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ABSTRACT

This document provides information on U.S. federal support for maternal and child health programs from 1935-1985. After a brief history of the Children's Bureau, which was the first unit of the federal government concerned with maternal and child health, funding and allocation formulas for Title V of the Social Security Act of 1935 are examined. Information is provided for three parts of Title V of the act: (1) Maternal and Child Health Services; (2) Services for Crippled Children; and (3) Child Welfare Services. The Omnibus Reconciliation Act of 1981 is also discussed with regard to funding and allocation. The major portion of the document is comprised of 61 tables which present information on amount of funding and allocation of funds for different programs and program components, as well as information on allocations and amounts to each state, by program components, from 1936 to 1985. 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Historical Background

The early organizational unit in the United States Federal Government concerned with maternal and child health was the *Children's Bureau*, established in 1912 in the Department of Labor. Its purpose was "to serve all children, to try to work out the standards of care and protection which shall give to every child his fair chance in the world." The Bureau's initial role was as a fact-finding agency.

The Bureau selected *infant mortality* as the first subject it studied because of its "fundamental social importance, the popular interest it aroused" and because, as each segment of the study was completed, it could be issued. The study was conducted in selected areas throughout the country (because no national birth or death registry existed) and found great variations in infant mortality rates between States, in different areas of the same State or individual communities and between towns and rural districts. The variations were related to:

- Differences in social and economic conditions identified.
- Differences in the quality of prenatal and infant care and the availability of facilities to provide such care.

The Children's Bureau also assembled and disseminated evidence of the methods used in successful efforts to reduce infant mortality:

- Instruction of mothers through infant welfare centers using public health nurses.
- Bulletins on proper care of children and the value of breastfeeding.
- Public information programs on the importance of consulting a physician upon the first evidence of a "disease" during pregnancy.

These efforts, widely implemented throughout the nation, contributed to the substantial reductions in infant mortality between 1915 and 1921 from 99.9 to 75.6 deaths per 1,000 live births.

The Children's Bureau funding was for \$25,640 a year initially and did not increase very much for several years.

The studies and education activities of the Children's Bureau addressed a broad spectrum of problems of mothers and children and resulted in many laws and programs and development of many organizations:

- Development of a U.S. Birth (and Death) Registry (which by 1922 included 30 States and the District of Columbia and included 72.2 percent of the newborn population).

- Laws addressing use of children in the labor market.
- Laws for juvenile courts.
- Laws concerned with mother's pensions
- Laws concerned with sex offenses against children.
- Laws concerned with importation and exportation of children and with abortion.

Another early study comparing the U.S. infant mortality rates with those of other nations showed that the U.S. rates were worse than those of five countries with comparable economic development. This finding and formation of the birth (and death) registry led to a study analyzing vital records, which showed that the reduction in infant mortality mentioned above made little progress in reducing deaths in the period of early infancy—most of which were defined as having "maternal causes." This analysis and the fact that the maternal mortality rate in the U.S. was actually increasing led inevitably to concern for care of mothers before, during and after childbirth.

In 1917, the annual report of the Children's Bureau called attention to a cooperative effort between national and local governments in Great Britain to provide grants-in-aid for maternal and infant "welfare." The report suggested the use of U.S. Federal-aid grants to States as a basis for national and State cooperation to reduce the high mortality rates among U.S. mothers and babies.

This approach was adopted under the Sheppard-Towner Act of 1921. The act called for a "State-initiated plan" for the program to be undertaken by each State and provided for:

- \$5,000 unmatched to each State, and
- an additional \$5,000 to each State if the State matched the money \$1 State (or local) for \$1 Federal.
- The balance of each appropriation was to be allotted on the basis of population and was granted only if matched as described above.

The Sheppard-Towner Act was funded at \$1,240,000 annually for its first five years and limited the amount which the Children's Bureau could use for administration to \$40,000 per year. The Act ended in 1929.

The activities of the Children's Bureau during its first 10 years (1912-1921) resulted in an increase in the number of States with special units concerned with child health from 1 to 46. Forty States participated with the Federal government under the Sheppard-Towner Act.

The purpose of this very brief description of the beginnings of the Maternal and Child Health Program is to call attention to the fact that from the very outset, this program operated quite differently from many other government programs.

- It provided leadership at the Federal level by furnishing facts which identified problems and methods of dealing with them and it focussed national attention on the problems of mothers and children
- It helped to develop legislation and it built support in the Executive branch and the Congress in Washington and among professional, women's, church and other groups throughout the nation for the efforts defined to address the many health and welfare needs of mothers and children
- It helped to develop a Federal program which required State initiation of a plan for the State and, while providing a small grant to start the effort, encouraged States by providing Federal monies to match monies which States would commit.

Title V of the Social Security Act of 1935

The ending of the Sheppard-Towner Act and the impact of the "great depression" eroded the States' abilities to continue useful child health work. One result of the cutbacks in promoting health care and reduced quality of nutrition was an annual increase in the infant mortality rate in 1933. See Figure 1 which depicts infant mortality rates by race in the U.S. from 1930 to 1982. Figure 2 depicts maternal mortality rates by race for the same period. The Children's Bureau response to this situation was a new and stronger plan based on the Sheppard-Towner Act, presented by Frances Perkins, Secretary of Labor, in her Annual Report of 1934. A principal advisor on the health portions of the new bill was Dr. Martha M. Eliot who was head of the Bureau's Division of Child and Maternal Health at the time and later a Chief of the Children's Bureau. The bill was enacted in 1935 as Title V of the Social Security Act—Grants to States for Maternal and Child Welfare. Part 1 was for Maternal and Child Health (MCH) Services, Part 2 was for Services for Crippled Children (CCS) and Part 3 was for Child Welfare Services (CWS). There were also two other parts of Title V of the Social Security Act: Part 4, Vocational Rehabilitation, and Part 5, Administration. Geographic areas included in the original legislation were the 48 contiguous States, the District of Columbia, and the territories of Alaska and Hawaii.

