ABSTRACT

A series of data tables and graphs provides a longitudinal summary of information about the students at Los Angeles City College who earned an Associate of Arts degree (AA) from 1964 through 1980. The first table offers information about selected student characteristics, including number of graduates, percent of total enrollment who graduated, number and percent of males and females, and number and percent completing work in the Spring semester. The second table indicates students' stated majors at graduation, grouped and totaled by department. The final table reveals the numbers of students majoring in eight curricular areas, i.e., business, fine arts, sciences, communications, social sciences, vocational-health, vocational-technical, and college transfer. Graphs corresponding to these tables make the trends in the data over this 16-year period apparent. Analysis of the data reveals that: (1) the number of AA degrees awarded annually rose from approximately 900 in the mid-1960's to a peak of 1,719 in 1976, and then dropped to 1,243 in 1979 and 1,251 in 1980; (2) the number of graduates has amounted to between 5% and 10% of the total Spring enrollment; (3) approximately 33% of the graduates completed their work in the Fall semester, while the remaining students finished in the Spring; and (4) since 1972, more females than males have earned associate degrees. PURPOSE OF THE STUDY

This study was initiated to provide a longitudinal look at characteristics of students earning the A.A. degree at Los Angeles City College. Although less than one in five students who enter LACC persist to the granting of the A.A. degree, many thousands of the degrees have been awarded at LACC in its more than fifty years of existence.

It is known that many students transfer or obtain a job without completing degree requirements, and other students take classes for personal development, in-service training, or other reasons and obtaining an A.A. degree is not their objective. Nevertheless, analysis of characteristics of students obtaining A.A. degrees provides an important perspective on the college's accomplishment of its mission.

PROCEDURE OF THE STUDY

Data for the LACC graduates were obtained from Admissions Office records. Most of the data come from statistical tabulations made by the Graduation Unit of that office. As some of the information was incomplete, student's stated major for certain years was tabulated from lists printed in graduation programs. Inasmuch as some students on the list did not subsequently graduate on schedule, some totals in the data following do not match. However, such discrepancies have little apparent effect on the overall picture.

FINDINGS

Table 1 presents some selected statistics on LACC graduates over the period 1964-1980. Included are number of graduates, percent of total enrollments, number and percent male, and number and percent completing work in the Spring semester. Figure 1 presents some of this information graphically.

Table 2 indicates students' stated majors at graduation, grouped and totaled by department.

In order to obtain an estimate of trends in broad areas of majors, department totals were grouped subjectively into the following seven categories:

Students who declined to state a major but met minimum graduation requirements are indicated as "College Transfer", providing an eighth category.

