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ABSTRACT

A study was conducted to obtain information on the transfer outcomes of Community College of Philadelphia (CCP) students who transferred to another Philadelphia-area college or university. The study sought information on the grade point average (GPA), credit hours taken, graduation status, and other measures of student persistence for 252 former CCP students who matriculated at 24 transfer institutions. Study findings indicated: (1) 41% of the transfer students had graduated from programs at CCP; (2) the average cumulative GPA for transfer students at CCP was 2.9; (3) an average of 88% of CCP-earned credits transferred into the programs at the receiving institutions; (4) the average number of credits earned per student at the transfer school was 25; (5) the average ratio of credits earned to credits attempted at the transfer school was 95%; (6) the transfer students experienced an average drop of 0.7 points in GPA between CCP and the transfer institution; and (7) only 7% of the students transferred into programs that were obviously different from their CCP program of study. The report includes information on transfer activity at each of of the 24 responding transfer institutions, including numbers of students transferring into particular departments, the programs of study taken by the transfer students at CCP, the numbers of students experiencing academic difficulties, and the CCP courses that did not transfer. Introduction _

Over the years, a sizeable number of CCP students have transferred out of CCP and into other Philadelphia-area colleges and universities. Previous institutional research indicated that nine months after leaving CCP, approximately half of the CCP graduates and 30% of the former, nongraduating CCP students had enrolled in a program of study at another school.

Unfortunately, in the past little information was gathered by the College that could be used to evaluate the post-CCP academic progress of our former students. Several pieces of information that routinely appear on a student transcript would be useful for this purpose and therefore form the basis of this transfer outcomes report.

Grade point average has received much attention in transfer outcomes studies conducted by others. Much of this preoccupation with GPA stems from its acceptance as an efficient and relatively reliable measure of student academic progress. In addition, a comparison of GPA's across schools is a useful measure of the degree of academic assimilation achieved by former CCP students at their transfer school. CCP and transfer school GPA have therefore been included in this report.

Credit hour information is interesting for several reasons. By itself, it provides an uncomplicated measure of student persistence. In addition, research conducted by others has indicated there is a postive correlation between the amount of course work completed at community college and the students academic performance at the transfer school. For these reasons, CCP credit hour information and graduation status are included in this report.

In this report the analysis of specific CCP courses that transfer into four- year programs was limited to nonremedial courses in which the student earned a grade of C or better. Even though course analyses conducted within these parameters measure the effectiveness of articulation between the schools rather than measuring a direct student outcome, they have been included in this study since the presence or absence of articulation agreements will effect outcomes, particularly transfer credit information.

Finally, several additional measures of student persistence are worth considering in a transfer outcomes study. These include the number of cumulative credits earned and the ratio of credits earned to credits attempted at the transfer school.

This report is a supplement to an earlier IR Report #26, entitled "Transfer Outcomes Fall 1982". Report #26 provided admissions and matriculation information for former CCP students who transferred to other institutions in the Philadelphia area. Each of these students would have matriculated in Fall '82



semester and completed at least 9 credits at CCP.

A total of 30 receiving institutions were included in the study. Only Drexel and Lincoln Universities did not cooperate by providing transcripts of work completed by our former students at their schools.

A list of participating schools, the number of former CCP matriculants and the number of applicants appears in Table 1.

Principle data sources for this study were transcripts from CCP and the receiving institution. One drawback with this approach is the diversity of the information that is routinely printed on transcripts. Although all schools list the courses the student takes internally this is where the standardization ends. Most school transcripts contain the name and number of transcripts credits from other institutions, some list the specific courses that transfer into their programs, a few record current student



status or graduation information. Because of this diversity, much of the transfer outcome information in this study will be aggregated by transfer institution, yeilding a descriptive profile for each receiving institution.

