. These newspapers are received daily by air mail and are being clipped and filed in binders for reference under 52 subject headings (see Appendix I: "Newspaper Clipping File Subject Headings"). At present, the Center has a continuous record of clippings from October 1, 1970 to February 1, 1972. Our policy is to keep the latest two months' issues without being clipped since the combination of clipping according to the subjects and displaying the latest two months' issues seems to be most effective for researchers and students.

Another function of the Center in New York is to provide assistance to researchers and students on campus and to those who seek information about Japan from outside campus such as businessmen, journalists and students

from other universities. The Bibliographer not only tries to give information for materials which are available on campus but also helps in making contacts with other institutions.

In order to present a more detailed picture of our operations, the list in Appendices presents the names of organizations from Which we receive materials (see Appendix II: "Organizations From Which Materials Are Received -- as of March 23, 1972").

<u>Future Plans</u>

The period between the fall of 1970 when the Center was established and the spring of 1972 has been an initial organizing period. We have tried to formulate Center policies very carefully in order to maximize its value as a unique aid to Japanese studies. We believe that our efforts to date have already amply shown that our approach is enriching the research source of social science in Japanese studies.

Considering the fact that a lost all of the materials we have been receiving are on contemporary affairs, it is vital that we keep as close contact as possible with the Tokyo office in order to fulfill the research needs here at Columbia. The service of the Tokyo office has been proving very satisfactory considering the limited time and human resources they have and difference of custom and the characteristics of human relationship between the two countries in terms of contacting various governmental and private organizations. However, depending on only the Tokyo office all the times sometimes causes unnecessary technical procedures in corresponding and contacting the organizations we are interested in. For this reason the

Center in New York also tries to explore new contacts as much as possible through its own channels.

Although the volume of the Center's materials is still small, new materials are flowing in; user requests also are increasing not only from researchers within the Columbia area, but also from those who are distant from New York City. It may become necessary in the future to establish some regular system of microfilming, preferably, within the context of the operation of the whole library system, not just of the Center's operation. Up to now we have been paying particular attention to the governmental agencies and political parties. In the future, we plan to expand our attention to various research and other institutions and explore the possibilities of obtaining materials through some kind of exchange program.