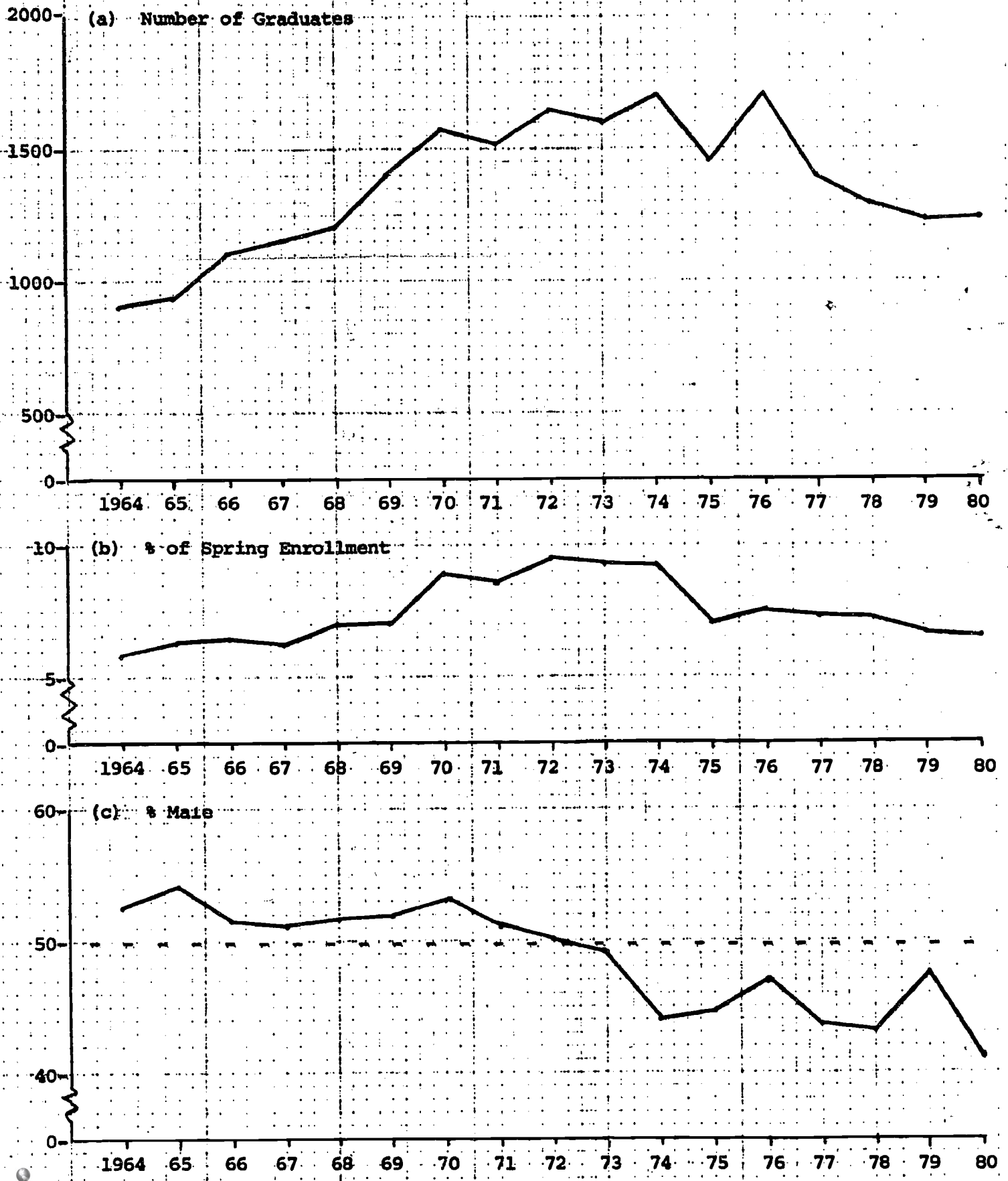
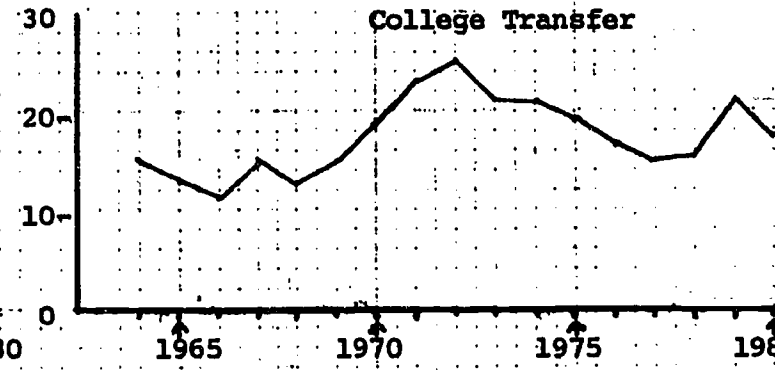
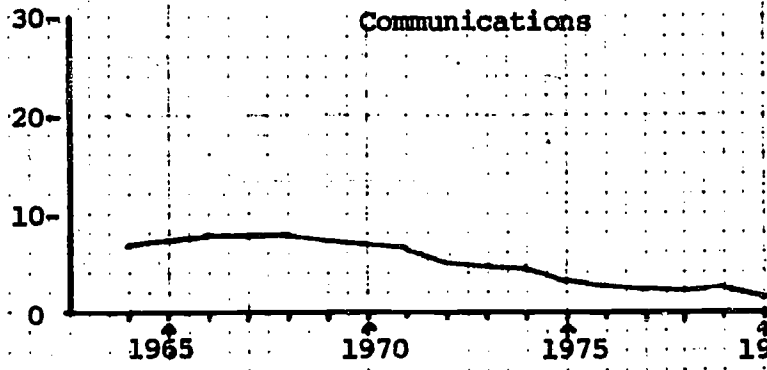
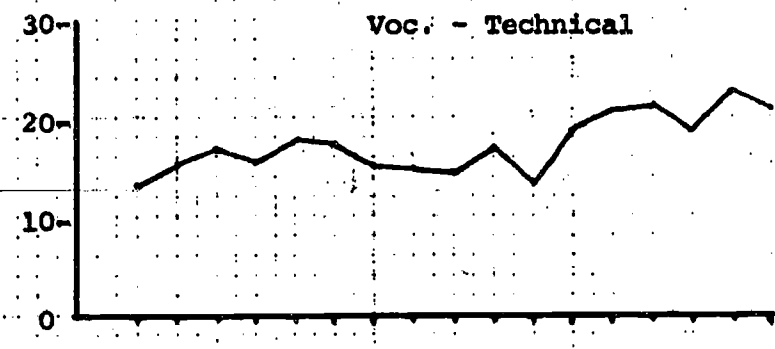
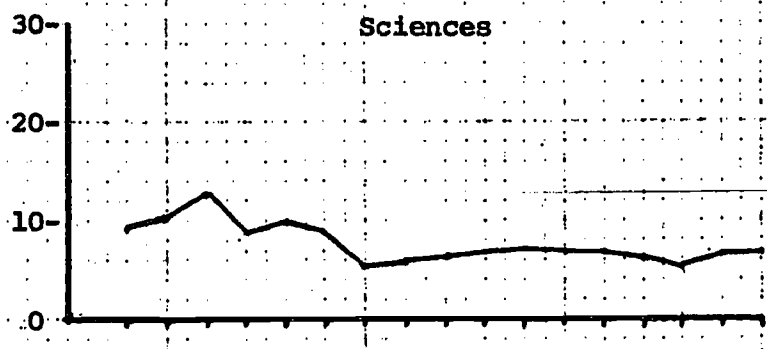
