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ABSTRACT

Because folklife studies have been integrated into a variety of scholarly and public pursuits, the breadth and vitality of the field has sometimes been underestimated. This directory demonstrates the extent of resources and programs available. Chapter one presents U.S. and Canadian federal agencies and organizations that provide long-range programmatic and financial support for the conservation and study of traditional culture in the United States. State folk cultural programs that function in an official capacity for their respective areas are listed in chapter two, which points out that folk arts coordinators can provide valuable information on publications, programs, and resources in their states. Societies with specific cultural interests, such as the Southern Appalachian Dulcimer Association, provide an invaluable source for information on folk culture and are identified in chapter three. Organizations and institutions included in chapter four have an on-going programmatic interest in folklife study, conservation, and presentation demonstrated either through their own activities or grant support. Chapter five identifies serial publications available for the study of folklife. Chapter six describes archives which are oriented primarily to folklore, folklife, and ethnomusicology. These archives have special collections of significance, or have been included on the recommendation of state folk cultural programs. Higher education programs in folklore and folklife will be found in chapter seven of the directory. Chapter eight identifies recording companies in North America specializing in folk music. Chapter nine presents a list of supplemental guides to general or specific folklife topics or networks. (SM)

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This publication celebrates the 10th anniversary of the American Folklife Center at the Library of Congress and commemorates the centennial of the American Folklore Society, founded in 1888.

INTRODUCTION

This sourcebook has been assembled to serve a variety of interests. The information it encompasses reflects the broad reach of professional folklore and folklife networks and the many allied pursuits and activities involving folklore and folklife studies and programming in the arts and social sciences, public programs, and educational institutions. Because folklife studies have been integrated into a variety of scholarly and public pursuits, the breadth and vitality of the field has sometimes been underestimated. By demonstrating the extent of resources and programs available, we hope this directory will encourage public and scholarly participation and an awareness of programs, institutions, and activities linked to cultural conservation.

In recent decades the task of compiling directory information has been performed by the Archive of Folk Culture under the direction of Joseph C. Hickerson. As part of the Archive's services, and more recently as part of the broader range of services provided by the American Folklife Center, the Archive staff and volunteer interns have prepared and maintained reference aids to assist researchers who have visited and corresponded with the Archive. These reference aids became the basis for many sections of this directory. The sources and resources they list have become so multiple and varied that a unified directory now seems a useful contribution to the field.

In preparing this publication existing lists were updated, and during winter and spring of 1985 two major surveys were undertaken. The first was a questionnaire survey of holdings in folklife and folksong archives. The first of its kind, it not only provides archivists with an opportunity to share data and professional concerns but also introduces the public to important resources previously difficult to locate. The second survey, of folklife studies in colleges and universities in the United States and Canada, required the distribution of approximately 4,500 questionnaires and the examination of numerous college and university catalogs. It was conducted by Dr. Ronald L. Baker, Chair,

Department of English, Indiana State University at Terre Haute, as a joint project of the American Folklife Center and the American Folklore Society. For his analysis of the survey's findings see *Journal of American Folklore* (Volume 99, Number 391, January-April, 1986).

The directory takes its organization and arrangement of data from the expressed needs of users of the Archive. Organizations and institutions are arranged by states and cities, with Canadian provinces integrated. The listing of university courses is arranged alphabetically, since users generally identify universities and colleges by name. Recording companies and serials, which are normally contacted by mail, are also presented alphabetically.

We have appended a selected list of directories, not only to guide readers to additional sources but to illustrate the breadth of informational resources germane to the field of folklore and folklife. Whether the search is for ethnic societies, museums, arts councils, or funding sources for scholarly research or public projects, the *Directory of Directories* is an established reference source of great value.

The planning and development of this publication required thousands of questionnaires, hundreds of phone calls, and the verification of an immense number of details. Without the close cooperation of many this directory would not exist. Special acknowledgement and appreciation are gratefully extended to Joseph C. Hickerson, the staff and interns of the Archive and Center, Aldona M. Kamantauskas, Michael Licht, and Ronald L. Baker.

FEDERAL AGENCIES

Beginning with the establishment of the Archive of Folk Culture at the Library of Congress in 1928 as the Archive of American Folk-Song, several federal agencies have provided long-range programmatic and financial support to the conservation and study of traditional culture in the United States. The Smithsonian Institution began its Festival of American Folklife in 1967, expanding to the Office of Folklife Programs in 1977. The National Endowment for the Arts established its Folk Arts Program in 1974. The American Folklife Center was established in 1976 with the passage of Public Law 94-201, the American Folklife Preservation Act. Other federal agencies, including the Departments of Interior, Education, and Agriculture, as well as the National Endowment for the Humanities, have coordinated and funded important efforts.

Key Canadian agencies have also been listed. Like the U.S. agencies, they will serve as guides to additional resources. Most of the agencies listed below engage in a broad range of consultation and public programs and produce scholarly and informational publications.

STATE FOLK CULTURAL PROGRAMS

State folk cultural programs function in an official capacity for their respective states. Such programs date from the 1960s and have now been instituted in most states with the assistance of the Folk Arts Program of the National Endowment for the Arts. They are often located within state arts councils, but several are based in historical societies and commissions or within governor's offices. Others are independently incorporated. State folk arts coordinators or state folklorists (as they are sometimes called) work with a wide range of local, state, private, and federal agencies and organizations, and their activities range from Folk Artists in Education programs to apprenticeships, field studies, exhibits, festivals, and other public-education projects. They can provide valuable information on publications, programs, and resources in their states.