The Act made very clear that it was not intended simply to "pay for" services for the groups identified. In each program, the purpose was to "extend and improve" services available in each State for the target group, "especially in rural areas and in areas suffering from severe economic distress." For the CCS Program, it was also stated that the State should insure "services for locating crippled children" as well as providing services and facilities for diagnosis, hospitalization and aftercare for "children who are crippled or suffering from conditions which lead to crippling." The CWS Program was to help States establish, extend and

strengthen services for the protection and care of homeless, dependent and neglected children, and children in danger of becoming delinquent.

Early Funding

The initial appropriations¹ in February 1936 (for a five month period only) were as follows:

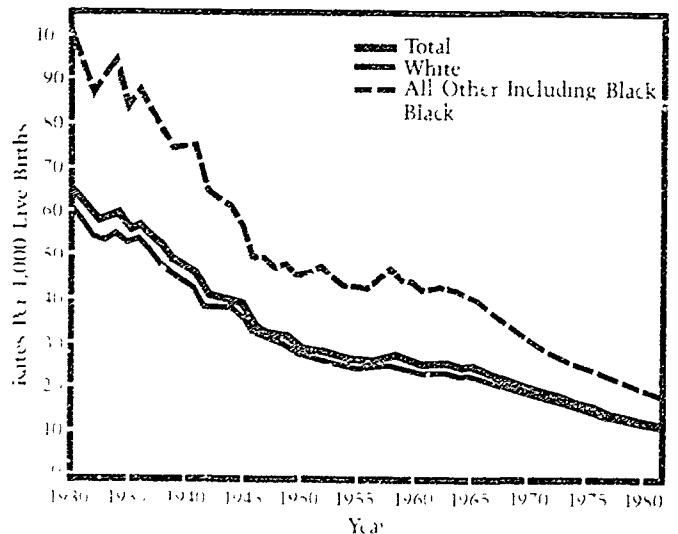

States were required to submit State plans for each program and payments could be made only to States with approved plans. Following the basic pattern

FIGURE 1. Trends in United States Infant Mortality Rates by Race, 1930 - 1982.



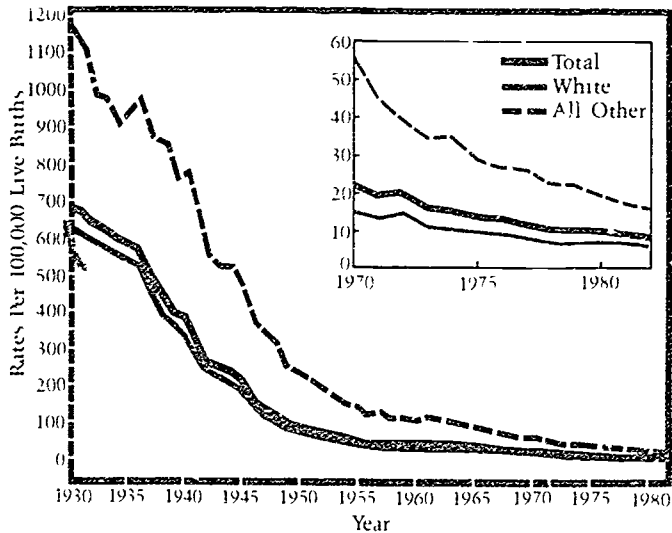

defined in the Sheppard-Towner Act of 1921, the Congress stipulated allotments to States for each program. The Act required, among other provisions intended to insure compliance with the intent of the Act, that the

¹ *Authorization* levels are the ceilings set by the Congress on amounts which can be spent on a program. *Appropriation* are the amounts authorized to be spent each year by the Congress. They may be the same but the appropriation is often less than the authorization. In at least one instance (FY1982) the appropriation was greater than the authorization limit. The appropriation could be used because of agreements between the Congressional committees and the language used in the appropriation bill.

States participate financially and that each one should assign supervision of the administration of its plans for each program to the health department (for MCH Programs) or another State agency. The States were required to match \$2,820,000 of the \$3,800,000 appropriated for the MCH Program and all of the \$2,850,000 appropriated for the CCS Program. The "match" requirement from the beginning of the Title V Health Programs (MCH and CCS) has been \$1 State (or local)

for each \$1 Federal Fund A portion. Within nine months of the time funds were appropriated, all authorized areas were participating.

Early Allocation Formulas

The early legislation was very explicit in some respects regarding the way the monies would be allotted to States. On the other hand, the bases for responding to the legislation's concern for rural populations and economically distressed areas were adjusted by administrative action fairly frequently. Funds appropriated early in 1936 were for a partial year (five months) and were generally seen as "start-up" money. The initial legislation stipulated distribution of the authorized monies on the following bases:

MCH Program:

- Allocation of \$2,820,000 by giving a uniform grant or "base" of \$20,000 to each State (see Appendix Table 2) and apportioning the remaining \$1,800,000 to States on the basis of each State's percent of all U.S. live births (in the latest

calendar year for which such data are available). This apportionment [defined in Section 502 (a) of the Act] became known as *Fund A* monies, which were awarded if matched as described above.