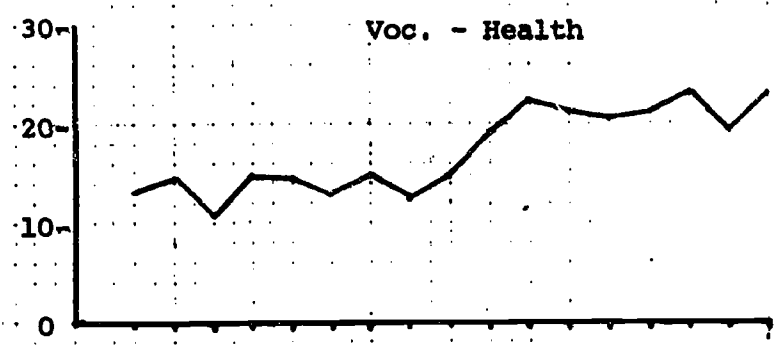
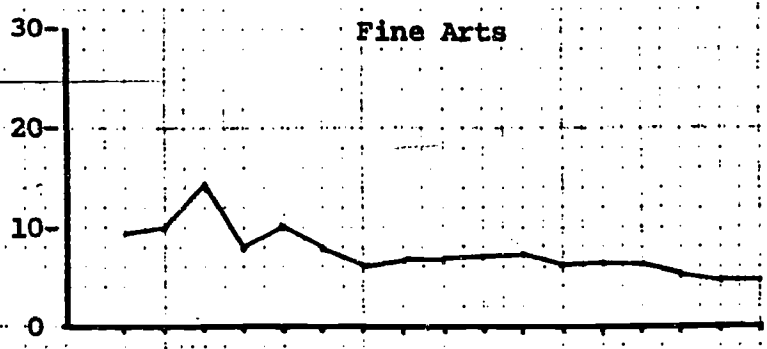
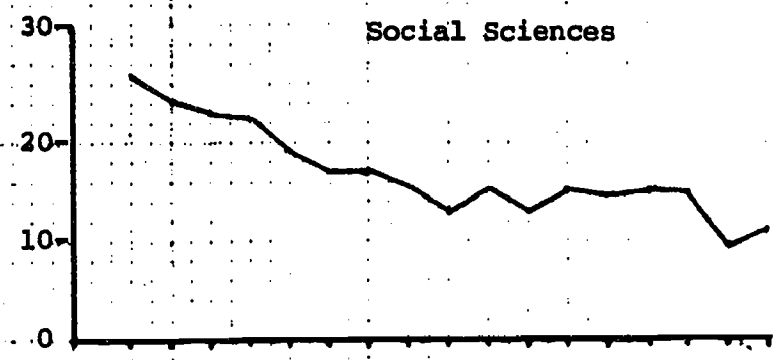
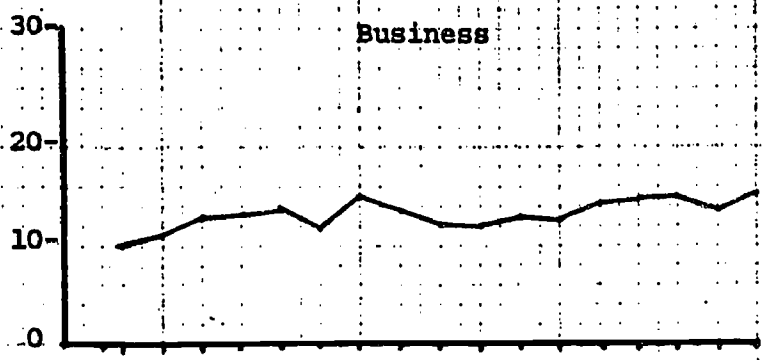


