ABSTRACT

Focusing on data for 1992-93, this institutional profile provides information on students, faculty, staff, finance, facilities, and services at Wallace Community College Selma (WCCS), in Alabama. Following an introductory section providing a history of WCCS and reviewing the college's mission and goals, the report provides detailed student data and includes information on: credit hour production from 1987 to 1993; credit enrollment for 1988 to 1992; credit enrollment by race, sex, and county; credit enrollment characteristics; feeder high school enrollment; enrollment by program, 1989-93; awards conferred; student financial aid profiles; non-credit enrollment; companies served through business and industry instruction; and job placement statistics, 1988-93. The next section provides data on WCCS' Educational Talent Search Program, an effort involving nine target high schools to promote college attendance through student services. Next, a brief report on WCCS's experiences with Tech Prep is presented. The following section provides data on school personnel, including salaries, race, gender, employment status, and full- and part-time faculty characteristics. Following data on fall 1992 library resources, financial data are provided for 1988-1993, including expenditures by function and object, revenues by source, and foundation revenues. Next, data on physical plant assets and a results of a building inventory are presented. The report then provides information on the Alabama Community College system, including data on credit hour production, student headcount by race and sex, and personnel classified by salary schedule. Data tables; campus, service area, and system maps; and a report evaluation form are included. (KP)

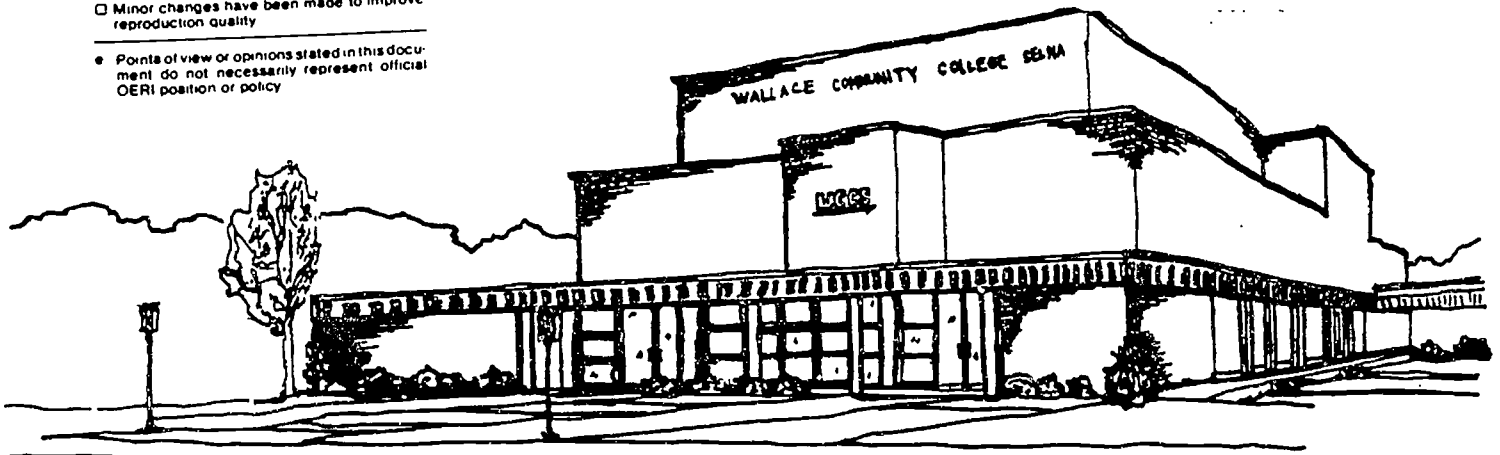
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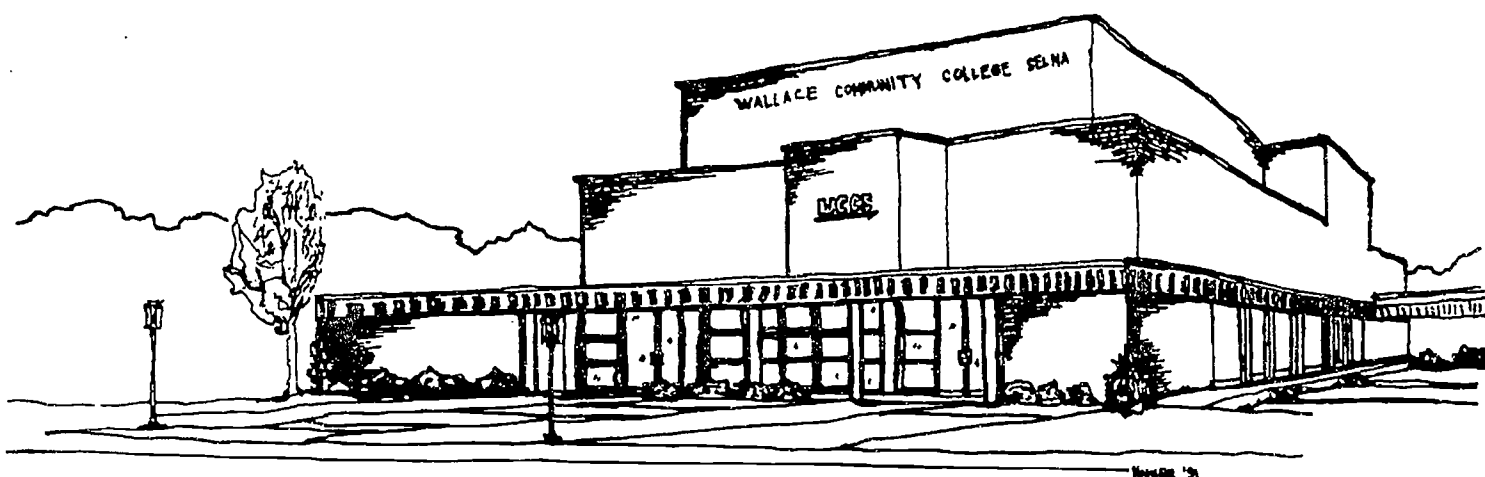

HISTORY OF

WALLACE COMMUNITY COLLEGE SELMA

On May 3, 1963, the Alabama State Legislature approved Acts No. 92, 93, and 94 which provided for the financing, development, and control of Alabama's 2 year colleges. These Acts paved the way for the eventual creation of Wallace Community College Selma and The Alabama College System's other junior and technical colleges.

Many individuals and organizations in the Selma and Dallas county area were active in obtaining Selma as a site for a technical institute. Mr. E.S. Watts donated 20 acres of land in north Selma, just inside the city limits, to be used for the location of the technical institute. The name of the institute was named William Rufus King State Vocational Technical School in honor of the famous Alabamian who served 29 years as a United States Senator and served as Vice President in 1852 under President Franklin Pierce. William Rufus King was responsible for giving Selma its name.

When the college opened for its first classes in 1966, the campus consisted of an administration building, cafeteria, seven shops and laboratory buildings, and a warehouse. All of the classrooms were provided with central air-conditioning and equipped with modern facilities. The initial enrollment was 32 students.

On February 16, 1970, under the advisement of Governor Albert P. Brewer, the Alabama Trade School and Junior College Authority approved a resolution establishing a junior college in Selma on the same or adjacent site of the William Rufus King State Technical Institute. The State Board of Education gave its approval the same day. Prior to the ground breaking ceremonies the name of the institution was changed to George C. Wallace State Junior College and Technical Institute in honor of the incoming governor. Mr. Charles L. Byrd, who had been the Director of the Technical Institute, was appointed president. The State Board of Education changed the institution's name to George Corley Wallace State Community College on October 1, 1973. Mr. Stan Frasier served as interim president from January until May 1989, at which time Dr. Julius R. Brown became president of the college.

PHILOSOPHY, MISSION, AND GOALS OF WALLACE COMMUNITY COLLEGE SELMA

The philosophy of Wallace Community College Selma is expressed in the following beliefs:

*Education is essential to the economic, social, environmental, and political well being of the citizens of West Central Alabama.

*Education should be made academically, geographically, physically, and financially accessible to the students.

*Wallace Community College Selma is uniquely qualified to deliver excellent and equitable educational opportunities and services.

The mission of Wallace Community College Selma is to provide high-quality educational opportunities and services that are responsive to individual, community and State needs. To accomplish this mission, Wallace Community College - Selma shall provide the following:

*General Education and Collegiate Programs at the freshman and sophomore levels that prepare students for transfer to other colleges and universities.

*Technical, Vocational, and Career Education that prepares students for immediate employment, retrains existing employees, and promotes local and state economic stability and competitiveness.

*Business and Industry Development Training that meets employer needs.

*Developmental Education that assists individuals in improving learning skills and overcoming educational deficiencies.

*Student Services and Activities that assist individuals in formulating and achieving their educational goals.

*Continuing Education and personal enrichment opportunities that support life-long learning and the civic, social, and cultural quality of life.

*Operation of a quality, comprehensive community college.

Imperative I: Accessibility

Goal 1: To provide educational access to individuals with a desire and documented ability to benefit from the College's offerings.

Goal 2: To provide affordable tuition and fees and make available comprehensive financial aid programs.

Goal 3: To provide educational offerings in locations, at times and in facilities that can best serve the College's communities.

Imperative II: Quality

Goal 1: To assure quality in all programs and services by employing a continuing cycle of effective planning, evaluation, and improvement.

Goal 2: To strengthen teaching and learning by promoting innovative and effective teaching methods.

Goal 3: To facilitate course and program transferability, equivalency, and articulation between the College and Alabama's public universities.

Goal 4: To attract, retain and support qualified personnel and to provide comprehensive opportunities for their professional growth.

Goal 5: To secure funding sufficient to assure a quality learning environment.

Goal 6: To assure that all institutions acquire and maintain accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and appropriate program accreditations.

Imperative III: Diversity

Goal 1: To assure that educational opportunities are available without regard to race, gender, ethnicity, socio-economic status, disability or age to those who have documented ability to benefit.

Goal 2: To assess special educational needs of diverse student populations and provide support and educational services to meet those special needs.

Imperative IV: Economic Development

Goal 1: To stimulate economic development in Alabama through education, training, and retraining to meet the needs of private and public sector employers.

Goal 2: To integrate the College fully into the local economic development effort and to increase public awareness of the College in this role.

Imperative V: Community Services

Goal 1: To provide community service activities and establish partnerships which support civic, economic, educational, and cultural needs within the College's service area.