- Apportionment of \$980,000 by the Secretary of Labor on the basis of each State's need for financial assistance in carrying out its plan. This apportionment [defined in Section 502 (b) of the Act] became known as *Fund B* monies. The funds initially allocated under the Fund B allotment were available only to State agencies and never had a requirement for State matching monies. They were awarded based on the following:

- \$255,000 distributed as a minimum grant of \$5,000 to each State;
- \$240,000 on the basis of the State's proportion of excess infant deaths, deaths that would not have occurred if the U.S. infant mortality rate existed in the State;
- \$240,000 on the basis of the State's proportion of excess maternal deaths;
- \$245,000 on the basis of sparsity of population (rurality).
- The act provided for carry-over of "A" funds for up to two years.

CCS Program: Allotments to States with an approved plan for this program (see Appendix Table 1) called for the uniform \$20,000 grant allotment (see Appendix Table 2) with the rest to be apportioned on the basis of the numbers of crippled children²⁷. There was no Fund B initially in the appropriation of CCS Program monies so all of the CCS appropriation required State matching monies. However, even before a CCS Fund B was established, reference was made to an "S-Fund" set aside from the CCS appropriation to go to States where the number of crippled children and costs of services were "above average."

CWS Program: For this program the basic allotment to each State with an approved plan was \$10,000. The remainder was to be allocated on the basis of the State plan, not to exceed the proportion of the State's rural population to the rural population of the U.S. Expenditures were to be made to encourage and assist development of State services in areas which were predominantly rural or were areas of special need. This report will not deal further with this type of Title V funding, but includes the initial instructions on allotments to States because they provide another example of the concepts used in apportioning the Title V monies.

²⁷ Since the numbers of these have never been known, the proportions of the child population under 21 years in each State have been used to estimate the proportion of crippled children on the assumption that the incidence of crippling conditions is the same in each State.

From the outset, the leadership group in the Children's Bureau recognized the importance of special kinds of support for their efforts. One of these involved development of *research* studies to document the need for improved health care for mothers and children and the usefulness of various efforts to make an impact on health status measures. This was seen for some time as an "in-house" responsibility. Another involved the need for *training* for the various types of health professionals to manage health programs for mothers and children and to provide services. Initially training was focussed on State program employee needs for "in-service training." Finally, there was the need for *demonstration* projects to show how to organize and provide services. These were viewed as "special projects" and monies were awarded based on requests for funding of individual activities.

The annual total fiscal-year Federal appropriations for Title V Health and Related Programs (FY1936 - FY1981) and for the MCH Block Grant and for its components (FY1982 - FY1985) are shown in Appendix Table 1. The "uniform and minimum" grants to States as part of the allocation formulas for both Fund A and Fund B (non-reserved portion) are shown for FY1936 - FY1981 in Appendix Table 2. The amounts "set aside" or "reserved" for project grants to address specific purposes were stated in the agency's report to Congress each year, but there is almost no information after 1952 on how these funds were awarded to States. Estimates of US totals for these amounts (reserve B funds) are shown in Appendix Table 3. Appendix Table 4 shows the U.S. appropriation (FY1936 - FY1985) and the constant dollars as defined using the Consumer Price Index. The information in the individual State Allocation Tables (Appendix Tables 5 through 61) reflects MCH and CCS Program monies (Fund A and Fund B) reported in allocation tables submitted to Congress. Prior to 1952, the State Allocation Tables include monies from Fund A and all of Fund B and monies for a special World War II program described below. After 1952, these tables show Fund A and non-reserve Fund B monies along with monies for some other components.

The following is a summary of other changes to aid in understanding the Title V health programs funding picture. They include changes in the basic coverage of the programs or in the formulas used to allocate the appropriations to States as well as procedures used to distribute the appropriations to various program components. In all cases, the table of U.S. annual appropriations data (Appendix Table 1) and tables of State allocations (Appendix Tables 5 through 61) reflect these changes.

Over the years, the ceilings placed on the amounts authorized for the Title V appropriation have increased. The authorization ceilings are generally not covered in this report.

1939 - 1949

In 1939, several important changes occurred in the legislation:

- A "Fund B" was approved for the CCS Program and an authorization for \$1,000,000 was added to provide monies for this. The first reference to an appropriation and allocation of this fund was in 1941.
- A new special program concerned with heart disease was assigned to the CCS Program to administer and new funding was provided to support services to children with rheumatic fever and heart disease. In time, 29 States had projects caring for children with these problems.
- The "required" elements of the State plans for MCH and CCS Program were changed to include a new provision for "establishment and maintenance of personnel standards on a merit basis."

Puerto Rico was defined as eligible for coverage under Title V of the Social Security Act as of January 1, 1940.

In 1941, the concept of "reserved" monies from the CCS Fund B to be spent on specified "priority areas of program concern" appeared in the allocation tables. Other or "non-reserved" Fund B monies were allocated to States on the basis of defined formulas.

In 1943, the Emergency Maternal and Infant Care (EMIC) Program was funded to be administered by the Children's Bureau (at the Federal level) and the State MCH Programs. This program awarded grants to States to provide maternity and infant care services to wives and infants of enlisted men of the U.S. Armed Forces (4th, 5th, 6th and 7th grades). The program was ended in 1949. The EMIC Program initiated the principle that payment by the program to hospitals and physicians represented "full payment" for services provided to the EMIC patient. The program also developed a *per diem* cost formula for payment to hospitals for delivery services, which stipulated that no additional payment was to be made, e.g., for any surgery needed.