FIGURE 2 - A.A. Degrees Earned at LACC, 1964-80, by Area of Stated Major (in percents)

Table 3 indicates (using percentages) the numbers of majors in each of the above eight categories over the seventeen year period. Figure 2 presents this information graphically.

FIGURE 1 - A.A. Degrees Earned at LACC - 1964-1980

OBSERVATIONS AND CONCLUSIONS

This study looks at some characteristics of students who have earned the A.A. degree at LACC during the past seventeen years.

Following are some observations on the findings:

- (1) Number of A.A. degrees awarded during an academic year rose from about 900 in the mid-sixties to 1600-1700 during the early seventies. After a peak of 1719 in 1976, the number dropped sharply and for the past three years has been about 1250.
- (2) The number of graduates for a particular year has amounted to between 5 and 10 percent of the spring enrollment. Highest percent was 9.4 in 1972, lowest was 5.7 in 1964.
- (3) Approximately one-third of the graduates complete their work during the fall semester, two-thirds during the spring semester.
- (4) Since 1972, more females than males have received degrees. In 1980 the percent female reached 59.0, an all-time high.
- (5) A subjective clustering of majors indicates that the number of A.A. degrees awarded in vocational areas, especially those in health services, has increased markedly over the past seventeen years. The number receiving degrees in majors relating to business has also increased but not as markedly. Areas showing decline in numbers are Fine Arts and Communications (slightly), Sciences (although not since 1970), and Social Sciences (markedly).
