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#### **ABSTRACT**

A nationwide survey of state education departments was conducted in order to learn the extent to which study of Asia is included in precollegiate education. It was found that there is a place for Asia in the curriculum. A course in world history, world geography, and/or world cultures is reportedly offered as part of the common course sequence in almost all 50 states, and is required in approximately 1/3 of the states. Responses from state education departments in each of 15 survey categories are included. The 15 categories are: (1) state; (2) contact persons; (3) state mandated requirements; (4) usual courses/sequences; (5) state textbook policy; (6) teacher training networks; (7) language provisions; (8) international high schools; (9) geographic alliance/JCEE (Joint Council on Economic Education); (10) other key organizations/individuals; (11) outreach programs; (12) mood of the state; (13) sister city/sister state relations; (14) other; and (15) notes. General conclusions from the survey are provided, as are a number of other summaries of survey data. (DB)

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#### IS THERE A PLACE FOR ASIA IN THE K-12 SOCIAL STUDIES CURRICULUM?

Roberta Martin Columbia University (November 1990)

This survey was begun in 1987 as a telephone survey of state education departments, conducted by Sue Gronewold. Its purpose is to give a general overview of the climate and context for education on Asia at the precollegiate level nationwide. The immediate impetus for the survey was the inexplicable lack of interest in Asia among educators in a state that, given its size and economic characteristics, seemly had every reason to be interested in educating its population about Asia. The only ascertainable reason was that the educators, no matter how interested they might be, did not teach social studies courses in which Asia could be easily included. World history, world cultures, and world geography were not common elements of course sequences throughout the state.

We set out to ask, therefore, which states had a "place," a course, in which material on Asia might be included, and which did not. We sought also to identify other aspects of the state profile that would support increased education on Asia, should materials and approaches be made available.

The result of this inquiry is a thumbnail sketch of the climate for intercultural, and particularly Asian, studies in all 50 states. The survey has revealed both interesting common curricular patterns as well as stunning diversity. The commonalities among states as well as the individual characterists of each provide important information which centers for curriculum development on Asia can use to coordinate delivery of resources to states.

The survey is not definitive. There are mistakes, omissions, and inaccuracies as well as unreported changes that have taken place in the three-year period of the survey, all of which we hope readers will correct for future revision and expansion of the survey. As a working paper, however, this overview begins to provide the type of information needed for the next step of national coordination in Asian studies education at the K-12 level.

IS THERE A PLACE FOR ASIA IN THE CURRICULUM? The answer is a resounding "yes." A course in world history, world geography, and/or world cultures is reportedly offered as part of the common course sequence in almost all 50 states, and is required in approximately 1/3 of the states.



#### The challenges before us are to:

- materials and educational resources that already exist for teaching about Asia in order to enhance the quality of education on Asia and discourage the "reinvention of the wheel," district by district. Demonstrating which materials are particularly relevant to the course sequence of a given state is essential. While sharing common information, presentations must be tailored to the state being served.
- 2) capitalize upon commonalities to encourage the sharing of information among states with similar curricular patterns and contexts, whether it be a course in world history commonly taught in 33 states at the 9th-10th grade level, a world communities course offered in 13 states at the third(3rd) grade level, or the presence of large numbers of Asian nationals in school districts in a large number of states.
- 3) translate pragmatic interest in learning about Asia because of its economic success into sound educational policy.
- 4) design a new, coordinated, and vastly expanded network for dissemination of services that makes them accessible to teachers and is adequate to the demand found nationwide in the 1990s.



#### SURVEY CATEGORIES AND ABBREVIATION CODES

The survey is divided into fifteen (15) categories. An explanation of these categories follows below.

Supplementing the survey is a mailing list of approximately 5000 educators, which can be broken down by state. This list includes all those who participated in the Keizai Koho/JISEA travel program to Japan, all schools offering Chinese language funded by the Geraldine Dodge Foundation, all secondary schools reporting a Japanese language program, and all state offices of the Joint Council on Economic Education and the Geographic Alliance.

#### STATE OF THE STATES: GENERAL CONCLUSIONS

#### State Requirements

In general, it appears that this is a time of change in many states that are moving in the direction of either a mandated curriculum or of more broadly defined objectives set by the state. There have been new requirements established for global education in a number of states in 1987 and others are developing requirements for the near future. These mandated requirements are not only in world history, geography, or cultures courses; often an intentional focus is spread throughout the curriculum, using the Indiana model of the "State and the World."

In states which lack clear mandates but which have active social studies specialists or state social studies councils, specialists often work with local teachers and administrators to develop international programs (as in Massachusetts where outreach centers are particularly important) or with universities which might require world history (as in Tennessee).

#### Scope and Sequence

There is enormous variation across the states, but it appears that most frequently there is a world geography or cultures course in approximately 7th grade with a world history course at some point 9-12, usually 10th grade. Electives which may include economics or contemporary world problems may be taken any time 9-12 but are frequently cited as selected by seniors.

#### Textbook Policy

There seems to be a great North/South divide in textbook policies, with most northern states following Yankee individualism and local autonomy and more southern states favoring state lists of one sort or another. Most states with state lists, however, do not require that all state monies be spent on the list; usually 70-80% of the monies must be spent but some can be used for non-list supplemental materials. The big text adoption states are perceived to be Florida, Texas, and California; in actual fact, California only has a required list for elementary grades, leaving texts for world history courses open to teacher or district choice.

#### Teacher Training

Again, there is enormous variation across the states, with many states organized into educational service districts responsible for in-service training and staff development. These districts tend to focus on basic skills, except in those states which have most recently changed the curriculum. It appears that quite frequently active social studies specialists at the state level are very involved in teacher training, developing materials, doing workshops, lobbying for state resources.

There are many outside organizations which are active in international education and Asian studies. Most frequently cited were: state councils of social studies; universities, particularly those with international programs or centers; World Affairs Councils; National Geographic Alliance's programs; Chambers of Commerce, especially in the South.



#### Mood of the State

Except for the few anomalous states (Vermont, Wisconsin, Minnesota), most of the states with strong global education programs are states with growing Asian presence and ties. The southern and southeastern states with new Japanese corporations, the midwestern states with Japanese companies or hopes to develop economic links for failing agriculture, and the western states with Asian populations and Pacific Rim awareness have the most active global education programs. In many of those states, there is the most ideal conjuncture: local teacher and district demand coupled with active state departments of education and governors, fueled by resource granting state legislatures. The role of governors seems crucial in many states, especially those in the South and Southeast, but there must be a sure source of funding to make the programs a success. State legislatures are an obvious source, but even California apparently has problems with funding; foundations increasingly are becoming involved, such as Rockefeller, Danforth, and the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH).

The major challenge confronting those active in international education, particularly in the South and Midwest, will be to move the discussion of Asia from economics to education, from Japan to all of Asia. A second challenge was voiced by Roger Wangen of Minnesota: to infuse the total curriculum, especially the elementary curriculum, with an international focus and to coordinate resources across the country and make them more accessible and more visible.