In 1946, the Children's Bureau was moved from the Department of Labor to the Federal Security Agency. Also, beginning in 1946, the total amounts authorized for the MCH and CCS Programs were divided equally between the Fund A, which had to be matched, and the Fund B, which did not have to be matched. Prior to this time, as mentioned above, the concept of reserve and non-reserve B funds was defined, with the non-reserve funds going directly to State programs on a basis to be responsive to the legislation's concerns for insuring the availability of care and services to each State's rural population and economically distressed areas. The formulas were adjusted periodically to reflect changing program emphases and funding levels. The

reserve B funds were used only in response to funding requests for projects of "regional and national (as well as State and local) significance" for the development or expansion of MCH and CCS Programs

An example of a relatively early effort to develop a more sensitive measure of need is an allocation procedure of the MCH Program to distribute an "increased" amount appropriated for the non-reserve Fund B in 1946.

- States were arrayed by *Per Capita Income* (PCI). Eighty percent of the increase was allotted to the two-thirds (34 States) with the lowest PCI's as follows:

The PCI was weighted by the ratio of children under 21 years to adults.

The number of live births was weighted by the proportion of rural births.

The State apportionment varied inversely with the weighted PCI and directly with the weighted number of live births

- The remaining 20 percent of the increase was apportioned among 23 States which had 1944 infant and maternal mortality rates above the U.S. rates and PCI's less than that for the U.S. as a whole. The distribution was based directly on the State's proportion of the "excess" infant deaths in all 23 selected States. "Excess" was defined as the number of deaths in the State less the number which would have occurred in the State if the U.S. rate had obtained.

The CCS Program developed a similar approach to allocating its increase in "non reserve" B funds

- Eighty percent of the increase was allocated as for the MCH Program except that the population group for weighting the rural proportion of the population was children under 21 years.
- The 20 percent was allocated to the 34 States with the lowest PCI's, based on the numbers of crippled children on State program registers and admissions to crippled children's clinics weighted for the proportion of children in rural areas

The Virgin Islands became eligible for coverage under Title V of the Social Security Act as of January 1, 1947

1950 - 1959

In 1950, the MCH and CCS Programs' unbudgeted and unpaid Fund A monies from 1948 and 1949 could be included in the current fiscal year budget. In 1951, provisions for automatic carry over of unpaid Fund A monies were eliminated.

The 1950 MCH Program allocation table referred to the Fund A as having a \$35,000 uniform grant base for

the allocation to each State plus an amount apportioned on the basis of each State's proportion of the US live birth population by State of residence. For Territories, the same uniform grant base was awarded, but the proportion of live births was by place of occurrence. For non-reserved Fund B, each State/Territory received a minimum grant of \$20,000 plus an amount computed by developing an adjusted population base using two times the rural live births plus urban births which was further adjusted by a factor based on each State's PCI divided by twice the U.S. PCI. The State's proportion of the U.S. total of this adjusted population base was used to distribute non-reserve B funds to each State. This process gave added weight in computing the State's proportion of the new "total" to areas with large rural populations and reduced the States proportion of the new "total" based on its PCI. States with higher PCI's had the new "total" reduced more than States with lower PCI's. These materials also referred to the obligation for continued funding support for "special projects" funded by reserve Fund B monies and specified that monies were set aside for continued funding for these projects

The CCS Program in 1950 had a \$30,000 uniform grant base for the Fund A allocation to each State plus a portion based on each State's proportion of the U.S. child population. The CCS Fund B non-reserved portion had a \$10,000 minimum grant for each State. Here also rurality and financial need were defined by doubling the rural child population in the population base and adjusting it by the PCI factor described above.

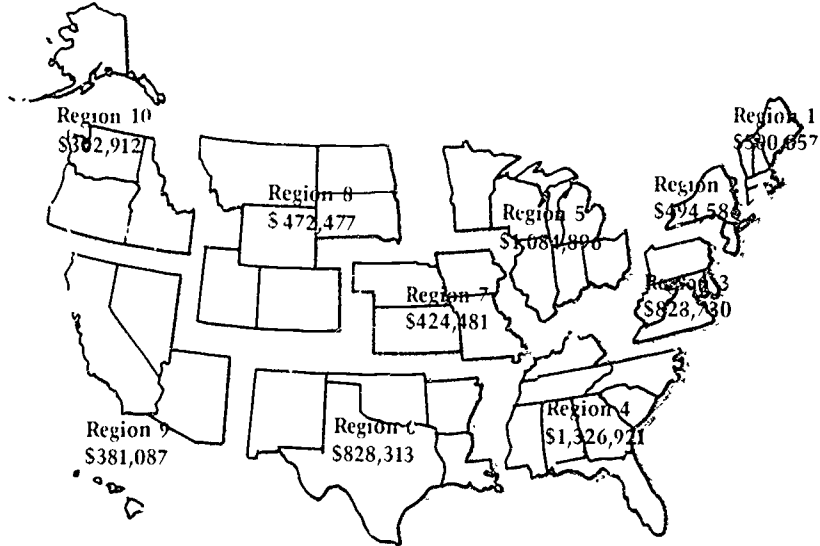
Improvements in medications available to treat infections, in obstetrical procedures, and in surgical procedures stemming from the war had been reflected in improved infant and maternal mortality rates during the 1940's. Nonetheless, in the 1950's, infant mortality, which had been declining steadily since the late 1930's, slowed its rate of decline and finally reflected an increase (See Figure 1.) The studies of maternal, infant and child mortality had, since the initiation of the Children's Bureau, been very useful in assessing the health status and needs of mothers and children. Studies of infant mortality and natality characteristics of the 1950's identified several "high risk groups," notably low birthweight infants, babies born to mothers with a poor childbearing history (a prior fetal loss) and other-than-white infants. The analyses to identify causes for the infant mortality rate problems in the 1950's were used to define new program initiatives for mothers and children. A major finding in these analyses (completed in the early 1960's) was that providers and facilities to provide health care were moving to the suburbs as blacks began moving from the rural south to major urban centers. By the mid-1950's, black ghetto populations in major cities, and poor whites as well, were not receiving adequate maternal, infant and child care