Analysis

A summary of much of the transfer outcomes information appears in Tables 2 and 3, which are on the next two pages. Table 2 summarizes CCP-related information for each transfer school that responded to the data request. Table 3 handles transfer school-related information in the same way. The total set of figures that appear at the top of both tables can be used as a baseline when reviewing institutional data. For example, 41% of all matriculated students graduated from CCP. Several schools, including La Salle, Hahnemann, Philadelphia Textile, Spring Garden and Gwynedd Mercy admitted a higher percentage of CCP graduates than the norm. As a result, students who transferred to these schools earned, on the average, more CCP credits than the average 46 earned by all students who transferred.

On the other hand, students who transfer to Peirce Junior College, New School of Music, Frankford Hospital, Philadelphia College of the Performing Arts and University of Pennsylvania were enrolled at CCP for the fewest credits. It should be pointed out that much of this information is based on one or two students and should therefor: be reviewed cautiously.

As a group, the matriculated students included in this study did well academically while at CCP, the average cumulative CCP GPA was 2.7. Only Peirce and Albert Einstein matriculants earned GPA's below 2.7 while at CCP.

An average of 88% of CCP earned credits transferred into the programs at the receiving institutions. The figures in the last column of Table 2 are based on only nonremedial courses in which the student earned a grade of C or better.

Schools accepting a lower than normal percentage of CCP credits include Thomas Jefferson University, Gwynedd Mercy College, Moore College of Art, Albert Einstein Hospital, Philadelphia College of the Performing Arts and University of Pennsylvania.

CCP courses and the transfer program the course did not transfer into are detailed in the Institution Profiles which appear at the back of this report. In an effort to enhance articulation, CCP departments should evaluate core courses that repeatedly turn up in this category.

Much of the information that is contained in Table 3 helps to monitor student academic progress after CCP. This information indicates that former students are likely to be full time at the transfer school. The average student has completed the equivalent

of two semesters' worth of full-time course work at the transfer institution. Only students at Peirce and West Chester have completed fewer credits than the norm of 25.

Several students have already completed a Bachelor's degree program at the four-year institution. In most cases, these are students who earned credits at another school prior to attending CCP and the transfer school, or in the case of the New School of Music, students who attended the "transfer" school full time and picked up some general education credits at CCP during concurrent semesters.

Using the ratio of credits earned to attempted as a measure of academic competence, it appears that the eight students at West Chester and the six students at Philadelphia College of Art are experiencing some difficulties in their transfer programs. By contrast, transfer students at several schools including Gwynedd Mercy, Villanova and Beaver completed 100% of their attempted course work.

Based on transfer school GPA information that appears in the last two columns in Table 3, it looks as if former CCP students experience a degree of transfer shock in the transition between institutions. Overall, the students included in this study experienced a drop of 0.7 points in GPA between schools. Only the students at Peirce and the one student at University of Pennsylvania maintained a higher GPA at the transfer school than at CCP. The lowest GPA's were earned at Widener, Hahnemann, West Chester and Moore College of Art.

It is insightful when reviewing transfer outcome information to consider the match between CCP program and transfer school program, since a mismatch of the two could explain drops in GPA or loss of earned credits. Generally speaking, few students (7%) transfered into programs that were obviously different from their CCP program of study. General Studies students were excluded from this analysis since individual student transcripts would have to be studied in detail in order to determine if the General Studies program paralelled the transfer school program. Since 54% of the students included in this study were CCP General Studies students, it was decided this type of analysis would be included in the detailed General Studies Program Audit that is currently in progress.

Profiles of each of the receiving institutions are appended to the end of this report. After reviewing the profiles and the table information, the conclusion can be made that student academic success after CCP varies over transfer institution. Our former students strongest academic performance occurred at Thomas Jefferson University, Gwynedd Mercy College, Holy Family College, Philadelphia College of Textile and Sciences and Frankford Hospital School of Nursing. Weakest academic performance is associated with Hahnemann University, West Chester College, Widener College and Moore College of Art. Future research should be concerned with determining the reasons for poor academic



performance at these institutions.

Departmental staff should take the time to review each Transfer Institution Profile to determine in which of the receiving institutions most of their former students enroll, the number who experience academic difficulty (defined in the profile as a cumulative GPA below 2.00) at the transfer school and core courses in their program that do not transfer into paralell programs.