Goal 2: To provide adequate and flexible facilities, equipment and institutional services to cooperating businesses, agencies and other non-profit groups for community program activities consistent with institutional goals and policies.

Imperative VI: Public Relations Strategies

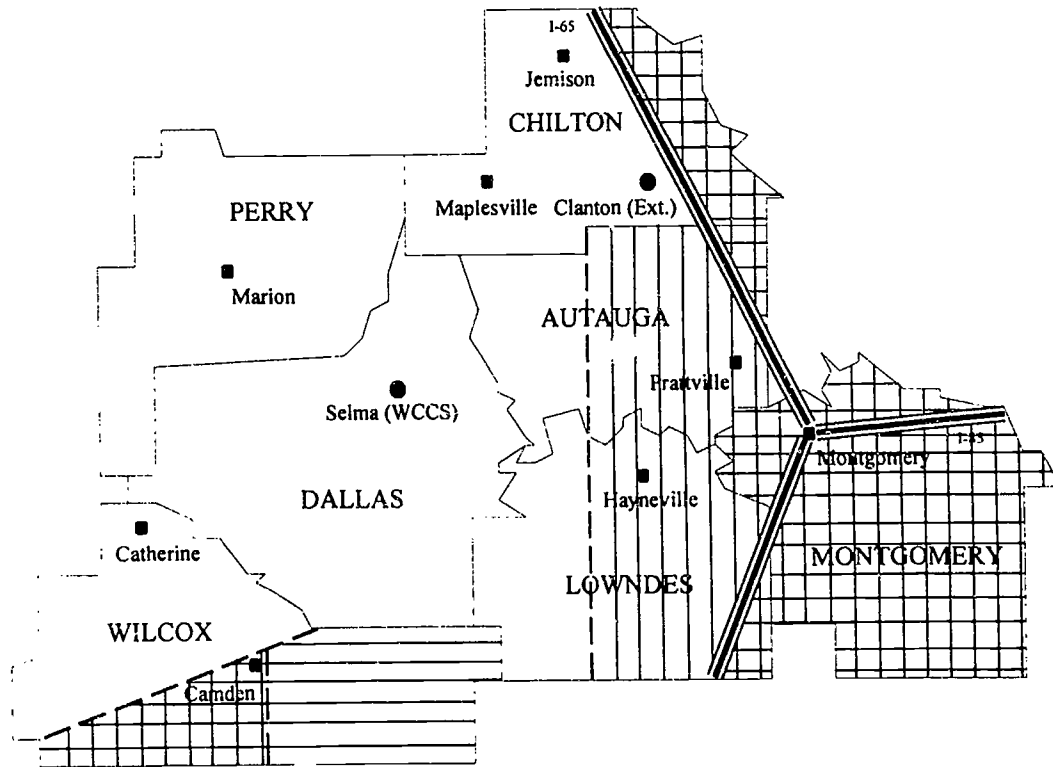

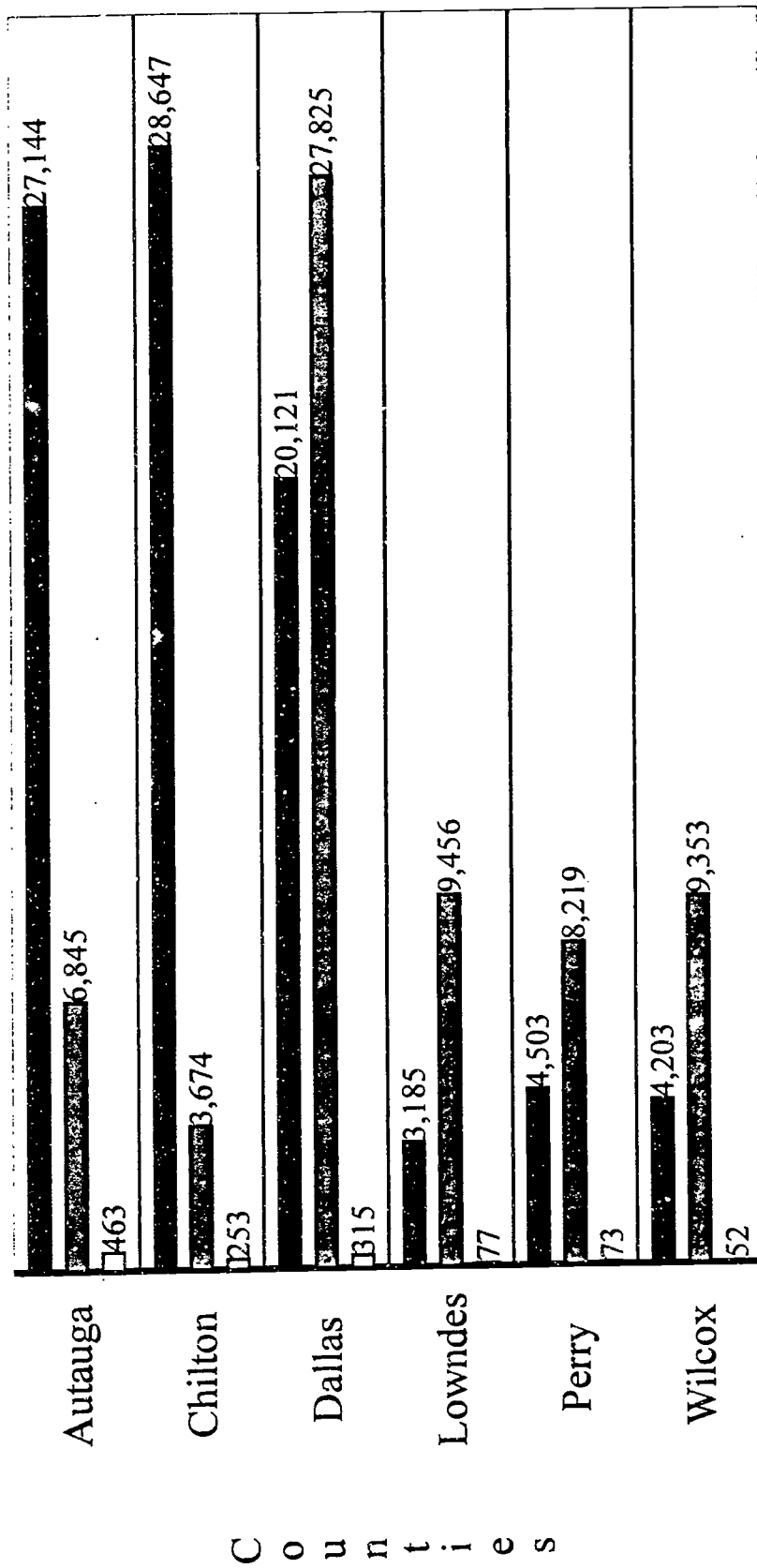

Program Service Area Race Percentages

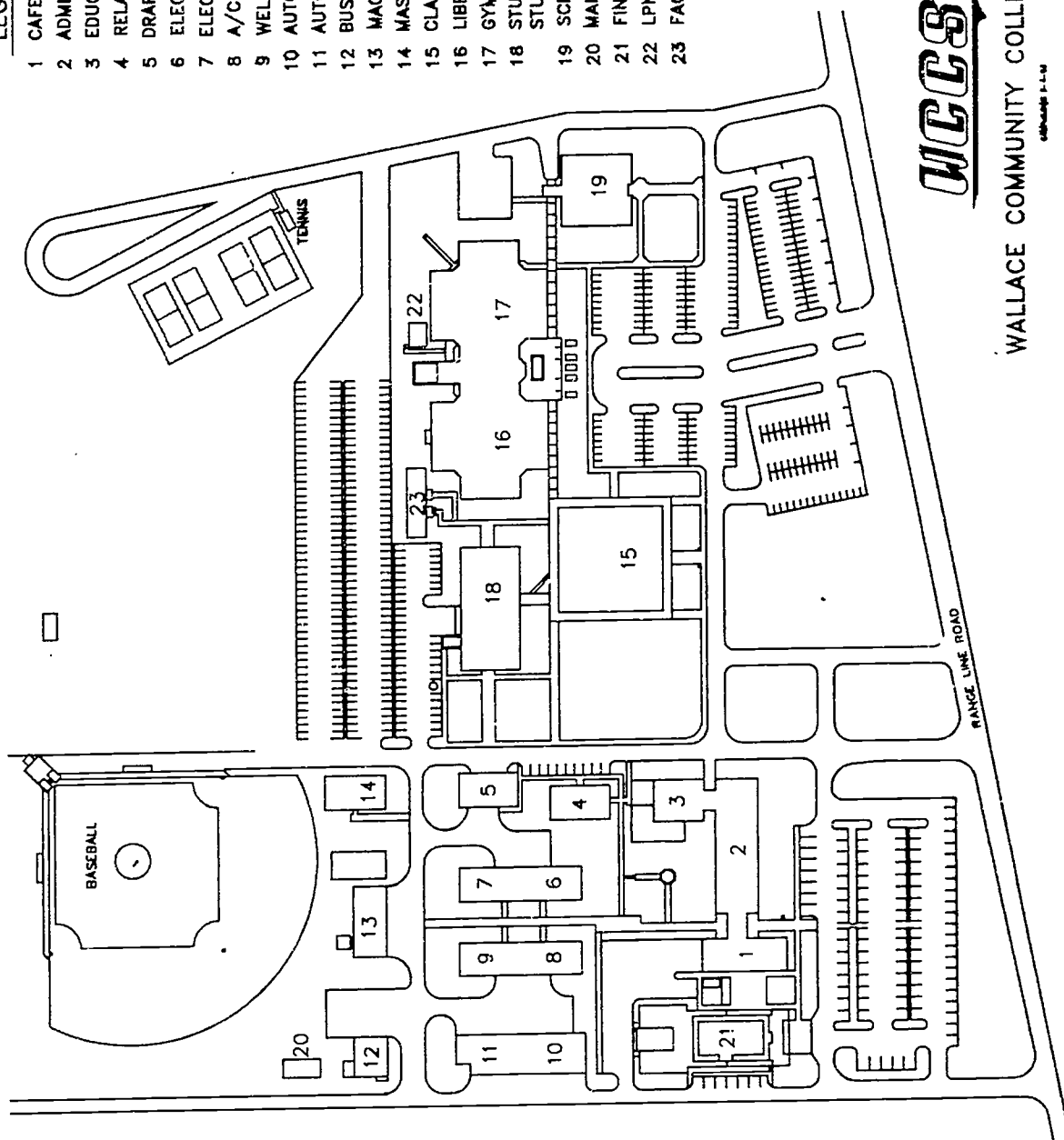

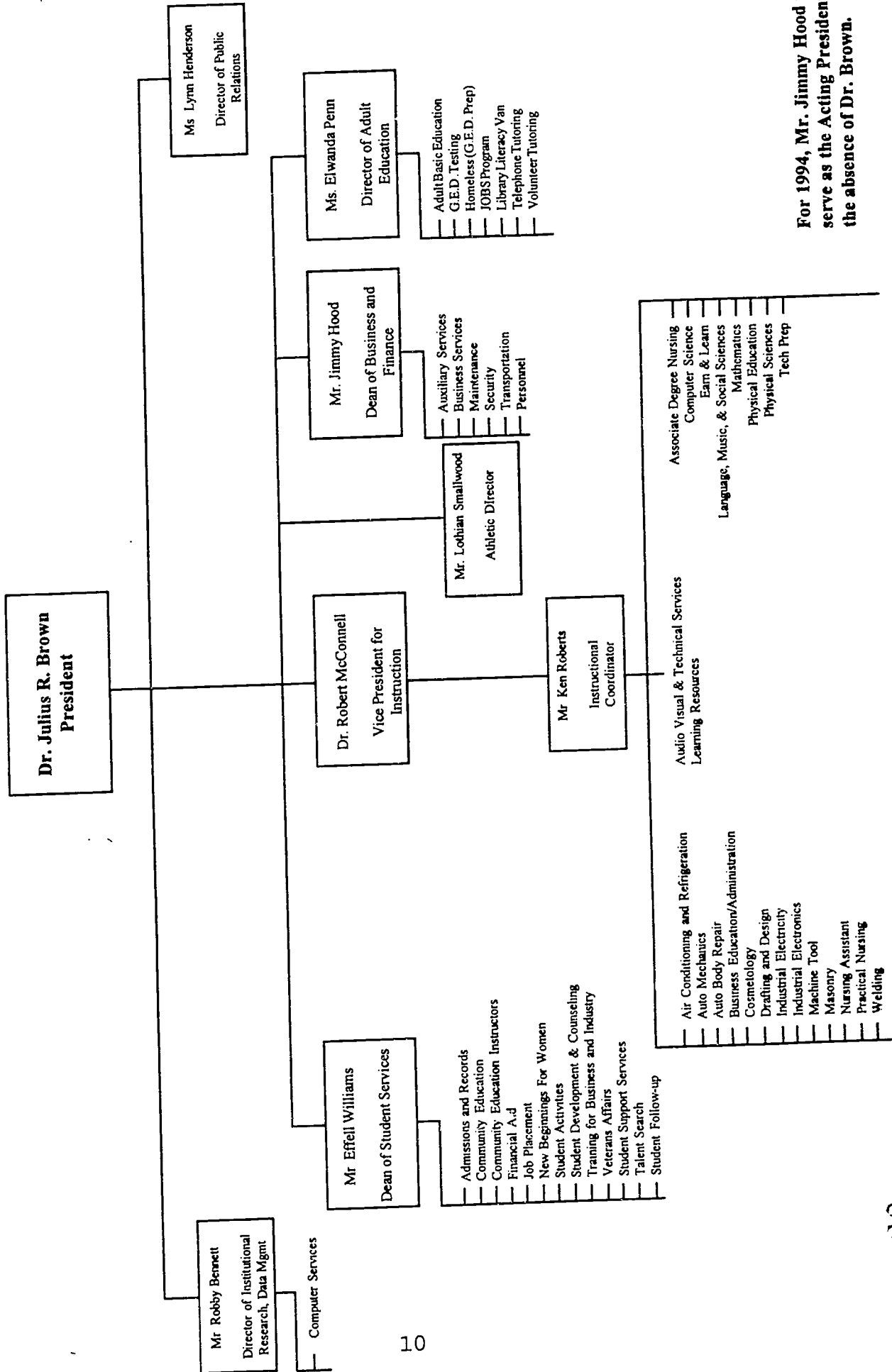

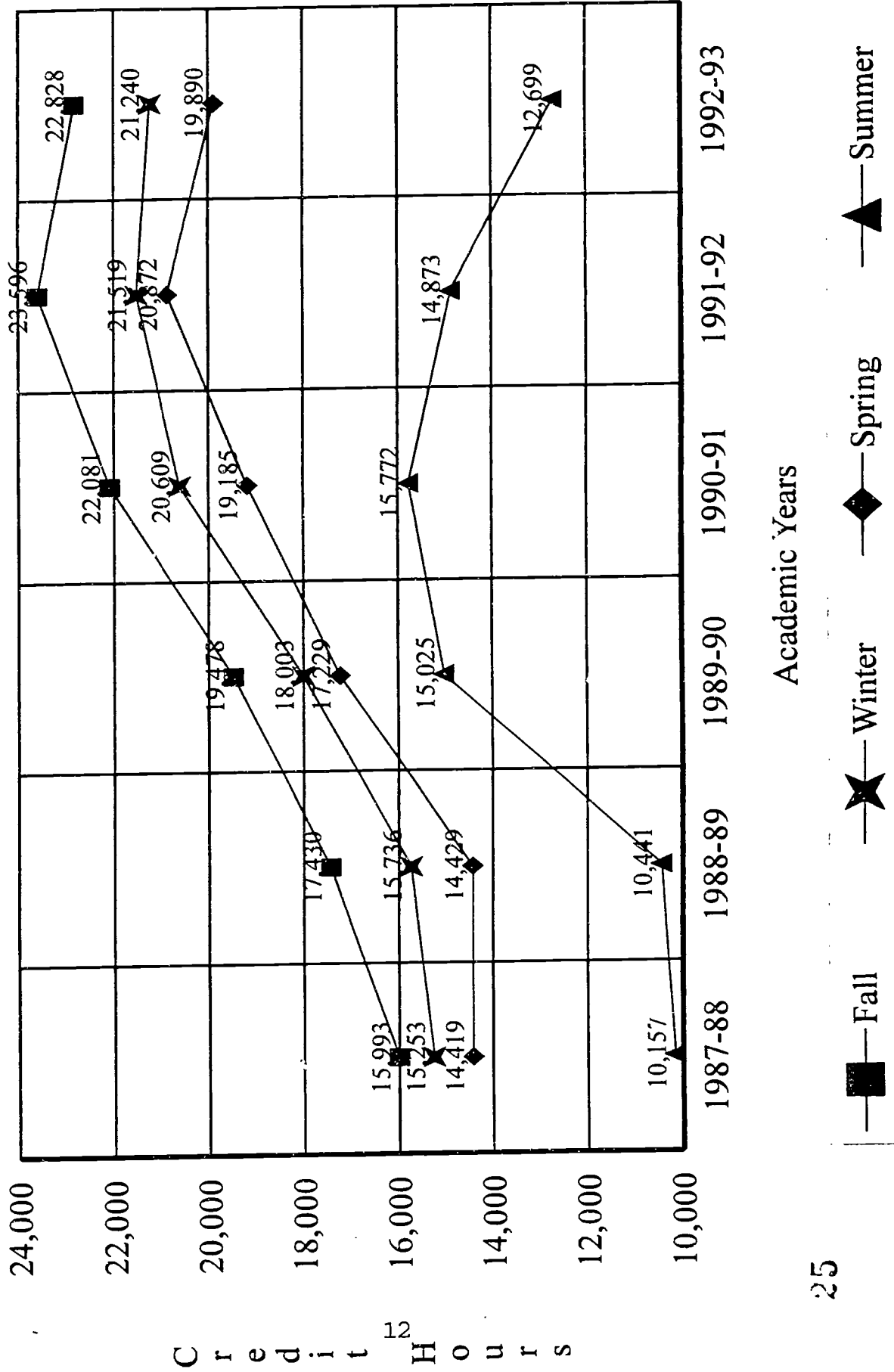