Unlike mortality information, information on morbidity of children had never been so readily available

Total Title V Dollars Allocated to State Programs by DHHS Regions¹ in FY1937²

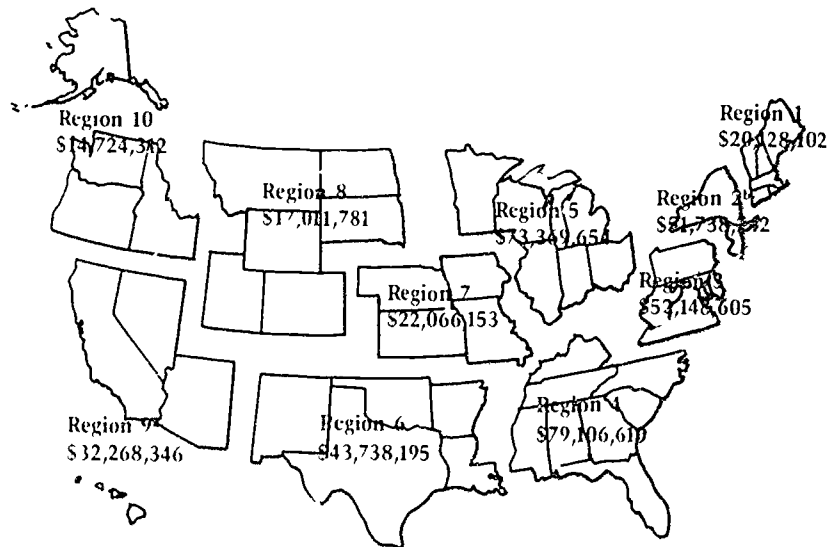
U.S. Total - \$6,644,460

(the National Health Survey was finally undertaken in 1956) nor so comprehensive (it is based on a very small national sample). However, the National Health Survey of 1956 did provide, for the first time, a national estimate of levels of acute illnesses, selected chronic conditions, hospitalizations, dental care and special services such as X rays, for use in health planning. There was a new national concern and focus on handicapping conditions of children, stemming from the threat posed by poliomyelitis (infantile paralysis) and from the information on numbers of children with a broad range of handicapping conditions defined by the National Health Survey and the work of voluntary agencies.

In 1953, the new Department of Health, Education and Welfare (DHEW) absorbed the Federal Security Agency and the Children's Bureau became part of the Social Security Administration

In 1958, for the first time, a portion of the Title V funds was earmarked for use only for special projects for mentally retarded children. These were often referred to in later years as MR funds.

In August 1958 (FY 1959), there was a special appropriation of \$1,500,000 for surgical correction of congenital heart defects. This is part of the CCS total appropriation in 1959 and is also reflected in State CCS allocations for 1959.

In July 1959, Guam became eligible for coverage under Title V of the Social Security Act.

1960 - 1969

In 1960, major new changes defined distribution and use of Fund B monies. The appropriation for each Program (MCH and CCS) had been defined in 1946 as divided equally between Fund A and Fund B. The following describes the 1960 changes:

- From the Fund A half of each program's appropriation, a uniform grant base of \$70,000 was awarded to each State with an approved plan, with the balance awarded on the basis of each State's proportion of the U.S. live birth and child populations, if matched (This is only a change in the uniform grant level.)
- The other half of the appropriation (Fund B) was to be awarded in two portions - the same "reserve" and "non-reserve" portions defined earlier. The non-reserve portion was awarded on the basis of the minimum grant, the rurality factor and PCI definition of a State's economic need already described. For the reserve B funds, not more than 25 percent of this part of the appropriation (Fund B) for both programs or 12½ percent of the Fund B part of each program's appropriation could be awarded as grants to State health agencies, other

public (State or local) agencies, and nonprofit institutions of higher learning for "special projects of regional or national significance" (This is a major change since until this time, such grants could be given only to State agencies administering a Title V Program.)

In 1963, the Children's Bureau was one of five units moved from the Social Security Administration to the Welfare Administration of DHEW. In October 1963, two major new developments occurred:

- A new 5-year program of project grants to States or local health agencies was authorized for projects to provide necessary health care for expectant mothers who have, or are likely to have, conditions associated with childbearing that increase hazards to the health of the mothers or their infants and who, because of income or other reasons beyond their control, will not receive such care. These grants, which came to be known as Maternal and Infant Care (M&I or M&IC) Projects, required a matching of \$1 State or local for each \$3 Federal. In the 1960's the project grants which, in time, became known as the "Program of Projects" were called "Special Projects" [See Appendix Tables 1 and 5-61 (Special Projects).] The initial authorized funding levels and appropriations were for:

- A new *research* program was authorized with \$8,000,000 to be used for grants, contracts, or jointly financed cooperative arrangements which "can provide a substantial contribution toward improving maternal and child health and crippled children's services" Funding for this program began in 1964. Appropriation levels were less than the amount authorized

In 1965, another group of changes was enacted.

- A new *training* program was authorized to award grants to institutions of higher learning for training professional personnel for health and related care of crippled children and children with multiple handicaps. Initial authorized funding levels were:

Appropriations were substantially less than these ceilings

- A new requirement was that States demonstrate a satisfactory effort to extend MCH and CCS

Program services to children in all parts of the State. This came to be referred to as the requirement to demonstrate "state-wideness" of Title V MCH and CCS Programs.

- A new schedule of project grants was established to fund projects to State health departments, or, with their approval, to local health departments or various other institutions (of higher learning) - teaching hospitals to provide diagnostic services, preventive services, treatment services, correction of defects, and aftercare for children and youth who would not otherwise receive it because they are from low-income families or for other reasons beyond their control. The projects were to provide comprehensive care and services in both medical and dental areas. These projects became known as Children and Youth (C&Y) Projects. The legislation required an evaluation of the projects by 1969. They also were funded on the basis of \$1 State/local for \$3 Federal. The initial authorized funding levels for these projects were.

Appropriations were included in the Special Projects total on Appendix Tables 1 and 5-61

In 1967, further reorganizations of the DHEW resulted in the Children's Bureau being assigned to the Social and Rehabilitation Service.

In 1968, major changes appeared in the program legislation.

- The Child Welfare Services were moved from Title V, Part 3 to Title IV, Part B of the Social Security Act.
- The funding levels for all of the Title V Health and Related Programs were put into a combined authorization and use of the monies was defined as follows:

Fifty percent of the appropriation was for MCH and CCS Programs until 1972. These funds were still divided into A and B fund portions and were to be allotted to States on the basis of the formulas for these programs.

Forty percent of the appropriation was for M&I, C&Y and Dental and Other (Special) Projects as authorized in later years until 1972.

Ten percent of the appropriation was for training and research grants as described earlier.

One half of one percent of the appropriation could be used by the Secretary's Office for evaluation

After FY1972, 90 percent of the appropriation would be for the MCH and CCS Programs, envisioning incorporation of the Special Projects into the State program framework as part of the "Program of Projects" and 10 percent would be for training and research grants. In fact, the 50/40/10 distribution formula was continued through FY1974 as described below

- The Secretary was given leeway to transfer up to 5 percent of Title V funds from one unit to another.
- New requirements for "early identification and treatment" of crippled children and "special attention to development of demonstration projects for family planning and dental care were provided and the "state-wideness" requirement was extended to these program areas. Title V funds for "family planning services" were required to be no less than 6 percent of the monies for the "MCH Program."
- State plans were required (as a condition to approval) by FY1972 to provide for a "Program of Projects" (one each of a specified set of projects which, in time, included M&I, C&Y, Family Planning, Dental and Intensive Infant Care Projects) and to plan to "take over" responsibility for existing Special Projects in the State by FY1972. Plans were also required by FY1969 to provide for training and use of subprofessionals.
- Various changes were made in the emphasis of training programs to reflect interest in undergraduate training
- A new requirement was for maintenance of the 1968 level of financial support for MCH and CCS activities by State and local agencies. This became known as the "maintenance of effort" requirement.
- Payment by the Title XIX (Medicaid) Agency to Title V organizations providing services to Title XIX eligible patients was authorized.

A program of special family planning projects was authorized in 1969. This program was to be funded from the 40 percent of the Title V appropriation defined in 1968 for Special Projects. In 1969, the portion authorized for Family Planning (FP) Projects was \$12,000,000. In later years (FY1970-FY1972), Title V monies were transferred to the National Center for Family Planning Services to fund these projects. For FY1971 and FY1972, the allocations for Family Planning Projects in the Special Projects funding totals for States are not included in the appendix tables. In FY1973 and FY1974, the family planning monies were included again in definitions of Title V Special Projects funding and were part of the base for the Title V of Section 516 funding levels. (See page 9 for a description of Section 516.) FY1969, FY1970, FY1973 and FY1974 family planning project monies are included in Appendix Tables 1, 3 and 5-61.

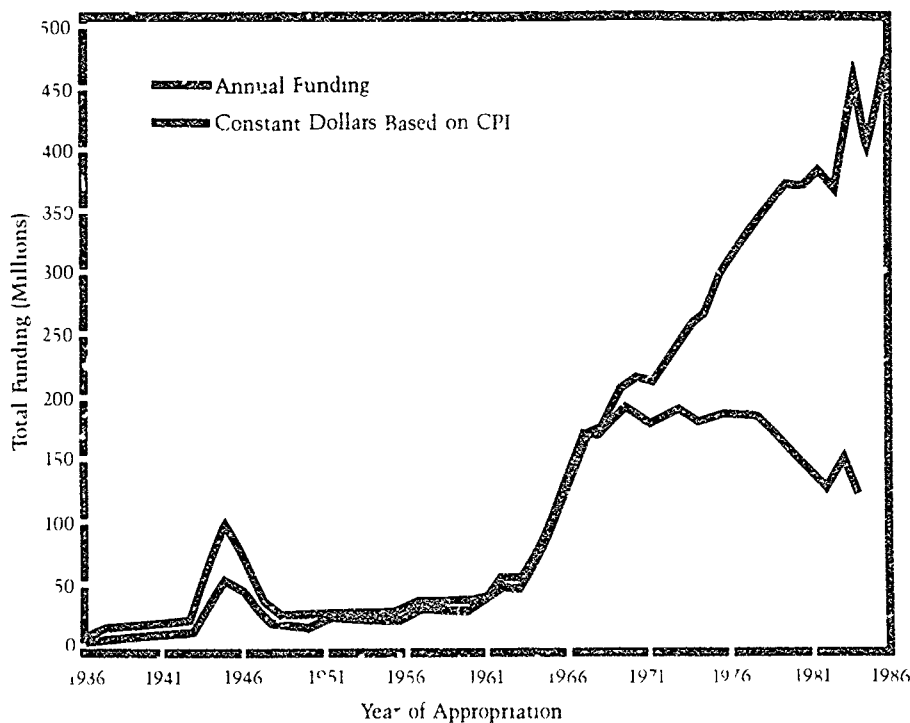
By 1969, a major reorganization in the Department of Health, Education and Welfare moved the Medical Services component of the Children's Bureau, which involved medical and health program efforts for mothers and children, from the administrative control of the Children's Bureau to the Public Health Service, Health Services and Mental Health Administration. Administrative control of the health services for mothers and children by the Public Health Service, which had been suggested repeatedly since the earliest days of the Children's Bureau, finally came to pass. The administering agency is a government unit which has been known,