Credit Enrollment History

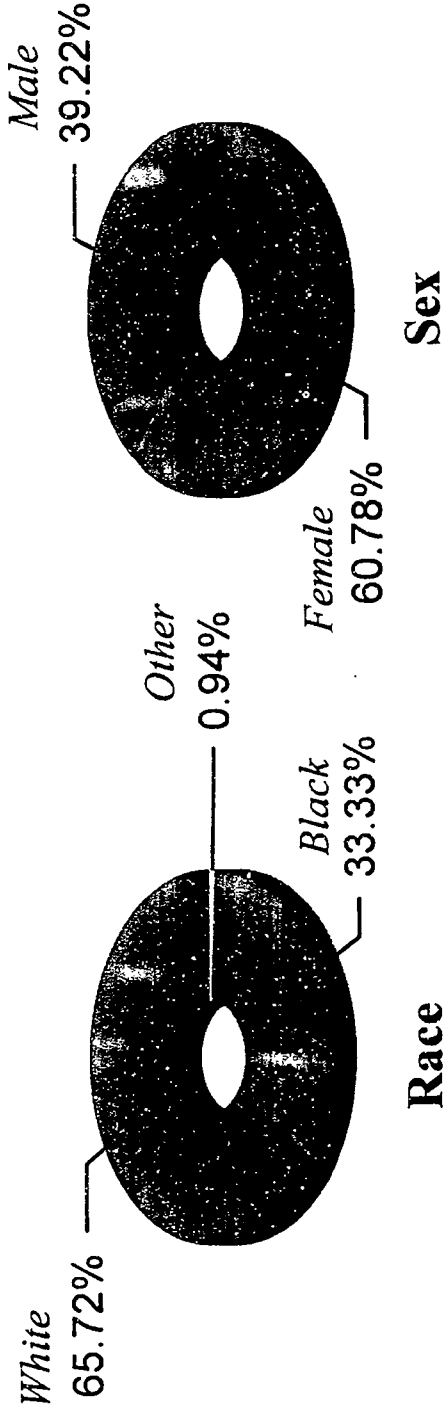

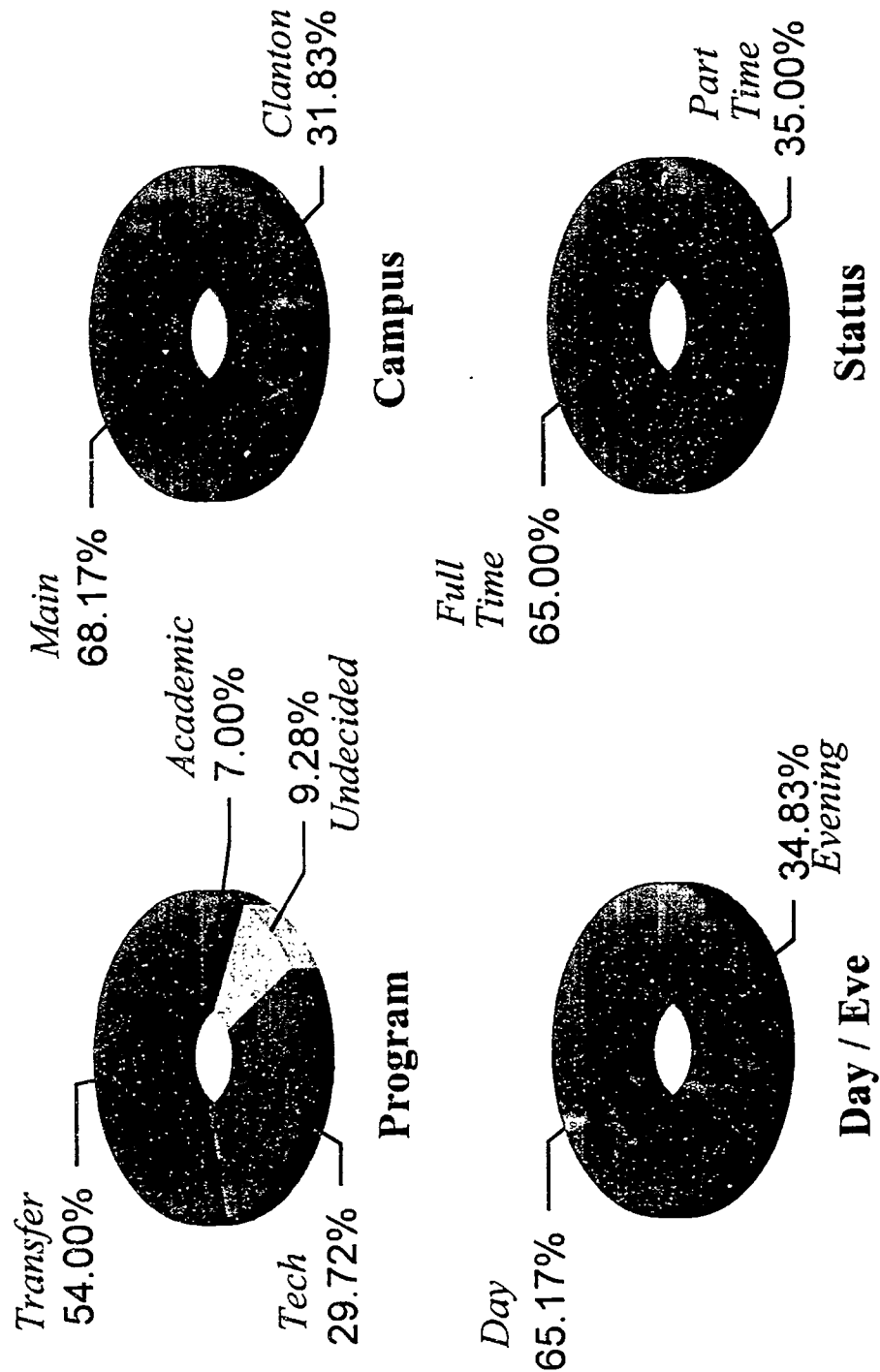
Credit Enrollment by Race and Sex

Fall Quarter 1992



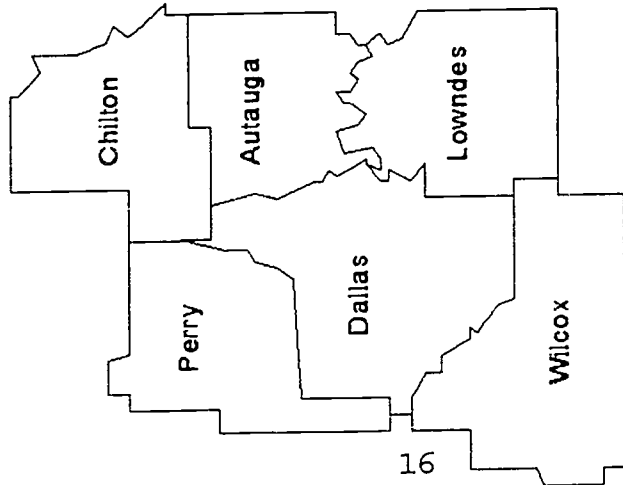
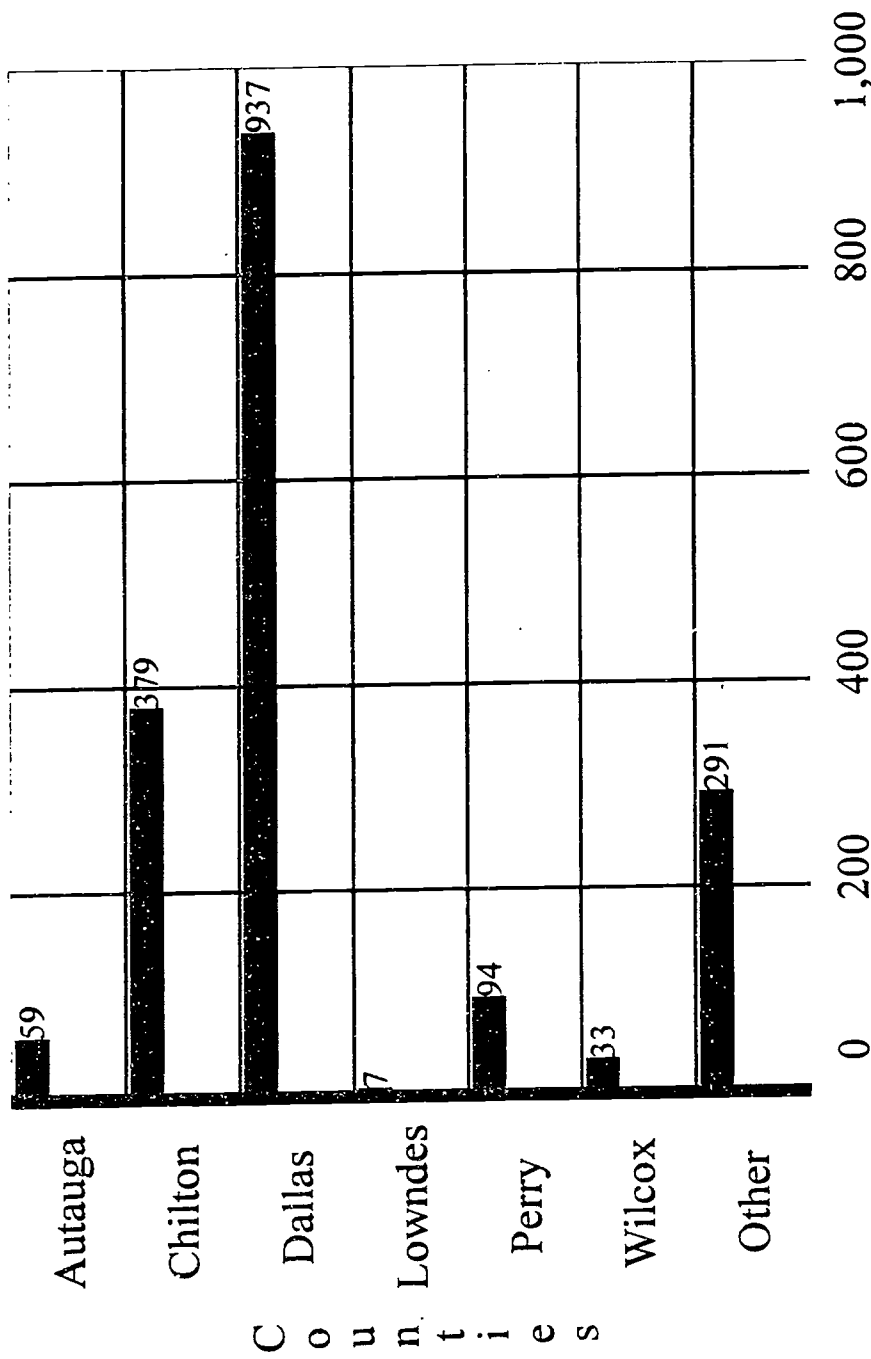
Credit Enrollment Characteristics