authorized. These projects were the fourth category funded from the 40 percent of the appropriation for Special (Program of) Projects. The initial authorized funding level was \$450,000 a year.

Dental Projects were authorized as part of the "40 percent" monies in 1971. The initial authorized funding level for these projects was \$500,000 a year. These were the final projects defined as part of the Program of Projects

In 1972, among other actions, implementation of a number of decisions on Title V funding was delayed

over the years, as the Maternal and Child Health Service, the Office for Maternal and Child Health, and at the present time, as the Division of Maternal and Child Health (DMCH).

By the late 1960's and throughout the 1970's, the infant mortality rates declined steadily and at a much faster rate than in the 1950's and early 1960's (See Figure 1.) The combination of new programs, especially Medicaid funding and the Program of Projects models for quality care, and new medical practice, seemed to be having the "hoped-for" impact

1970 - 1981

In 1970, a program for special projects to develop Intensive Infant Care Units (IIC's or ICU's) was

In July of 1972, the separate funding (40 percent of the appropriation) of Special Projects was extended for one year. In fact, the separate funding was extended year by year until FY1975 when a compromise was worked out which protected (held harmless) the existence and funding of the projects already in existence from changes which it was believed some States planned to make. The arrangement was that the total Title V allocation for the MCH and CCS Programs and the Special (Program of) Projects which a State would receive could be no smaller than it had been in FY1973, as defined in the FY1973 State "base" for Title V funding. The monies, defined in Section 516 of Title V of the SSA and shown as "Section 516" monies on the appropriation and allocation tables reflect the monies defined for protection of the Special Projects. In later years, complaints were made that since CCS Program monies were included in the total and since the

allocations reflected the formula's rurality bias, the MCH Program in large urban States (those with the most 516 monies) were, in fact, being penalized. As a result of these issues, a number of analyses were performed to assess what might be involved in trying to modify the Title V formulas. It soon became clear that changes in the allocation formula would mean one of two problems: either there would be a new group of "gainers" and "losers" under the new formulas (and while all States agree with the need for a new and better formula, no State wants that formula to mean that it would lose funding), or the basic "inequity" (as perceived by some States) of the distributions would remain, if Congress again tried to "hold harmless" the funding levels of some States. The formula was not changed.

- In October of 1972, a number of stipulations were made relating to "charge levels," development and monitoring of charge schedules and prohibitions of payments to persons under certain circumstances.
- Also in 1972, coverage under Title V of the Social Security Act was extended to American Samoa and the Trust Territories of the Pacific.

In 1974, a small amount of Section 516 money was given to selected States to plan for the "Program of Projects," including takeover of existing Special Projects.

Finally, in FY1975, the State MCH Programs assumed responsibility for the Program of Projects, including the early Special Projects. The Special Projects funding shown in Appendix Tables 1 and 5-61 for 1975 was the \$10,472,000 appropriated in 1973 and impounded by President Nixon until released by a court order and distributed in 1975. Materials developed for this publication also include the allocations for the so-called "transition quarter" in 1976 when the Federal Government redefined its Fiscal Year, but in most analyses this information is ignored.

In 1978, coverage for the Title V Programs was extended to the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.

Although not directly related to Title V Program funding, a number of new programs were authorized during the 1970's on the basis of separate or categorical funding with most being assigned to be administered by the Division of Maternal and Child Health. These included lead-based paint poisoning prevention, sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS), hemophilia, genetic disease and the adolescent pregnancy program. Another program, transferred to the DMCH in 1977, was the Supplemental Security Income Program for Disabled Children (SSI/DC). Monies for programs which were not appropriated under Title V of the SSA, even if administered by the Federal MCH Program, are generally not shown on the Appendix Tables, but the genetic disease program and hemophilia program funding are shown on Appendix Table 3. Renewed emphasis within the Title V Programs was given to preventive health programs such as inoculations for preventable diseases, child accident prevention, monitoring the health status of pre-school children (0-3 years), and adolescent health programs. Major new efforts to monitor cost of care saw development and implementation of regionalized care programs to improve pregnancy outcome and for persons with hemophilia as well as efforts to develop innovative approaches to financing or arranging for care of handicapped children.

These programs are mentioned because in some cases the funding levels were included in the MCH Block Grant funding base under the Omnibus Reconciliation

Act of 1981 or they are categories of grants funded under the "new" Special Projects of Regional and National Significance (SPRANS). These are reflected in Appendix Table 3.

A review of the Federal appropriations and the uniform and minimum grants allocated by the formulas during the 1970's shows that the funding levels were such that the \$70,000 base for each program's A and B funds became a smaller and smaller part of the total allocated to some States. The following example (using live births for MCH allocations and children under 21 years for CCS allocations) was the last formula used prior to the implementation of the Omnibus Reconciliation Act of 1981. As can be seen, it subtracted the uniform grant base for each State from Fund A and allocated the remainder of Fund A. The process was repeated for the non-reserve Fund B, using the minimum grant base.