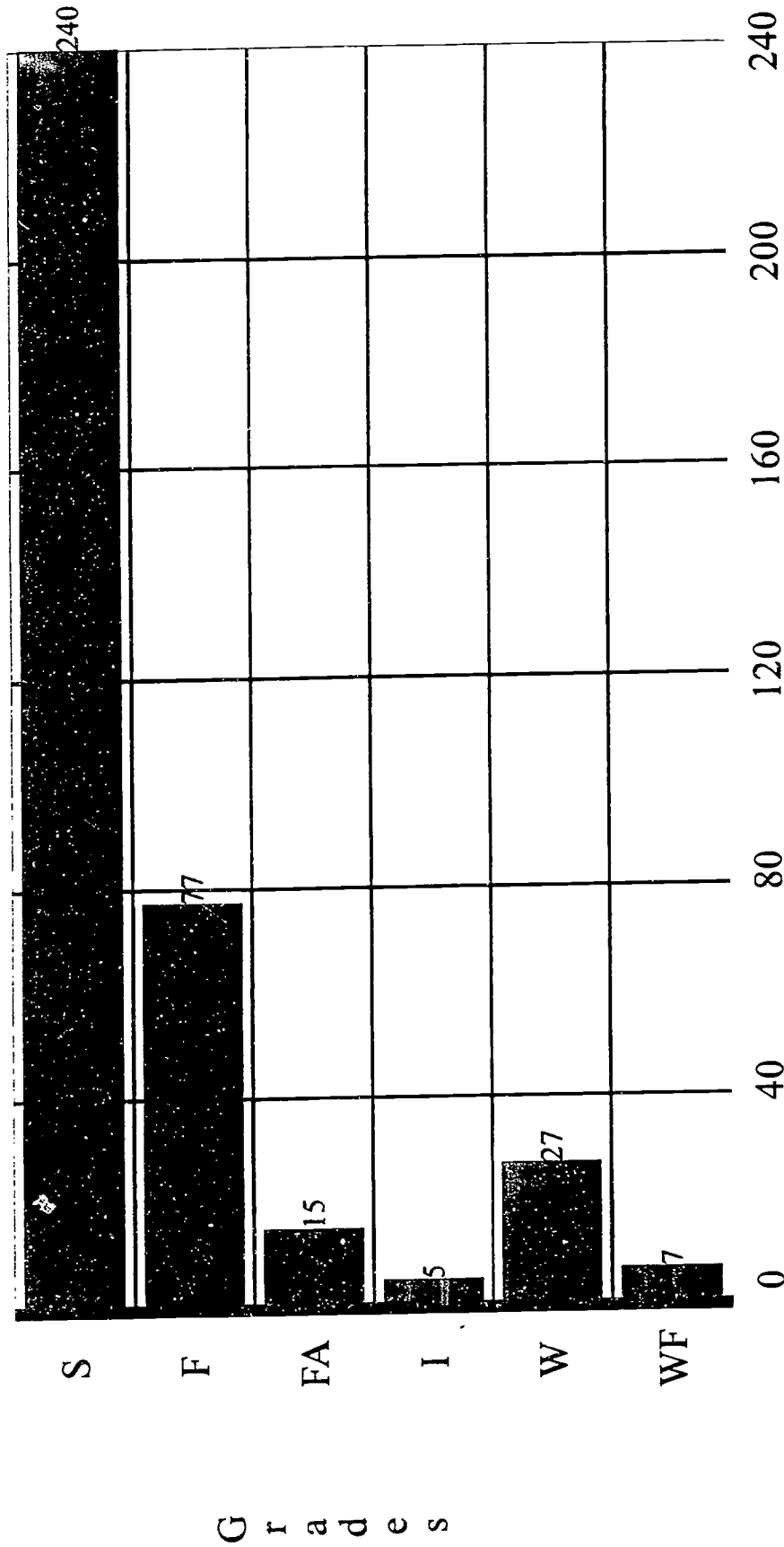

Educational Talent Search

The 1992-93 school year was another exciting year for the Educational Talent Search Program at Wallace Community College Selma (WCCS). The hard work of the staff, the assistance and support of the WCCS family, and the excellent cooperation of the eleven target schools allowed the project to exceed each of its stated objectives for 1992-93. The program was funded to serve 750 students; however, through the hard work of the Talent Search Staff, 932 students were served during the year. More than 88% of the seniors enrolled in postsecondary education, and over 72% of the 7th and 8th graders enrolled in college preparatory programs. Several of the top ranked students at the target schools were Talent Search participants.

The students were provided counseling, academic advising, tutorial assistance, campus visits to post-secondary institutions, and cultural enrichment activities and programs. Also, for the first time, the Program sponsored an academic summer camp for grades seven through twelve.

Based on the accomplishments of the past two years, the Program should have even greater success for the 1993-94 school year.

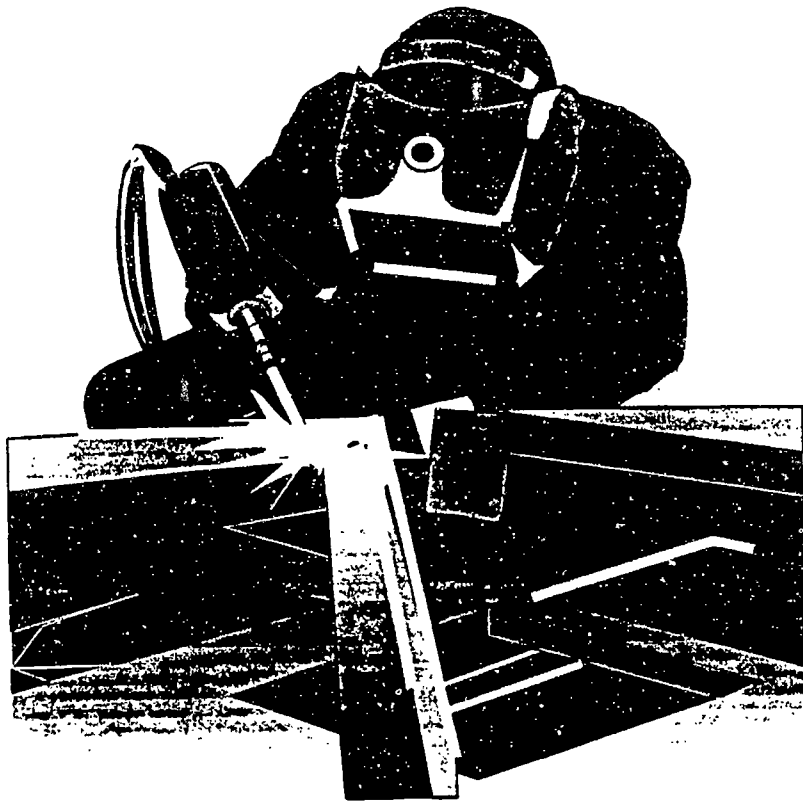

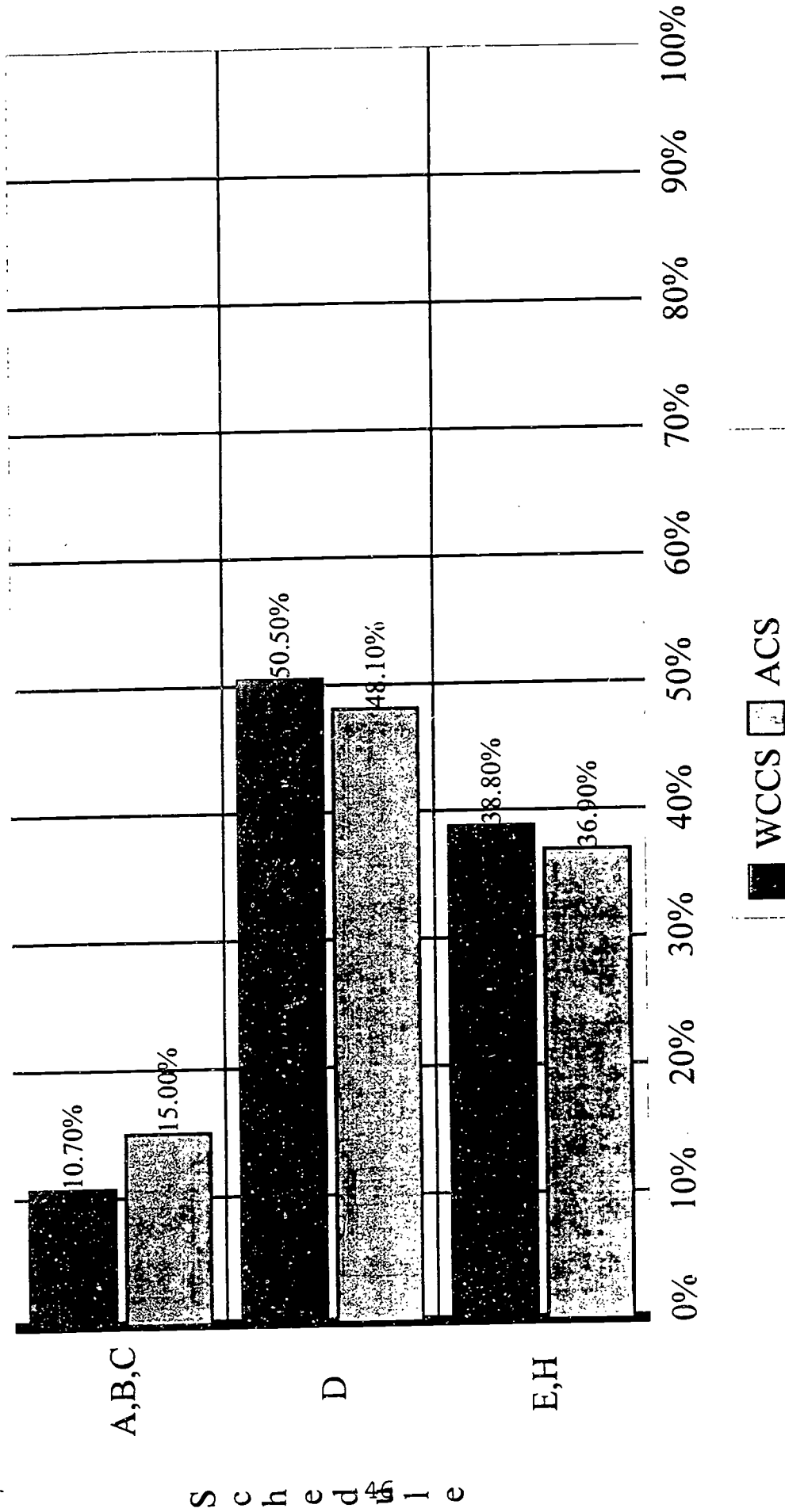

Comparison of Personnel By Salary Schedule

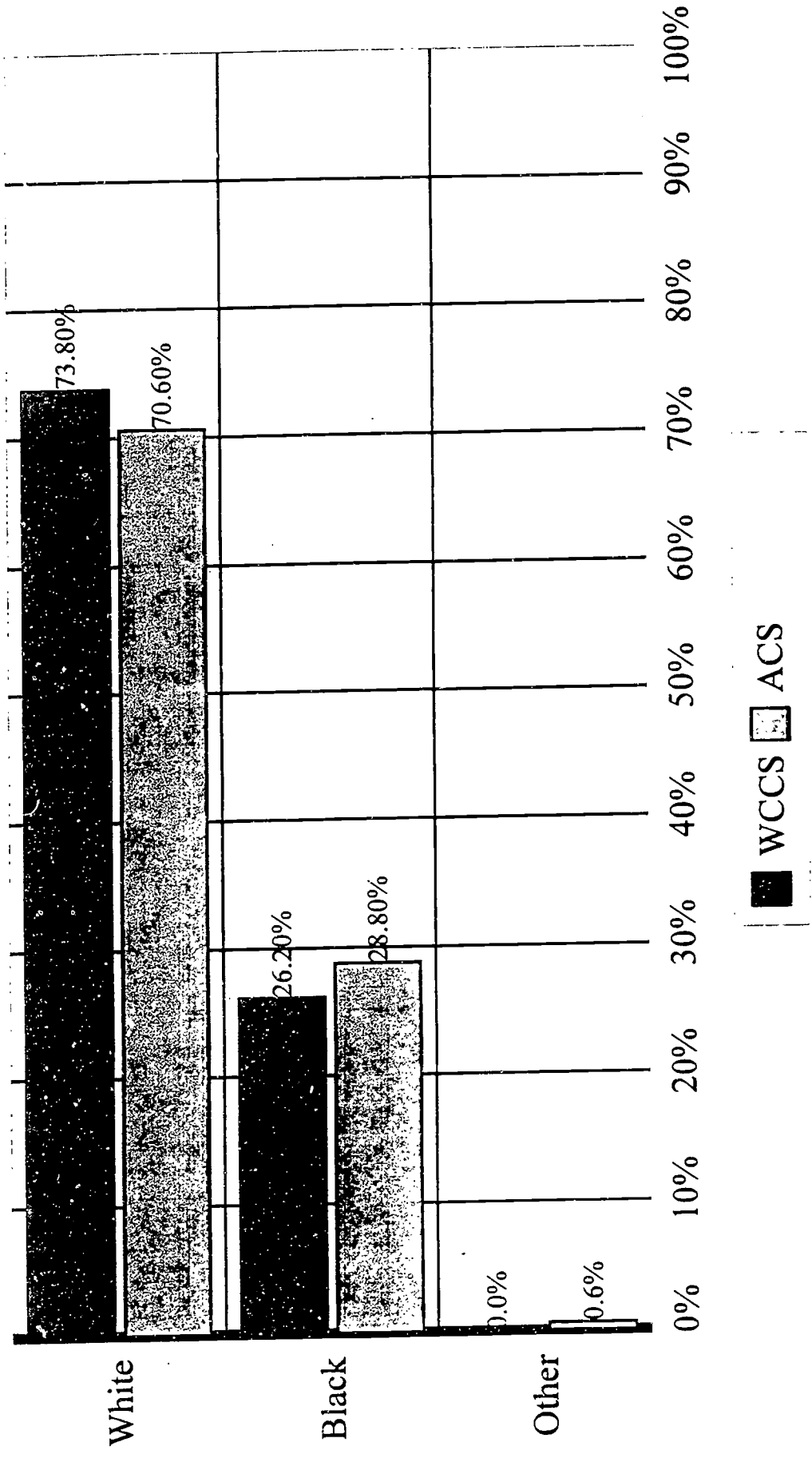
Fall Quarter 1992

Fall Quarter 1992



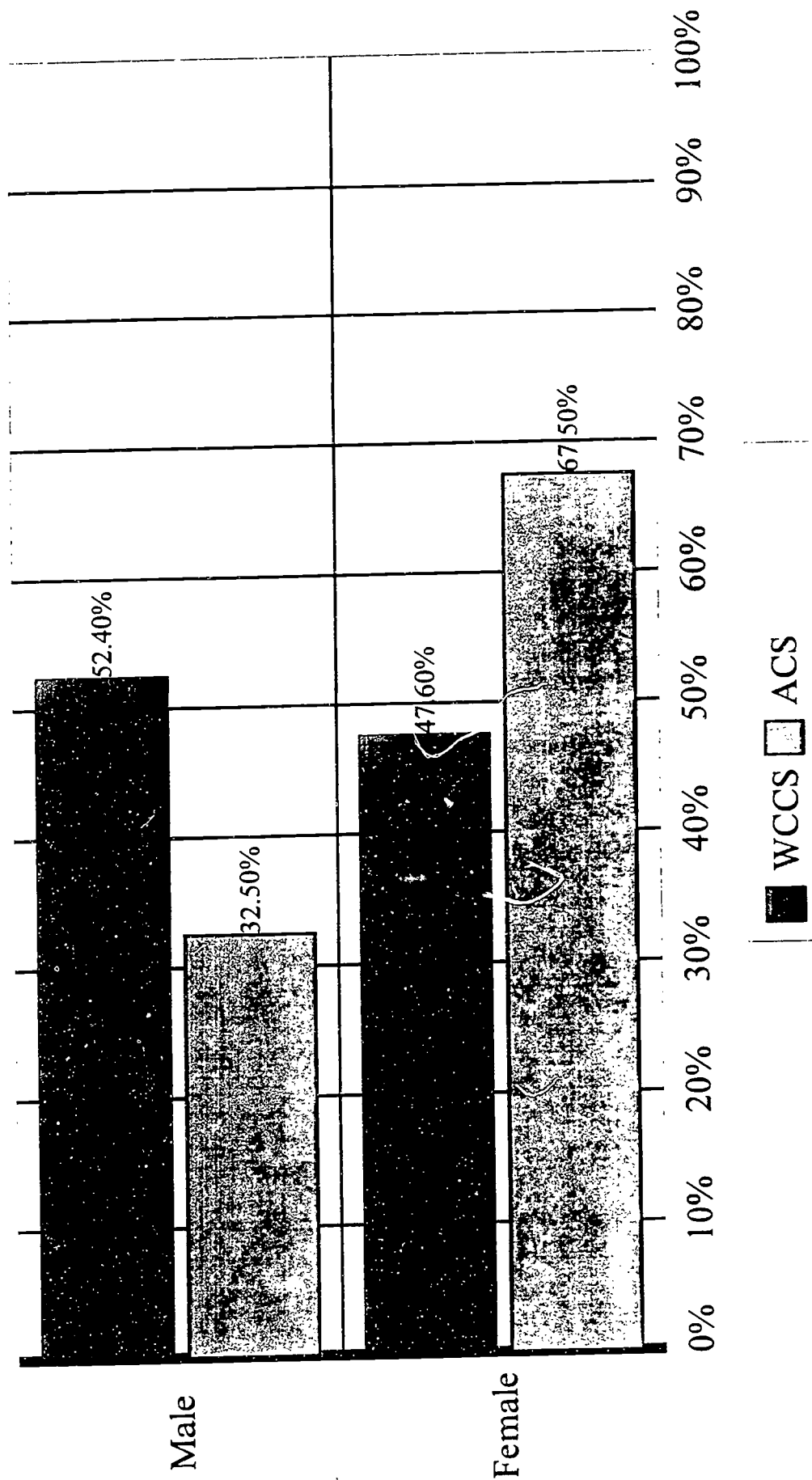