If this calculation generated at least \$70,000 for each State's MCH and CCS Programs for Fund A and for the non-reserved Fund B, this was the final calculation. If this was not the case, all States under \$70,000 were adjusted up to \$70,000 and the difference was subtracted

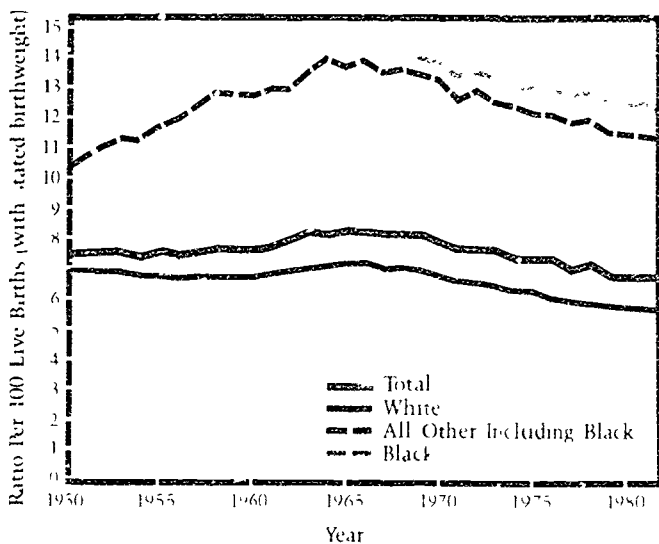
from the total to be allocated and their population base and \$70,000 were subtracted from the appropriate figures. By the same token, the other figures were adjusted so that there was a new "dollars per adjusted population unit" amount which would distribute the new pool of dollars available for allocation to the remaining States based on their adjusted State (population) base (ASB)

Another reorganization in the Federal government in the late 1970's resulted in the dissolution of DHEW and establishment of a new Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) to manage the MCH and CCS Programs.

The Omnibus Reconciliation Act of 1981

The changes in the legislation and regulations beginning in 1969 and continuing through 1981 granted a great deal of leeway to States in the use of the Federal monies. The concept of Block Grants in the Omnibus Reconciliation Act of 1981 extended even further this freedom to define how Federal monies for mothers and children would be used in each State.

The legislation also called for a review of the formulas used to allocate the monies to States and cited a list of factors to consider, including populations-at-risk and availability of services. It did not cite explicitly two items in the Title V legislation, "rurality" or "economically depressed areas," but put an open-end on the list

by mentioning "any other factors." This part of the legislation raised again the many complaints about the formulas and the DMCH undertook another major review of the formulas and possible modifications of them as a basis for allocating the new MCH Block Grant to States. This review was undertaken with an advisory group selected from the Association of MCH and CCS Directors, the Association of State and Territorial Health Officers and the Association of Teachers of Maternal and Child Health. This report will not cover the more than 300 formula models which considered 50-60 data items in many combinations and based on many types of data transformations examined during that review, nor variations developed by the National Center for Health Statistics.

In the end, the Congress decided that the MCH Block Grant would be allocated on the following bases.

- 85 percent of the total MCH Block Grant to be awarded to States on the basis of their proportion in 1981 of the amount of designated types of funds included in the MCH Block Grant, especially Fund A (MCH and CCS), non-reserved Fund B (MCH and CCS), SIDS, SSI/DC, adolescent pregnancy and lead-based paint poisoning prevention programs. No awards were to be made separately to CCS Programs, but most States agreed to retain the apportionment between the two programs which had existed in 1981.
- 15 percent of the total MCH Block Grant to be awarded as grants to authorized organizations for Special Projects of Regional and National Significance. See Appendix Table 3, which depicts the evolution of reserve B funds, research and training funds, as well as genetics and hemophilia funding into the new SPRANS Grants Program.

Federal funds to support the efforts to improve the health of mothers and children and handicapped children have increased significantly over the years 1936 to the present. This is shown both on Appendix Tables 1 and 4 and in Figure 3 (showing the differences in allocations to current DHHS Regions in FY1937 and FY1985) and Figure 4. Of special concern since 1980 is the major increase in the Consumer Price Index which is keyed to 1967 prices. This index which was, by definition, 100 in 1967, had increased to 170.5 in 1980. By 1984 it had rapidly increased to 311.1. Thus, while the increases in funding were fairly substantial in terms of annual dollars, the amounts in constant dollars reflected much smaller increases and, finally, beginning in the mid-1970's, amounted to a net loss in purchasing power. See Appendix Table 4, which shows the difference between actual dollars appropriated and constant dollars defined by the CPI, and Figure 4 for the trend in Title V and MCH Block Grant funding in actual and constant dollars, FY1936-FY1985.

The portion of the 1983 "Jobs Bill" appropriation specified for the needs of mothers and children (\$105,000,000) is included in the MCH Block Grant total in Appendix Table 1, in Appendix Table 4 and in Figure 4. It is shown as a separate supplement in Appendix Tables 5 through 61 for each State.

Also of concern is an apparent slowing in the reduction of the infant mortality rate in the mid-1980's. Another area receiving attention at the present time is the fact that the major reductions in infant mortality levels over the years have not been reflected in a similar reduction in low birthweight ratios although the relationship between the two measures was noted as soon as birthweight data were collected on birth records. The trend in low birthweight ratios in the US can be seen in Figure 5.