Fall Quarter 1992



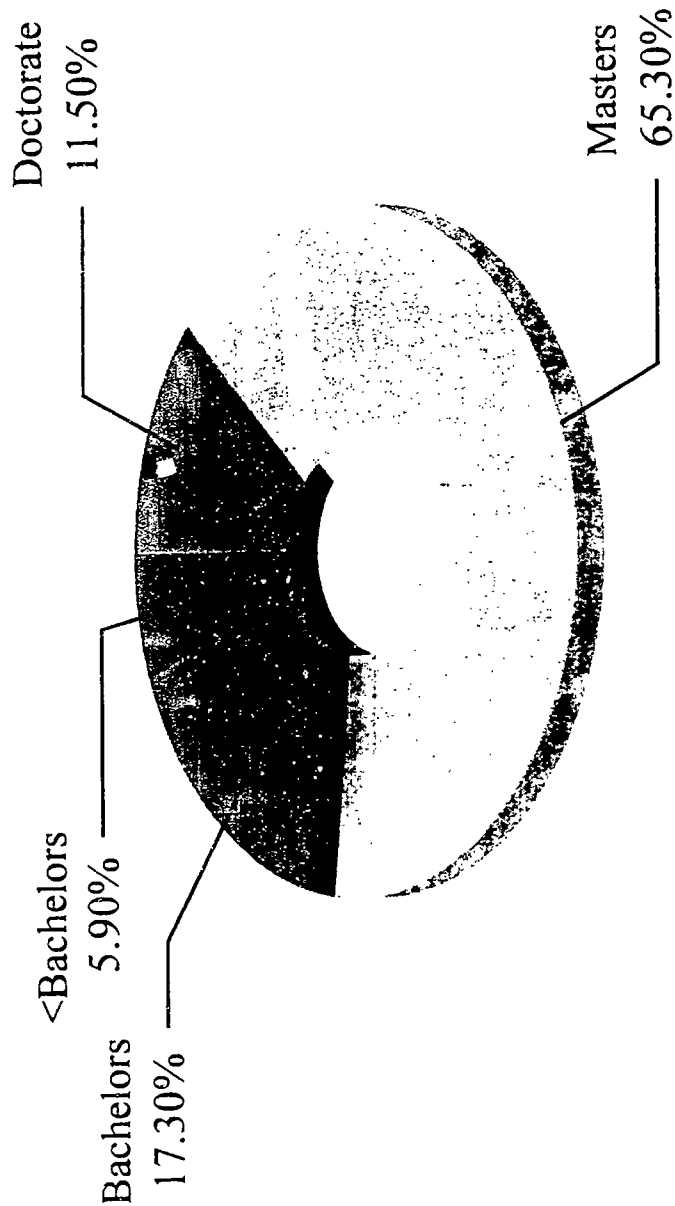
Full-Time Faculty Characteristics

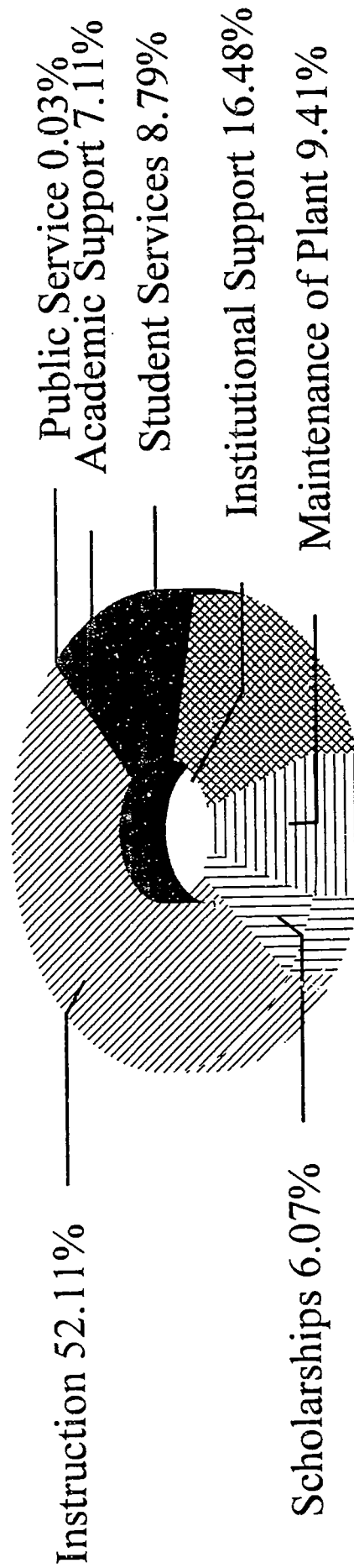

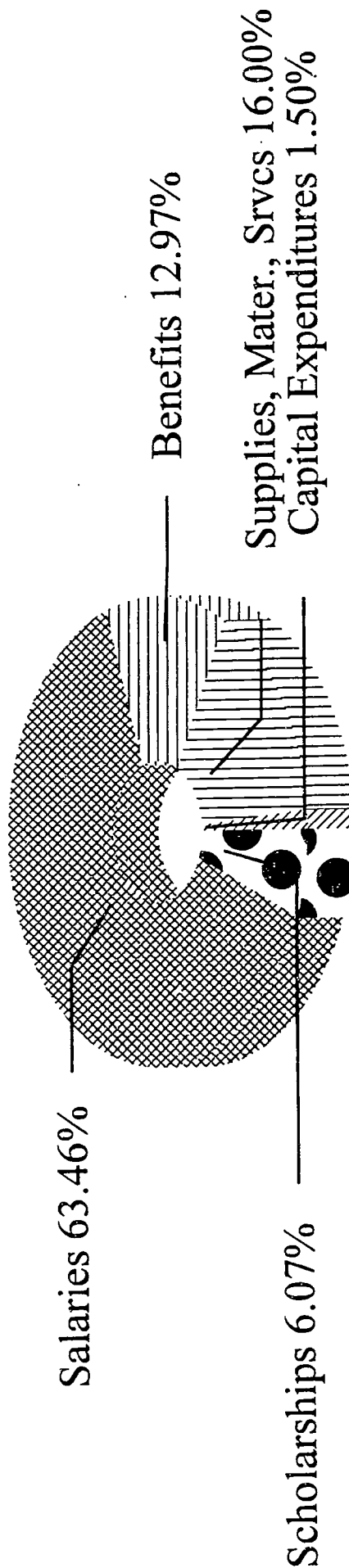

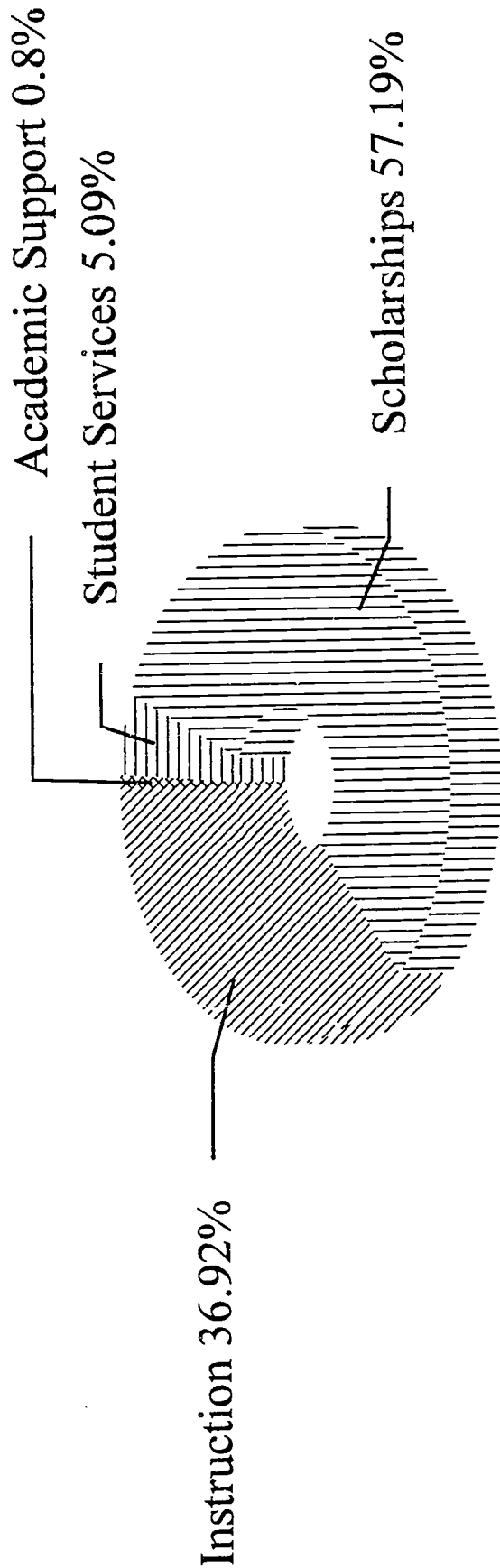

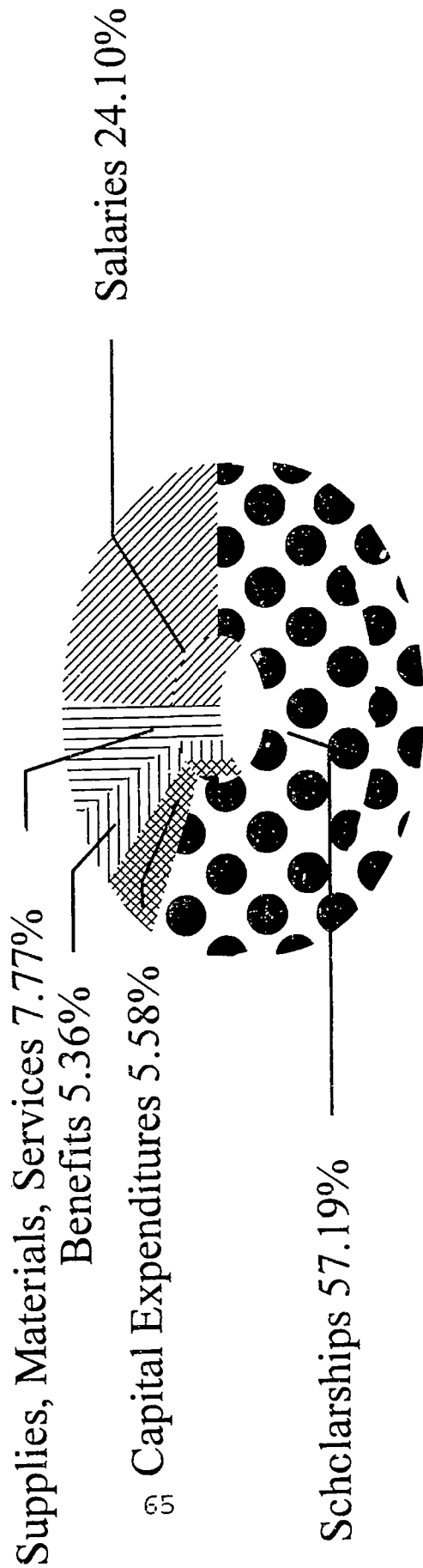

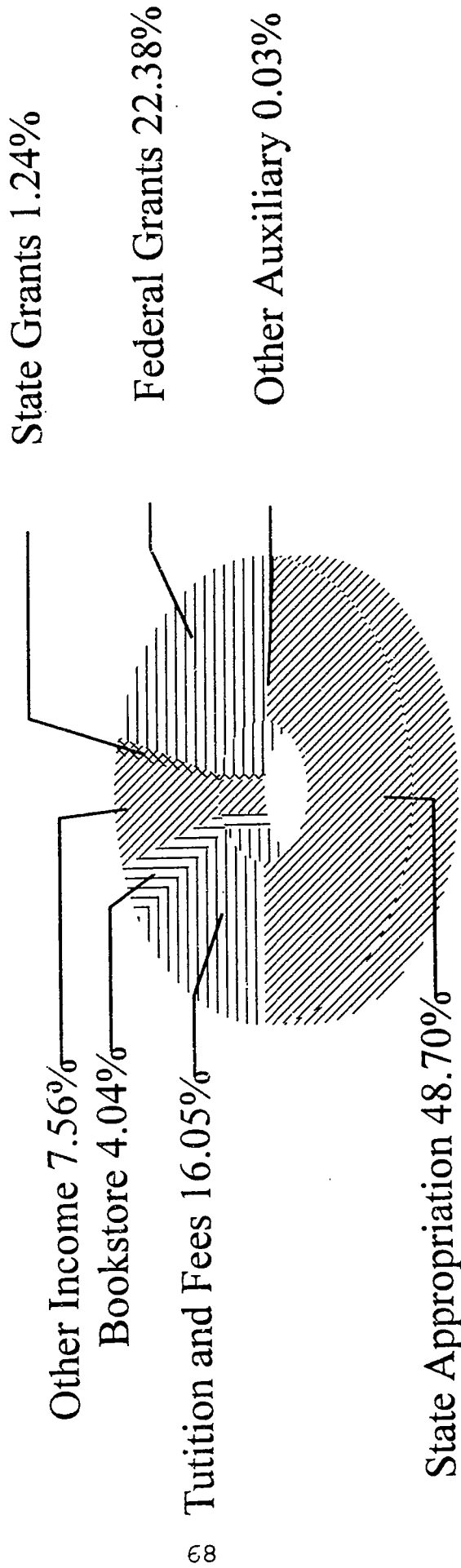

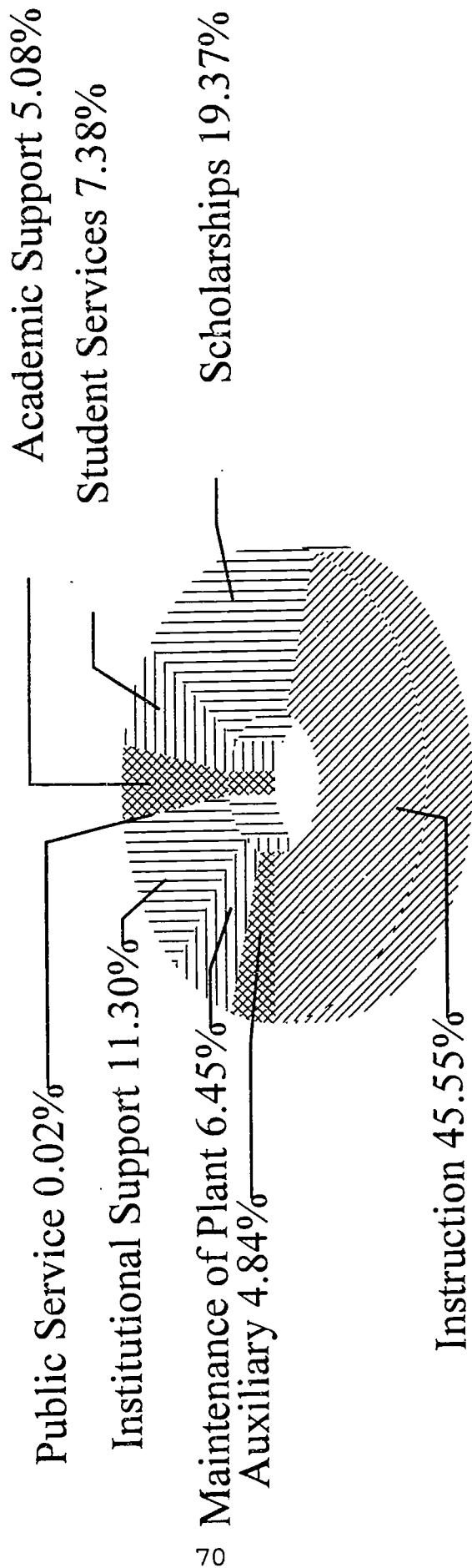

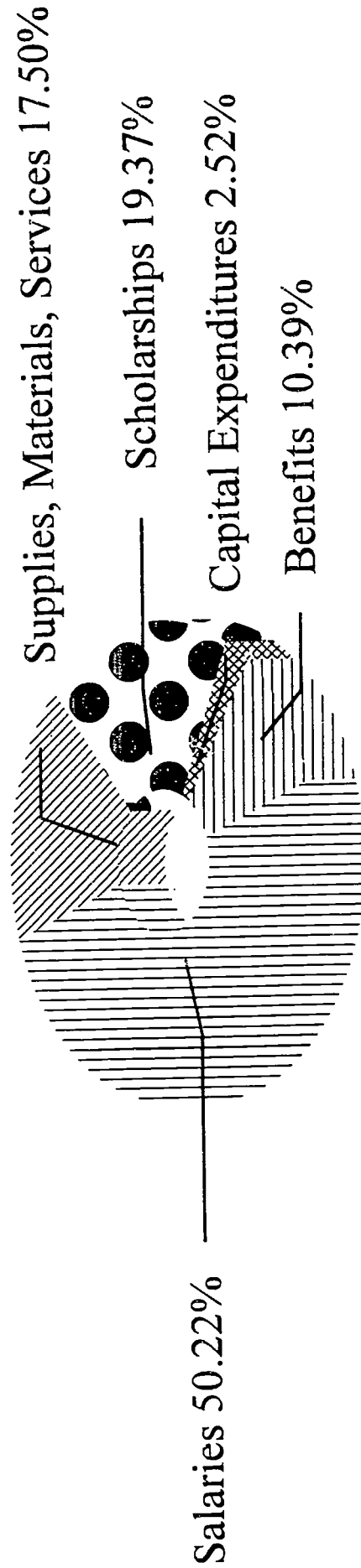

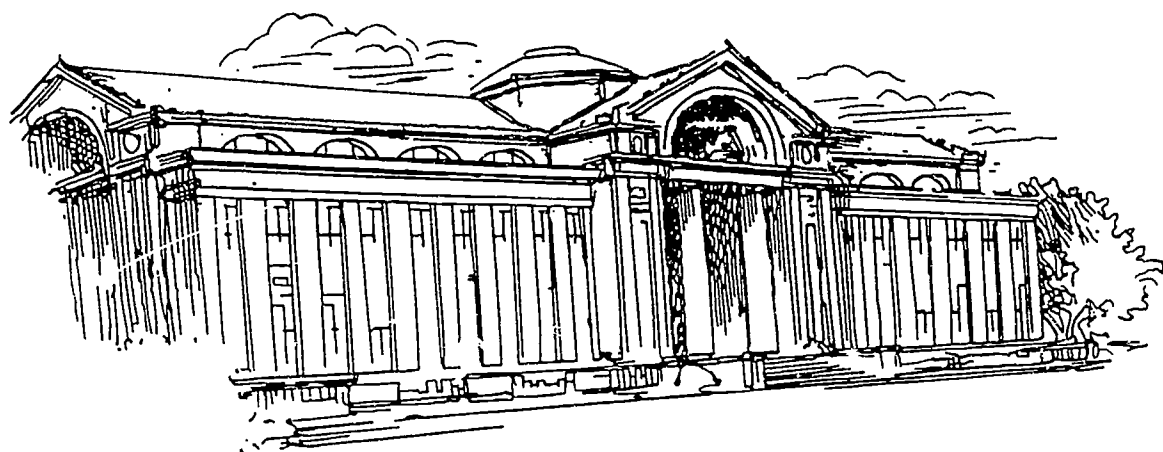

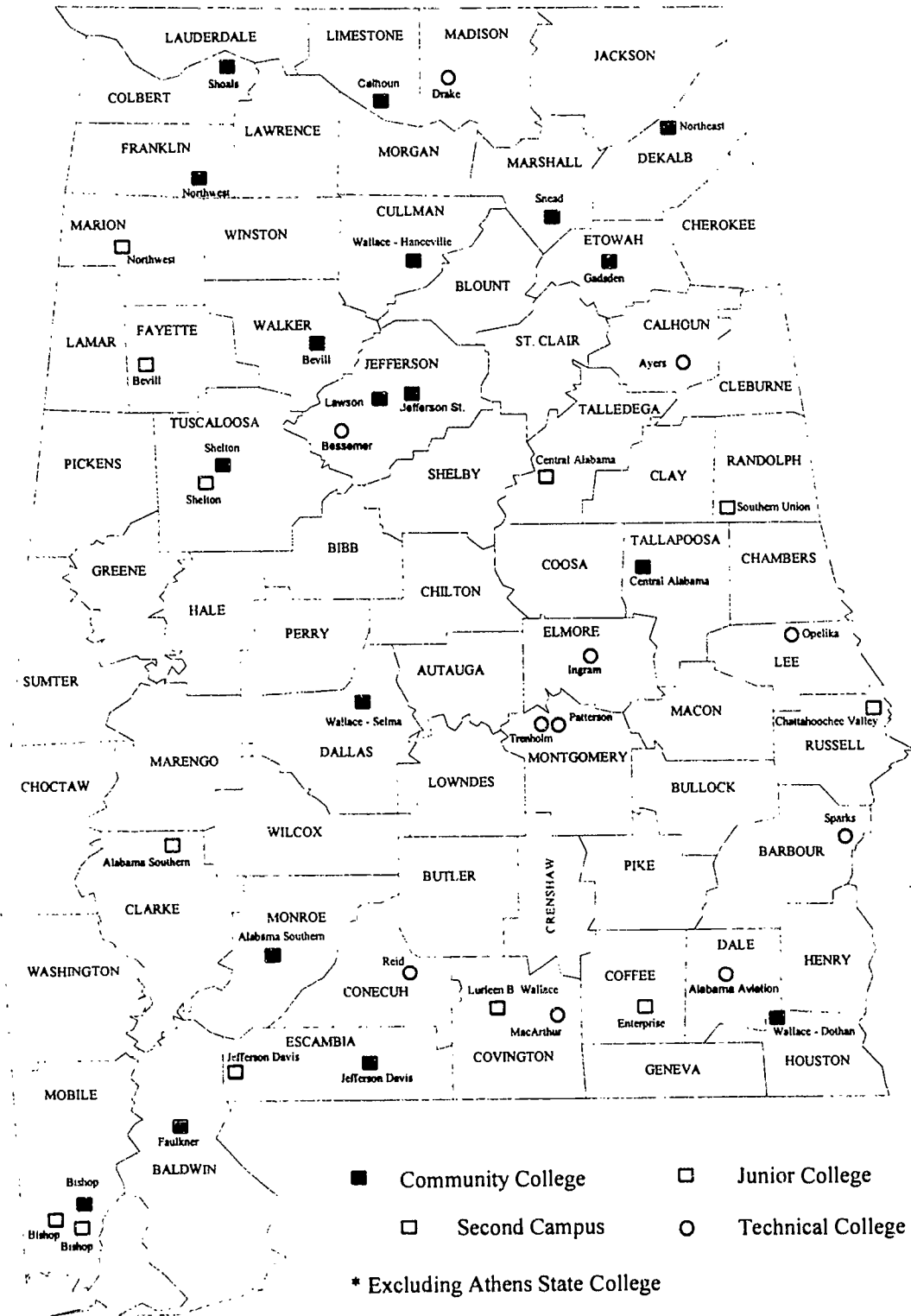

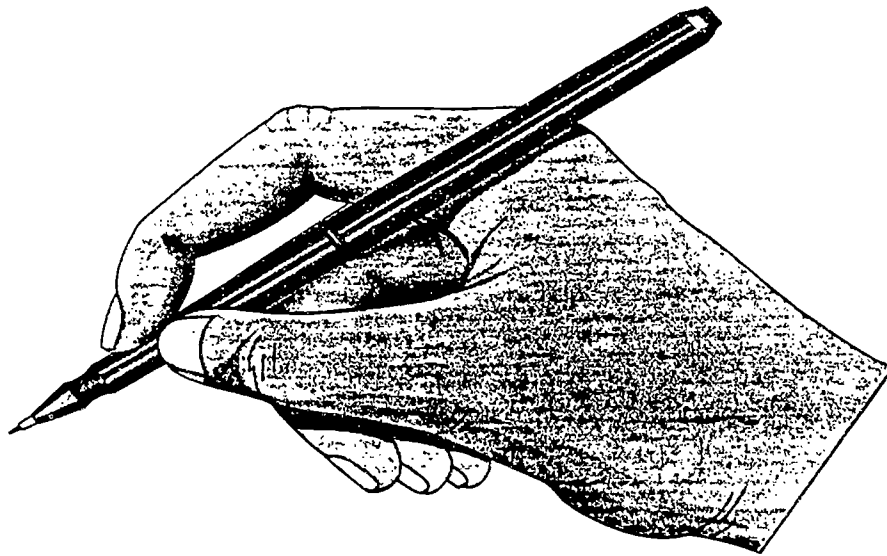
